The ref 6263 remains one of the most sought after and well known models from the Daytona family. First put into production in 1969, the 6263 was the contemporary to the reference 6265, and replaced the first oyster chronograph ref 6240. These manufacturers fought hard to promote the importance of gold parts alongside watchmaking techniques and to therefore flag a standard of superior quality. At that time, it didn't really have the impact on the market that they desired sadly, but it did produce an interesting subtle collectible variant of this reference

The present lot is offered on behalf of the original family. It was bought by R. Eade who successfully completed an engineering apprenticeship in east London before joining the army in August 1972. He was a member of REME - the Royal Electrical and Mechanical Engineers - and served in both the UK and overseas. Ray was attached to the Army Air Corp for much of his time and worked with helicopters. He was posted to Belize, Central America in February 1975 and, as a 25th birthday present to himself, bought a Rolex watch on 1st April, 1975. This was a particularly happy time in R. Eade's life; he was living and working in a tropical climate while fishing for barracuda in the Carribean at the weekends! R. left the army with an "Exemplary" discharge in April 1978. He was always very proud of his time in the army and was particularly pleased to have such a fantastic watch as a momento of that time. The original Guarantee accompanying the watch testifies how important his military career was to him as it bears, "British forces" next to his name.



- (iii) Sotheby's Authenticity Guarantee as printed in the sale catalogue;
- (iv) any additional notices and terms printed in the sale catalogue, including the Buying At Auction Guide; and
- (v) in respect of online bidding via the internet, the BIDNOW Conditions on the Sotheby's website, in each case as amended by any saleroom notice or auctioner's announcement at the auction
- (b) As auctioneer, Sotheby's acts as agent for the Seller. A sale contract is made directly between the Seller and the Buyer. However, Sotheby's may own a lot (and in such circumstances acts in a principal capacity as Seller) and/or may have a legal, beneficial or financial interest in a lot as a secured creditor or otherwise.

2. COMMON TERMS IN THESE CONDITIONS OF BUSINESS

In these Conditions of Business:

- **"Bidder"** is any person considering, making or attempting to make a bid, by whatever means, and includes Buyers;
- "Buyer" is the person who makes the highest bid or offer accepted by the auctioneer, and includes such person's principal when bidding as agent;
