





INSTALLATION

Unravel the AC cord and connect it to a conveniently located AC outlet having 120V and 60Hz only. The Clock Display will illuminate and "12:00" will blink in the window. NOTE: If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. If the AC plug does not fit into a nonpolarized AC outlet, do not file or cut the wide blade. It is the user's responsibility to have an electrician replace the obsolete outlet.



If the AC cord is disconnected or if there is a power failure, this electronic clock is designed to continue operating internally (without showing the time on the Clock Display) with two (2) AA size batteries (not included).

To install the batteries:

- Remove the battery compartment door by sliding it out.
- · Insert two (2) AA size batteries into the battery compartment to the right. Be sure to observe the polarity markings which are engraved inside the battery compartment. If the batteries are inserted incorrectly, the unit will not operate.



· Replace the battery compartment door.

Be sure to check the condition of the batteries periodically by disconnecting the AC cord and connecting it again two or three minutes later. The preset times should continue operating. If the present time does not appear, it indicates the battery is dead or not connected properly.

BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:

- Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
 Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated in the battery
- compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.

 3. Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.

 4. If the device is not to be used for a long period of time, remove the batteries to prevent
- damage or injury from possible battery leakage.

 5. Do not try to recharge batteries not intended to be recharged; they can overheat and rupture. (Follow battery manufacturer's directions.)

OPERATION

TO LISTEN TO THE RADIO



Press the ON/OFF button 10 to turn the unit on; the AM or FM indicator will light. Press the BAND button 9 to select AM or FM.



Tune a station by pressing the REV 0 or FWD @ button. Press and hold the REV 1 or FWD 2 button and the unit will scan and stop on the next strong

Antennas

FM: Extend the FM antenna wire (located in the battery compartment) for best reception.

AM: Turn the unit for better AM reception.

SETTING RADIO PRESETS (10 PRESETS FOR AM, 10 FOR FM))



Adjust the volume using the VOLUME control 0.

Press the ON/OFF button 2 to turn the unit off.




Tune a station as described in step 1 above, then press the MEMORY button • once; the MEM indicator will blink. Press the PRESET button 2 to select a radio preset number, then press the MEMORY button • again to confirm and the radio preset will be set.

TO RECALL RADIO PRESETS

To recall a Radio Preset, press the PRESET button repeatedly until the desired Radio Preset appears in the display.


TO CHANGE A RADIO PRESET



To change a Radio Preset, simply tune a radio station as described on the previous page, then press the MEMORY button **0**; the MEM indicator will blink. Repeatedly press the PRESET button @ until the desired Radio Preset appears in the display, then press the MEMORY button 0 again to memorize.

NOTE: Once a radio frequency is selected, the display will revert to the time display after 10 seconds.

TO SET OR RESET THE ACTUAL TIME



With the unit off, press the MODE button once to set the time and the display will blink.



Press the REV 10 to set the hour and the FWD @ button to set the minute. Make sure the PM indicator is lit if you are setting to PM, and make sure it is not lit if setting to AM. Wait 10 seconds, or press the MODE button **9** three times and the time will be set.

TO SET OR RESET THE ALARM TIME(S)






With the unit off, press the MODE button twice to set Alarm 1, or three times to set Alarm 2, "AL1" or "AL2" will appear in the display

Press the REV • to set the alarm hour and the FWD • button to set the alarm minute. Make sure the PM indicator is lit if you are setting to PM, and make sure it is not lit if setting to AM. Wait 10 seconds, or press the MODE button • until the WAKE indicator disappears from the display to set the Alarm 1 or 2.

TO SET THE ALARM TO WAKE TO RADIO




Set the alarm time as previously instructed. Select a radio station as described on page 7 and make sure the VOLUME control 10 is set as desired. Press the desired ALARM 1 ON/OFF 20 or ALARM 2 ON/OFF 30 button until the respective AL indicator lights




Press the RADIO/BUZZ button until the RAD indicator lights. When the actual time matches the selected preset alarm time, the radio will automatically turn on.

To shut off the alarm, see TO SHUT THE ALARM OFF section on the next page.

TO SET THE ALARM TO WAKE TO BUZZER




Set the alarm time as previously instructed. Press the desired ALARM 1 ON/OFF ● or ALARM 2 ON/OFF ● button until the respective AL indicator



Press the RADIO/BUZZ button until the BUZZ indicator lights. When the actual time matches the selected preset alarm time, the buzzer will automatically sound.


To shut off the alarm, see TO SHUT THE ALARM OFF section below.

TO SHUT THE ALARM OFF



To shut the alarm off, press the ALARM 1 1 or 2 2 ON/OFF button once to turn off the alarm and not set it for the next day. Press the ALARM 1 1 or 2 2 ON/OFF button again until the respective AL indicator lights and the alarm time will be reset for the next day.

SNOOZE




The alarm can be temporarily turned off manually by pressing the SNOOZE button; the alarm will turn back on automatically nine minutes later.


TO ACTIVATE THE SLEEP FUNCTION



Tune the desired radio station as described on page 7. Press the SLEEP button; the SL indicator will light and "10" will appear on the clock display, then release the button. The unit will turn on for 10 minutes and then turn off.




To adjust the sleep time up to 90 minutes in 10 minute intervals, repeatedly press the SLEEP button.



To cancel sleep time, press the ON/OFF button.

DIMMER



This unit has four levels of brightness for the display. Repeatedly press the DIMMER button until the desired brightness appears in the display.
