The present lot is notable given its diminutive size of 78 mm, a remarkable technical achievement given the complexity of the singing bird movement. Other examples of singing birds range in the length of 85 to 90 mm.

Salomon Chénevard (1773-1837) worked as jeweler living in the Rue de Temple, Geneva. Both Chénevard and the jeweler Jean-Louis Joly (1757-1825) had been partners of the firm Roux, Ponçon & Cie., manufacturers of bijouterie, from September 1801 until 1803. They are recorded as entering their first marks in the name of Joly & Chénevard in 1807/8. In 1815 they had taken on a younger partner, Pierre Jouvet, exemplified by their new mark, depicting ICI in a lozenge. In 1820, they re-named the firm Chénevard, Jouvet & Cie. Jouvet's wife, Jacqueline Etienette Guidon took Joly's place on his retirement in 1824.

The firm of Frères Rochat began as David Rochat & Son in Le Brassus (1718-1806) and became famous for its complicated movements and a variety of complex novelties that included singing birds in mirrors, snuff boxes, needle cases and pistols.

The present lot is one of 30 watches created

to the specifications of Otto Fleischhauer's calendar patent. Fleischhauer registered his patent, no. 25267 in Berlin on June 5th, 1883. He collaborated with A. Lange & Söhne to produce his calendar system.

The unusual calendar work proved somewhat awkward compared to other contemporary setting designs on the market, and never gained popularity. Of thirty pieces made, one other, no. 19065, was sold at auction, in 2015. This is the first time the present lot, no. 19079, has been offered at auction.



Potter remains one of the most celebrated American watch makers. The present example incorporates many features unique to Potter's production, including his patented safety barrel, his highly recognized bridge arrangement, his own form of pivoted detent, and his method of securing the movement in the case.

Albert H. Potter was born in Saratoga County, New York in 1830 and served his apprenticeship in Albany. In 1855, he established himself in New York City. He spent five years working in Cuba and later returned to the United States and organized a watch company with his brother William Cleveland Potter.

However, in 1876, he moved to Geneva. He likely sought to surpass the boundaries of the American watchmaking industry, which, at the time, was focused on mass production, rather than individual innovation.

He produced approximately 600 watches while working in Switzerland.





While these are no mean feats in watchmaking, they are somewhat overshadowed by the widely considered 'most complex of horological complications' - the grande sonnerie or grand-strike complication. Combining a quarter striking mechanism with a minute repeating mechanism, it allows the user to hear the time striking as it passes, and activates a minute repeating function on demand.

It is this complication that F.P. Journe took six years to master and ten patents to create in his *Grande et Petite Sonnerie Souveraine*. This remarkable achievement, produced by a Manufacturer not even 20 years old, combines every element that has come to define both Journe himself, and his watches.

Though fitted with such a highly intricate complication, it is, in essence, an incredibly simple watch. The dial encompasses Journe's signature minimalist aesthetic with a beautifully engine turned eccentric dial screwed to an 18k white gold plate. the dial, lies the mind-boggling in-house caliber 1505 and all of its functions. Only through the small aperture revealing the striking hammers is the wearer afforded a glimpse of the 18k pink gold work beneath. This elegant simplicity carries through to the plain, circular case, with two pushers to the band operating the sonnerie and minute repeating functions. Journe's rather utilitarian ethic is epitomized by the fact that the case of this, the most expensive watch in the Manufacturers repertoire, is not made out of gold or platinum, but steel. For Journe, this was the obvious choice, as it is the material which allows the watch to produce the most perfect chime.

Through the sapphire crystal display back, the movement is on full view. One can observe the intricacies of the machine within (the praying mantis style repeating arms are especially fun to watch), but again, this spends most of its time sitting modestly out of sight against the wrist.

The above lot is presented at auction for the first time in wonderful condition and with all of its accompanying pieces. Awarded the Aiguille D'or at the 2006 GPHG and, with only 4 pieces made per year, it offers any collector the rare opportunity to purchase what may rightly be considered the pinnacle of the F.P. Journe collection.

tourbillon is inclined at a 25° angle and performs a 24-second revolution, a remarkable feat when compared to more traditional one-minute tourbillons. The Tourbillon 24 Seconds Incline works to minimize the effects of gravity on the watch; the use of extremely low density alloys such as Avional and titanium, which are employed in aeronautics, enables the tourbillon carriage to overcome the stresses imposed by the high rotation velocity. The tourbillon cage alone comprises 87 parts, yet it weighs just 0.39 grams.

The superior hand finishing of Greubel Forsey's movements is renowned and practiced with acute attention, as a quarter of the team at the firm's atelier is purely devoted to this work. The architecturally inspired case, with its asymmetrical design, is perfectly balanced by the opposing niches that contain the tourbillon carriage and the power reserve sector. With an additional curved sapphire crystal set to the side of the case, it is possible to fully appreciate the tourbillon carriage in action, as it gives the impression of being almost magically detached from the gear train.

The present lot in platinum is distinguished by the visually stunning three-dimensionality of it's dial architecture. The off-set subsidiary dials, layered chapter rings, and inscribed panels are harmoniously arranged in anthracite, creating an aesthetic that is dynamic, powerful, and legible.

Among his work he developed the CFHT12K camera (a highly advanced type of CCD digital camera) which is able to capture images of more than 100,000,000 pixels, and has since contributed to the revelation of the acceleration of the expansion of the universe, of which the research and discovery was awarded the Nobel Physics Prize in 2011. Luppino also helped to develop the Pan-STARRS camera (atop Haleakalā on Maui, Hawaii) and contributed

to the work done on the Hubble and James Webb Space Telescopes.

In addition to his astronomical endeavors, Luppino was an avid watch collector, and horological enthusiast, contributing greatly with technical articles and pieces in the early days of the website, timezone.com.

The collection is an excellent example of Luppino's vocation and passions: modern, complicated, and rare pieces coupled with vintage sports watches, notably early Speedmasters with their ties to NASA.





In total, only 244 examples were made. 1981 and early 1982 were the only years of production for the first series examples, featuring a red dot for the leap year and Arabic numerals for 1,2 and 3. It is estimated that these account for perhaps about 10% of the total production run. In 1982, the leap year display was updated to feature only Roman numerals I, II, III and IV.

Both the 3448 and 3450 are beloved for their striking, angular case shapes, which straddle the line between 'vintage' and 'modern' from a design and historical perspective. The chunky and bold presence of the watch on the wrist was

a departure from the ultra-slim dress watches favored at the time of their production. Almost inconceivably to collectors today, when first introduced, the models were not terribly popular and often sold years after production, sometimes even at discounted prices. They were ahead of their time aesthetically, but today collectors have caught up with full appreciation for the modern and timeless design.



BUYING AT AUCTION

All bidders should read the Conditions of Sale and Terms of Guarantee in this catalogue, as well as the Glossary or any other notices. By bidding at auction, bidders are bound by the Conditions of Sale and Terms of Guarantee, as amended by any oral announcement or posted notices, which together form the sale contract among Sotheby's, the seller (consignor) of the lot and any bidders, including the successful bidder (purchaser).

1. SYMBOL KEY

☐ Reserves

Unless indicated by a box (), all lots in this catalogue are offered subject to a reserve. A reserve is the confidential minimum hammer price at which a lot will be sold. The reserve is generally set at a percentage of the low estimate and will not exceed the low estimate of the lot. If any lots in the catalogue are offered without reserve, such lots will be designated by a box (). If every lot in a catalogue is offered without a reserve, the Conditions of Sale will so state and this symbol will not be used for each lot.

O Guaranteed Property

The seller of lots with this symbol has been guaranteed a minimum price from one auction or a series of auctions. This guarantee may be provided by Sotheby's or jointly by Sotheby's and a third party. INFORMATION ON SALES AND USE TAX RELATED TO PURCHASES AT AUCTION

To better assist our clients, we have prepared the following information on Sales and Use Tax related to property purchased at auction.

Why Sotheby's Collects Sales Tax

Virtually all State Sales Tax Laws require a corporation to register with the State's Tax Authorities and collect and remit sales tax if the corporation maintains a presence within the state, such as offices. In the states that impose sales tax, Tax Laws require an auction house, with a presence in the state, to register as a sales tax collector, and remit sales tax collected to the state. New York sales tax is charged on the hammer price, buyer's premium and any other applicable charges on any property picked up or delivered in New York, regardless of the state or country in which the purchaser resides or does business.

Where Sotheby's Collects Sales Tax

Sotheby's is currently registered to collect sales tax in the following states: California, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, Maryland, Massachusetts, Minnesota, Missouri, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Texas and Washington. For any property collected or received by the purchaser in New York City, such property is subject to sales tax at the existing New York State and City rate of 8.875%.

Sotheby's Arranged Shipping If the property is delivered into any state in which Sotheby's is registered, Sotheby's is required by law to collect and remit the appropriate sales tax in effect in the state where the property is delivered.

Client Arranged Shipping Property collected from Sotheby's New York premises by a common carrier hired by the purchaser for delivery at an address outside of New York is not subject to New York Sales Tax, but if the property is delivered into

any state in which Sotheby's is registered, Sotheby's is required by law to collect and remit the appropriate sales tax in effect in the state where the property is delivered. New York State recognizes shippers such as the United States Postal Service, United Parcel Service, FedEx, or the like as "common carriers". If a purchaser hires a shipper other than a common carrier to pick up property, Sotheby's will collect New York sales tax at a rate of 8.875% regardless of the ultimate destination of the goods. If a purchaser utilizes a freight-forwarder who is registered with the Transportation Security Administration ("TSA") to deliver property outside of the United States, no sales tax would be due on this transaction.

Where Sotheby's is Not Required to Collect Sales Tax Sotheby's is not required to collect sales tax on property delivered to states other than those listed above. If the property is delivered to a state where Sotheby's is not required to collect sales tax, it is the responsibility of the purchaser to self-assess any sales or use tax and remit it to taxing authorities in

Sotheby's is not required to collect sales tax for property delivered to the purchaser outside of the United States

Restoration and Other Services

Regardless of where the property is subsequently transported, if any framing or restoration services are performed on the property in New York, it is considered to be a delivery of the property to the purchaser in New York, and Sotheby's will be required to collect the 8.875% New York sales tax.

Certain Exemptions Most states that impose sales taxes allow for specified exemptions to the tax. For example, a registered re-seller such as a registered art dealer may purchase without incurring a tax liability, and Sotheby's is not required to collect sales tax from such re-seller. The art dealer, when re-selling the property, may be required to charge sales tax to its client, or the client may be required to self-assess sales or use tax upon acquiring the property.

Local Tax Advisors As sales tax laws vary from state to state, Sotheby's recommends that clients with questions regarding the application of sales or use taxes to property purchased at auction seek tax advice from their local tax advisors.

IMPORTANT NOTICES

Certificates of Authenticity

Various manufacturers may not issue certificates of authenticity upon request. Except as specifically noted in the catalogue, Sotheby's will not be required to furnish the purchaser with a certificate of authenticity from the manufacturer at any time.
