

Please keep these instructions somewhere safe in order to be able to hand them to a new owner in any eventual case of sale.

In case of any problems, address exclusively to your local authorised service centre.

#### **DATA SECURITY**



You must guard against the loss of your important data by making backup copies. You can backup your data onto CDR, CDRW, floppy disk, USB memory drive or other media such as ZIP drives. It depends upon how much data you want to backup. IF you do this and something happens to the hard drive in your computer, you have another copy of your data. We do not assume liability for any data loss or damage to data storage units, and no claims can be accepted for damages resulting from the loss of data or any consequential losses.

#### SAFE USAGE GUIDELINES

- Keep the product away from damp, protect it from jolts, dust and heat and do not expose it to direct sunlight, in order to avoid any operational problogs
- Do not open the product casing: this would cause the forfeit of the guarantee and the eventual damage/destruction of the product.





# **GETTING STARTED**

#### **INSERTING BATTERY**

This product is operated using a single 1.5V 'AAA' type battery. Open the battery compartment [ $\mathbf{14}$ ] by sliding the small cover on the back of the MP3 Player. Insert the battery (observe the + / - polarity!) Close the battery compartment.

It is recommended to use alkaline batteries. NiMH batteries or batteries of higher capacity are also suitable.

Please observe the safety advice on batteries (page 3).

#### **BATTERY STATUS**

The battery status is shown on the display [A].



Battery empty, ⇒ Battery the device weak will turn off.

Battery in good condition.

#### **RESETTING THE MP3 PLAYER**

If your MP3 Player does not respond properly (e.g. because of incorrect input, error in the data transmission, static discharge) proceed as follows:

- 1. Disconnect all connection cables
- 2. Remove the battery and insert it again.
- 3. Turn on your MP3 Player.

#### **CONNECTING THE EARPHONES**

Stereo earphones are included.

Insert the earphone plug into one of the appropriate sockets  $[\mathbf{3}]$  of your MP3 Player. Either socket can be used.

Caution: Listening to music at a very high volume can cause permanent damage to your hearing. Before starting playback, adjust the volume to the lowest level, then start the playback and adjust the volume to the desired level.

# COMMANDS

#### TURNING ON/OFF THE MP3 PLAYER

To start the MP3 Player, press the Power On key [1] and confirm with the menu key [8].

Now the device is in the playback mode.

The MP3 Player turns off automatically after some time when not in use in order to save the battery. (This does not happen in the playback mode and in the pause function.)

To turn off the MP3 Player, hold down / press the Power Off key [1] for three seconds.

#### **VOLUME ADJUSTMENT**

To adjust the volume press the appropriate buttons [12 = Vol - / 11 = Vol + ]. The display [D] will show the recent adjustment.

#### PLAYBACK / PAUSE / STOP

After turning on the MP3 Player, press briefly the button [1] to playback a track. To pause the playback, press the button [1] again briefly. To start the playback again, press the button [1] again. When the button [1] is pressed for one second the playback will stop and return to the beginning of the track. Holding the button [1] for more than two seconds will cause the MP3 Player to turn off.

For instructions regarding transferring / loading music tracks onto the MP3 Player, read from page  $21\ \text{onwards}.$

#### **TRACK SELECTION**

Press **briefly** the button [**6**], to playback the previous track. To select the following track, press the button [**7**] **briefly**. By keeping the button pressed, the tracks scroll backwards and forwards while the playback is muted.

#### **S**ELECTION AND REPETITION OF TRACK SEGMENTS

It is possible to select some "segments" of a musical or vocal track. This segment is then played back endlessly (loop).

#### 1. Definition of the segment start:

Press briefly the button [9]. On the display [K]  $\mathbf{A} \rightarrow$  lights up

#### 2. Definition of the segment end:

Press again the button [9]. On the display [K] A  $\leftrightarrow$  B lights up and the segment so selected is repeated endlessly until you press the button [9] again.

#### **MENU SETTINGS**

# **V**IEWING THE **M**ENU

To bring up the menu and to be able to modify the mode of operation and the default settings, proceed as follows

- 1. Turn on the MP3 Player.
- 2. Press the button [8], to show the menu.
- 3. To select the desired word of the menu press the button [**6**] or [**7**].
- Select the option [EXIT] and press the button [8] to exit the menu.

If no selection is made within 5 seconds of a button press the main menu will disappear automatically.

#### **HOLD MODE**

The MP3 Player is provided with a key/button lock function that prevents the unintentional activation of a key. This function is useful if you listen to music whilst keeping the device in the carry pouch or a pocket.

- 1. Press the menu button [8].
- Press the button [1], appears on the display [E], and the device ignores any given command.

To stop the hold function repeat the steps 1 to 2.

#### Music

The music mode enables the player to playback the music stored on the device:

- 1. Press the menu button [8].
- 2. With the buttons [6/7] select the word [Music].
- 3. Press the menu button  $[\mathbf{8}]$  to confirm your selection.

This is the default mode when turning on the player.

#### VOICE

The voice mode enables the player to playback the recorded audio stored on the device:

- 1. Press the menu button [8].
- 2. With the buttons [6/7] select the word [Voice].
- 3. Press the menu button [**8**] to confirm your selection. The Display [**H**] will show a microphone.

## **SETTINGS**

This sub menu has the following options:

#### EQ (EQUALIZER)

The following options are available for the setting of the equalizer: **normal, rock, jazz, classic or pop**.

#### PLAYMODE:

**Normal:** All the files will be played in the se-

quence in which they where saved / stored, the playback stops after the last

file.

Repeat Track: The selected file will repeat endlessly

until stopped.

Repeat All: All files in the saved / stored sequence

will be played back endlessly until

stopped.

**Random**: Playback of a file chosen at random.

**Random Repeat**: This repeats the random playback

playing music endlessly until stopped.

#### **CONTRAST**

This option is to set the contrast of the display.

## POWER SAVING

When no track is played and no button is touched the MP3 player will shut down automatically after:

1 -  $10\ minutes.$  The option "disable" will turn off this power saving function.

COMMANDS

#### RECORD SETTING

It is possible to select the desired resolution of the recording. It is possible to choose between 8000 and 48000 Hz. The higher the value is, the better the quality and the greater the musical dimensions.

#### **BACKLIGHT SETTING**

This option is to set how long the background light will stay on. You can choose between 5 to 20 seconds or "off".

#### **BACKLIGHT COLOR**

Choose the colour of the backlight: Red, Green, Yellow, Blue, Violet, Light Blue, White or Random.

#### **EXIT**

Terminates the settings menu and goes back to the main menu.

#### **E**RASE

Use this option to delete files on your MP3 Player without connecting it to a computer.

To delete a file proceed as follows:

- 1. Press the menu button [8].
- 2. With the buttons [6/7] select the word [Erase].
- 3. Press the menu button [8].
- With the buttons [6/7] select the word [Music], if you want to delete music files, or select [Voice] to delete your recorded files.
- 5. Press the menu button [8].

- 6. With the buttons [6/7 or 1] select the file you want to delete.
- 7. Press the volume buttons [11/12] to toggle the confirmation from NO to YES and vice versa.
- 8. Press the button [1] to delete the file. The display will briefly state "File Deleted".
- 9. If you want to delete more files repeat the steps 4 8.
- 10. Select the word  $[\mathbf{Exit}]$  to go back to the main menu.

#### **ABOUT**


This sub menu will display the firmware release version and the amount of memory installed on the MP3 Player, including any MMC/SD-Card that may be inserted.

#### **R**ECORD

You can record audio material on to the MP3 Player by using the integrated microphone.

- 1. Press the menu button [8].
- 2. With the buttons [6/7] select the word [Record].
- 3. Press the menu button [8] again to start recording. Point the microphone (next to the earphone socket) at the audio source.
- 4. Press the menu button [8] again to stop the recording session.
- 5. If you want to perform more recordings repeat step 3 to 4.
- The recorded files will be saved in the subfolder "Voice" and named V00x.WAV, where the x stands for a sequential number.

#### **USING MEMORY CARDS**



- Warning: DO NOT insert or eject Memory Cards while the MP3-Player is turned on. This will avoid possible damage to your memory cards.
- Advice: The MP3 Player only recognises cards which are formatted in FAT-16 format. Please consult the online help of your computer's operating system to get more information about formatting and file formats.
- The Memory card will be recognised as an additional removable device if the MP3 Player is connected to your computer. Accordingly it will be assigned a new drive letter.

# **INSERT A CARD**

- 1. Turn the MP3 Player off.
- 2. Insert the card, as shown above, until it fits perfectly in the slot.
- 3. Turn the MP3 Player on.

#### **REMOVING A CARD**

- 1. Turn the MP3 Player off.
- 2. Pull the memory card carefully out of the slot using your fingernails and store it in a safe place.

## **USING WITH A COMPUTER**

#### FIRMWARE UPDATE

The CDROM that is supplied with the device contains a program that allows the updating of the operating software (firmware) of the MP3 Player.

The updating of the MP3 Player software is not strictly necessary. This is a task that you should only perform when you encounter problems and the service centre hotline advises you to do so.

To install the software:

- Caution! During the installation of the software it is possible that some important files are overwritten or modified. To have access to the original files in case of problems that arise after installation, it is advisable to create a back-up of the hard disk contents.
- Insert the supplied CDROM, click on START and select EXECUTE.
- 2. In the **Open** field, enter the name of the CD drive followed by a colon (:) and the word **Setup.**
- 3. Confirm by clicking on **OK**.

#### **CONNECTION TO THE COMPUTER**

- Turn the USB plug in order to fit it into a free USB socket on your computer. Please use a USB cable extension (not included) if the plug doesn't fit.
- Turn on the MP3 player. On the MP3 Player display, the word READY will appear.
- 3. The computer should now recognise that a new device / peripheral has been connected.

**USING** WITH A COMPUTER

#### **INSTALLATION OF THE DRIVER**

( $\underline{\text{ONLY}}$  Windows 98SE – Windows ME/2000/XP does not need any additional driver)

 A request to indicate the driver location will be made to the user. Select the folder **DRIVER** on the CDROM and confirm.

#### PC/MP3 PLAYER FILE EXCHANGE

The new driver enables file movement from PC to MP3 Player, it will therefore be possible to copy your favourite tracks onto the MP3 Player or transfer other files to the MP3 Player and use it as portable data device. However, the MP3 Player only accepts / plays music files in MP3, WAV and WMA format.

- 1. Select (Click) in your Windows Explorer on the track you want to copy / transfer to the MP3 Player.
- 2. Drag the track to the MP3 Player that has been recognised as a drive and let it drop. ('Drag & Drop')

#### **MEMORY DRIVE FUNTION**

It is also possible to use your MP3-Player as a Memory Drive. Simply copy the desired files onto the MP3 Player. Take into account that the MP3 Player only shows files with the extension \*.wav, \*.mp3 or \*.wma.

#### **SOLUTIONS FOR COMMON PROBLEMS**

#### The computer does not recognise the MP3 Player:

- Check the installation (page 21 and following. Windows 98 SE: is the driver installed?)
- > Is the battery loaded?
- > Check the cable connections.
- > Is the MP3 Player turned on?
- In Windows Control Panel, check if the MP3 Player is installed correctly. Try installing the USB controller again. Remove any other USB peripherals as a test.

# In the MP3 Player, the files are not shown correctly:

The MP3 Player does **not** display the name of the file but its own coded information with an ID tag. This information can be modified with special programs (not included).

# The MP3 Player does not execute the commands correctly:

- > Is the battery loaded?
- Is the connection between USB and PC correct?
- > Reset the MP3 Player (page 11)

#### The titles are not shown in the correct sequence:

- Check that the playback mode is set correctly (page 12)
- > Is the USB to PC connection correct? Reset the MP3 Player (page 11)
