

TIMER OPERATION

Your unit can be set to turn on and off at predetermined hours. To set the on and off time proceed as follows:

- 1. Press the STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit, select CD/Tape/Tuner, and select volume position up and down, then turn off the unit.
- 2. Press the MODE button and the TIMER ON indicator flashes.



- 3. Press MEMORY button on the unit and the hour position flashes.
- 4. Press SKIP buttons to adjust the hour.
- 5. Press MEMORY button and the minute position flashes.
- 6. Press SKIP buttons to adjust the minute.
- 7. Press MEMORY button to complete Timer On setting.
- 8. Press MODE button again. The TIMER OFF indicator flashes.



- 9. Press MEMORY button and adjust the hour by pressing the SKIP buttons.
- 10. Press MEMORY button and the minute position flashes.
- 11. Adjust the minute by pressing the SKIP buttons.
- 12. Press MEMORY button to complete the Timer OFF setting.
- 13. Press MODE button to complete the timer setting.
- 14. Press TIMER button to activate the timer function (Timer will on LCD Display).

COMPACT DISC OPERATIONS

PLAYING A CD

- 1. Press the STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Press the OPEN button to open the CD door.
- Load a CD, with label side upward, inside the CD compartment and close the CD door.
- 4. Press CD button to operate the unit in CD mode.
- After a few seconds, the local number of tracks on the CD will appear in the Multifunction Display.
- 6. Press the PLAY button (▶) to start playing the CD.

PROGRAMMING CD TRACKS

Control the volume

With this function you can program 20 titles in the order you desire.

- 1. Power on the unit and insert the CD.
- 2. Press the CD button to operate the unit in the CD mode.
- 3. Press MEMORY button to start programming the tracks. The track memory indicator (Blinks).
- 4. Search the desired track by pressing the SKIP buttons
- Press MEMORY button again to complete the programming process.
- 6. Repeat step 3 to step 5 to program another track.
- Press PLAY button (>) to start playing the tracks in your programmed order.

DUBBING A CASSETTE TAPE

This unit is equipped with a dubbing system which allows duplicating a pre-recorded cassette.

- 1. Insert a pre-recorded tape into Deck B and a blank cassette tape into Deck A.
- 2. Press the TAPE button on the remote or press FUNCTION button until TAPE is shown on the display.
- 3. Press the PAUSE button then the RECORD button on Deck A; the PLAY button will go down automatically.
- 4. Press the PLAY button on Deck B and will release the PAUSE button on Deck A and the dubbing will begin.

NOTE

For best results, use normal bias (type 1) cassette tapes when recording.


CONTINUOUS PLAYBACK FROM DECK B TO DECK A

To continuously play two pre-recorded cassette tapes from Deck B to Deck A, operate the unit as follow

- 1. Load deck B and Deck A with pre-recorded tapes.
- 2. Press the TAPE function button.
- 3. Press the PAUSE and PLAY buttons on Deck B.
- 4. Press the PAUSE and PLAY buttons on Deck A.
- Release the PAUSE button on Deck B; Deck B starts playing. Adjust the VOLUME as desired.
- 6. When the cassette tape in Deck B reaches the end, its PLAY button will Release and Deck A begins playing.
- To stop playback before the tape is over, press the STOP/EJECT button on Decks A and B.

CASSETTE TAPE OPERATING TIPS

- 1. High quality tapes are recommended to obtain maximum quality reproduction from recordings.
- Tapes with playing time of 120 minutes (C-120) are not recommended because they contain thinner and Longer tape that has a greater chance to malfunction and jam, which may damage the cassette mechanism.
- To obtain good reproduction, the head should be cleaned after every 10 to 20 hours of use. It is also Recommended that the cassette be kept away from excessive heat or cold.




HOW TO USE THE REMOTE HANDSET

- POWER button Press to turn the power on. Press again to turn the power off.
- 0-9 buttons Press to program CD track or direct CD track access, or recall tuner preset stations.
- MUTE button Press to mute the sound.
 Press the MUTE button again or one of the VOLUME button up/down on the remote to restore the sound.

NOTE: Mute function can only be operate from the remote handset.

- VOLUME UP ▲ button Press to increase the volume output level.
- VOLUME DOWN ▼ button Press to decrease the volume output level.
- 6. TIME button Press to activate timer function, press again to cancel it.
- 7. TUNER/BAND button Press to access the TUNER mode. Press while in the TUNER mode to change the band.
- 8. CD SKIP search / tuning up-down button.
- 9. Press to access the CD mode
- PLAY/PAUSE Press to start CD playing, press again to pause.
- 11. STOP button Press to stop CD operation and clear programmed memory.
- 12. TAPE button Press to access the TAPE mode
- REPEAT button Press to select CD REPEAT modes to pause.
- Press the SLEEP button and the panel shows 90 minutes of playing timer.
- Press the MODE button will change the Display on the panel.

CARE AND MAINTENANCE

- 1. Clean your unit with a damp (never wet) cloth. Solvent or detergent should never be used.
- 2. Avoid leaving your unit in direct sunlight or in hot, humid or dusty places.



GETTING STARTED

This Stereo Compact Disc Cassette Recorder operates on AC120V/60Hz line power supply or 8 "D" size batteries. (Not included)

The remote control unit operates on 2 "AA" size batteries. (Not included)

To back up clock operates on "AA" size 1.5V X 3 (not included).

INSERTING BATTERIES INTO THE REMOTE CONTROL

- 1. Turn over the remote control, and remove the battery door.
- Install 2 "AA" size batteries (not included) according to the polarity diagram inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the battery door.

INSERTING BATTERIES INTO THE UNIT

- 1. Open the battery door.
- 2. Insert the 8 "D" size batteries (not included) according to the polarity diagram inside the battery compartment.
- 3. Close the battery door.

IMPORTANT: Be sure that the battery is installed correctly.

Wrong polarity may damage the unit.

Note: For better performance and longer operating time, we recommend the use of alkaline-type batteries

- (a) Do not mix old and new batteries.
- (b) Do not mix alkaline, standard (carbon-zine) or rechargeable (nickel-cadmium) batteries.

Under standby mode, the unit will still consume a small standby current for maintaining normal functions of the clock, timer and remote control. If the unit is not to be used for an extended period of time, remove all the batteries. Old or leaking battery can cause damage to the unit and may void the warranty.

AC POWER OPERATION


- 1. Connect the left speaker and the right speaker to the appropriate speaker jacks on the rear of the unit.
- 2. Insert the power cord into the AC socket on the rear of the unit.
- 3. Connect the power cord to an AC120V/60Hz power source.
- 4. When the unit is operated by AC power, the internal battery circuit will automatically be disconnected.

*CAUTION

WHEN THE POWER IS IN THE STAND-BY (POWER OFF) MODE, A SMALL AMOUNT OF CURRENT WILL CONTINUE TO FLOW TO OPERATE THE CLOCK, BUT CONTROLS WILL NOT WORK UNTIL THE POWER IS TURNED BACK ON. POWER CAN BE COMPLETELY CUT OFF BY UNPLUGGING THE POWER CORD FROM THE AC OUTLET. WHEN THE UNIT IS NOT TO BE USED FOR A LONG PERIOD OF TIME, IT IS RECOMMENDED TO UNPLUG THE UNIT FROM THE AC OUTLET.

CASSETTE PLATYER OPERATIONS

Note: The Remote Control is not able to control the operations of the cassette player. The cassette player can only be controlled by the buttons on the unit.



PLAYING A CASSETTE

- 1. Press STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Press EJECT button to open the cassette door.
- Insert a cassette tape with the exposed tape facing upwards and close the cassette door.
- 4. Press TAPE button to operate the unit in the cassette mode.
- 5. Press PLAY button to start playing the tape.

RECORDING FROM THE RADIO AND CD

- 1. Press STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit.
- Open the cassette door and insert a cassette tape with the exposed tape facing upwards. Close the cassette door.
- 3. Press the PAUSE button followed by the RECORD button.
- To record from the radio, press the TUNER button and tune to your desired station.
- To record from the CD, press the CD button and select your desired CD tracks. Press the PLAY button (►) to start playing the CD.
- 6. Press the PAUSE button to start recording.

Note: This unit has a built-in Automatic Level Control (ALC) circuit, the volume of the recorded sound will be optimized automatically.

BASS BOOST

To emphasize the bass sound, press the BASS BOOST button on the unit.

AUTOMATIC STOP

To protect your cassette tapes and prevent unnecessary wear to the pinch roller of the cassette mechanism, this unit is equipped with an Automatic Stop System. When the tape ends, the PLAY Button will automatically release to stop the cassette from running.

RADIO TUNING

- 1. Press STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Press TUNER button to operate the unit in the radio mode.

BASS BOOST

To emphasize the bass sound, press the BASS BOOST button on the unit.

PRESET CHANNELS

With this function you can store up to 20 AM and 20 FM Radio stations.

- 1. Tune to a desired station.
- 2. On the unit, press the MEMORY button. The Memory indicator blinks
- While the Memory indicator is blinking, press the REPEAT button to select the desired preset channel.
- 4. Press the MEMORY button again to complete.
- 5. Tune to other stations and repeat steps 2 to 4 to store these stations in other preset channels.

Note: The Memory indicator will go off automatically If no button is pressed in 5 seconds.

TO RECEIVE PRESET STATIONS

- 1. Press STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit.
- 2. Press TUNER button to operate the unit in the radio mode.
- 3. Press REPEAT button to select the preset channels.

Note: When listening to FM programs, extend the Telescopic antenna to insure maximum tuner sensitivity. When listening to AM program, try rotating the unit until the best receptions is obtained.

USING HEADPHONES

Inserting the plug of your headphones into the Stereo headphone jack will enable you to listen to the CD, radio and cassette player in privacy. When using headphones the built-in Speakers will be disconnected.

NOTE: READ THIS IMPORTANT INFORMATION BEFORE USING YOUR HEADPHONES

- 1. Avoid extended play at every high volume as it may impair your hearing.
- 2. If you experience ringing in your ears, reduce the volume or shut off your unit.
- 3. Do not use while driving a motorized vehicle. This is dangerous and also illegal in some states.
- 4. Keep the volume at a reasonable level even if your headset is an open-air type designed to allow you to hear outside sounds. Please note that excessively high volume may still block outside sounds.

CLOCK & TIMER OPERATIONS

SLEEP OPERATION

- 1. Press the STANDBY/ON button to turn on the unit.
- Press the SLEEP button and the panel shows 90 Minutes of playing time.



- 3. To set the desired sleep time, hold down the SLEEP button and the sleep time will be automatically count down.
- Release the button when you reach the desired length of time you wish the unit to play. You can select time period from 90 minutes to 10 minutes.
- The unit will automatically turn off when the chosen sleep time has elapsed.

TO SET THE CLOCK

- 1. Press the STANDBY/ON button to turn off the unit.
- 2. The display shows the current time setting.



3. Press the MEMORY button and the hour position flashes.



- 4. Press the SKIP buttons to adjust the hour.
- 5. Press the MEMORY button and the minute position flashes.



- 6. Press the SKIP buttons to adjust the minute.
- 7. Press the MEMORY button again to complete.




