

Donald M. Layton is an Associate Professor at the Naval Postgraduate School, Monterey, Calif. He received a B.S. from the U.S. Naval Academy and a B.S. in Aeronautics from the Naval Postgraduate School. He holds an M.S. in Engineering from Princeton University and an M.S. in Management from the Naval Postgraduate School. He was commissioned in the U.S. Navy in 1945 and retired in 1968. He was assigned to ship duty from 1945-48 during which time he commanded the USS PGM-31 and the USS QUAPAW ATF-110. Mr. Layton was a naval aviator from 1948-68, qualified in Lighter-than-Air and Heavier-than-Air, single and multi-engine land and sea planes. He headed the Maintenance and Material Department of the Naval Safety Center from 1962-65 and was Director of Aviation Safety Programs at the Naval Postgraduate School in 1967-68. He edited Hazard Prevention, The Journal of the System Safety Society from 1969 until 1977. He is an Associate Fellow of AIAA and has served on numerous technical committees.
