





INSTALLING THE BATTERIES

Use four AA batteries of the same type (lithium/Ni-MH/alkaline).







1 Open the battery cover.

Turn the battery cover unlock lever down, towards ▼ and open the battery cover.

2 Insert the batteries.

Be sure to insert the batteries with the "+" and "-" sides facing the correct directions.

3 Close the battery cover.


Press the cover until you hear it click and make sure that the cover is properly locked.





ATTACHING THE BATTERY GRIP TO THE CAMERA








- Open the battery grip connection cover on the camera, and remove the interface pins cap on the battery grip.
- 2 Attach the battery grip to the camera by fitting the interface pins and attachment screw of the battery grip to the battery grip connection terminal and tripod socket of the camera as shown above.
- 3 Secure the battery grip by turning the attachment wheel firmly in the direction of the arrow as shown above.


⚠ CAUTION

- · Make sure the camera and the battery grip are turned off before attaching.
- · Leave the cap on when not using the battery grip. Do not touch the interface pins with the cap off.
- You can store the battery grip connection cover of the camera in the cavity of the battery grip after removing from the camera in step 1 (see illustration in step 2). When storing the cover, push it down straight with your both thumbs.

TAKING PICTURES WITH THE CAMERA IN THE VERTICAL POSITION








Make sure to turn on the battery grip before attempting to operate the shutter release button or the **AE-L** button on the battery grip. However, the camera can still be operated by its own control even if the battery grip is turned off.

Memo

• It is recommended to turn off the battery grip when using the camera in a position other than the vertical position as the switch may accidentally be pressed.





The **AE-L** button can be operated in the same manner as that of the camera.
