### Operating range of the remote control unit



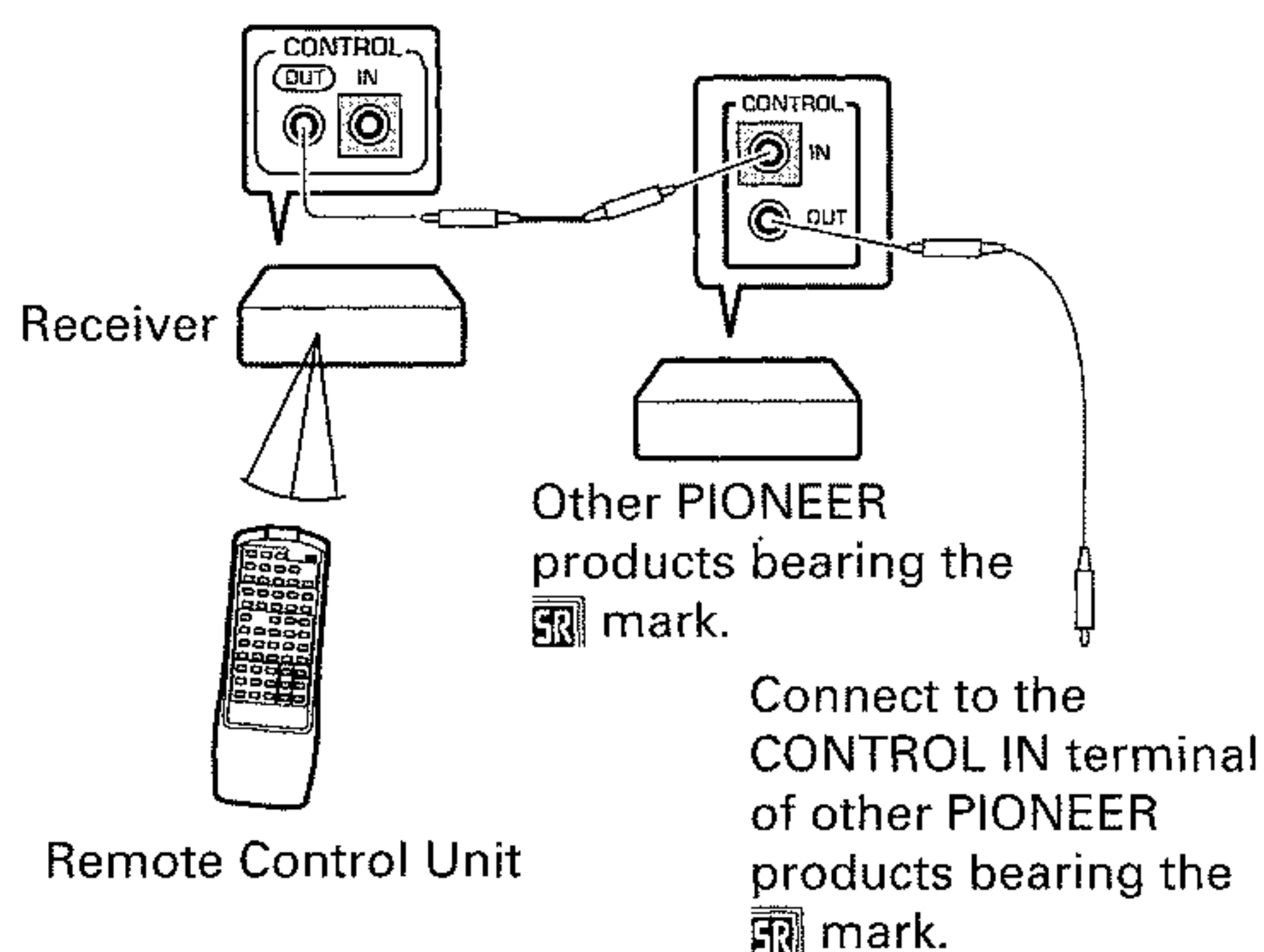

- The remote control unit may not work if there is an obstacle between the remote control unit and this unit, or if the remote control unit is not directed towards the remote sensor of the main unit at the correct angle.
- The remote control unit may not work properly if strong light such as direct sunlight or fluorescent light is shining onto the main unit's remote sensor.
- The remote control unit may not work properly when this unit is used near devices emitting infrared rays, or when remote control units of other devices which use infrared rays are used.  
On the other hand, the use of this remote control unit may cause other devices to work improperly.
- When the operating range of this remote control unit becomes too short, replace the batteries.

### Operating the remote control unit

By connecting a control cord (optional), other PIONEER products can be operated using this remote control unit via this unit. Direct the remote control unit towards the remote sensor of this unit.

The remote control signals are received by the remote sensor of this unit, and sent to the other devices via the CONTROL OUT terminal.

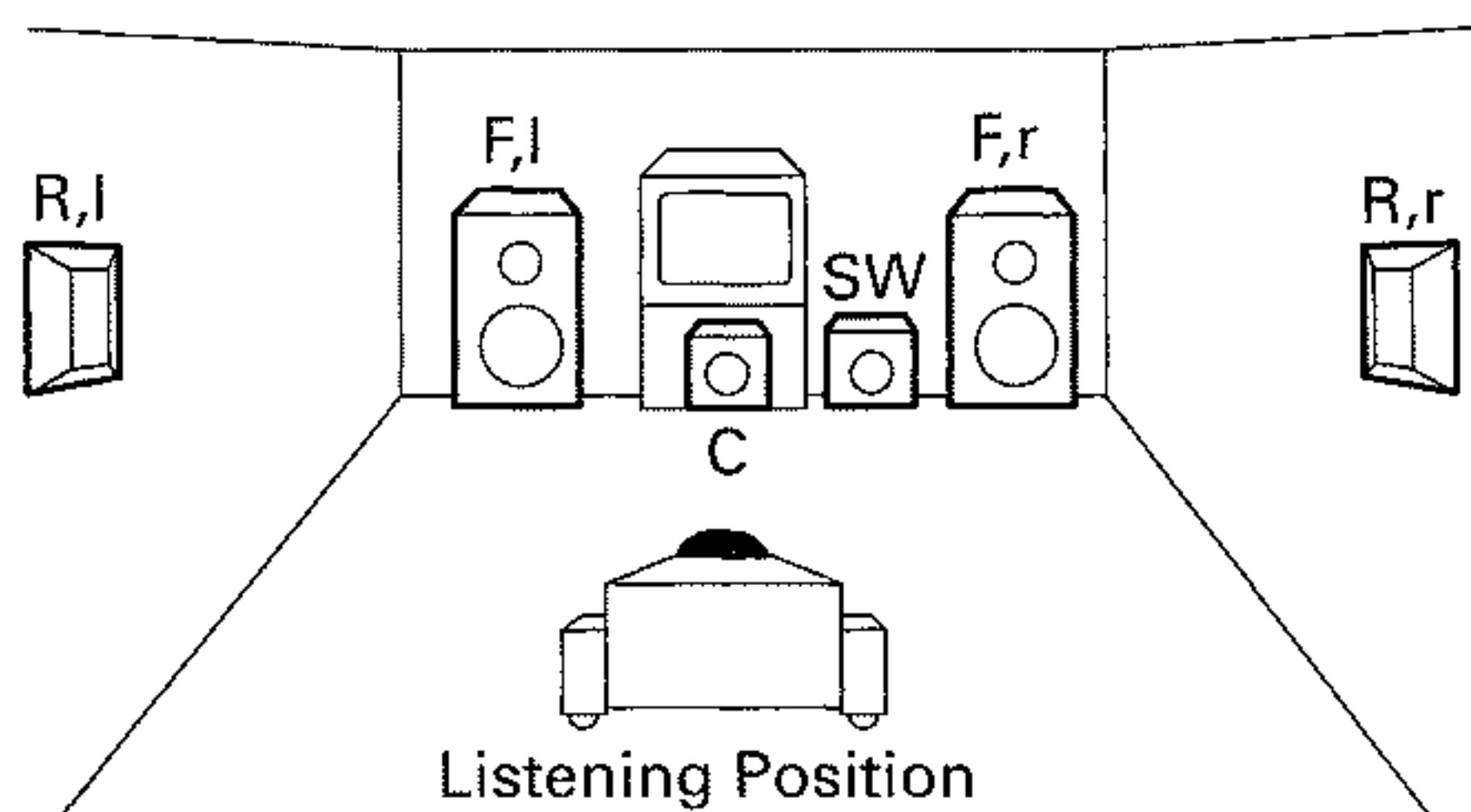


## INSTALLATION

### Installing speakers

To achieve the best surround effects, install speakers as shown in the following figure.

#### Installation Example



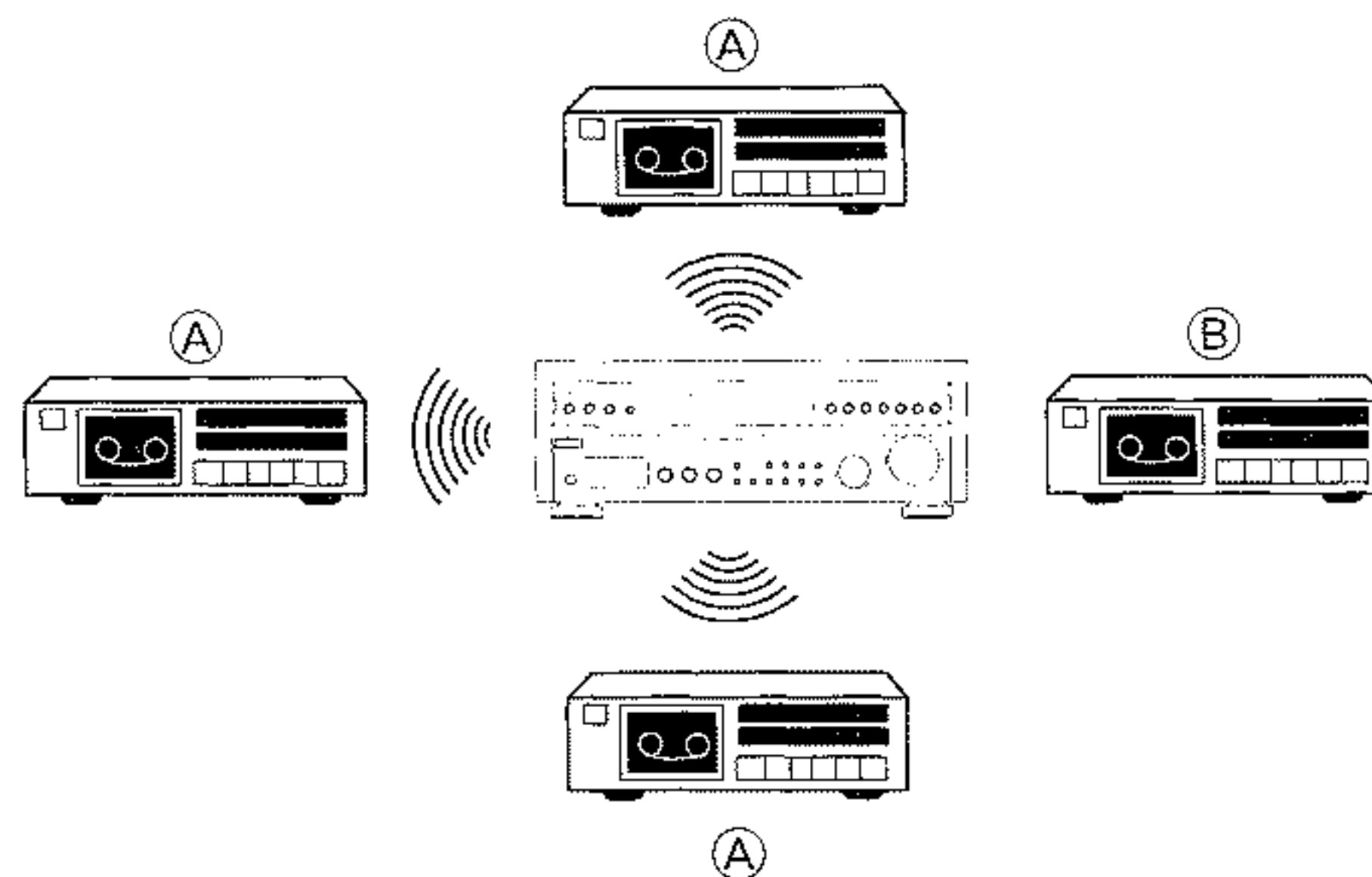
\* In the above figure, F indicates front speakers, R indicates rear speakers, C indicates center speaker, SW indicates sub woofer, r indicates right, and l indicates left.

#### memo

- If installing the rear speakers far away from the front and center speakers, surround effects cannot be fully achieved.
- Installing speakers near the TV may cause interference such as the TV color to change. In such cases, use magnetically shielded speakers or install the speakers away from the TV.
- Install the left and right speakers at equal distance from the TV.
- Install the center speaker at the top, bottom, or behind the TV so that TV sound and images match.
- It is recommended to install the rear speakers slightly above ear level.

### Installing the cassette deck

Installing the cassette deck in the following (A) positions in the figure may affect playback. It is recommended that it be installed in the (B) position.



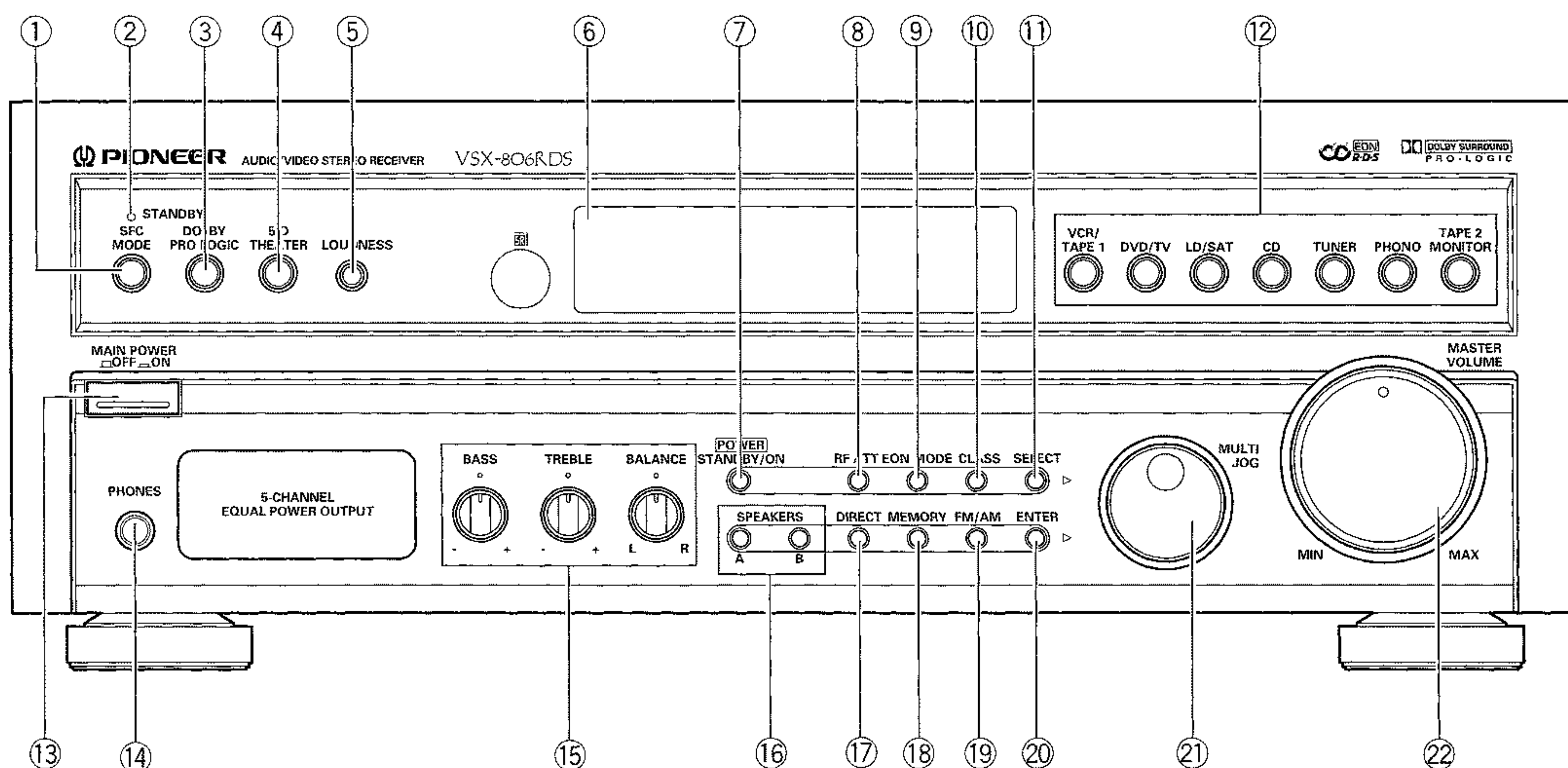

### ■ Selecting a broadcast station using this unit

1. Press the **POWER STANDBY/ON** button to turn the power ON.
2. Set the **TUNER** function.
3. Press the **FM/AM** button and select FM or AM broadcast.
4. Press the **SELECT** button, to set the frequency mode.  
FREQ indicator lights.
5. Rotate the **MULTI-JOG** and adjust to the desired broadcast station.  
The **TUNED** indicator lights up when a broadcast program is received.

Suitable for DOLBY PRO LOGIC surround sources with lots of movement such as action movies. It provides sounds with more speed.

### ② 5-D SURROUND

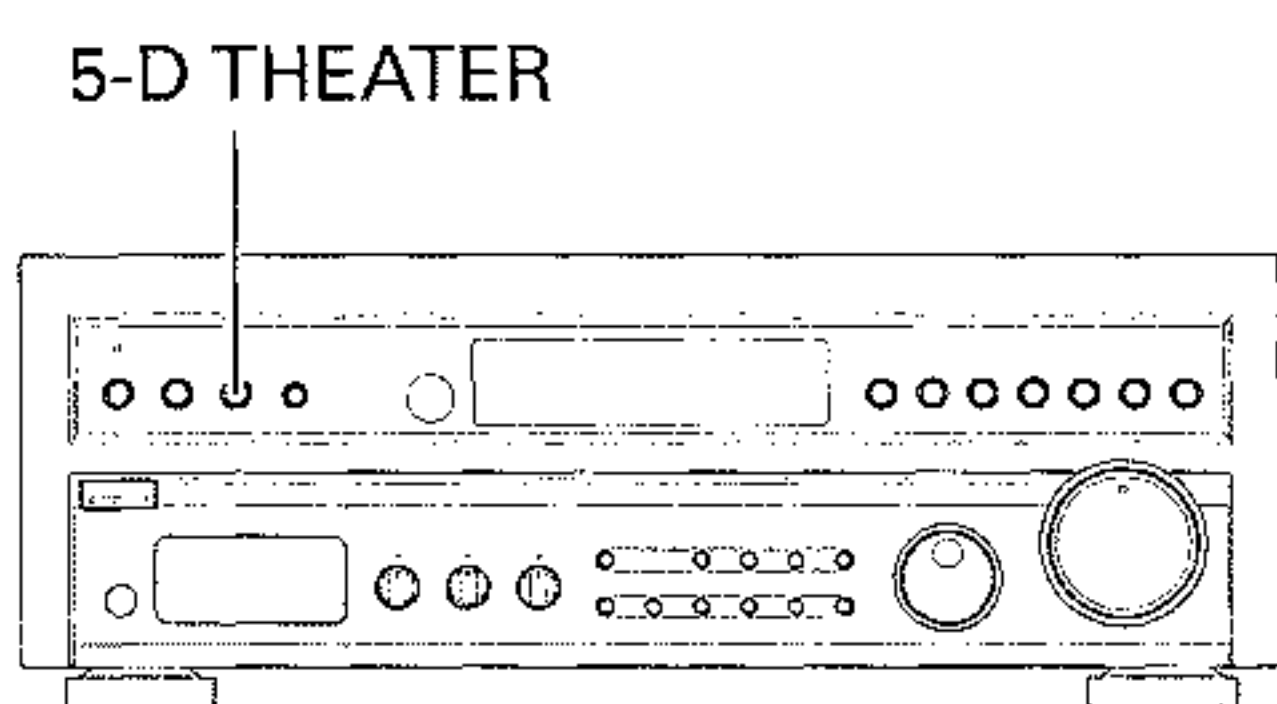
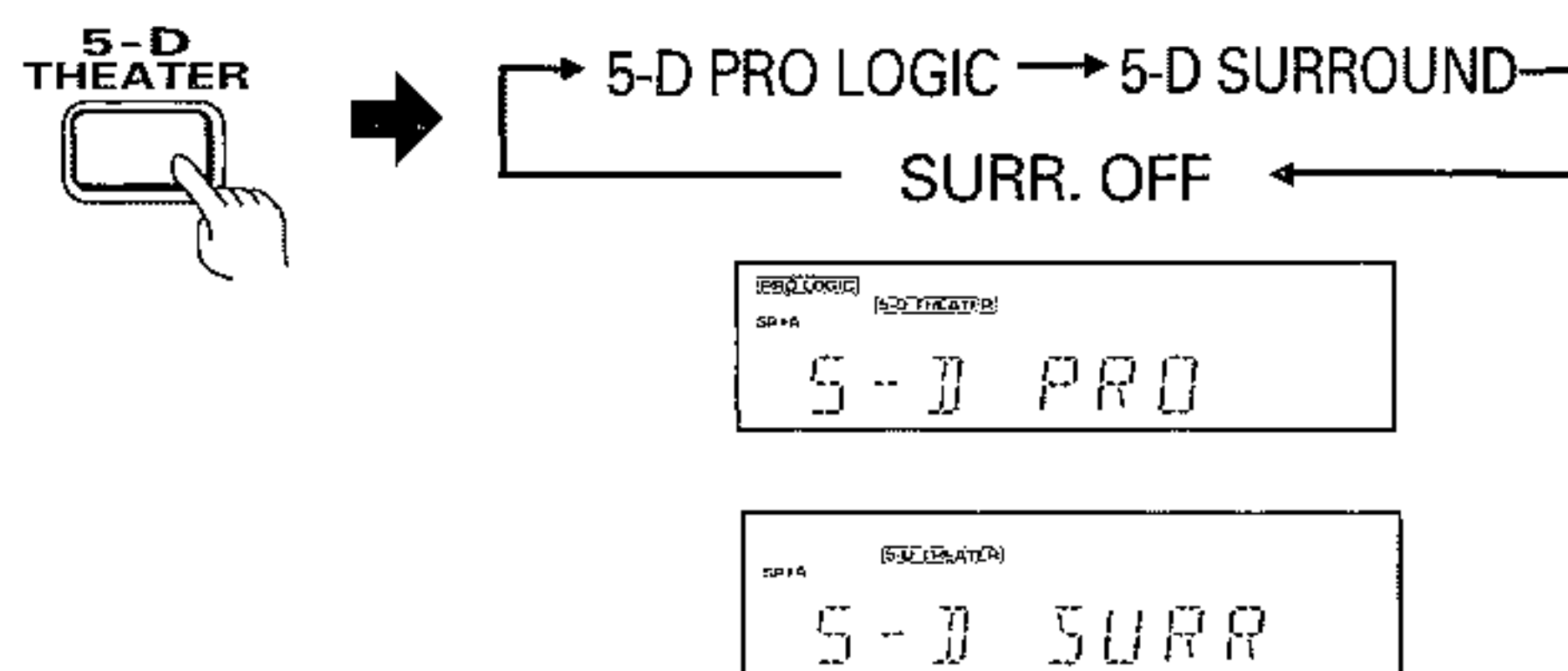

- In the RT mode, should any noise be picked up while displaying the RT scroll, some characters may temporarily be incorrectly displayed.
- In the RT mode, when no RT data is transmitted from a broadcast station, "NO RADIO TEXT DATA" is displayed once and after that the PS data is displayed.
- In PTY mode during RDS broadcast reception, there are cases where "NO TYPE" is displayed. In this case, it will automatically switch to PS mode after a few seconds.
- When reception conditions are strong, and RDS data is incorrectly displayed, press the RF ATT button.



## Memorizing a desired broadcast station name (Manual Station Name Memory) (Main unit only)



- Four characters can be memorized for each broadcast station.
- If a preset class number or station number is memorized, the old memorized data will be erased.
- The memorized name takes priority over the PS data and will be displayed.

- The EON mode is cancelled if you switch to AM reception during setting EON. It starts once more when you return to FM reception.
- Simultaneous request waiting for Traffic Information (TA) and News programs is not possible.
- Some functions cannot be used while the EON MODE indicator lights or flashes.
- Function other than TUNER cannot be changed while the EON MODE indicator flashes (receiving on EON broadcast).  
If you want to change to a function other than TUNER, press the EON MODE button and turn the EON MODE off.
- You cannot listen to Traffic Information (TA) and News programs when you playback TAPE 2 while setting EON.
