The present watch is a very fine example of a complicated timepiece made by Louis Audemars for his faithful client, Breguet in Paris. According to the Archives of *Montres Breguet*, ébauche and case were supplied by Louis Audemars, finished by Breguet and sold on 29 December 1885 for the amount of 2,500 Francs to Messrs Mir et Cottereau, their agent in Constantinople at the end of the 19th century.

The case is stamped with Louis Audemars' shield-shaped hallmarks, one inscribed "Brassus", one featuring a dog's head and capital letters L.A. for Louis Audemars above the double cross of Lorraine (see *Louis-Benjamin Audemars - His Life and Work* by Hartmut Zantke, pp. 182 - 187). For a comparable watch, however with the addition of a chronograph, sold by Louis Audemars to Breguet in 1882 see p. 408, op. cit..

The engraved initials on the front cover of the present watch are most likely those of the Ottoman Sultan 'Abdulhamed II, the engraving on the back indicates the Islamic year AH1303 or 1885AD, year of sale of the present watch. The Sultan had often objects made for him featuring these initials, including watches, cigarette boxes, and other decorative items.

His Imperial Majesty, The Sultan Abdülhamid II, Emperor of the Ottomans, Caliph of the Faithful (1842 - 1918), was the 34th Sultan of the Ottoman Empire. He ruled from 31 August 1876 until 27 April 1909 and was succeeded by Mehmed V.

An example of the Big Pilot's watch is on permanent exhibition at the prestigious IWC Museum in Schaffhausen. The biggest IWC pilot's watch was supplied to the German Luftwaffe in 1940 in an edition of 1,000 examples. The big device constructed according to the criteria for observer's watches with the pocket watch caliber 52 T.S.C. is the biggest wristwatch ever built by IWC, with a case diameter of 55 mm., a height of 16.5 mm. and a weight of 183 grams. The extra long wrist strap with double bow and clasp clip makes it possible to wear the watch over a flying suit.

This movement was fitted with an indirect sweep center mechanism with hacking feature thanks to which the balance is stopped while the crown is pulled out, thus allowing setting of the time to the split second. The large size of the crown allows winding and setting even when wearing gloves.

The inside of the case backs were engraved with the following military markings:

B-Uhr (for Beobachtungs-Uhr or Navigation Watch) Bauart (manufacturer): I.W.C., Werk Nr. 1013894 and Anforderz. FL 23883 (classification number).

As of around 1937, watches used by the German Air Force were fitted with such a panel indicating manufacturer, serial number and a Fl number. In order to disguise information regarding manufacturer and quantities produced, these indications were coded from 1941 onwards.

The watches were primary tested by the Deutsche Versuchsanstalt für Luftfahrt DVL (German Aviation Research Institute) and classified with a so-called Fl.-Number. The Fl stands for flight and the first two digits, 22, for flight control; 23 stands for navigation and 25 for radio surveillance, followed by the three digits serial number given by the DVL.

It takes much more than a cursory glance at Patek Philippe's debut showpiece for Basel 2003 to realize that reference 5101 is a highly complicated wristwatch. In fact it is the first timepiece that combines two complications which are very difficult to accommodate in the confined space of a rectangular movement: two tandem mainspring barrels with 240 hours of energy storage capacity and a tourbillon precision regulator composed of 72 individual parts.

Characteristic for Patek Philippe, hardly any signs on the outside of the piece would reveal the complexity of its inner workings. Understated elegance has always been a hallmark of Patek Philippe but the tourbillon cage is in fact concealed for a very practical reason - the oil used to lubricate the mechanism is sensitive to ultraviolet rays and would decompose if exposed to daylight, thus losing its beneficial tribological properties. As extremely stringent standards are imposed on all Patek Philippe movements and even more so on tourbillon pieces, the present timepiece is stamped with the Geneva Seal.


