



There's a trend back to the old fashioned idea of family activities centering in the kitchen. Some of the latest kitchen designs include a play area where the family can congregate. Here a pink Chord Organ trimmed with gold is in the "play area" part of General Electric's model kitchen. Pink was chosen as the color for the Chord Organ to match the kitchen cabinets. The G. E. electric range (concealed by the screen) offers contrast with a bright canary yellow. The walls are of red wood paneling giving balance to the color scheme.



A National Home in Tyler, Texas featured the Chord Organ in its living room. The ebony finish of the Chord Organ is silhouetted against a wall of robin egg blue. The draperies are metallic gold with horizontal stripes. The sofa is mustard colored. The cocktail table's ebony finish matches the Chord Organ, but the coral top offers a pleasing contrast. THE CHORD ORGAN IS PART OF THE MEANING OF "HOME" FOR THE MANY THOUSANDS OF FAMILIES OWNING ONE

Fare you well, old house! you're naught that can feel or see, But you seem like a human being—a dear old friend to me; (From "The First Settler's Story", by Will Carleton—Stanza 20)

The word "home", with all its implied meanings, is beyond definition. Home has a different meaning for everyone.

But one thing is certain, the building does not make the home. It's what goes into the building and the relationship among the people who live in it that make the home. Home is an instrument for happy living and this is true whether it be a one room apartment or a forty room mansion.

Psychologists have shown us that our surroundings influence us for better or for worse. If our home surroundings are comfortable, restful, and pleasing, we are better equipped to deal with the everyday problems. A good home makes for better social adjust

Hammond in the Heart of the Home—The Hammond Chord Organ was placed in the activity room of the "Home for All America" model house in Arlington Heights, Illinois, because this room is the heart of the house where children play and sleep, and where the family gathers for fun with music and books.

The room is rectangular with windows at both narrow ends. The Chord Organ is at right angles to one window space with pin-up lamp near it for lighting, and casual pull-up chair for seating. To the left of the Chord Organ, under the window is the TV set.

Hammond's new blond finish was chosen for the room to blend with the monochromatic color scheme of the house—mustard, cinnamon, and pumpkin, with accent colors of black and white. One color scheme was chosen for the house for several reasons—to give continuity to an open house—to give the house a spacious feeling—to avoid conflict of color.

In the activity room, wood paneling goes from floor to ceiling. Vinyl tile on the floor is cinnamon and white, and area rugs are cinnamon with white fringe. Glass curtains are fishnet in a warm tone, and bed spreads are bark cloth.

ment, more social opportunities, more friends, more fun. These are the things that create a possibility for happiness.

In spite of all the many technological advances that have been realized in home building and interior design, a basic problem has arisen. Space is the great luxury of the 20th Century. Increasing construction costs discourage the building of the large roomy kind of home. More planning and forethought have to be given to save space. The compact little ranch-type home or small apartment has no room for large, clumsy looking furniture.

The Hammond Chord Organ meets the space-saving demands of the 20th Century. It will fit into the smallest spaces of a crowded apartment or a compact house trailer. It is just 43 inches wide and is less than three feet high. Not only is the Chord Organ compact in design but it is light in weight as well. Weighing only 156 pounds, it can be moved around easily to give variety to the interior scheme of things.

Leading interior designers have discovered that the Chord Organ is as modern looking as the 20th Century and will blend harmoniously with any kind of om interior. The three basic finishes of the Chord Organ—walnut, blond, and ebony make it possible to fit into a room that is Early American, French Provincial, Victorian, contemporary, modern, or any other design. And the Chord Organ is used in every part of the home. The living room is the most popular choice for the Chord Organ, but it is also found in activity rooms, dens, dining rooms, patios, and even kitchens.

The Chord Organ is a musical instrument for the whole house and for the whole family to enjoy. It goes wherever there is entertainment for friends, or where privacy can be enjoyed.

The Chord Organ in being a part of the meaning of "home" is not just a musical instrument to play, but it is a thing of beauty to make home surroundings more pleasing in which to live. But even more important it is an integral part of the many happy hours that the family share together in the enjoyment of music. In contributing these things to family life the Chord Organ is an important part of what "home" symbolizes for the many thousands of families owning one.

Music is being published for the Hammond Chord Organ at an average rate of one musical selection each day. More than 300 selections were published last year. Since 1951 when the Chord Organ was first introduced to the public, about 1600 selections of music have been issued by the leading publishers of the country. Among these selections is music to appeal to everyone's taste — popular hit songs, semi-classical favorites, hymns, folk songs, school songs, jazz and classical selections. This quantity and variety of selections are providing almost endless hours of diversion for the Chord organist. But this is only the beginning of music published for the Chord Organ. Leading publishers

are planning to expand their publication of Chord Organ music in the future, and more recordings are being made with the Chord Organ.

Chord Organ and are having a lot of fun. We have no previous musical training so are pioneering in the field of music."

... "May I say for both my husband, daughter, and myself — never have we had and enjoyed anything as much as our Chord Organ. It certainly does have a calming and restful effect on one."

... "I just have to write this letter to tell you what a wonderful instrument the Hammond Chord Organ is. The wonderful thing about it is the working man can afford to buy one because of the low prices. And how simple it is to play without knowing music. 



About one third of the material was composed by Ralph Federer whose musical ideas are entertainingly styled in a distinctly modern manner. Some of his pieces progress slowly and are of a romantic character ("Roses at Twilight," "Starlight Serenade," etc.) while others move along in a light syncopated style ("Gute as Cotton," "Struttin' Along," etc.). Also included is a fine collection of characteristic pieces depicting motion (skipping, flying, playing, etc.) which cover the "hurry" and "mysterious" types used by the old time movie theater organist in accompanying the silent pictures. Then too, there are Tieman's lovely "Hawaiian Twilight" and Engelmann's "Melody of Love." Contents:

PURPLE HEART VETERANS GIVE CHORD ORGAN TO LONG BEACH, CALIFORNIA VA HOSPITAL

Veterans at the Long Beach VA Hospital received a new and unusual rehabilitation and entertainment instrument when the Long Beach and Hollywood Motion Picture Chapters of the Military Order of the Purple Heart presented a Hammond Chord Organ to Dr. E. V. Edwards, Hospital Manager and Col. W. R. McBrien, Chief of Special Services for the veteran patients.

The Chord Organ was presented on the eve of General George Washington's birthday, as part of the Purple Heart Order's customary celebration of the anniversary of the great military leader, who originated the Purple Heart decoration in 1782, and upon which the present national veterans organization of combat wounded service men was founded.

The presentation was made by Past National Commander Clifford A. Parmenter, a charter member of the Long Beach Chapter, who represents the Purple Heart on the VA Volunteer Service (VAVS) Committee, which is comprised of representatives of veteran's and civic organizations interested in helping maintain necessary entertainment, recreational,

and various supplementary "aid" service to the regular hospital staff.

When Parmenter presented the Chord Organ to the Long Beach VA Hospital, he stated that "the greater value of a Chord Organ, which can be adequately mastered in a very short time lay in its potential as a rehabilitation instrument to rejuvenate and uplift the sagging or low morale patient and especially those not able to get out of their wards, or even beds. The mobile organ can be rolled up to a bed, when the patient can even play it from a semi-prone position or easily from a sitting position on the bed."

A low slung moving "dolly" equipped with roller bearing casters on which the Chord Organ will set was built by the engineering staff (gratis) of Calavo Growers of California. This will enable the Organ to be moved easily from ward to ward, where concerts will be played for the benefit of bed-ridden patients, who can't be escorted to the Recreation Hall for the many fine entertainments put on by veteran and civic organizations.

AUTHOR OF "EXECUTIVE SUITE" AND "CASH MC CALL" RELAXES FROM HIS WORK BY PLAYING HIS CHORD ORGAN

Cameron Hawley needs no introduction to readers of fiction and movie-goers. His novels, *Executive Suite* and *Cash McCall*, were on the best seller lists for months. The movie version of *Executive Suite* was one of the most successful film productions of two years ago. Readers also know Mr. Hawley for the many articles and stories he has written for magazines like the *Saturday Evening Post*, *Life* and *Good Housekeeping*.

Hawley's popularity as a writer of fiction is of recent origin. He didn't always write short stories and novels. The material for his writing is based upon his years of actual experience in the business world. He got to know the ins and outs of corporate life (the subject of most of his writings) during his 25 years with the Armstrong Cork Company.

Born in Howard, South Dakota, the son of a policeman, and grandson of an Indian Scout, Hawley attended South Dakota State College. He joined the Armstrong Cork Company in 1927 as an advertising man and eventually worked up through sales to become Advertising Director. As a sideline during his business career, Hawley wrote magazine fiction, movie scripts, and almost 200 radio and television plays for network broadcasts. His success as a part-time fiction writer was so phenomenal that the sideline became a full-time career. After 25 years of service he retired from a suc-

cessful advertising career at Armstrong Cork Company, to devote all of his time to writing novels.

The rest of Mr. Hawley's career is well-known. His first novel, *Executive Suite*, met with immediate success and was even adapted into a movie. His next novel was another success appearing in condensed form before publication in *Life* magazine.

Businessmen are depicted by Hawley in his novels as neither heroes, nor heels, nor geniuses, but as expressed by one of the characters he created, "A quite ordinary group of men, disconcertingly human, given to the man-on-the-street practice of basing decisions on hunch and intuition." Reviewers of Hawley's novels were baffled when they read them. So accustomed to the satirical treatment of businessmen by other well known novelists, they kept searching for the tongue in Hawley's cheek.

Hawley now lives on his farm in Lancaster County, Pennsylvania, where he is devoting his time to writing and the management of breeding Aberdeen-Angus cattle. But getting away from the strenuous work of writing is vital to the success of any author. One of the best sources for Hawley's relaxation is playing the Hammond Chord Organ. As Hawley explains it, "A half hour at the Chord Organ is one of the best ways I have found to let down the tensions and unwind those nerves."

What is it like to run a flying service, be your own pilot and mechanic, land hunters on the cow pastures, hunt for frozen bodies in the Eastern Montana snow, and fly pregnant women from the farms to hospitals?

These are the varied experiences in the life of Art Soare, owner and operator of the Glendive Flying Service in Glendive, Montana. Soare also does cropspraying and specialized work for the Oil Companies. His fleet of planes includes three Aeronca Champions, a single engine Beechcraft Bonanza, and twin Cessna. Until recently he had a Cessna 120 for instruction and charter, but a student pilot demolished the plane on a take-off. Although the pilot was uninjured, the plane was a total wreck.

Soare has flown almost 8,000 hours since he started flying back in 1930. During the war he was a civilian instructor for the Army Air Force at the Oxnard, California primary school, and later at War Eagle field at Lancaster, California.

After the war, Soare continued flying, but this time for himself, as a charter pilot and later as Airport manager at the Pomona, California field where he also operated a flying service.

Today, Soare is busier than ever before and is running a highly successful business. He takes almost daily trips for Oil Companies, flying core samples out and taking personnel in for inspection tours. He does a lot of charter work and flies from Canada to the Eastern part of the United States and would probably fly to Alaska or Cuba if anybody hired him to do it.

When the weather is too bad for flying or if business is slack, you'll see both Art Soare and his wife at their Chord Organ. Just as they share the responsibilities of running their flying business together, they also share in the fun and relaxation of creating their own music on the Chord Organ.

The differences in language did not permit an explanation of the instrument's controls to Mrs. Hashimoto, but she sat down and was soon making a rhythm with the chord buttons that sounded very Oriental but good. Mr. Hashimoto, an electrical engineer was intrigued by the Chord Organ's production of tones, since a similar instrument is not made in Japan.

Back in the United States Lt. Colonel Byron E. Cowart has a Chord Organ in his home at Colorado Springs, Colorado. Although he is now more or less permanently stationed at nearby Fort Carson,



Organ seems to have a great deal more therapeutic value than I anticipated. During the two years previous to my buying a Chord Organ, I was having real trouble with my digestive system. Shortly after buying

the Chord Organ, my condition seemed to improve. After extensive x-rays and laboratory tests, my trouble was diagnosed as due entirely to nerves and tension. I realize that such a pleasing hobby can do a lot for such a condition, but in my case, the organ is paying for itself in the saving of doctor bills."

... "All my life I have wanted to play an organ. I'm 61. Imagine my joy when I found your Hammond Chord Organ and could play it right away! My husband had passed on just a short time before I found it and it certainly has helped tremendously in making such terrific adjustments. Later I had to have a major operation and again my Chord Organ came to the fore through a long period of convalescing."



MUSIC PUBLISHERS STEP UP CHORD ALBUMS FOLLOWING HAMMOND PROGRAM IN NEW YORK



Mr. Harold C. Lembke, General Sales Manager of the Hammond Organ Company addressed a gathering of America's top music publishers in New York at a luncheon sponsored by the company.

"My Prayer" Released For Chord Organists

The trend towards more current hits arranged for the Chord Organ is exemplified by the release of "My Prayer" (published by Shapiro, Bernstein, and Company, Inc., 1270 Sixth Avenue, New York 20, N.Y. 50c). Recent BILLBOARD magazine ratings listed this tune at the top of their Honor Roll of Hits. Chord Organ owners will certainly want to take advantage of this opportunity to add a hit parade favorite to their music library.

A profile of sales of the Hammond Chord Organ, given at a Hammond luncheon for music publishers in the Colonnades Room of the Essex House, New York, revealed a continuing upsurge for more solo arrangements, folios and albums, according to Harold C. Lembke, General Sales Manager of Hammond.

Mr. Lembke told publishers that Chord Organ sales are pushing the instrument into a top keyboard position with sales running 61% over last year, and a very definite promise of winding up the year with a 90-to-100% increase.

Publishers responded to the Hammond presentation by releasing five new albums and one solo arrangement. Most publishers are planning several new albums for early release this Fall. (Reviews of the Chord Organ music albums just released by the publishers are on the next two pages.)

Over the past few years, close to 2,000 selections have been arranged and published for the Hammond Chord Organ in album form, which is just a token of what the Chord Organ music market can absorb.

New music in particular catches the fancy of the Chord organist, as they are eager to learn the current top tunes. Publishers were urged to place more emphasis on this phase of their Hammond publishing.

COLUMBIA RECORDS RELEASES NEW CHORD ALBUM, "ORGAN AND FIRELIGHT", FEATURING HAL SHUTZ

The quest for new talent is a continuing one with America's recording companies. About three months ago, a group of Columbia Records executives were listening to some tapes by a comparatively new but talented organist from the West Coast, Hal Shutz. They knew him only by reputation. And,



most amazing to them: he was playing a Hammond Chord Organ.

Columbia had produced many records on the larger model Hammond Organs, not to mention some of the world's finest pipe organs, but to their way of thinking, the Chord Organ was strictly an "easyto-play" instrument with very little real musical potential.

Hal's first selection on the tape was "'S Wonderful". The polite listening that, perhaps, accompanies many auditions soon turned to sharp attention, as Hal revealed an exciting styling with this fast tempo selection. However, it was his next number, "Love is a Many Splendored Thing", that really captured his critics. Hal started with some lovely string tones, built to startling crescendos and quickly faded into some beautiful and delicate oboe qualities.

Midway through this tape Columbia's people were on the phone to Hammond's offices in Chicago. The conversation went something like this.

"Shutz is great! One of the best organ recordings we've ever heard. We're really impressed but are

you certain he's just using a Chord Organ? Isn't that your lowest priced unit anyone can play?"

We quickly assured them it was a Chord Organ—anyone can play it—but don't be misled by its simplicity of operation. The Chord is quite an instrument. It has a musical potential which could very well exceed anything on the market in the years ahead.

The tape played on and Columbia's listeners heard Hal handle the Chord in the rhythmatic, "Ecstasy Tango", followed by a truly majestic rendition of "Riders in the Sky". The clear and true percussion effects of the Chord Organ were nicely demonstrated in his next number, a very unusual melody called "Hawaiian Wedding Song".

Maybe no other musical instrument is capable of accompanying such dramatic changes as Hal displayed when he recorded his very authentic "Calliope Medley", and then moved into an interpretation of "I'll Remember Paris", which gives the feeling of a George Shearing type combo in places.



Multiple strings set the mood for his next song, "I Could Have Danced All Night" and absolutely no one stirred during his "Song from Moulin Rouge"—a sincerely beautiful arrangement with tremendous expression.

The tape wound up with another nice fast beat tune,

"I Can't Believe that You're in Love With Me", a pulsating rendition of "Tabu" (one of his best) and the scintillating "Lisbon Antigua". Although the decision had been made on the second selection, the Columbia officials nodded after the last number and started production on this exciting new album, "ORGAN AND FIRELIGHT". It has now been released.

Two words seem to keynote this album — Feeling and Versatility. The feeling comes from the artist, Hal Shutz. A native of San Francisco, who is not too well known outside of the Bay region, he has taught and played professionally for many years. You might say Hal is a "musician's musician". His music demands careful listening to really appreciate his intricate coloring, unusual styling and great sensitivity.

The versatility comes from the organ in the hands of a fine musician. Few people realize that the Chord Organ is not only a truly remarkable organ, but, within itself it is a very distinctive and individualistic instrument. Hal Shutz brings out these qualities very capably. It is difficult—almost impossible—to describe many of the different, yet lovely tonal effects and shadings he uses, because many of them are completely new to the world of music.
