SHOWINGS

hat a glorious show it was too! If you don't mind being trapped in an enclosed space with several thousand Commodore owners, that is. The Amiga dominated totally, there was hardly a C64 in sight, and consequently this year's Commodore Show was also buzzing with a lot more interest than some previous ones.

There was no single outstanding event but the feeling of excitement was tangible and there was a host of new products on show and being announced. Serious software and hardware were very much the order of the day, with only a couple of games houses represented, so the vibrant atmosphere was all the more gratifying.

Attendance was 10% up on the previous show at the 12,000 mark for the three days and the organisers, Database, are pleased with the way things went. As yet there is no date set for the next show, but we'll keep you posted.

MICROILLUSIONS WRANGLE

Visitors to the Commodore show may have noticed that Microlllusions had their own stand where Music X was on display, and that copies of Photon Paint 2 were on sale at other stands. At first glance this isn't curious, until you realise that Activision are still claiming the UK rights to these Microlllusions products.

At present the situation is unclear but it appears that Activision are involved in a legal tussle with both Microlllusions in the US and the new group which claims to represent them in the UK. Which means that neither program will be widely available until the dispute is settled.

Let's hope that's not too long away, because this is what Jon Bates and Brian Larkman had to say about Music X and Photon Paint 2 respectively...

MUSIC XTRA

Music X for the Amiga is coming. But from where? The American software house Microlllusions has been promoting this stunning sequencing, voicing and sampling package heavily in the American press for well over a year now. Surprising, therefore, that the only versions seen this side of the pond were demo versions that had yet to be de-bugged.

The first demo version, which was pretty spectacular, was shown by Activision who claimed to have an exclusive deal with Microlllusions. Confusion has arisen now since dealers and the press alike have been informed that The Software Business now has "the exclusive UK and European rights to Music X", and was exhibiting at the Commodore show and taking orders with one ex-Activision staff member doing the demo work, although at the time of going to press they "hadn't got the final version yet" (not bad for a program that has been advertised for nearly eighteen months!) Activision claim the matter is "under negotiation" with mutterings about contractual obligations. Time to stand back and watch the litigation!

PHOTON PHANTASY

After a few quiet months on the Amiga painting front, things are hotting up again. First it was Deluxe Paint III, soon it will be DigiPaint 3 but now we have Photon Paint 2!

The original Photon Paint has remained the favourite of the three HAM painting packages for most artists because it is the easiest to use and most 'painterly'. Many traditional effects are easy to achieve, including the best watercolour effect so far on the Amiga with Blend. The new ver-



sion provides lots of new features and greater speed without sacrificing the effortless operation.

The most dramatic additions are contour mapping and multipage, 'pageflipper' type animation, but also included are stencils, airbrush, rub-through, pantograph, auto-shadowing, cycle draw and many more minor enhancements.

In line with our new policy for graphics reviews, a really full description of *Photon Paint 2* including DIY tips and tutorials, written by people who are using the program every day, plus original artwork that will be included on the cover disk, is being prepared. It takes time, but you will see it soon! *Photon Paint 2* by

HOLOGRAPHIC AMIGA

One of the more unusual sights at the Commodore Show was the first hologram generated from a microcomputer image. Using developed equipment at Loughborough University and an Amiga 500, Rob Munday and his team, with advice from the Amiga Centre Scotland, have produced a 3D holographic view of a partiallyanimated wireframe bird rendered using Sculpt 3D.

To produce it, over 100 frames were generated and recorded onto a holographic plate in stereo pairs as a series of vertical strips. Viewing the image from the front, slight movements of the head reveal hidden parts of the object that would normally only be seen if it was real and solid. This is normal for a hologram as anyone with a bank card



knows. Usually though, the object from which a conventional hologram is taken is a 3D model; here it is a series of flat, 2D images. This is much more difficult and has previously only been achieved using high-powered Cray supercomputers. Now, in another first for the Amiga, a 3D computer model has been recorded holographically.

The physics is quite difficult, but if I understand it correctly, the process works something like this: conventional holography captures the image of a complete 3D object in such a way that the parts of it that can be seen vary according to your viewpoint, just as would happen with a 'real' object. In effect the hologram has superimposed an almost infinite series of 'views' of the object which are revealed as your viewpoint is changed. Stereoscopic holography has the same effect but in this case the 'views' are captured separately like the frames of a stereovision film, one for each eye, in the form of pairs of vertical strips on the plate.

The advantage of this method is that the content of each 'frame' is much more controllable so that any object capable of being modelled on a computer can be captured in 3D and even animated. The use of Amigas, or other cheap micros, also means that the commercial potential of such 'animated' holograms is much more likely to be realised. It is only a matter of time before fullcolour, fully-animated sequences and even whole films appear.

JUST SAY THE WORD

SNIPPETS

Computers can be of great use to the disabled in all manner of ways, one of which is demonstrated by Arnor's new speaking version of their word processor Protext. It's designed for use by the blind and is currently still undergoing development and testing.

All Protext's functions are available from the keyboard, which is essential because pull-down menus and a mouse are no use to blind users. The WP will be able to speak each key as it is pressed, speak every word as it is typed, read back the current line, read back from the start of the paragraph. speak characters as the cursor is moved and speak useful status information. Price and release details have not been decided yet but Arnor promise discounts for the visually handicapped. More on 0733 68909

ROMBO MACHO VIDEO

Rombo are well known for their digitisers and other add-ons on other machines, but now they are bursting onto the Amiga scene for the first time with the Video Image Digital Interface, VIDI-Amiga.

Although it's their first attempt it could make a big impact because it is attractively priced at £99.95 and has an impressive list of features. These include grabbing frames from a moving video in a 50th of a second in both mono and colour, load and save in IFF format, overlaying an incoming frame anywhere on an existing one, a user-definable palette, analogue contrast and brightness control, eight-level brightness control and

COLOURFUL CARDS

Heads-up artistic geniuses with a few pennies to spare! Hi Tension are working on Ami-graphex, a graphics expansion card in two versions. Zooming in at £899 will be Ami-graphex 1, which raises the screen resolution to 1024x768 pixels and provides a palette of 256 colours on screen from a choice of 16 million. The card comes fitted with 2Mb of high-speed RAM.

The Ami-graphex 2 will cost the princely sum of £1599 and for your cash you get 1280x1024 pixel resolution and the same palette options. CENTRAL TELEVISION

The Amiga is taking off as the most important tool in video work with new products like G2's Videocenter bursting onto the scene. The Videocenter combines in one neat box the facilities of a video mixer, genlock and PAL encoder.

The Center mixes an incoming video signal with computer output using sliding faders or software to control fade to black and the mix level. It also has a filtered and buffered RGB output for connecting an RGB monitor. YC inputs and outputs take advantage of the new Super-VHS systems. G2 are no novices to the video game having produced the G2 MasterPieCe 900 that, among other things, mixes the graphics and live action for the BBC's quiz show Going for Gold. The fact that they produce everything from genlocks to broadcaststandard graphics and captioning systems really makes this one to watch out for. The Videocenter costs £595 from G2 Systems on 0252 737151.

If talk of PAL encoders, genlocks and buffered RGB outputs is just so much wibble to you, then check out the video feature on Page 17. Also keep your eyes peeled for a review of the Videocenter coming to Amiga Format's pages soon.

FOFT ARRIVES: THE FIRST OF A SERIES

Gremlin's massive space trading shoot-em-up, Federation Of Free Traders, is set to arrive on the Amiga in the near future. Billed by Gremlin as an 'Elite beater', FOFT was some two years in development and was advertised heavily in the press prior to its release on the ST. When it finally arrived the game proved to have a few major gameplay flaws which, when combined with the appalling manual, reduced the game almost to unplayability.

Gremlin listened to all the criticisms, read the reviews, took note of what people had to say and set about correcting the



game before releasing the Amiga version. Ian Stewart, Gremlin's MD, is now "Very, very happy with the product – we've really done the business and got it just right." When asked if he thought Amiga FOFT really was an 'Elite beater'

lan replied "It's not an Elite beater we're after so much – we just wanted to produce a really good game that would appeal to fans of this genre". Let's hope Gremlin really have got it right this time: and watch the reviews pages next month for the definitive Amiga Format in-depth review.

The next game in what's planned to be a Federation series is well under way. It won't be another space trading cum shootem-up, but it promises to be just as large and have just as much playability. It's not due for release until sometime next year, so we'll bring more news as it comes in.

ANIMATED MAGIC

A really useful piece of software must have two qualities if it is to be marketed successfully as a professional product. It must do its job well, obviously, but also it ought to look good, operating intuitively and ergonomically so that its power is not hidden by a complex interface. In short, it should be fun to use. ANIMagic (Aegis, £69.95 from Digipro, Tel 0703 703030) is a powerful and almost unique piece of software for editing ANIM files, but like many Aegis products it suffers from an ugly and clumsy interface that takes time to get to grips with.

This is a great pity because, unlike most other animation editing and sequencing programs, it allows direct editing and rearranging of individual frames of the actual compressed ANIM files. What it does can be divided into

two areas: ANIM editing and enhancement, and Digital Video Effects (DVEs). Among the editing features are: full cut and paste between ANIMs, plus merge and crop, 'A-B Rolls' type transitions, layering of several ANIMs on top of each other, adjustment of colours (for one frame or globally) and optimise palettes, and use of any resolution or screen mode. DVEs include all the usual transitions, wipes, turns, rolls and spins plus a library of special effects such as shatters, fountains etc that can be 'enhanced' with other customised effects by the user. The layers of effects possible can be so complex that the dialogue box provides space for a four-line description that can be saved with the DVE. A lot of people are really going to need this versatile and powerful package.

KLASSIX GOING CHEAP

The first three titles on US Gold's new budget label Klassix are *Out Run, Foundations Waste* and *World Class Leaderboard*, each one for the amazing sum of just £9.99. As yet no other full-price software house has followed suit in the move to cut-price bestsellers.

Among US Gold's major competitors are Microprose, who have no plans to introduce a budget 16-bit label according to Managing Director Stewart Bell. "You get what you pay for. If you can't compete on quality or gameplay, you could try to compete on price. If I had bought a game at £25 I would be very annoyed to see it being sold for £10." Activision's Amanda Barry said they too had "no plans for a budget label, we're a full-price only company."

Mastertronic already produce budget Amiga games like Sidewinder and Chase for £9.95. Spokesman Andy Wright was unconcerned by US Gold's move and promised "a new range of 16bit titles at a new price point." Watch these pages for more details.

DESIGNS ON DISKS

Over recent months, Antic seem to be breaking the habit of a lifetime and converting their excellent Atari graphics programs for the Amiga. This is quite a revolutionary development for the Amiga. Already Cyber Paint has warped across in the form of Zoetrope (available in PAL format from ISM: 0983 864674): now the whole set of Design Disks has arrived, along with an entirely new one.

A number of other developers are starting to offer 'readymade' objects for use in 3D modelling systems, but this set from Antic is the most comprehensive and useful available. Disks on offer are:

 Architectural Design: everything from a doorstep to a complete city. Instant Frank Lloyd Wright.

 Future Design: space stations, space craft, robot vehicles and androids. DIY Star Wars.

 Human Design: skeletal male and female human figures.
 Detailed structures that are anatomically correct. The ST demo did backward somersaults!

 Microbot Design: DIY robot kit.
 Almost all possible components for detailed, advanced robots.

 Interiors: latest addition to the set, with room plans, objects for the inside of a house, 3D clip-art.

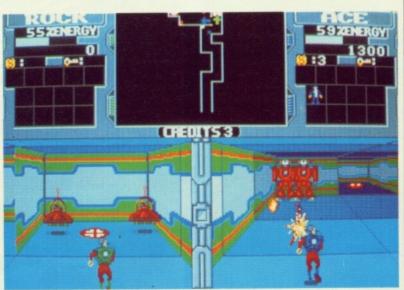

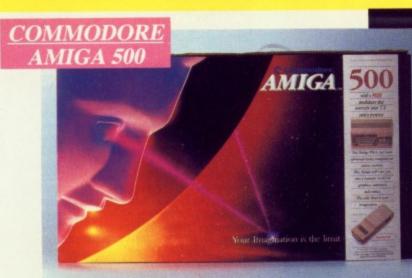

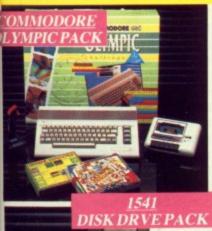

If there was one person in the country who knew everything that was happening to the Amiga, who knew exactly what hardware and software would be available, you'd want to talk to him... so we did.

sunny, blue-skied morning on a typical hi-tech industrial park near the edge of Maidenhead, beside the green fields of the Berkshire countryside. Within the friendly red-brick walls of Commodore UK's headquarters, in a light and airy office, sits Dr Rahman Haleem. He is head of Technical Support and a guiding light of the Amiga Developers' Advisory Board in this country: and as such, he knows everything there is to know about developments in Amiga hardware and software. He's also uniquely placed to give an insight into how Commodore see the Amiga's strengths and weaknesses, both now and in the future.

Commodore have been accused in the past of blurring the public perception of the Amiga, and even being confused about its

role themselves, with the A500 daring to be more than just a winning games machine, and the A2000, expensive for home use, moving into powerful 'business' roles. But in fact, just a few minutes' chat with Rahman Haleem reveals a dedicated and impassioned commitment to a very definite future for the Amiga range. Not one single use, of course: but certainly a distinct direction dictated by the Amiga's architecture and capabilities.

HOME USE

The A500, Dr Haleem believes, has now "broken through the barrier of 'would it make it' ". A touch wary of revealing sales figures, he prefers to look at the total number of machines that have been sold to date and now form the user base: the A500 has passed the

one million mark, and of these some 6-700,000 are in Europe. In roughly a year, so Commodore reckon, the A500 will have outstripped the Atari ST. This comparison reflects the popular

use of both as games machines, a role in which the Amiga is bound to become stronger and stronger as programmers' awareness of its capabilities grows.

Rahman sees the increasing domination of the 16-bit games charts by Amiga games (19 as against 11 ST in the latest top thirty, he notes) and the concur-

rent release dates and equal prices of Amiga and ST games as "a major breakthrough", indicative that software houses now recognise the size and continuing expansion of the Amiga market. Even so, the Commodore people would join with many Amiga owners in lamenting the tendency to port over 16-bit games from poorer machines without any adaptation: "We're asking for Amiga-specific development". The full potential is a long way from being fulfilled. "I have not seen a real Amiga game yet", says Rahman. A challenge?

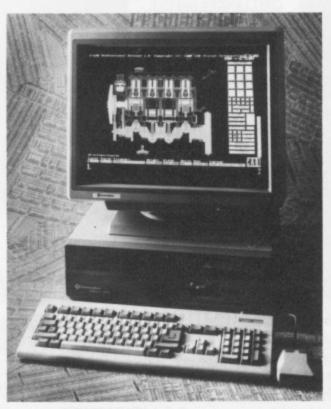

Meanwhile, any home machine nowadays must be able to support a couple of serious applications – Commodore would like to be able to bundle in some word-processing software with the computer – but wp and home accounts are not seen as necessarily the machine's greatest strength. They particularly wish to encourage the 'hobbyist' user, who needs the machine as a leisure tool.

The pattern for the Amiga's future is revealed by the great emphasis Commodore place on its graphics capabilities, which is not entirely unreasonable considering the power available in this field as a result of the machine's design. Dr Haleem hopes to be able to bundle in graphics and animation demos, perhaps even a tutorial along the lines of The Very First covering this area, and to continue to supply users with information about hardware and software for use in the graphics and animation field. In a similar

Commodore were proud of the fact that What Video magazine voted it the most important video peripheral of the year: and it's been described as the most significant development since the video camera. With a simple genlock tool, the humble A500 can provide a range of professional quality post-production facilities, particularly useful for dropping captions, logos or animation sequences into any video picture.

Commodore see the Amiga as having great potential benefits for the musician, too, denying vehemently that the ST has any inherent superiority in this area except for an in-built MIDI interface, which can be bought quite cheaply anyway. The possibilities of the Amiga's internal soundchip have barely, as yet, been touched. All these areas for home use of the Amiga will be even more enhanced, we are assured, by a strong push from Commodore on the use of the computer's unique multi-tasking capabilities. Keep watching this space...

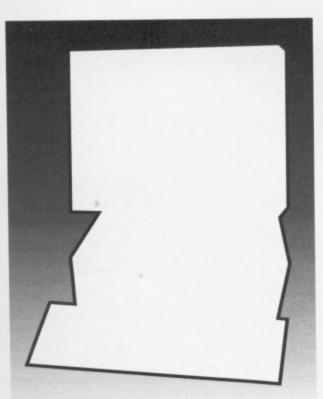
SERIOUS USES

Meanwhile, the expandable A500 with its big brothers the B2000, the possibly-to-be-released A2500 and the pipeline A3000, shift the Amiga up into the business user bracket. Once again, though, the impression Rahman Haleem gives is not of an ordinary computer trying to compete in the serious world of accounts spreadsheets and word-processing. Instead, it is apparent that he sees the machine as having specific strengths suited to particular uses. "The visual aspect is very important," he stresses, noting that the audio-visual power the machine delivers for the price is its unique selling point. However, the perceived cheapness and flexibility of the Amiga may actually discourage some specialist users:

"The Amiga: voted most important video peripheral by What Video"

in a certain European country, we were told, every time the price was increased sales went up.

Interactive video programs, particularly for training purposes, represent one area "where the A2000 needs to go", says Rahman. Desk-top presentation is another "very strong area", particularly considering the high-quality graphics the machine offers, and even using the computer as a delivery system for slides and the like. Desk-top publishing would not seem to be such a high priority, the niche having been amply filled already - "it's what you can offer that's different that counts" developments although on a Commodoreapproved laser printer and other DTP peripherals shortly, following proper evaluation. Computer-aided

design is another growing field, with some mention being made of use by architects and of a five-fold speed gain over the standard Autocad system.

Networking, with Ethernet and Arcnet already available, will also come in for some serious attention, and a cut-price network for schools is currently under test. This latter example reflects the Amiga's attempt to move in on the educational market (left somewhat open by the gradual fading of the BBC micro) and the BBC Emulator for the Amiga has already sold more than a thousand copies, which speaks for itself.

Perhaps the most glamorous professional use of the Amiga is in the heady media world of video and television: it's even been spotted by Rahman's son in use on Rolf Harris's programme! And we are told to expect some "very interesting developments" in the near future...

HARDWARE NEWS

The big news, of course, is of the imminent non-appearance in this country of the 68020-equipped A2500 workstation as an upgrade development of the Amiga 2000, of which there are more details elsewhere in these pages. The importance of development with an upgrade capability is highly stressed by Rahman, intended to protect Amiga owners from the "technology trap" that catches so many machines that were once at the forefront of progress.

Next step up, currently in development, is the A3000, employing a Motorola 68030 CPU to give a 600% speed increase running with a 25Mhz MMU and a processor. abound of a development machine under test by McDonnell Douglas in the States being glimpsed by a local user group, but Commodore are playing their cards close to their corporate chest...

This coyness, prompted by a laudable wish not to harp on about products that simply aren't available, also delays news of the A2024 hi-res monochrome monitor, which will feature 1K by 1K resolution and is clearly intended for use with DTP or similar highquality presentation functions. More excitingly, we can bring you the news that Workbench 1.4 is currently with 12 developers in the UK for beta-testing in conjunction with the Enhanced Chip Set, ECS. It will feature a new noninterlace high resolution graphics mode and fast filing for floppies. Again, watch this space...

AMIGA DEVELOPERS' ADVISORY BOARD

The Amiga Developers' Advisory Board grew out of a meeting at the Commodore Show in June 1988. Its purpose is to act as a forum for ideas and to help sort out technical problems. New software and hardware is made available by Commodore to be "beta tested" in actual use, and to be updated as a result of the experience: for instance, Workbench 1.3 underwent five changes after developers' testing. The Enhanced Chip Set (ECS) and Workbench 1.4 are now under test with 12 developers.

A two-monthly mailshot gives details of new projects, and also supplies technical notes to advise developers on problems: recent Kickstart 1.3 loading problems with certain games on certain drives, for example, were traced to a loader that exceeded the specs laid down by Commodore.

Developers are also asked to register their projects to avoid duplication of effort and unnecessary competition, whilst being guaranteed confidentiality in sensitive areas. This comes across as a benevolent version of Apple's coordination of Mac software developments, intended to encourage unique developments and seed ideas. Marketing opportunities are also opened up and passed around within a European forum. A test lab has been set up at Maidenhead to make the very latest hardware available in all the possible combinations, to which developers can bring their software and test it themselves: Commodore don't touch pre-release product, although they will test it all postrelease. The new AGNUS chip is currently available for development testing.

So why do Commodore bother with all these expensive and time-consuming facilities? Basically, Rahman Haleem sees development support as an obligation for such a 'young' machine: "The Amiga has been around for three years now, and three years is not a long time." Support ensures the quality of Amiga software, which naturally benefits sales of the machine, helping "to break the chicken and egg situation" of 'no decent software, so no point buying' that has had such a detrimental effect on other innovative machines. It further serves to curtail harmful rumours about Amiga technical problems, and gives a picture of development which puts Commodore in a good position to ascertain what they should undertake themselves, as they did with the BBC Emulator.

Although Commodore UK do provide a technical support hotline for users, much of their effort goes into dealer support, so your dealer should always be able to help if you ever encounter any problems...

THE Your view of the Amiga video scene might be slightly distorted. STEVE JARRATT went to Leicester to obtain an Alternative Image. The addition of dynamic

generators in this way. However, similar effects could be produced by quite simply using sequences of static, digitised images to replace the pre-edited video footage, with only a comparatively minor loss of quality in the finished product.)

With the freeze-framed head running through the Amiga, two lens shapes were drawn using a particular colour. This colour was then used as the 'key' on which the second video source would appear. In this case, three VCRs would be needed: one for the head, one for the stills in the lenses and one to record the composite image. The photos must be filmed to video separately and positioned in the frame so as to completely cover the key.

n much the same way that the power of 16-bit machines augmented by MIDI compatibility has opened a world of opportunity to electronic musicians, the Amiga's superior graphics capabilities combined with genlocking promise similar opportunities for the amateur video producer. However, the often-misleading hype that surrounds the topic belies the true nature of the beast: any Amiga owner who buys a genlock with the intention of creating 'Roger Rabbit II' is going to be sadly disappointed. But with the right equipment, plenty of time and some patience, impressive results can quickly be obtained.

The hardware at the heart of Amiga video production is the genlock. This ingenious device enables pictures from the Amiga to be composited with a video source from VCR, Camcorder or even another Amiga.

Any output TV or monitor picture is built up with hundreds of scan lines, all of which are drawn and redrawn around 50 times a second. To enable the separate images to be combined, their signals must be synchronised by locking together the line and frame sync generators of each source, hence the name 'genlock'. By keying the video signal onto a specified colour within the Amiga's

RGB monitor output, the genlock effectively acts as a real-time 'matte' generator: anyone familiar with the blue-screen 'chromakey' system used in TV broadcasting will see immediate comparisons.

There's a variety of genlocks on the market, starting at just under £100 for use with domestic standard videos. After that, the limiting factor is cash: investment is reflected in increasing picture quality and system flexibility.

THE RECIPE FOR SUCCESS

Video production is hardware intensive, so anyone who doesn't have or can't afford access to the

minimum of equipment might be advised to follow a different creative path. Realistically, would-be Julian Temples need an Amiga with one meg of memory; two video recorders; a genlock device; and specific software packages, depending on the image required.

A catalogue of additional equipment might fill the rest of the magazine, but to make the whole process a little less painful, interested parties should take a look at a video camera of some sort (a second-hand Camcorder is fine, although shoestring budgets can always stretch to short-term rental or even to filming in Super 8mm with subsequent transfer to video).

Live-action footage of an approaching Bass truck is run and then freeze-framed. The genlocked logo zooms in and the robot slides up into full view. The truck image then fades to black, leaving the robot to begin his intro speech.

All 3D animation sequences produced by Al are executed in the same way, using compressed files played back at 20-30 frames per second onto videotape. Recorded sections can then be edited together to form longer sequences.

Memory space is always at a premium, but never more so than when fiddling around with graphic images. Extra RAM, second drives and hard drives become increasingly important as more and more computer-generated artwork is employed in the video production.

A digitiser provides a rapid route for the creation of graphics, and can be used as a base for hand-drawn artwork or to provide a source of static photograph-quality material for inclusion in composite sequences. Similarly, a real-time frame grabber can be employed to great effect. It allows you to take images from already-prepared videos, store them as

IFF files and then re-touch or animate them as necessary using a suitable art package.

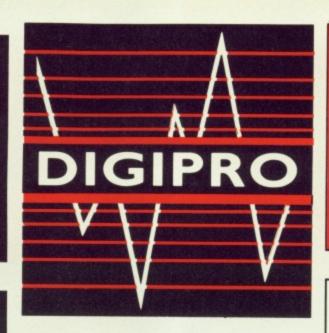
An imposing shopping list, but not totally outside the realms of possibility, especially for a group of friends, or for members of a video workshop (a visit to local information bureaux should yield the location of any facilities in the area). And although the right hardware is a vital necessity, it's not really how much you've got but what you do with it: the important thing is to have at least a clear idea of what the final image is to be. Storyboarding is a good habit to get into, allowing precise preplanning, choreography and timing

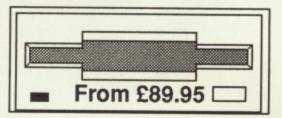

SEEING IS BELIEVING

The images reproduced on these pages are all taken from videos produced by Alternative Image. This Leicester-based company first appeared in 1984 as a small production unit with the intention of creating visual media for small businesses as well as industrial and community projects. Their work encompasses all manner of presentations, including video productions and audio-visual slide

shows, handling graphic design, photography and even looking after some of the sound work.

Their links with the Amiga started from the need for a cheap caption generator. For little extra outlay, the Amiga was seen as a

flexible and viable alternative to any specific hardware, also doubling as an entry-level computer generated graphics system. An A2000 was purchased at the end of 1987, which currently boasts 4.5 megs RAM, a 20-meg hard drive and two floppies. It also includes a turbo board composed of a 68020 processor with 68881 maths co-processor, 68851 memory management chip and 2 megs of 32-bit dynamic RAM: generally, one mean mother of an Amiga.

The most recent addition to the studio is a Polaroid Palette which outputs IFF files directly onto 35mm colour transparency film, producing very-high-quality screen shots. This now enables them to run a bureau service for the costeffective production of slides for presentations, promotions etc.

IMAGE PROCESSING

Alternative Image are fortunate enough to have professional-quality equipment placed at their disposal. However, most of the effects described here could, with some effort, be reproduced using an amateur set-up, with only a minor reduction in quality.

Alongside an impressive array of equipment, the Al crew employs a large library of art packages to create specific effects. Of these, there are a few which get used more than most: used primarily in creating hi-res key areas for the

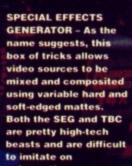

The background footage lasts 30 sec-



onds, but the entire title sequence couldn't be played back realtime due to memory restrictions. To resolve this, each logo was individually recorded



against planet footage, neatly choreographed to avoid glitches when spliced together. A subtle fade between cuts completes the illusion of a single shot.

genlocking process, and also for producing background pictures or re-touching digitised images, is Deluxe Paint II. The arrival of Deluxe Paint III (£90) now facilitates the inclusion of simple and rapidly-produced animation.

TV Show (£61) does wipe transitions easily using an editable script file to create synchronised sequences. (Anyone wanting to include Amiga-generated sounds should look at Aegis' Lights, Camera, Action). TV Show can also move single bit-mapped images around, although this function has now been superceded to some degree by Deluxe Paint III.

Aegis Videotitler (£96) uses Amiga fonts in any resolution and comes with four stretchable fonts, which can be scaled, compressed or condensed and still retain their true outline. It also features a variety of wipe transitions and captioning effects, and can animate titles easily, creating anim files like Videoscape does.

Version 2.0 of Videoscape 3D (£125) is used in preference to Sculpt 3D due to the speed of rendering. However, with the advent of Sculpt 4D (£368) including a 68020-compatible version of the program, Al now intend to produce full ray-traced animations with shadows and reflections. (Sculpt 4D Junior is about to be released at around £100 as a cut-down version without the ray-tracing facilities).

Finally, the Pixmate Image Processor (£43) is used to analyse pictures and re-format them to suit. For instance, a HAM image can be reduced to 32 colours and imported to D Paint, while retaining the overall integrity of the image. PIP is also used to clean up pictures, de-focus them, produce edge effects, and even compress or stretch the image. Palettes can also be customised, in a fashion analogous to a graphic equaliser for colours.

■ 40K is allocated to samples in a SEUCK game, which allows a fair old bit of racket to be appended to the action. The Sound Editor control screen, however, allows you to meddle with the rate at which a sample will be played back, so the same effect can be used at different places within a game and yet sound completely different. Examine Slap 'n' Tickle in SEUCK, for instance, and you'll find that one sound is used five times: but you'd never realise this was the case by just playing the game. For continuous noise, effects can be looped: the tank in Blood 'n' Bullets drives across the screen accompanied by two looped samples.

The Sound Editor control screen allows a designer to fiddle around with a sample that has been assigned a sound effect number, adjusting the vol-ume and sample rate at which it will be played, and previewing the effect of adjustments by



■ A little lateral thinking allows you to create extra effects by doing more than assign noises to obvious events, like bullets being fired, objects being picked up and so on. Tiny or even invisible objects can be assigned a sound and triggered for additional effects. In Blood 'n' Bullets, for instance, a tiny object that travels with a line of soldiers shoots off bullets which have the effect "Fire!" tagged to them. So as this row of enemy troops marches down the screen, their commander simply appears to be shouting "Fire!" at



SHOOT IT YOURSELF

GRAEME KIDD finds that the easy way to be a Games Designer is to do it yourself with Palace's Shoot 'Em Up Construction Kit...

ccording to the original Palace masterplan, Amiga Shoot 'Em Up Construction Kit should have been released about six months ago, but it's only just appearing in the shops now: so why the delay? SEUCK has effectively been re-written, explains Palace supremo Pete Stone. "Lots of little changes have been made, but they are all important ones. We're releasing a product which has been re-vamped."

SEUCK originally appeared on the Commodore 64 a couple of years ago. The Sensible Software guys, Chris Yates and Jon Hare, were working on Wizball using a

number of sprite and background utilities that Chris had written. They were talking over a few game plans with Palace when the idea of producing a construction kit based on the utilities came up, and a few months later SEUCK was launched to an appreciative audience.

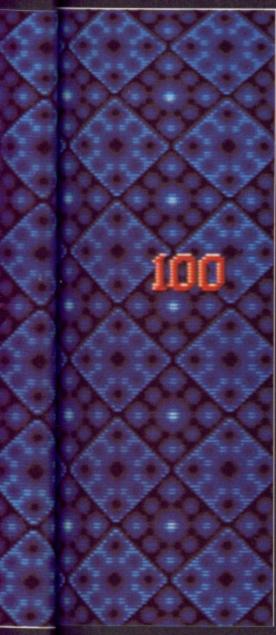
Last year, work began on an Amiga conversion with Richard Leinfellner in charge of the project. Six or seven months' work followed which resulted in the early version seen by magazines around Christmastime. Then Sensible's Jon Hare was called in to use Amiga SEUCK to write a trio of games that would accompany the final



■ Building the Number 4 sprite in the editor. The three-digit counter at the top left of the gamescreen was cunningly assembled from a sequence of ten different sprites – the digits '0' to '9' – grouped together as an enemy object and copied twice to give three ten-digit objects. The three enemy object counters were then animated at appropriate different speeds and placed in position on the background as static enemy objects to give a digital readout that gives all the appearance of decrementing in real time.

■ Enemy objects, or aliens as far as the player is concerned, can be linked together by assigning the same flight path to them, thus creating a wave of followme aliens like these taken from Slap 'n' Tickle. Shuffle the objects closer together and composite sprites like the end-of-level dragons in Space Harrier may easily be created.

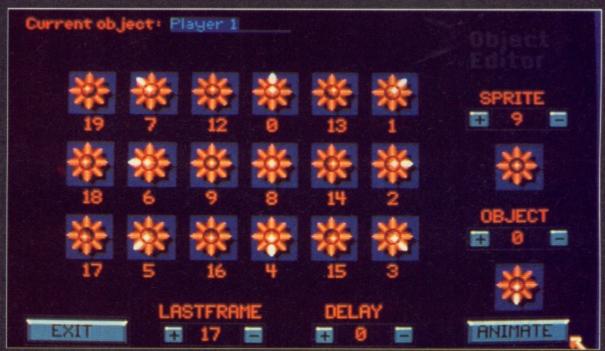

package, and suddenly things began to evolve. "I needed someone to write a game in it to find all the pitfalls. I began to get the feedback I needed when Jon started on the project," Richard explains. Jon was on the phone to Richard almost daily, with suggestions for tweaks to make the software more competent and more user-friendly.

At the same time, musician Richard Joseph was working on sounds for the three games Jon was writing as well as building a library of samples to accompany the finished package. Leinfellner happily took musical suggestions on board as well, and as a result

the final SEUCK will come with three sound directories, each containing 25 files, and you can now load in any IFF sound sample. Richard created all the vocal effects himself, and everything else was collected from a tape library at Pinewood. "I hope that people will organise themselves," he explains, "and start collecting their own sounds, swapping sample disks and so on."

Three example games accompany the kit: Blood 'n' Bullets, Slap 'n' Tickle, and Psycho Blast. SEUCK is completely mouse and joystick driven, and while the temptation may be to dive straight in

and start knocking up a game, to get the most out of the package you'll need to give the manual a close read and plan your game before starting work. Lateral thinking is the key to producing good SEUCK software.

SEUCK is a versatile utility, capable of producing games that are much more than vertically-scrolling shoot-em-ups (as the example game Psycho Blast reveals) providing you understand fully how the package works and can think laterally. It would be quite possible to do a Paperboy-style game, so long as you remembered to make the paper a

bullet and had the letterbox as an enemy with a rattling noise as the explosion when the enemy takes a hit. The best way to start, according to Jon Hare, is to load in one of the example games, play for a while, then start taking it to pieces in SEUCK, meddling with the parameters. Experiment to your heart's content. You'll soon get a feel for the possibilities...

SEUCK will cost around £29.95 and contain three disks: the Master Editor, which is the keydisk; the Sound Disk which contains the sample libraries; and a copyable disk containing all the files needed to run a stand-alone game design.

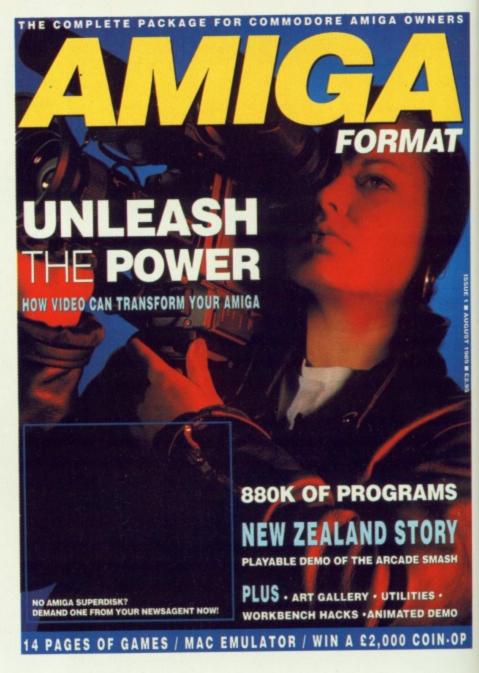

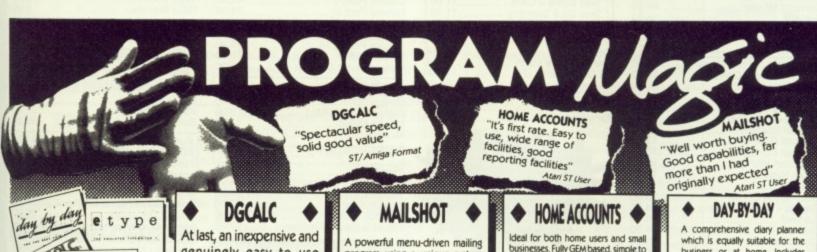

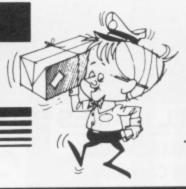

utureSound provides everything you need to get started. For eighty quid you get a hardware unit with left and right RCA phono jack inputs, 3.5mm mic input and recording level control slider; a disk containing the main controller software program, prerecorded sound sampled examples and routines in "C" and BASIC showing you how to use the sound samples in your own programs; a 44-page manual covering all the package's features; and a registration card. What you don't get is the leads to connect your sound source to FutureSound, so that'll set you back approximately £3 more.

DOCTORING THE MOUSE

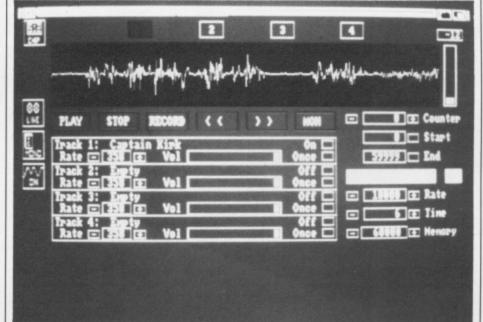
Getting started couldn't be simpler. You connect the hardware unit to the parallel port on the Amiga, hook up your Walkman or CD player to the phono socket or sockets (depending on whether you want mono or stereo samples) and load up the sampler software.

Once the software's running, you control everything with the mouse, just clicking on the function you want to acti-

SOUND IT OUT

So you think you know your stuff, eh? Well here is a run-down of the tech-specs of Futuresound 500.

- · FutureSound is an 8-bit sound sampler, utilising the Texas Instruments TI 548 high-speed analogue-to-digital

vate. With the software you can listen to any incoming sounds, record and play back a sample, alter the rate of playback/record, select mono or stereo recording, switch the high-pass filter on or off, monitor the incoming sound's signal (allows you to adjust to just the right recording level), magnify the sound sample's graph, select one of the four possible Amiga sound channels, select either chip or fast RAM (if you've got extra RAM you can have bigger samples), edit your sample using standard cut and paste commands, and load and save your samples.

SOUNDS ALL RIGHT TO US

FutureSound is a sound sampler's delight. From the sturdy hardware to the efficient software, everything you need is on hand. As far as the hardware's concerned, we haven't seen anything better on the market. We tested it out with other sound sampling software and discovered it worked better than the original hardware every time! Noise disruption is kept to a minimum, and the on-board recording-level control is a real solid gold bonus.

As far as software is concerned, FutureSound provides most of the facilities you could wish from this type of package, with no frills whatsoever. Although its front-end looks primitive, this just translates into every function being easily accessible and instantly

executed. We've used better sampling software before, but if this bothers you too much you'll probably be able to use your old sampling software with FutureSound's hardware: thus having the best of both worlds.

The manual is an easy read, although it may confuse the complete novice at first. Bad marks for not including an index, but this can be forgiven in the light of it being only 44 pages long.

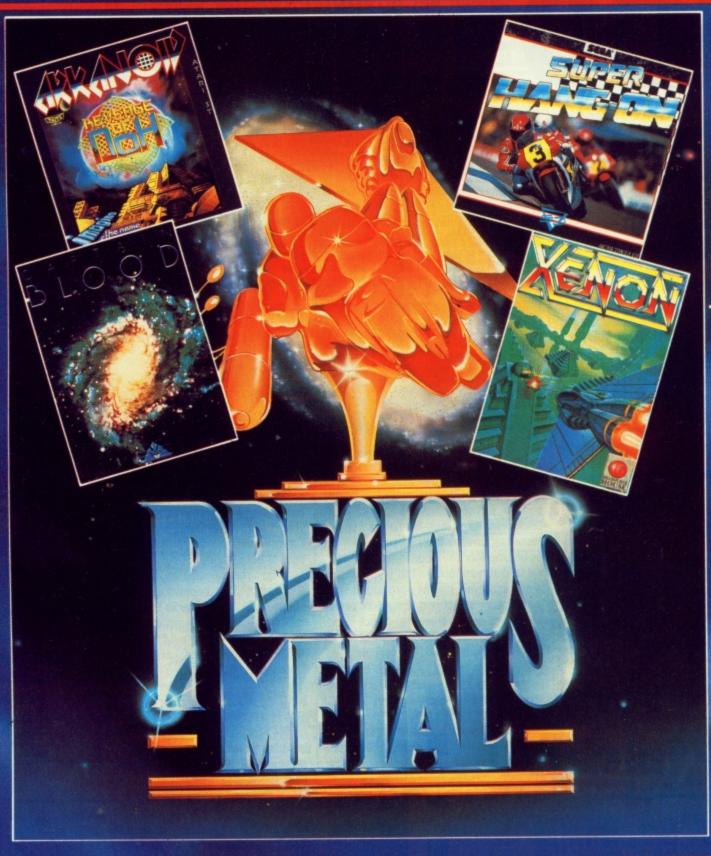
In conclusion, we can recommend FutureSound without any hesitation to anybody wanting to experience Amiga sampled-sound making at first hand. This is the best sound sampler package on the Amiga, and although the software is rather primitive, the hardware is firstclass. You'll have a great deal of fun (and more than a touch of frustration) along the way, and you'll end up with results which can be used in your own programs, in other sound creation or composition packages, or saved to disk, reserved for the next time you need to manufacture a hit record!

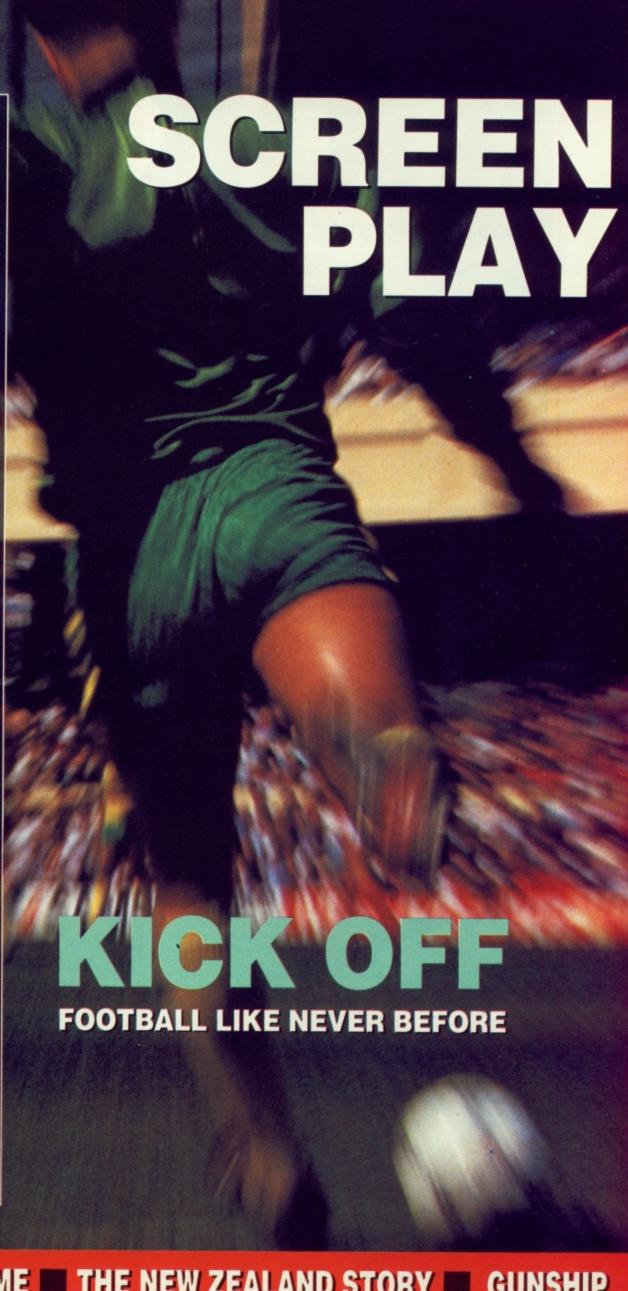

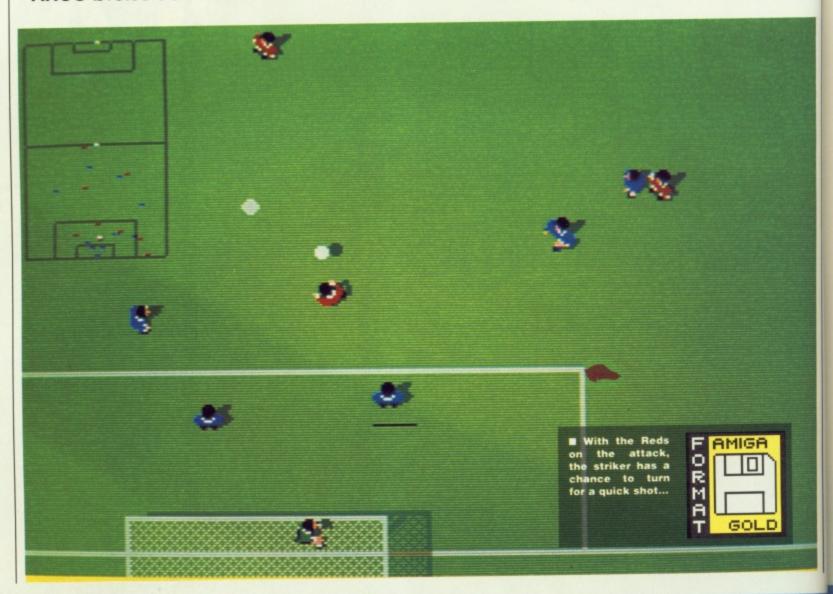

t's a funny old game, Brian.

Two varieties of the game are included: outdoor (British style, the more familiar kind) and indoor six-a-side (US style, a faster game on a smaller pitch). The pitch is viewed from above and scrolls in all directions, with goals situated at top and bottom of the play area.

You can choose to take part in several types of tournament: these range from the full-blown World Cup Finals, via a league or a two-player friendy fixture to an individual challenge tournament in which the player attempts to beat progressively harder teams. These competitions remain the same for both types of soccer, with two or more players able to take part in all but the challenge.

During the game you control a single player, and switching between team members can be

ention the name Anco. and the chances are images of mental scantily-clad poker-playing women will pop into the average gamesplayer's head. This stereotype is not entirely fair - because Anco have released some great titles in the past, including Karting Grand Prix - but perhaps Kick Off will go some way towards changing Anco's image in the public eye. It's the first in what promises to be a strong range of products coming up over the next few months.

As you might guess, Kick Off is a football game. One or two players can compete, each controlling a full eleven-a-side team

during games of between ten and a full ninety minutes of real time. All the action is viewed from above and you control the player in the best position to get at the ball: the character under control is highlighted by a black line. The game has been designed so that players automatically dribble the ball whenever they come into contact with it. Shots or passes to another player simply require a tap on the fire button, and the longer the button is held down, the higher the ball will go.

Because of the dribbling it's tough to get used to turning with the ball, so for the first match or two you'll end up kicking the ball

half-way up the pitch in completely the wrong direction! You can hold the fire button down before making contact to trap the ball and turn in any direction you wish, then release the button to kick the ball. This makes things easier, but by taking advantage of the 'practice' option you'll be in much better shape to play against someone who's trying to beat you.

Once confident with the controls, you can choose to play a single game or to compete in the league (the players and the computer can have their skill level adjusted, from International class right down to Sunday League).

There are eight teams in the league (so up to eight people can compete, if each selects a different team) and each team has a different playing style and skill level. For example, West Germany tend to tackle heavily (not always to their own advantage) while

Russia are extremely fast and very skillful. A coin is tossed at the start of the match to determine whether you play up the pitch (screen) or down. Then you select a line-up, 4-2-4 for attacking play, 5-3-2 for sweepers and so on, and dive straight into the match.

Anco have really delivered the goods here. Kick Off is the best football game on the Amiga to date and should be in any gamesplayer's library, whether he or she is a fan of real football or not.

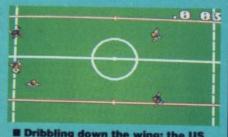

manual or automatic. Possession is gained by running into a loose ball or tackling the player with the ball. The ball sticks to the ends of a player's boots until he is tackled or kicks it, so dribbling is easy.

Kicks are split into three types: volleys, chips and banana shots. The banana shots can be quite spectacular, but they bend far more than a real ball would. The computer opponents range from kickabout-in-the-park cannon fodder to the I-cost-£3million-and-vou're-five-nil-down superteams.

One of the annoying features of Microprose Soccer is that you can run straight through the man in possession without actually tackling him. To tackle, the fire button has to be pressed. It's not a serious pain, but this and several other factors make it lose out to Kick Off in the 'best footie

game' stakes. The larger graphics merely reduce the on-screen playing area and don't improve the gameplay at all. The action is much slower as well, losing the adrenalin rush of non-stop action.

This is not a bad game, but it just is not as good as Kick Off. It has more features though: the indoor league is of particular interest, and the different types of competition add interest too.

flying aliens) can be picked up. With progress through the moons the enemy get tougher and smarter. For example, Squashers which appear from Moon Two onwards can only be destroyed by dropping an atomic bomb in their vicinity: unfortunately, there are always more Squashers than you have bombs, so a quick tactical analysis is called for.

As a 3D shoot-em-up it's one of the best around. The filled-3D graphics are slightly jerky, but are at least fast. The title music is far more interesting than the sparse

sound effects. Although lasting interest fades because the task tends to get repetitive, the subtler challenge of working out how best to deal with the tougher enemies remains, and with 800 to blast you won't finish in a hurry.

omark launch the new Tengen label, on which most major Atari coin-op conversions will appear for three years, with this space-tank shootem-up for one or two players.

Controlling an SR 88 Strategic Battle Tank, the player must eliminate each one of 14 multi-level space stations, sent to conquer earth by the evil alien Tangent Empire, by finding and destroying the control centre at the heart of each station. To reach the next level, the player must locate and trundle over a key.

Each level is defended with turrets and roaming tanks, but to make your job slightly easier a number of star symbols lying on the floor can be collected and traded for goodies such as increased shot power, speed and

shield strength. Unfortunately, the tank is very fuel-hungry so you'll also have to collect fuel canisters. After bombing a control centre the player enters a bonus room littered with goodies to collect.

Good coin-ops don't always make good computer games but, happily, Vindicators does. The 'viewed from almost directly above' perspective works well and the sprites and backgrounds are



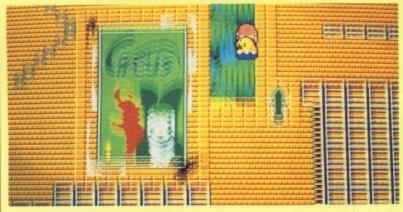
great, with the explosions worthy of particular note. Sound is not so impressive: sampled tunes are reasonable but effects are weak. Vindicators is an out-of-the-ordinary shoot-em-up, very addictive and playable, especially when played with a friend. 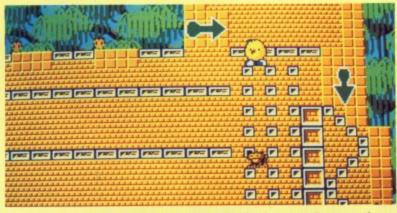

The action's all viewed in two dimensions, and there are five levels to play through, each level made up of four sub-levels with the fourth sub-level guarded by an end-of-level nasty that needs destroying before you can progress.

Again as if you'd not guessed, the sub-levels are guarded by a bunch of... well, you can't really call them nasties, because they appear to be teddy bears and snails! But contact with them will cause you to lose one of an initial three lives. For self-defence you're armed with a small bow, from which to fire arrows at the baddies (a bow and arrow? Well, you might have known, really).

might have known, really). There are also other weapons, including bombs



and lasers, to be obtained by shooting certain baddies: most baddies simply turn into juicy pieces of fruit, which are collected for bonus points. Some baddies fire back, though, so keep on your toes to dodge their shots.

As well as the baddies, there are objects in the scenery that can kill you, such as spikes on the floor that must be jumped over. The levels (and sub-levels) get progressively harder and puzzles start creeping in: for example, on sub-level three your chum is caged on the right side of the level but there's no obvious way of getting to him. Until you realise that with careful timing you can shoot the

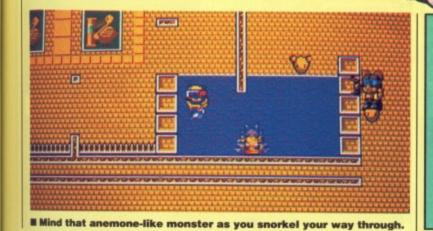

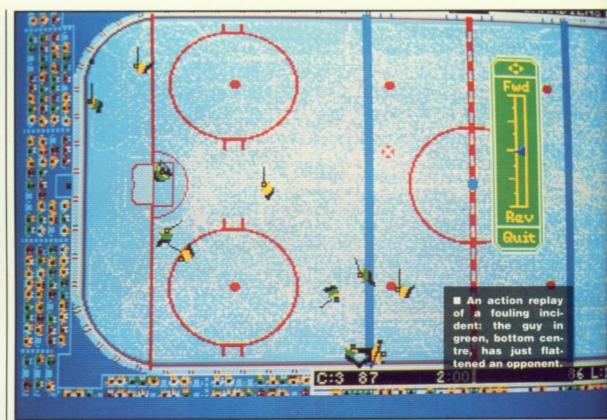
ride of Canada, biggest name in the world of ice hockey, but still virtually unknown in the UK: that's Wayne Gretzky. In North America he has achieved the sporting god status reserved for lan Botham and Daley Thompson over here.

Like recent soccer games, it's viewed from overhead. The pitch is about two screens wide and scrolls horizontally as the puck moves from end to end. While not visually stunning, this display is functional, because you can always tell exactly what's going on.

As with most American sports games, this one loves statistics. There are whole screens full of information and options, which are useful on the coaching side because you can alter everything from individual players' attributes to the 'lines' (best described as preset team line-ups for particular situations: attacking, defending, taking penalties and so on). You can opt to control a player, coach, both or neither. The coach decides which lines to play: the strategic side of the action.

On the ice, you control one player at a time but can switch between any of them except for the goalie. All the rules of ice hockey must be obeyed, so there are penalties for charging, holding, tripping, cross-checking, elbowing, high-sticking, hooking, roughing, slashing, spearing and anything else ending in '-ing'. You can also have fights and instant replays to add even more realism.

Options allow skill levels and playing time to be altered: a match against the professionals is the ultimate challenge, and no easy proposition. Starting at the most basic level, the game's very easy to play, but has hidden depths of strategy. To begin with, you can hit the ice and simply skate around enjoying the game,

but later on there is more satisfaction to be derived from it through gaining experience of switching lines and learning tactics.

In the long term, most reward can be obtained from the process of creating your own teams. Each of the teams has ratings for 11 different characteristics, and once the players are defined they can be arranged into lines of your own choosing. As well as changing lines, the players can be made to operate certain pre-arranged plays to try to gain the upper hand. All in all, this wealth of detail adds depth to an already good sports simulation, making it one of the better ones currently available.

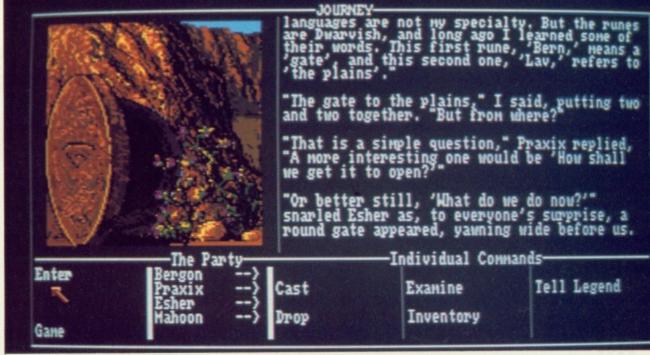

colourful. Take the plunge, set everything on 'realistic' and volunteer for some of the more hazardous missions, and you'll find that Gunship is action-packed enough to keep you coming back for months.

f 'cyclic' and 'collective' mean absolutely nothing, then the chances are you've never pitted your wits against a helicopter flight sim. In a real helicopter the pilot uses two joysticks: the cyclic, which controls the pitch and roll of the aircraft, and the collective, which controls the angle of attack of the rotor blades, so governing the lift.

In Gunship - a simulation of the American AH 64A Apache helicopter - the player uses a joystick to control the cyclic and the keyboard to control the collective. There are a number of missions to attempt, set in various parts of the world and with different divisions of the American air force. As with most games of this nature, diving straight into missions is not a good idea until you've put in some flight practice and can handle the 'copter confidently despite the weather. Fortunately you can swing things slightly in your favour while training: for example, by making crash-landings impossible or minimising cross-winds.

Once you're competent, it's time to attempt a mission with a difficulty level equal to your ability.

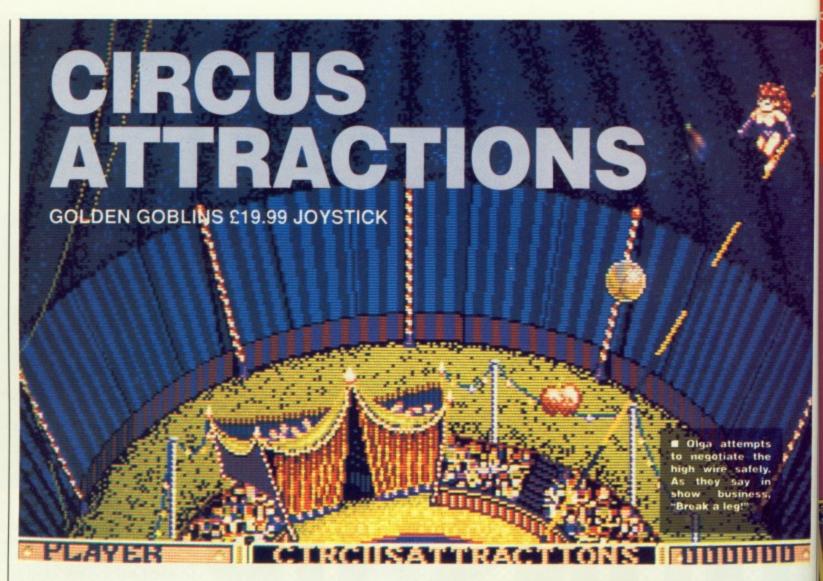
You've a whole range of weapons to choose from, including guided anti-tank Hellfire missiles, FFAR rockets and a 30mm chain gun. The cockpit is equipped with all the latest gadgetry including TADS (Target Acquisition and Designation System) and radar and infra-red warnings and jammers.

Missions usually feature both primary and secondary objectives, so if your 'copter isn't shot to pieces on the first, you can go for the second. The Apache is lightly armoured, so can take a little flak without crashing into the bush, but it's still vulnerable, so it's always advisable to land at base for repairs if things start to look bad. Should you complete a mission successfully, the chances are you'll be awarded a medal and maybe promoted.

Gunship has plenty going for it: the missions are numerous and varied and it's high on lasting interest. The politics are dodgy, but if you're not worried about zapping gooks you'll find the game entertaining, challenging and packed with action.

There are five events in which you and a friend can participate. The first is trampolining, in which you have a couple of minutes to bounce around performing forward and backward somersaults in order to impress the crowd and so score points. In two-player mode, each player controls a character on his own trampoline, but when one player starts a somersault the other follows.

Having had a surfeit of this bouncing, you can turn a leg to tightrope walking. The task here is to help Olga balance during her diagonal walk across the screen

by moving the joystick to the left and right. If things are going well it's possible to attempt tricks such as scissor kicks, handstands and backwards somersaults, each completed trick earning points.

Survive the high wire and it's time to try your hand at juggling, with up to six tennis balls plus a balancing ball on the foot and the occasional Indian club. As if that's not enough, a midget clown riding a motorbike occasionally attempts to run you down, so it's a good idea to jump in the air at the appropriate time and so avoid him!

The penultimate trick is quite likely to be the most dangerous: knife throwing. Line the cross-hairs up on the wheel, to which is securely fastened a nervous young lady, then take knives from

the obligatory scantily-clad assistant and lob them at the wheel, trying to miss the girl if at all possible. Curiously, the assistant is none too friendly and will sometimes try to hand you a stick of dynamite, which explodes if you accept it, thus ending the game.

The final trick involves three clowns and two see-saws. The player must guide each clown in turn as they jump from one see-saw to the other, avoiding a ghost that appears between them, and collecting any bonus points by catching various obstacles that appear above the clowns' heads.

The events all require practice to achieve a good degree of competence, and some events are definitely tougher to master than others. None of the events has outstanding gameplay, so *Circus Attractions* comes across as a pot pourri of mediocre games that tend to frustrate more than entertain. The fun improves if you play with two, but not greatly.

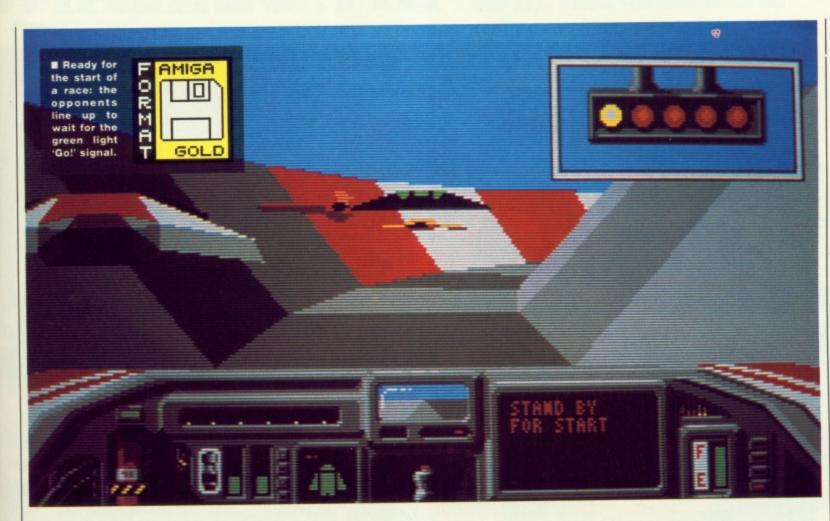

Imagine racing a jet fighter along courses that dive underground, twist and turn wildly, and even have moving walls. You are now imagining this game. It's a futuristic sport that is far more

demanding than anything on two or four wheels, or any flight sim. Not only are you required to battle the tortuous courses but you must also take on computer opponents, or another player via a datalink, at the same time.

There are seven tracks, the simplest of which is a basic oval: all the rest are much more complicated. You must fly around the tracks as quickly as possible, trying

to avoid the walls and other ships. This is made easier to start with by using a centring mechanism which attracts the ship back to the

middle of the track. It has adjustable strength that can be gradually turned down as you learn the intricacies of the courses and how best to fly them.

Each track is on a planet with its own atmosphere (methane, oxygen, ammonia or sulphur) so the ship must be fitted with the appropriate filters. This is complicated during races by rain or other precipitations that require particle filters to prevent engine failure. The ship also has other adjustable features, such as the fuel type, aerofoils and brakes, that affect its performance.

There are four other racers in different ships and contact with them or the track walls damages the ship. Too many accidents will affect the handling or instruments. In order to undergo repairs or be refuelled, the ship has to be

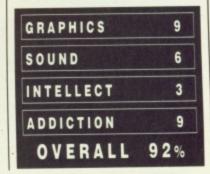

retired to the pit which takes up valuable time, so careful flying is just as important as speed.

After a few days' practice this is a fantastically absorbing game. Initially, the aids to flying help a lot, but once you are good enough to get rid of them it is a unique racing experience. Not only is it worth spending the time on to begin with: it will remain a classic for years to come.

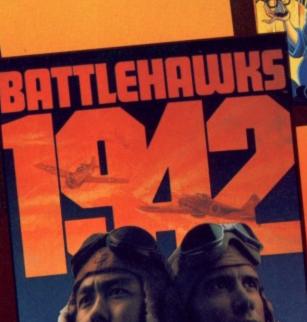

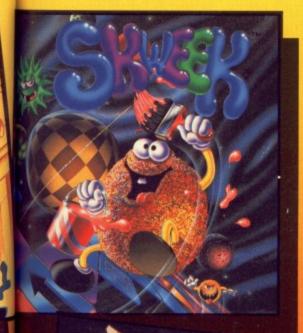

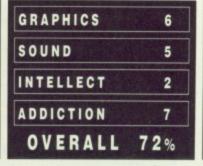

trap yourself in and take part in the African stages of the Paris-Dakar rally, courtesy of Parisian software house Tomahawk.

There are five stages to the game, the idea being to make it from Point A to Point B in the shortest possible time, any which way you can. There's a roadway to follow, should you so wish, marked out with old barrels, but it's twisting and the other racers tend to stick to it so your times

will be slow. To be in with anything like a chance of winning you have to venture cross-country, which is where the problems start.

The desert is full of hazards: barrels from last year's race, herds of resting camels and soft sand. Sand multiplies problems by slowing you right down, but fortunately you can simply switch from two- to four-wheel drive and crossing the sand becomes much easier, though still slower than two-wheel drive on firm ground.

To help you navigate while you're off the track there's a digital compass on the dashboard. There's also a fuel gauge and an indicator (updated by transmissions from a pursuit helicopter) giving you a grid reference, which enables you to follow and plot the course on the map supplied with the game. All the instruments are vital to successful completion of the stage, but they can get broken if

you smash your car up too much, and it's terribly difficult to navigate with no instruments: so careful driving is a prime requisite.

On the approach to the finishing post, only if you join and follow the track to the line will your position be logged. Then the car is repaired and you can set out on the next stage.

The perspective used is good, the game overall is very fast and it boasts good gameplay: but it's not the most exciting of race games and offers little new apart from the map-reading aspect and a couple of new hazards. Still, it's well worth a look.

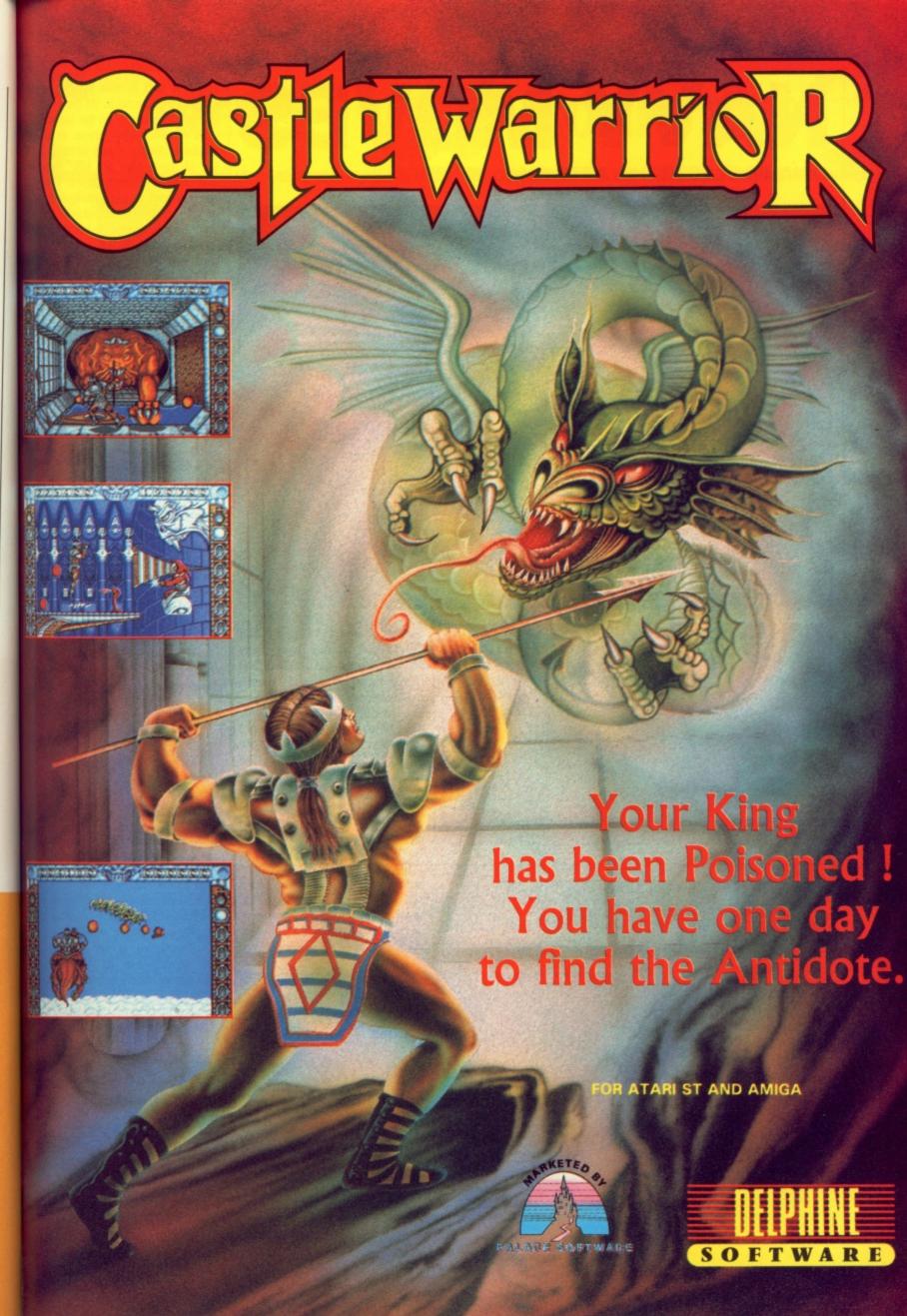

The U5544 nuclear submarine must be destroyed and it appears you're just the person for the job: if you can get there. Like Dinamic's earlier game *Army Moves*, it's a two-parter, access to the second part being denied until you complete the first part and receive an access code.

The first part is also sub-divided into smaller sections. At the start of the game you're on the surface of a very choppy ocean in an inflatable dinghy, trying to jump a line of mines that are little more than a boat's length apart. Then you confront enemy commandos on jet skis: here's where the harpoon gun comes in, because if these guys shoot or crash into you, one of six lives is lost.

Get past them and it's time to dive in and take on some deadly sharks and enemy frogmen. These are all small fry compared to the third stage, though, where you clamber inside a bathyscaphe to take on first an octopus and then a large eel-like monster.

The second part is a side-on viewed platform game set inside the sub, during which you must place a bomb in the reactor and escape. Unfortunately, it's not easy to move around the sub without the passes that officers carry, so you must shoot and rob them.

This game differs from Army Moves in the scenario only. Navy Moves too has extremely difficult gameplay, to the point where it spoils your enjoyment rather than increasing it. It's incredibly tough and for the first part at least, the game is simple, uninspired stuff.

ver the past couple of months, Commodore have stepped up their advertising into the vertical markets. The latest market to receive the Amiga treatment is that of the lowend CAD workstation. Commodore have pulled together a range of 'official' Amiga CAD 'solutions', as the PR people like to call them. The basic system consists of an Amiga 2000 with 3 Mb of memory, 14-inch multi-sync colour monitor, 68020 accelerator card and the professional version of X-CAD, the suitably named X-CAD Professional.

Prices for these lovely bundles of kit range from about three grand right up to a whacking eight grand (although pricing is still to be confirmed). For the home market, however, there is a distinct possibility that Commodore may bundle

both the A2000 and A500 with the low-cost version of *X-CAD*, *X-CAD* Designer. Modular Times' *X-CAD* Designer is a fully-featured, two-dimensional design and draughting tool which will be of interest to draughtsmen, designers and engineers alike. The package arrives in one of those very nice box folders that seem to be standard issue for serious PC software, but tend rarely to be used for Amiga products. Lurking inside the box you'll find a manual, a single program disk and a dongle, which must be plugged into the second joystick port for the program to function fully.

Both versions of X-CAD are designed in a modular form, which means the software is built up from

X-CA

three primary components: the X-CAD program itself, a set of run-time libraries and a set of command overlays. The advantage of this system is twofold. Firstly, system memory usage is kept to a minimum by loading commands only when they are required. Secondly, this modular form allows new commands to be added to the system comparatively easily by just adding extra command overlays and run-time libraries.

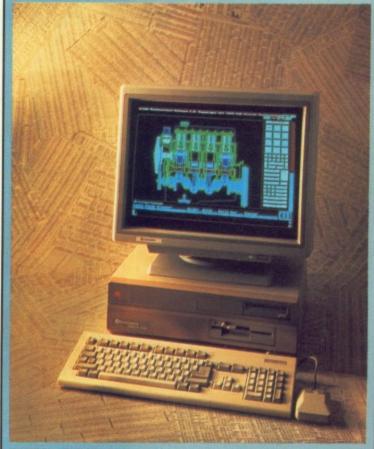
LAYER OF THE AMIGA

All professional CAD systems allow the use of layers, which means a diagram can be split up into several overlaying sections. *X-CAD* certainly isn't let down in this area, since it allows the definition of up to 256 different layers, which can be displayed in any combination.

X-CAD Designer features all the standard drawing tools that you'd expect to find in a high-end package, such as splines, cross-hatching, grouping, line breaking and trimming. All are executed at a phenomenal speed. This speed is probably X-CAD's greatest asset, because it uses the Amiga's custom hardware to offer redraw rates over five times quicker than those of the most popular PC package, AutoCAD, running on a 80386-based PC-compatible.

Once you've 'designed' your masterpiece, you'll want to output it to paper.
Luckily for those of us who can't afford
pen plotters, X-CAD has extensive support for dot-matrix printers. Even with a
bog-standard nine-pin dot-matrix, some
very professional results can quickly be
produced. When it is printing, X-CAD
automatically builds up a smoothed
representation of whatever is on-screen,
producing the highest resolution printout
that is possible on your printer.

It is very unusual to find an Amiga package that not only destroys the competition on the host machine, but also on all other comparable machines. This system's greatest assets are undoubtedly its high level of adaptability and sheer operating speed. X-CAD Professional running on a 68020-based



While X-CAD Designer is ideal for most semi-professional applications, for some users X-CAD Professional is the only choice. X-CAD Professional (£399) requires at least two megabytes of memory, but boasts a whole range of enhancements over X-CAD Designer. X-CAD Pro features full online help, an intelligent database, a complete programming environment and extensive batch processing facilities.

We haven't yet had a chance to take a look at X-CAD Pro,

We haven't yet had a chance to take a look at X-CAD Pro, but from initial impressions it looks like being a heavyweight, powerful package aimed at the big-league professional market. A set-up like the one shown here costs a tidy penny.

Amiga with the new super-high-res A2024 monitor could quite simply clean up the low-end CAD market. If Commodore's advertising department gets it right, I can see the Amiga and X-CAD becoming a formidable force. ■

JASON HOLBORN looks at the 'official' Amiga CAD package.

CADENCES

CAD is one particular area of computing that has been revolutionised by the arrival of machines such as the Amiga. Previously, the image that surrounded any CAD system was of a powerful graphics workstation costing many tens of thousands of pounds, linked to a super-high-res vector screen that required a fork lift truck to shift it. With the arrival of powerful personal computers such as the Amiga, CAD has finally been brought within the reach of the masses.

Apple's Macintosh has earned itself the rare honour of being regarded by many as almost a 'cult' computer. JASON HOLBORN checks out A-MAX, a new hardware add-on that will give your Amiga that old Mac magic.

BIG MAC & CHIPS

Mac emulator for the Amiga certainly has taken a long time to arrive: ST owners have been happily running Mac software on their machines for over a year now. What has finally arrived is a hardware-based emulator that has a very simple objective: to turn your Amiga into a perfect imitation of a Macintosh Plus computer.

The first thing you'll probably ask yourself before considering forking out for any emulator is "What can this machine do that I can't already do on my Amiga?" Well, the answer to that question isn't as straightforward as it would first seem. It would be correct to say that there probably isn't a great deal that you can do on a Mac that you couldn't already do on your Amiga. So why even consider a Mac emulator? Well the reason, put simply, is that Mac versions of software are often considerably more powerful than similar packages on the Amiga.

One area that the Mac excels in particularly is that of Desk Top Publishing. Compare Professional Page on the Amiga to even the simplest of Mac DTP packages and you'll soon realise why nine out of ten electronic publishers prefer the Mac. The Mac WIMP system, Finder, lends itself very well to heavily graphics-based applications such as DTP and although the machine lacks the advanced graphics hardware of the Amiga, graphics-based applications still manage to steam along at an astonishing rate. For an example, try comparing the redraw speed of Professional Page to that of a similar Mac package. The Mac has almost

completely captured the DTP market with its excellent range of professional DTP packages.

SETTING UP YOUR McAMIGA

As is the case with nearly every emulator known to man, A-Max isn't a 'plug in and go' add-on. After you've found a source for the Mac ROMs (no easy task), the next job is to actually get the Mac's WIMP operating system, Finder, over to an A-Max format disk. Because of obvious copyright restrictions, A-Max isn't supplied with the Mac OS: You'll have to obtain a copy of that yourself.

Once you've found a friendly Mac user who is willing to let you borrow a system disk, the next problem is how to get the contents of a Mac disk across to an A-Max disk. The Mac uses a special multi-speed drive with a disk format that cannot be read by any machine other than a Mac, so just inserting the Mac system disk into your Amiga drive isn't the answer (that would be far too easy!) If, however, you have access to a Mac second drive, getting Finder across is childsplay, because A-Max will allow you to plug any standard Apple drive into the A-Max cartridge and use it as you would with a 'real' Mac.

Thankfully, unlike with similar units on the ST, this initial setting up is fairly straightforward and can be achieved in no time at all. Although Amiga drives cannot handle the multi-speed nature of Mac drives, they are highly adaptable and can be forced to read just about any format with the right software (DOS-2-DOS is a fine example: it allows the Amiga

to read IBM and Atari format disks). Special formatting software is provided for the Mac that allows the creation of a mini transfer-disk that can be read by both the Amiga and the Mac. This disk only has a 272K capacity and so once you've got the Mac desktop on-screen, you're strongly advised to transfer a comms package across so that larger applications can be brought across into A-Max.

To get A-Max up and running, there are two files that must exist on your A-Max boot disk, namely the Apple Finder and System files. These two files between them contain the Mac operating system and desktop environment. On some versions of the Mac OS, you'll probably have to remove as many fonts and desktop accessories as you possibly can so that both files fit on the limited capacity of the transfer disk.

Once both the System and Finder files are on your transfer disk, A-Max will boot up and your hybrid Mac will spring to life. The next step is to format a Mac disk from within A-Max and copy both files to this disk so that the mini transfer-disk can be used again.

SOFTWARE COMPATIBILITY

ReadySoft, the producers of A-Max, claim that A-Max will run most productivity software without problems. We've managed to test several major Mac packages such as MacWrite, MacPaint, MacDraw, PageMaker 2 and the public domain comms package Red Ryder, all of which worked without any problems. A-Max will also support HyperCard and the new Multifinder, although you'll need at least a megabyte to take full advantage of these.

What A-Max won't run is any software which bypasses the Mac operating system routines and hits the hardware directly. The kind of

software that will definitely not run under A-Max includes the vast majority of Mac midi software, and quite a few Mac games software. The good news (in the view of the Amiga Format team) is that Spectrum Holobyte's excellent Mac version of Tetris works fine!

SCREEN SCENE

On a standard Amiga using the current release of Agnus, Mac emulation can operate in both high-res interlaced and medium-resolution screen modes. A-Max also provides full support for the new enhanced chip set (if we ever see it!) and the new high-res mono monitor, the A2024.

For those of you without either ECS or the A2024 (ie, 99.9% of Amiga owners), the rather annoying flicker of the Amiga's display in hi-res mode makes it almost unusable, so after the initial attraction of high-

res, you'll probably end up using A-Max in medium-resolution mode.

When using ECS with a multisync monitor, A-Max will provide a very attractive working environment. With the A2024, the A-Max screen resolution rises to an impressive 1008 by 800: virtually the same as that offered by a £5000 Macintosh 2.

HARDWARE CORNER

The A-Max hardware consists of a long, grey box that plugs into the external drive port. As well as providing a pass through connector for external Amiga drives, the A-Max hardware provides a connector for an Apple external drive. Unfortunately, Apple external drives (in fact, Apple hardware items in general) are not particularly cheap, but if you intend using A-Max seriously the investment will be worthwhile because it will allow you to read Mac disks directly.

Unfortunately, the current release of A-Max doesn't support hard drives, although plans are afoot to include this in future versions. For some applications, hard drives are a vital necessity, so the lack of support could prove to be something of a problem.

All Macintosh emulators require access to Mac ROMs, and A-Max is no sole exception. Unfortunately, A-Max does not come as standard with the necessary slithers of silicon, so you'll have to purchase them separately. A-Max will accept both the old 64K ROMs from the original Mac and the newer 128K ROMs from the Mac Plus. The larger ROMs have several advantages over the older

64Ks in that they run faster and are able to handle a higher proportion of the newer Mac software. If you have an accelerator card in your Amiga, you must have 128K ROMs because the smaller ROMs are not compatible with these more advanced processors.

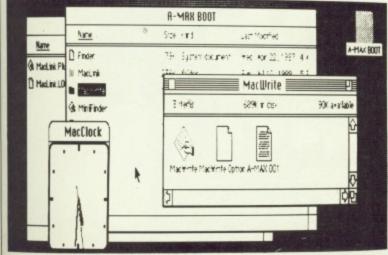
Installing the ROMs into the A-Max cartridge is childsplay (although removing them from a Mac is a nightmare!). With them installed, your Mac is ready to roll.

Obtaining Mac ROMs can be a difficult task: most Apple dealers are not to keen to hand them out. Unfortunately, this means that UK-based suppliers who are willing to admit the fact that they supply Apple ROMs are very hard to find. Entertainment International are currently looking at the possibility of supplying ROMs as well as the A-Max unit itself.

CONCLUSION

A-Max certainly is an impressive piece of hardware. It is highly compatible, and the inclusion of ECS and A2024 graphic modes is bound to earn A-Max more than a few friends. The only negative aspect of A-Max is the lack of hard disk support, which makes professional use of the system questionable. Many users will also complain about the inability to autoboot A-Max from hard disk: with the new 1.3 autobooting ROMs, hard drive support shouldn't be hard to implement. Hopefully, future releases of A-Max will address this: but this is one of the best emulators available on any machine, and is not only great fun to own, but also very useful.

Music Editor Jon Bates explains that with no talent, no expensive equipment and one Amiga, you too can make incredible music...





his is a journey into sound: a guide to what the Amiga can do musically. Many Amiga music packages offer all three of these options under one roof, whereas more specialised programs will make extensive forays into just one area.

AND MIDI MAKES SIX

MIDI, the Musical Instrument Digital Interface, is a common language that enables the Amiga to perform all three functions with electronic instruments. With a synth, for instance, it can create sounds to be replayed from the keyboard as well as storing, recreating and editing those sounds: the sounds are called voices, so this function is known as voicing. Particularly important with MIDI is the organising of sound: sequencing. As a sequencer, the Amiga can, in effect, record music played on electronic instruments, and edit the music so bad notes are chopped out, play the piece back via the instrument. Moreover, MIDI allows for 16 channels, so 16 separate instruments can go into one song, and the sequencer allows sections of a piece to be looped, repeated and generally messed about with.

The usual MIDI interface uses the serial port of the Amiga although there are in existence plug-in boards which will give you permanent MIDI ports. MIDI travels at 31.25K baud, which is quite fast enough for most processes. And the beauty of MIDI and the Amiga is that the interfaces are all one standard.

INTERNAL EXPLORATION

First off, the internal sound chip. A quick flick to the back of your Amiga book produces a picture of the sound chip "Paula". Not terribly enlightening, but it gives you a rough idea of the chip's capabilities. It can produce four sounds simultaneously and spread them between the stereo left and right ports. It has a range of nine octaves - one more than a piano - and the claim about using amplitude and frequency modulation means it can create sound from both simple and more complex waveforms. Obviously the way forward is to seek some reasonable software to control it, so a selection of the most commonly available packages follows.

INSTANT MUSIC

Perhaps the most 'entry level' program is Instant Music. For 'entry level', read 'absolute bozo beginner'. Instant Music is rather a neat composition program that doesn't really require any musicality on behalf of the user. It uses a graphic score, a series of coloured oblongs relative to the length of the note which scroll past on screen: a different colour represents each instrument, and it comes with a full compliment of sampled instruments. Actual composition is performed by dragging and placing blobs around the screen; the higher up the screen , the higher the note. If you drag the note out from left to right it becomes longer. Notes occurring at the same time form a chord, and every movement of the note on screen lets you hear the pitch and sound of that note. If you are familiar with traditional notation this is a really slow way of working, but as a heuristic (such big words!) approach to music it works very well.

The favourite feature is 'Mouse Jam' which everybody who has had a go with this program becomes addicted to. You select the backing and style that you want to play with and away you go. By clicking the mouse and moving it around the screen it manages to play only those notes that sound in tune and in stylistic keeping with the backing; a form of 'artificial intelligence' that should be a compulsory implant in the brains and fingers

of adherents to the 'Widdly Widdly School of Guitar Torture'.

MUSIC STUDIO

If you can live with the fact that your sound files will not be compatible with any other program, a decent sequencing and sound creating package is the *Amiga Music Studio*, which has a very good instrument design page. The program comes with fifteen preset sounds which can be subjected to a whole host of alterations: harmonics, envelope shape, sustain, vibrato and tremolo, and stereo position. Not a bad introduction to the world of sound (or voice) creating.

It offers you a choice of either graphic or traditional music notation to sequence the notes. Graphic is an alternative to traditional musical notation that uses a set of shapes to represent notes. The usual way this is done is to have the pitch of the note running from the bottom of the screen to the top and the time/length of the note running on the other axis from left to right. With Music Studio each instrument is given a separate colour. You can even add lyrics to your efforts and it supports the full 16 MIDI channels in and out.

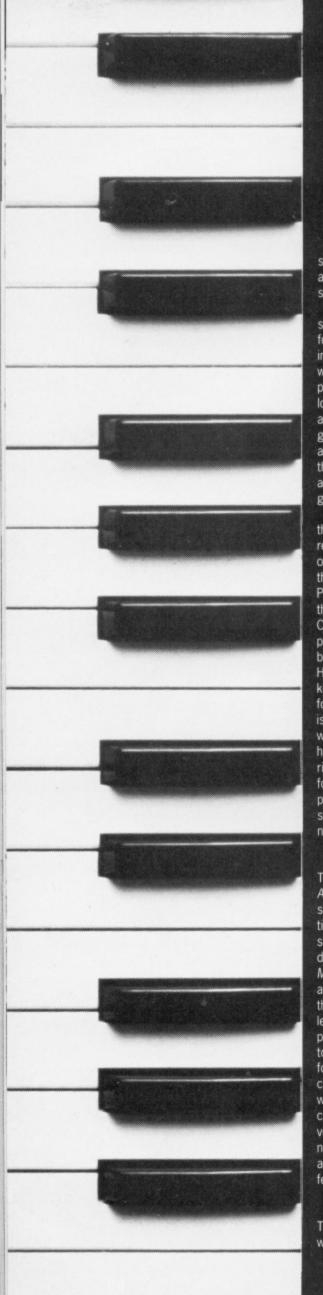
PAULA IN PUBLIC

There are several Public Domain programs that give you access to the Paula chip in varying degrees. There will be an article in the not too distant future covering the music aspect of PD software. But for now, you could check out Fish Disk 94 which has an 'Audio Tools' utility.

SAMPLING

Avoiding the technical details for the moment, sampling is the way in which sound is encapsulated digitally. The most critical part of this, as far as your ears go, is the actual conversion from messy electrical impulses to digital data, and vice versa, known in the business as ADC (analogue to digital conversion) and DAC (you can work that one out).

Most other micros require hardware to convert sound to digital and back again, but the Paula chip is very efficient at converting digital data back to the stuff that makes your speakers work. It would be not far short of the truth to say that the sonic capabilities of the Amiga rival all but the most expensive – as in coming up to £1000 – of professional samplers. Plus with sound editing software you can actually see the sound and play around with it,



something that is a real pain to achieve on a piece of dedicated sampler hardware.

Since there is also a common standard for storing data (IFF), it follows that many sound sequencing and creation programs come with sampled sounds all ready to play. Any sample can usually be loaded into another piece of suitable software. There are also programs about that will let you arrange these sounds into pieces that can subsequently be stored as a module to be used in games, or wherever.

Although you can easily enjoy the benefits of playing back prerecorded samples, making your own will require some outlay. The three main contenders are the Pro Sound Designer, AMAS, and the Datel Amiga Sampler. Compatible with these are MIDI players that allow the samples to be played from a MIDI keyboard. However, ST/Amiga Format marketed sampling hardware in kit form in Issue 11, May 1989. This is available from Magenta who will also sell you the sampling hardware, Perfect Sound, for a ridiculously low sum. How's that for a low-cost entry into sampling? There will be a sampling special in a coming issue, but for now check Pages 31 and 73.

MIDI STEP BY STEP

Two good MIDI programs are Aegis Sonix, which contains sections on all the subjects mentioned (creating sound, altering sound, creating songs and handling MIDI data) and Deluxe Music Construction Set, which is a step-time sequencer. You insert the notes individually defining length and pitch for up to eight parts, using a combination of up to four of the internal voices and four of the external MIDI channels, although you can if you wish use up to eight MIDI channels as well as the internal voices. It has a full palette of notes and signs and the graphics are well-observed. Sound editing features are absent, however.

MIDI ON THE ROLL

The ball really starts to roll when we start to consider multiple-

t r a c k sequencers of the real-time variety. These will let you play your tunes in sections, and check them for errors via either graphic notation, traditional notation or at worst a data stream. Having sorted out the major calamities you can then call some smart software routines to help you correct bad notes and timing blunders, which is known as Quantizing. Once all is to your satisfaction, you can organise the sections that you have recorded

into a full-blown arrangement.

The list of dedicated MIDI sequencers for the Amiga gets longer each month and so I won't bore you with the details. However there are two programs soon to be available which will open up the field for the Amiga. The first is a version of one of the most successful of all MIDI sequencers, the Steinberg Pro 24, only available up until now for the ST. I think this is a measure of how Steinberg, who are a German software house, view things. Although they are starting to make inroads into the American market which is awash with PCs, they see the way forward on the Amiga, and not the PC with its problems of no standard interface (unless you count the ultra-expensive 'industry standard interface' of the Roland MPU401 at £250 a throw!) The Steinberg Pro 24 will cost exactly that, £250. Watch this space for an in-depth review of what is promised to be not merely a cross-over but also an update. More promising still is the modu-

lar program from the San Francisco based Microlllusions who are launching Music X. This modular program does all sorts of sequencing with several different types of editing features, all very professional, as well as full MIDI features. While all this is running you can also call up other modules which are resident in the machine at the same time. These will do voiceediting for various synthesizers and store them in libraries, which can be called in at any given moment into the sequencer, and will also handle voice creation and sample editing. The demo versions seen so far are tremendous. A full review should be possible soon, but meanwhile take a peek at the News pages.

You've got your Amiga, sorted out various bits of software and maybe a synth into the bargain. Now all you need to do is to hear yourself in true perspective and then commit it to tape. First thing is to get some decent amplification. The Amiga stereo outputs are of the phono type, which by a happy coincidence happens to be the same as most hi-fi amplifiers, so as long as the amp can accept an external source in, usually called Aux, you're away.

The part of the sound chain that is most suspect is the speakers themselves. A decent set of speakers will improve a hi-fi no end whereas a decent amp shoved through a rubbish pair of speakers still sounds pretty naff. If you have neighbours who will not appreciate a few hundred watts of bottom end bass line rattling the headboard of their bed at 4 am then maybe a good pair of headphones is in order. Money spent in these areas will save a lot of frustration later on. What you should try to get is a true picture of the sound in all its glory. If you don't, then when you transfer it to tape and take it somewhere with a decent system, your prized efforts will start to sound like a crossed telephone line to Greece with all sorts of unheard-of bangs and whistles.

There are various other items - no, lots and lots of other items that can be thrown into the chain of sound recording. In fact there is scope for a complete feature on just that in some future issue. The bottom line for anything like a mixer, tape deck or effects unit is to ensure that it doesn't add any significant amount of noise into the system. If you insist on using cassettes obtained free at the local garage along with a dirty old cassette player that used to double as a data recorder you'll get no sympathy from me when the result sounds like it was recorded on the wing of a 747 at 30,000 ft.

REAL-TIME SOUND PROCESSOR

Amiga sound samplers come in a multitude of different shapes and sizes. JASON HOLBORN checks out a sound sampler with a difference.

he Real-Time Sound Processor takes the Amiga's sound sampling capabilities that bit further by using it not for straight sampling, which until recently had been the sole application, but as a powerful sound manipulation tool. If you've ever used professional synthesizers such as the Roland D-50 supersynth or Yamaha's V50 Keyboard Workstation, then you're probably already familiar with the concept of sound processing.

When a sound is produced, feeding it through a sound processor can enhance the sound by adding new characteristics to it. For example, a reverb unit adds a 'roomy' feel to a sound, so it sounds as if it was played in a large hall.

MANIPULATING TIME

This Amiga-based sound processor takes an external mono sound signal (such as that outputted by a CD player, Hi-Fi or synthesizer), samples it at an astonishing 50 KHz and then manipulates it before it is emitted through the Amiga's stereo sound outputs. All this activity takes place in real time, which actually allows the unit to manipulate a continuous sound signal.

What you get for your money is the actual sampling hardware itself (which

also functions as a conventional sound sampler if you've a software package such as Aegis AudioMaster) which plugs into the parallel port, a spiral-bound manual, a single disk containing the sound processing software and a rather large dongle which must be plugged into the second joystick port for the software to work at all. I've never been a great fan of dongles and on a multi-tasking machine such as the Amiga: where several packages can be running simultaneously, they can be a real pain.

N-N-N-NINETEEN!

The package provides nineteen preset sound manipulation tools such as Echo, Reverb, Delay, Flange and both AM and FM modulation. As well as these presets, you can also configure your own effects using the extensive software controls and then store them in any one of 127 preset slots. Playing around with the supplied presets can be a lot of fun in itself, particularly if you've got a microphone that you can link up to the sampling hardware.

One unique and potentially very useful feature of the Sound Processor is the ability to change the current preset through MIDI control. This is achieved using the same MIDI 'program change'

messages that are used to change the sound to be played on a MIDI synth. This could be very useful when used in conjunction with a sequencer as it would allow your sequencer to control not only the operations of your synths, but also the sound processor.

ARSENAL!

For the Amiga user who also enjoys tinkering around with their home keyboard, the Sound Processor provides a useful addition to a music-making arsenal. The unit is undoubtedly flexible and costs considerably less than even the cheapest of professional effects units, but unfortunately it fails to deliver the kind of sound quality that serious musicians demand. This isn't really a fault in the sound processor itself, but merely a limitation of the Amiga's hardware.

For serious use, sound processors need at least a twelve-bit resolution, which is four bits more than even the Amiga can handle. Without these extra bits, the sound produced can become muffled and hollow, which really isn't acceptable for serious music making. If the unit featured a sixteen-bit sampling resolution, then it would not only be a corker of an Amiga product, but would also leave quite a few professional units out in the cold. If you want to use a sound processor seriously, you're probably best advised to fork out the extra cash and buy a dedicated effects unit.

MONEY GRABBERS

Please, please, can you help? I've just spent the last six months saving £250 to splash out on a colour digitiser. There are several available that all seem to offer similar facilities: which one would you choose? Michael Nash, Chelmsford, Essex

The choice of the right video digitiser really depends on what you intend to use it for. From your letter, it seems obvious that your decision will be guided by the extent of colour support offered by digitisers. If you aren't particularly worried about the digitiser being able to grab images at any great speed, then NewTek's Digi-View 3.0 unit is still one of the best (and cheapest!) colour digitisers available.

If you do want to digitise colour images, you'll also need to fork out for a black-and-white video camera. Surprisingly, these cameras can be picked up quite cheaply from most Amiga dealers (try the Amiga Centre Scotland on 031 557 4242 for both Digi-View and the video camera).

After purchasing Issue 11 of your parent magazine ST/Amiga Format, I tried using the SetKey utility that was included on the free coverdisk. After a few seconds of disk access, the SetKey window appeared, but apart from the menu bar nothing else was displayed. When I tried to guit out of SetKey by double-clicking on the 'window close' gadget, the machine just locked up and I was forced to reset my Amiga. What am I doing wrong?

There does indeed seem to be a problem with the SetKey utility, which had us stumped for quite a time. The problems lies in the fact that the program was written for the American market and therefore expects the default keyboard setting (set using the CLI command SetMap) to be usa0. If you boot your Amiga with the British version of Workbench, the keymap is automatically changed to the UK configuration which confuses SetKey.

To get around this, you will have to change the current keymap at the CLI prompt by typing 'SetMap usa0'. You can now run SetKey without problems.

After you have finished using SetKey, to change back to the British keyboard configuration,

just go back to the CLI and type 'Setmap gb'. Thanks to Phil Wares and Chris Morris of Cranbrook in Kent for sorting that one out!

ARE YOU PRO PROTEXT?

My reason for writing is twofold. Firstly, I am soon to purchase a memory upgrade and a Star LC-10 colour printer for my Amiga. I am also hoping to purchase a word processor and a colour DTP package, aiming to spend about £150 at the most. I've been advised to buy Protext and Comic Setter: are these goo choices? My second reason for

writing is to help other Amiga users obtain ridiculously cheap public domain software. I get all my PD disks from Ray Burt-Frost, a disabled Amiga fan who runs his own PD library. His PD disks often retail as low as 50p - quite an eye opener when you realise that other companies are charging around £3! Could you please print Ray's phone number so that other Amiga owners are able to take advantage of Ray's generosity. Ray Burt-Frost can be contacted on 0703 785680.

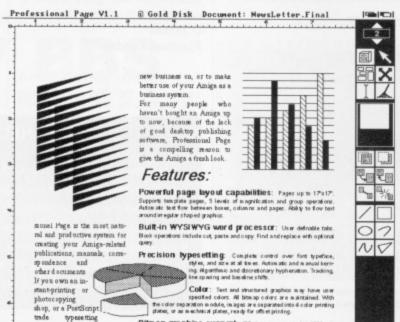

IS YOUR WORKBENCH A BIT PLANE?

How many colours does your Workbench screen have? Unless you've treated yourself to a package such as *Icon Paint*, you're probably limited to the standard four (though Workbench 1.4 will fix this). The following AmigaBASIC program is designed to allow you to add and remove as many bitplanes as hardware constraints will allow (a minimum of one and a maximum of four).

The two plane-manipulating routines are written as subprograms that can be called straight into your programs and are accessed in the same manner as any standard AmigaBASIC subprogram.

Using the programs couldn't be simpler. Firstly, make sure that you have the two .bmap files, 'intuition.bmap' and 'exec.bmap', in the same directory as your program. To add an extra plane, just call up the 'CreatePlane' subprogram and extra colours will instantly be made available. Extra bitplanes mean less free memory and slower program execution and therefore, to remove a plane, just call 'NukePlane'.

Until recently, Hard drives for the Amiga have indeed been rather expensive to say the least. Thankfully, the market does seem to have come to its senses and several cheap units are now available. The best of the bunch is undoubtedly ASAP's Amdrive which is a 40Mb unit for the A500 and A2000 for only £399. ASAP can be contacted at their Scunthorpe HQ on 0724 280222.

You'll be glad to hear that ReadySoft in the States are soon to release a hardware-based Mac emulator called A-Max. A-Mak plugs into the external drive port and, to all intents and purposes, transforms your Amiga into a Mac. This unit performs very well indeed, as you can read on Pages 64-7. A-Max is currently being distributed in this country by Entertainment International who should be contacted on 0268 541126.

The A-MAX unit allows you to connect an Apple disk drive to your Amiga and so, in theory, you shouldn't need access to a Mac.

START AT THE BEGINNING

I recently bought an Amiga 500 for myself and my five-year-old daughter but unfortunately I do not know the first thing about computers.

The manuals that come with the machine seem to assume that I have a basic understanding of computers, but I don't. Can you recommend any good books or packages that will help me?

Seriously though, one of the best introductions we have found to the Amiga actually comes with your machine: the 'Very First' disk that comes with your Amiga provides a very good tutorial which will help you understand the basic operations of your Amiga.

After buying my Amiga 500, I've found it to be the most useful and comprehensive computer I have used to date. However, I have the following questions:

- 1. Do you know of any add-on boards that hold both Workbench and extras in ROM so that they are instantly accessible as soon as I turn on my machine?
- 2. Do you know of any user groups in the Midlands area who can cope with the needs of a beginner in BASIC and assembler programming?
- 3. Can you please give me details on how to obtain back issues of ST/Amiga Format (your parent magazine).

- 1. We certainly haven't heard of such a device. The nearest you will come to your requirements are the Kickstart boards that seem to be so popular in the States. These boards allow more than one version of Kickstart to be resident in your machine at the same time.

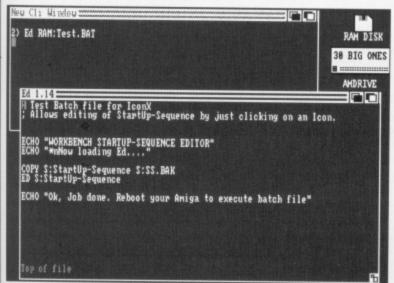

The wondrous little program in question is the lconX command that you'll find in the 'C' directory of your Workbench 1.3 disk. lconX allows you to run any program from Workbench that can usually only be run from the Command Line Interface (CLI).

An advantage of using IconX is that many programs (SetKey for example) need some form of setting up before they can successfully be run. The SetKey program is a fine example, as it needs the current keyboard map to be set to usa0 before it can be run. This is easy to do from the CLI but is almost impossible from Workbench. However, this is easily achieved with IconX.

IconX works by reading an ASCII batch file that contains all the commands that you would usually enter at the command line. To use IconX, create a batch file using a standard text editor and then find a data file that has an icon (a *DPaint* saved picture, for example). Copy the associated '.info' file across to your text file, giving it the same filename as your text file plus a '.info' extension (if your text file is called 'JOHN', the icon file would have to be called 'JOHN.info').

Next, using the Workbench menu's 'INFO' option, change the default tool to 'C:ICONX' (if you used a *DPaint* icon then it will probably already contain ':DPaint' in the default tool field) and then select 'SAVE'. Now when you double-click on the icon, IconX will be loaded and it will proceed to execute your batch file. Probably easier than falling off a log!



■ First, create your batch file. Here, we've created a sample batch file that deletes all '.BAK' files from a user-specified directory.

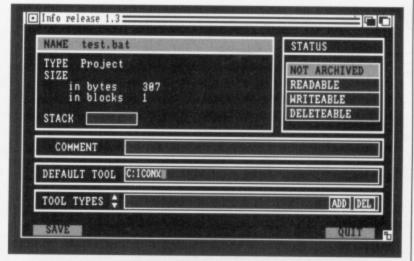

MACHII – MachII is a powerful little mouse accelerator program, complete with hot keys. If you've never used one of these programs, then you just don't realise what you've been missing.

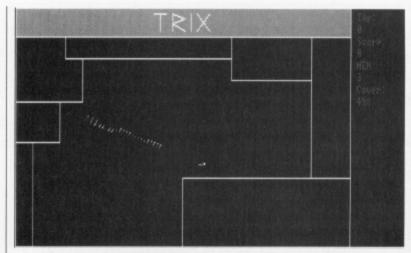

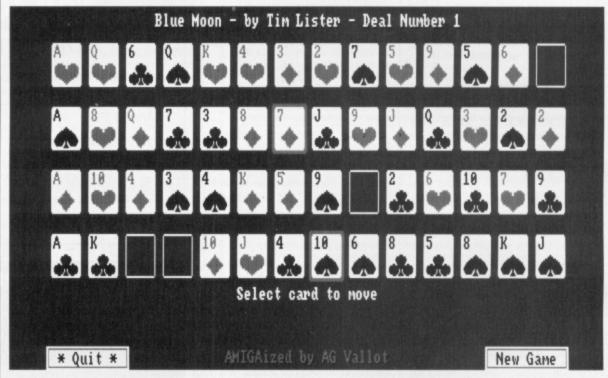

CARD FILE – Card File is a very simple but very useful database program that is written entirely in compiled basic. Card File's simplicity allows you to locate large

amounts of information with ease. HERMIT. – Everyone needs a screen grabber! As you've probably noticed when looking through Amiga Format, we use them extensively ourselves. Hermit is one of the best and will allow you to snap any standard intuition screen and save it as an IFF file that can be loaded into any of a number of paint packages.

UTILIMASTER – UtiliMaster is another of the 'DOS Workbench' programs.

MORSE – Turn any text file into dots and dashes without ever having to learn the Morse code. This program will be of special interest to all HAM radio buffs.

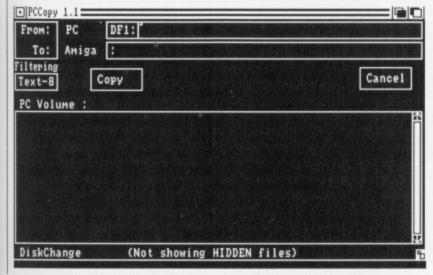
chunks while avoiding the various nasties that are after you.

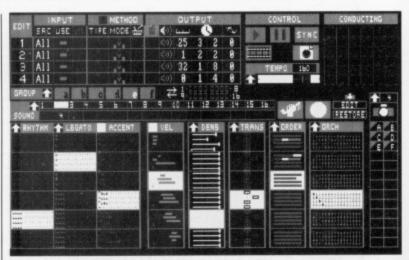

PROGRAM: PUBLIC DOMAIN FILES: VILBM

Everyone knows that the Amiga is a wonderful machine for creating your masterpieces on. With loads of colours, loads of art packages and the kind of screen resolutions that artists demand, the Amiga is the number-one choice for all would-be artists. But once you've created a disk full of works of art, what do you do with them?

Vilbm is a slideshow tool that allows the display of just about any IFF format pictures one after another. Even if your picture is in some strange resolution like overscan, *Vilbm* can handle it with no problems at all.

GETTING GOING

Vilbm can be run in two ways. The first, and probably the simplest, is to use the Amiga's extended selection technique from the Workbench. To display just one picture, click once on the picture file that you wish to view, then hold the [SHIFT] key down and double-click on the Vilbm icon. After a few seconds, the picture will be displayed.

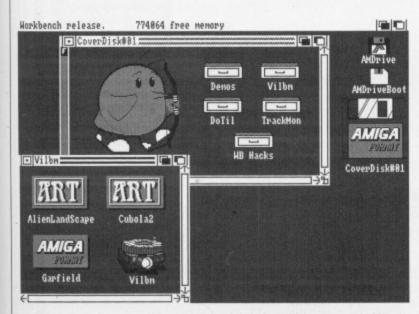
If you want to view several pictures, use the same method as detailed above, but instead click on each picture icon in turn (don't forget to keep the [SHIFT] key depressed) before finally double-clicking on the Vilbm icon.

The second method of running Vilbm is from the CLI. To view three pictures called 'Fred1', 'Fred2' and 'Fred3', all you have to do is to enter 'VILBM FRED1 FRED2 FRED3' and then press [RETURN]. To advance through each picture, just click the left mouse-button. Once all pictures have been displayed, Vilbm will return you to the CLI prompt (or the Workbench if you used the first method).

WORKBENCH HACKS

PROGRAM: PUBLIC DOMAIN FILES: SCAT!, VACBENCH, HACKS.DOC

So you think we're going to explain what these customers do, don't you? Well think again! Workbench Hacks are fun little programs that are at their best when you haven't got a clue what they do. To run this month's Hacks, double-click on the associated icon, then sit back and play!

DOTIL

PROGRAM: PUBLIC DOMAIN FILES: DOTIL, DOTIL.DOC

OK, confessions time. How many of you have tried to learn the Amiga's Command Line Interface, only to find it almost totally incomprehensible? Sounds familiar, doesn't it! If you are struggling to get to grips with the inner workings of AmigaDOS, why bother? You can use DoTil instead!

DoTil is a very useful utility that deserves a place on any self-respecting Workbench disk. DoTil allows you to carry out practically any task that you could previously only achieve through CLI from the Workbench environment. Instead of having to type in all those complicated (and difficult to remember) DOS commands, all you have to do is to point and click: it really is as simple as that! With DoTil, you can:

VIEW DIRECTORIES – Even if a disk contains practically no icons at all, with *DoTil* you can travel the directories, viewing those hidden files with ease. No more will you be hunting through a disk for that mysterious file, only to find that it can't be found because someone forgot to give it an

associated icon file.

FILE MANAGEMENT –
Even if a file doesn't
have an icon, there's no
hiding from DoTil's
extensive array of file
management tools.
Using multiple selection, you can copy,
delete, rename or view
any file on any disk.
AmigaDOS has never
been so simple.



■ What do you do if you want to copy all files, including all those without icons, to the RAM disk? Use DoTil of course! Here we've clicked on the files that we are planning to copy across.



■ Next, just bring up the pulldown menu containing the COPY option, select it and you're away.

GETTING GOING

You can load *DoTil* from the CLI... er, by double-clicking on the *DoTil* icon on the Workbench. Full instructions on getting the most from *DoTil* are available within the *DoTil* drawer.



■ Et voila, our files have been successfully copied. Now you've got no excuse for not being able to back up the Coverdisk!

HOW TO USE THIS DISK

Before using your Amiga Format disk, you should make a back-up of the master disk as soon as possible. This is very important!

BACKING UP YOUR DISK

Copying the disk may sound like a complicated task suitable for techno-buffs only, but it is surprisingly simple provided you read the following instructions carefully:

- 1. First, turn on your machine and load Workbench. Once the Workbench screen appears and the disk-drive light goes out, remove your Workbench disk and insert our cover disk.
- 2. Next, click once on the coverdisk icon and then press the right mouse-button and the Workbench menus will appear. Now, while keeping the right mouse-button depressed (you can cheer it up afterwards!), move the mouse pointer over to the 'Workbench' heading and a menu will drop down. Move the mouse pointer over the

'duplicate' menu option and then press the left mouse-button.

3. After a few seconds' disk access, the Workbench DiskCopy tool will be loaded and run. Now just follow the on-screen prompts and your Amiga Format coverdisk will be copied to a backup disk. When the machine asks for the destination, insert your blank disk into the drive. Further instructions can be found in the user's guide that comes with your Amiga.

USING THE PROGRAMS

All the programs on the Amiga Format disk are specially set up to make them as easy to use as possible. If you can use the Amiga's Workbench then you can use our coverdisk! If you do have problems with a program, full instructions on loading and using the programs are included in the disk pages and these should get you up and running. If you still have problems, you should read the documentation file (.DOC) that is included with every program.

To run any of the programs on this month's coverdisk, all you have to do is follow a very simple procedure. Unless specified differently within the disk pages, just double-click on the program's icon on the Workbench and the program will load and run. Full details on how to use the programs once they have run are included with the disk pages and as a text file accompanying the program.

To display a documentation file, just double-click on the appropriate .DOC file to be viewed and a window will open containing the file's contents. Pressing the space bar will advance a page at a time.

COPYING THE DISK

Unless specifically stated, the programs on the cover disk are not in the public domain and the copyright remains with the author. Selling or distributing these programs without the author's permission is against the laws of copyright.

HAVING PROBLEMS WITH THE DISK?

We have done our best to check that the programs on the *Amiga Format* coverdisk are simple to use, errorfree and have no known viruses. However, we cannot normally answer telephone queries on using the software, and we do not accept liability for any consequences of using the programs.

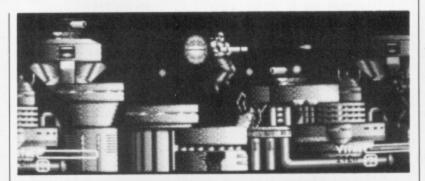

LORDS OF THE RISING SUN

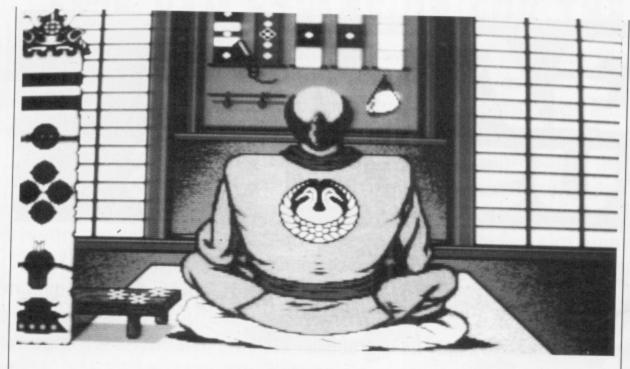
Try using these handy hints to get more from the game.

YOSHITSUNE

Yoshitsune is more skilled at fighting than Yoritomo, so at the start of the game make sure you have almost full strength and men before you try attacking anything. Your main objective now, because you are near maximum status, is to deal with your brother and to capture enemy castles. If you take over enemy castles, the enemy troops will have nowhere to recruit more men and all your brother's men and land is yours if he dies.



GAME BUSTERS



Your next job is to try and secure the eastern half of the Island. To do this, take over all the castles and destroy or recruit all the armies on that side of the Island. Now concentrate on the rest of the Island. In Edo try to leave a General with the least siege abilities as he probably won't need to siege castles anymore. Remember, one General will do and if the General is at Edo, Nagoya will be easier to storm by boat. If you can send a General from Akita to Matsue via Aikawa you will have a good base from which you can attack the Western castles. Once you have complete control over the main Island then you should be able to wipe out the remaining four castles on the two smaller Islands. Don't go for these unless you have a very firm base otherwise you will have to trek all the way back should a range trooper take over a castle.

YORITOMO

A great politician and strategist but try to take Edo first because it's the only castle you won't have to lay siege to to take. If you're lucky though, you may reach Toyama or Nigata before anyone else. The same rules now apply to Yoritomo as with Yoshitsune: wait until you nearly have a full army before attacking. Be careful if you get into any fights, because you have a low battle skill and a smaller army with higher skill can easily wipe you out. At the beginning of the game try to avoid taking risks and instead concentrate on improving your skills. If you ever fight your brother and survive long enough, chase him on horseback, because if you slay him things can change dramatically.

IN GENERAL

Participate in battles as you tend to lose more men if you don't. Chasing the General on horseback often leads to early victory as you can wipe out armies in one battle instead of at the end of the game, and once you're confident it's possible to do it every time: but do not engage in the siege sequence, because losing can be costly. The most important factor in battle is strength and long journeys can weary your troops, so ensure they have plenty of rest before a battle. An army coming by sea will be tired but faster and more flexible, so meet them on the shore and the advantage will be with your

Whichever character you've chosen, try to isolate the rest of the island so you're more able to concentrate on attacking the enemy and won't have to worry abaout defensive manoeuveres

and precautions: but watch out for the enemy trying to out-flank you. The islands will all be bitterly fought over, so ensure that your troops have confident strength before attacking. The islands are well worth going for though, because they are ideal resting places for a tired force and good Generals can interchange their armies from island to mainland without meeting too many problems.

The key to early victory is to recruit many more armies than your enemy, thus trapping him in a spider's web and gradually wearing him down (of course he can always try the same tactic on you, so beware). It's important to have a strong hold on North and South Japan, as a rogue force can wreak havoc and open up flanks, causing all sorts of problems. If you're unsure of your force, avoid battles because he who fights and runs away really does live to fightanother day. Ninja assassins may sound appealing, but only resort to them as a last resort and don't send them on too hard a mission because they might turn back and recognise you as the enemy!

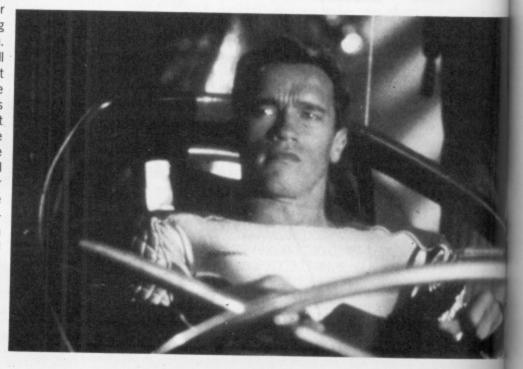

RUNNING MAN

The first three levels solved for you – next month we'll give you the solutions to the last two – so watch this space!

LEVEL ONE

A simple run and jump will get you onto the platform. If you have any problems with dogs kick or punch them: the best way to do this is to stand still with the fire button pressed, and move the joystick left-right depending on where the dog is coming from. Each kick of the dog rewards you with a small amount of extra energy. To jump the cravass, you'll have to have a running start so run towards the steps, jump up and run backwards and forwards (until you're confident) and jump between the first two black slants (indicated by the red arrows). Once across, keep running and jump the dogs, because hanging around to kick them could see you getting hit by an exploding puck at Subzero. Try to avoid Subzero and any more dogs until you get to the camera at the end of the level. Walk a little away from the camera (as indicated by the green arrow) and wait for Subzero to appear. When he does, he'll fire a puck straight at you so prepare to jump into the air. Subzero will then run behind you and before he has time to fire another, kick or punch him as he comes towards you - keep this up and you'll kill him, then you can exit as quickly as possible because hanging around in the cold is not a good idea.

LEVEL TWO

Run along and jump onto the boxes avoiding any dogs. The dogs can't climb onto the boxes so you're safe there, the brick is no use, so don't bother picking it up. Jump over the falling lighting and onto the boxes, on the other side is the lead piping, which you should pick up. Keep running until you reach the medical kit, which will replenish all your lost energy. Crawl through the rusty pipe and over the boxes and run along until you meet Buzzsaw. Be careful to avoid the many dogs that are here. You cannot jump over Buzzsaw when he's pointing the saw at you, but you can at any other time.

Use your lead piping on forward diagonals (used for punching) and it will slash out. Once you've lunged at Buzzsaw immediately get into the crawling position - he can't get you when you're crawling - and crawl past him. Beware though, because the dogs can still get you. When he's standing over you, he'll start to move in the opposite direction to you: quickly stand up and when he runs towards you hit him and get back into the crawl position. Do this until you've killed him and then run off the screen.

LEVEL THREE

You'll realise now that you haven't got your weapon, find the club on the first screen and use this to dispose of Dynamo, who is the toughest opponent in the game. Run to the blocks (there will be a dog either following you or coming at you, so avoid it) and jump

THE WINNERS GUIDE TO KICK OFF

It's fast and furious, it's the best football game there is, and despite what the Olympic movement would have us believe it's not taking part that matters: it's winning. In the interests of establishing an all-conquering squad of Amiga footie players, here are the Format team's definitive tips to winning at Kick Off.

THE KICK OFF

An excellent chance to score within the first few seconds of a restart. Trap the ball, charge straight up the pitch and shoot as you approach the penalty spot: there is a good chance it will go in. The computer teams are wise to this tactic, but they will frequently foul you on the way so the run can still be continued and a penalty may even result. If someone uses this tactic against you the best thing to do is to intercept the attacker: don't just chase him, wait for control to switch to a defender in his path and then move up the pitch towards him to tackle. However, because everything happens so fast it is frequently a matter of resorting to hacking the attacker mercilessly to the ground. Brutally effective.

CORNERS

Another good scoring chance. There are two main methods for putting the ball in the net. Either pull the ball back into the middle of the penalty area where a waiting player can blast it home, or float it across the goalmouth for an incoming forward to nudge in: you can even score directly this way. Never hit the ball low to the near post because the 'keeper will always collect it. Also beware of lofting the ball deep into the area because in this position it is much harder to control.

Defending against corners is difficult. You have to spot quickly what sort of kick is being taken and then get someone to the ball to clear it. The most dangerous kick is the in-swinger across the goal which you are likely to put in your own net. Just hope everyone misses and it goes past.

PENALTIES

A 90% success rate can be achieved by following the following instructions. Wait until the arrow is approaching the middle point and then give a sharp tap on the fire button. Anything more than the shortest of taps will send the ball over the bar. If you leave

shooting until the arrow has reached the middle or is going away, the ball will almost certainly

THROW-INS

Don't hack the ball straight upfield from these because it very often goes straight out again. Angle the ball infield before kicking it. Alternatively, dribble the ball, although this is more hazardous because there are always opposition players in close attendance at throw-ins.

PASSING AND SHOOTING

There are two main methods for kicking the ball: the kick-on-the-run and the trap-and-kick. The KOTR is quicker and goes further, but it is very hard to get it to go anywhere but in the direction you've been running, although 45, 90 and even 180 degree changes of direction are possible with a quick change of joystick angle just as the ball is kicked. This is also the method for changing direction while dribbling.

To TAK the fire button has to be pressed down just before the player runs into the ball and held. He can then swivel round freely and kick the ball in any direction by releasing the button: theoretically, it will be passed to another player. This is particularly handy if you are running in the wrong direction and when used well can result in very accurate and satisfyingly safe passing manoeuvres.

DRIBBLING

Because the ball is not 'stuck' to the end of your boot, dribbling is an art that has to be learnt. Running in a straight line is easy, but changing direction isn't. 45 degree changes are possible by hitting the diagonal at the right moment. Anything else requires a quick side-step or detour around the ball so that it can be approached from another angle. It sounds difficult but with practice you get used to the timing of the actual contacts with the ball while dribbling, so that changes of direction can be made extremely quickly and easily.

TACKLING

The easiest method of dispossessing someone on the ball is just to run into them. However, if you're approaching from behind and they are getting ever nearer the goal, have no hesitation in hacking them down: as long as it is outside the penalty area. Professional fouls are best used when the ref is easy-going or better still blind.

REFEREES

Pay attention early on to how the ref reacts to fouls. If he is whistlehappy then try to dribble with the ball a lot. Hopefully several of the opposition will get sent off or give away penalties. If he does not give yellow cards straight away, then feel free to hack the opposition down whenever necessary.



GOAL KICKS

It's crucial to learn how to win the ball from goal kicks and again there are two main methods. Either time the run to collide with the ball just as it bounces, allowing you to dribble away immediately, or hit the fire button with the joystick centred to leap into the air and head the ball on. The second tactic can gain valuable ground quickly. If these prove too difficult then try to trap the ball when it comes down by holding down the fire button.

HUMAN OPPONENTS

They are very susceptible to the charge straight up the pitch: always go for it. Try to trap the ball in the penalty area and wait for your panicking opponent to hack you down, giving a penalty. It works a treat, and will really annoy them too.

COMPUTER OPPONENTS

Possession is the key: give them too many chances and they will always score. Go for 4-4-2 or 5-3-2 formations so that you have plenty of defensive and midfield control. 4-3-3 is pretty useless and 4-2-4 is only for the brave who reckon they can out-play the computer: a tall order. The ultimate challenge is the USSR team because they are so fast. The trick to remember with them is not to futilely chase the ball-carrier with your (generally slower) players, but to wait for control to switch to the player in his path, then clear from the tackle.

up and over. Here you'll find a medi-pack to restore lost energy. Run past the first light bulb and then start walking. Chances are you'll meet a dog either between the lightbulbs or just as Dynamo appears on the screen.

Keep this up until you're in hitting distance, and if your timing's right you should be able to polish him off after a few blows. This is a lot easier said than done, especially as dogs tend to come after you just when you're about to whop Dynamo. Keep at it and get the timing right, and you'll manage it: then just walk off the screen and into the next level...

How to colonise the solar system and still return to Earth safe an' all that...

Electric Dreams' smart strategy game Millennium 2.2 might have one or two of you somewhat perplexed, if not completely stuck. If so, read on...

The first thing to do is activate the

Mk I Solagen which is already in stock in the Energy module. Once this is up and running, it's simply a question of initiating the Resource complex to get enough material to build a Mk II. Once the Mk II has been researched, you'll find that there isn't enough energy to build the thing. Turn off the Resource complex, build the Mk II and then turn it back on again. After that, it's simply a matter of researching and building increasingly powerful Solagens up to the Mk X. Don't worry about the failed Mk III. Simply use the Mk II which should be in store and repeat the process.

Once the base is operating properly, you have a number of

options. But before many of the items can be built, extra minerals are needed. To get these quickly and simply, research and build a small fleet of Grazers. These can continually ferry small amounts of much-needed ores from the asteroid field.

To find more information about the Solar System, continually build and launch probes. However, don't bother sending them to the inner planets, Mars and its moons, Jupiter and its focuses on the growth and expan- | moons, or the asteroid belt, sinceFleet Carrier, and the details beamed back to the Moonbase. Research this immediately: it's important that one be built. However, you'll find it takes rather a lot of materials!

Once the Fleet Carrier is built, fill it full of fighters and head for Mars. While in orbit the Carrier is attacked by a fleet of Martians, at which point all the fighters should be launched (lower right icon on the left hand side). A ferocious, if slightly tedious, battle ensues but the Martians should eventually surrender.

After this, Mars can be colonised in the usual way. The colonists then find plans of a Martian terraforming machine capable of making the Earth's air breathable. Again, this should be researched and built ASAP. However, you'll find that the stock of chromium is pretty much nil. This is where Triton comes in: you should, by now, have enough chromium collected for shuttling back to the moon.

Once the Terraformer is built, you'll find that even the Fleet Carrier isn't large enough to carry it to Earth. Don't despair: othe researchers redesign the ship so that the terraformer just fits in. The newly customised Juggernaut can now take the Terraformer to Earth, although it cannot take off again.

While the Earth is being terraformed, previous reports of a huge Martian fleet prove to be true, when the Moonbase is attacked by over 200 fighters! At this point the stockpile of Orbital Lasers - up to 16 - should be used up, prior to launching your fighters. Even after all this, it stands a very good chance that the attack cannot be repelled completely, and the Moonbase still gets duffed up a treat. In this case, you'll find that the moonbase's population has been

reduced to zero. Don't panic: send a couple of Carracks to the moon and dismantle them. The population increases by 80 for every Carrack destroyed.

Having survived the Martians' final assault, it should now be just a question of time before good old Terra is colonisable. In the mean time all your colonies start declaring independence. As long as you have a good stock of materials, don't worry about it. When a report comes in stating that Earth is once more in a habitable state, build the necessary SIOS, send it to Earth and then groan loudly at the naff end sequence.

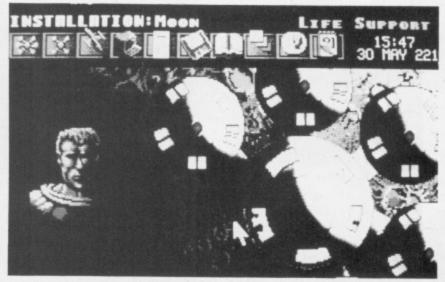

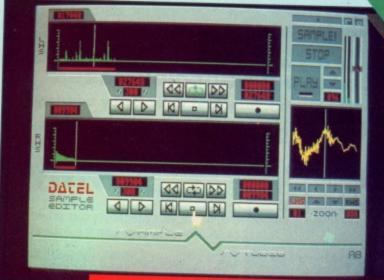

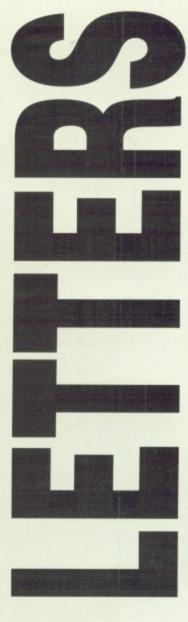

The biggest problem seems to be that computing is regarded as a male pastime. It seems to me that the only way to eliminate sexist drivel in the computer industry is to increase the proportion of women involved with it. It's like any other industry - there's a minority at the top that rake the cash in while the majority are battling to be part of that affluent minority. For instance, just because Michael Jackson makes a fortune every day doesn't mean you can lump the garage-band down the road into the same category with him.

Nobody likes hearing the bad news, which is why you don't hear too much about programmers struggling to eke out a living. Perhaps they would like to write to us and even the balance.

CONSOLE COMMODORE

I purchased an A500 nine months ago from my local dealer at £400 which included the standard software. A particular article which I read recently stated confirmed reports of a future Amiga console to be released. Customers who have paid four to five hundred pounds may well be let down with sub-standard software. When the Amiga was first released it carried a status symbol due to its sophisticated hardware and people have paid for that privilege. If a console is to be released based on 68000 technology Commodore will inevitably be required to sell the system at a competitive price what with the PC Engine, ST console, Sega, Nintendo etc. Will the select customer which has been apparent disappear after the Amiga console has been released? Those who will invest in a console may be unable to afford the previous prices. If Commodore opt to aim at the lower market the industry may well be-forced to produce sub-standard material to compensate for inexpensive software. A500 owners will be left with a machine which may not be programmed to its full potential. A matter to be taken seriously as it would restrain a prosperous business and regress advancements.

No plans for an Amiga console have been announced, and none are likely to be. Far more likely is that the A500 will be upgraded into a 1 Meg machine, making it even more powerful, and even cheaper for the technology involved. Have no fear, the existing (and increasing) user base means software houses will keep writing for the basic A500 machine and from there on things will only get better. In fact, it's only just beginning...

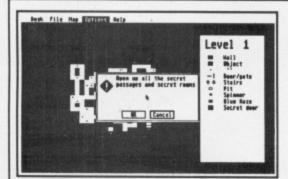
