



MOUNTING ON THE BASE

To use this unit with the supplied base, simply place the unit on the hub as shown in the illustration, then gently push it backwards so it snaps in place.


To remove unit from base, simply press in on the tab located at the rear of the base and lift up the unit.

To mount this unit with the supplied hanger, simply place the unit on the hanger as shown in the illustrations below.






INSTALLATION

To mount this unit with the supplied curtain hanger, simply place the unit on the curtain hanger as shown in the illustrations below.






WALL MOUNTING



POWER SOURCES

This CD player requires either 6 "C" cell batteries (not included) or a 9V AC adapter having a positive center.

BATTERY INSTALLATION

- Make sure the unit is not on the base. Open the battery compartment door by rotating the tab, then lift the battery compartment off.
- Insert six (6) "C" cell batteries (not included) as shown in the illustration to the right. Alkaline batteries are recommended for the longest playing time.
- Replace the battery compartment cover and rotate the tab so the compartment is secured.



BATTERY PRECAUTIONS

Follow these precautions when using batteries in this device:


- 1. Use only the size and type of batteries specified.
- Be sure to follow the correct polarity when installing the batteries as indicated next to the battery compartment. Reversed batteries may cause damage to the device.
- Do not mix different types of batteries together (e.g. Alkaline and Carbon-zinc) or old batteries with fresh ones.

AC OPERATION


To operate the unit using AC power, connect a 9V AC adapter (not included) to an AC outlet having 120V, 60Hz AC only. Plug the small end into the DC 9V jack on the unit and connect the other end into the AC outlet. The batteries are automatically disconnected when the AC adapter is used.

CAUTION: When not using AC power, disconnect the AC adapter from the wall outlet by pulling the plug (not the cord). Do not touch the AC adapter with wet hands and plug fully inserted without exposing any part of the blade.

TO PLAY THE RADIO



Press the POWER button **1** to turn the unit on, then press the FUNCTION button **2** repeatedly until TUNER appears in the display.



Press the BAND button • to the desired band (AM or FM) and tune a station by pressing the TUNING/TIME SET buttons • Adjust the VOLUME • as desired.



CARE AND MAINTENANCE

Caring for Compact Discs

 Treat the disc carefully. Handle the disc only by its edges. Never allow your fingers to come in contact with the shiny, unprinted side of the disc.



- Do not attach adhesive tape, stickers, etc. to the disc label.
- Clean the disc periodically with a soft, lint-free, dry cloth. Never use detergents
 or abrasive cleaners to clean the disc. If necessary, use a CD cleaning kit.
- If a disc skips or gets stuck on a section of the disc, it is probably dirty or damaged (scratched).
- When cleaning the disc, wipe in straight lines from the center of the disc to the outer edge of the disc. Never wipe in circular motions.



- This unit is designed to play only compact discs bearing the identification logo as shown here. Other discs may not conform to the CD standard and may not play properly.
- Compact Discs should be stored in their cases after each use to avoid damage.
- Do not expose compact discs to direct sunlight, high humidity, high temperatures, or dust, etc. Prolonged exposure or extreme temperatures can warp the disc.
- Do not stick or write anything on either side of the disc. Sharp writing instruments, or the ink may damage the surface.

Cleaning the unit
