ANA NURSING RESEARCH CONFERENCE

Stimulation of the conduct of nursing research and applications of research findings pertinent to nursing will be the focus of "Nursing Research: Integration into the Social Structure," the 1985 conference sponsored by the American Nurses' Association Council of Nurse Researchers, to be held in San Diego, California from December 4-7. The keynote speaker will be Ada Jacox, RN, PhD, whose topic will be "The Coming of Age of Nursing Research."
