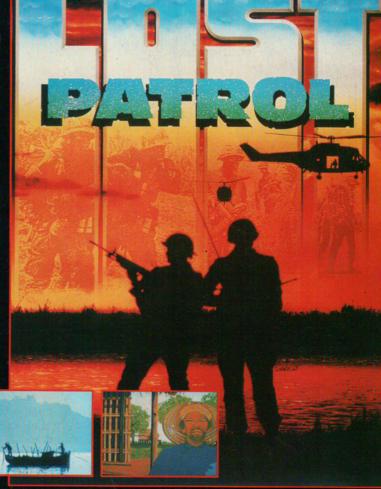
# Bit Machine

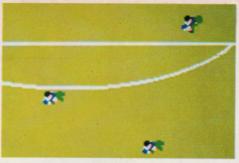

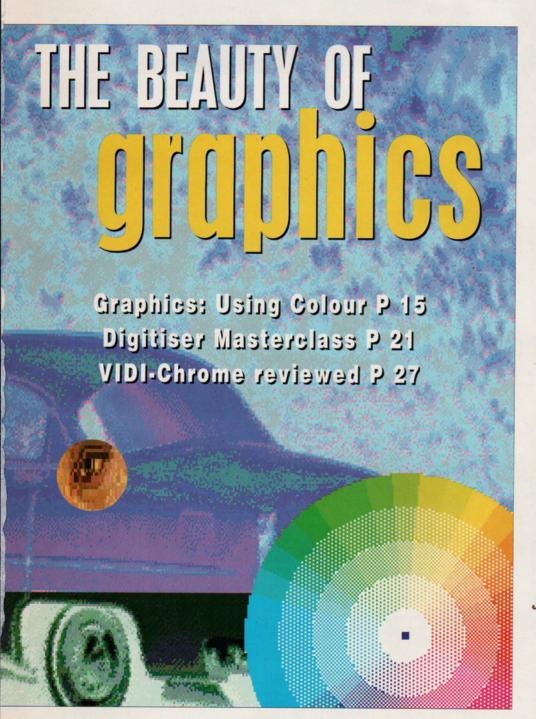

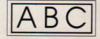

Commodore have launched a new A500 bundle that will undoubtedly keep the Amiga riding high through the summer months. The bundle is called 'Flight of Fantasy' and contains an A500, F29 Retaliator and Rainbow Islands from Ocean, Escape from the Planet of the Robot Monsters from Tengen/Domark, and Deluxe Paint Il from Electronic Arts.

This new bundle costs £399.99 - the same price as the Batman pack, which has been out for six months. It does not mark the end of the Batman pack either - that is being continued at the same price and is to be re-promoted to coincide with the launch of the Batman movie on video.

This latest launch is yet another coup for Commodore. capturing some of the most exciting recent game releases to make this the most up-to-date and interesting bundle. It's also an indicator of the success of both the Amiga and the bundles that Commodore can have two identically-priced packages out at the same time - a move previously unheard of on the personal computer scene.

A quick look at the software contents of the bundle tells you all you need to know about its value for money. F29 Retaliator is one of

the most eagerly-awaited games of the year and is set to be a classic battle/flight simulator. Rainbow Islands is already a recognised success, as you will see from this issue of AF, and should prove even more of an attraction than New Zealand Story did in the Batman pack. Escape from the Planet of

the Robot Monsters is also a bangup-to-the-minute game that rounds off the game side nicely. Then, of course, there is Deluxe Paint II. which was also in the Ratman pack, and is still an excellent art package.

Meanwhile, the Batman video that will be hitting the small screen soon features an advert and competition from Commodore on the front of the tape. The competition consists of riddles to answer, giving you the chance to win one of 10 Batman Packs.

At Amiga Format we are delighted with the new bundle, because Commodore has once again delivered what the public wants - the best computer with the best and, more importantly. most recent software with it. It's also good to see them continuing with the Batman pack, giving the public the choice between the two - not forgetting the Class of the '90s pack, intended for the more educationally-minded.

Where does the Amiga 500 go from here? The signs are that there will be another new offering for the Christmas period, and there is talk now of further 'specialist' packages. We would certainly like to see bundles aimed at music and video, areas into which the Amiga is exploding with great success already.

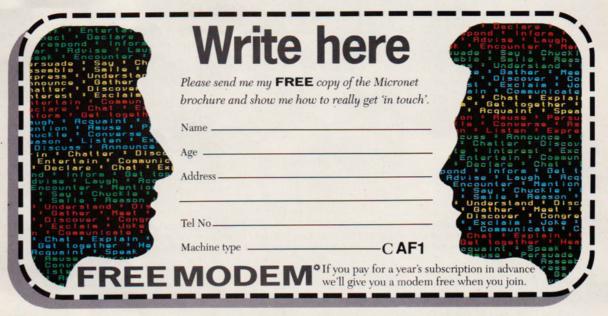

## CHECKMATE'S A1500 ARRIVES

Is it a bird? Is it a plane? Is it a new machine from Commodore? No. none of those - although Commodore have expressed a strong wish to take a look. This is the prototype of Checkmate Systems' adaptation of the Amiga 500, known as the A1500.

The machine will be available complete - it goes into production even as you read these words but the basic idea is that A500 owners can buy the necessary parts and perform the conversion themselves. It can be assembled. Checkmate promise, "by most confident people". Alternatively, you can send your A500 off and have Checkmate do the conversion for you, in which case they will provide a new warranty themselves, its length dependent on the age of your original machine.

The A1500 is incarnated in a sturdy metal CPU case with a separate keyboard, reminiscent of the Commodore 128 or even the original Amiga, the A1000. The disk

drive is moved to the front, with space for a second internal floppy drive, and the mouse or joystick ports are also placed handily at the front of the machine. The standard edge connector from the left-

hand side of the Amiga is retained to ensure compatibility with any add-ons you may already have, but there is room inside the case for any half-height hard drive unit, such as the A590, to be installed

instead of a second floppy. Badging is distinctive and the general look is very much that of an official Commodore computer.

Options include a full Amiga video slot (for use with Flicker Fixer boards or genlocks) or a full MIDI interface, both of which will fit internally. An expansion unit can be fitted on top of the base to provide space for any three A2000 expansion cards, including processor accelerators - extra expansions can be added for more cards or for more half-height hard drives. Finally, both the base unit and expansions will fit in standard 19" racks, which could open up a whole new market for the Amiga in professional musical use.

Pricing details for the kit, the adaptation and the complete machine have yet to be confirmed. but you can expect to pay around £200 to have your A500 converted and uprated to a near-A2000 spec. Checkmate on 01 923 0658 can tell you more. ■

#### **RIDERS OF ROHAN**

#### SPEEDBALL II

#### PSS

PSS are well known for their war games and have been introducing more and more graphic elements. Their up-and-coming titles continue

to branch out into new areas with Battlemaster (a fantasy role-playing game) Harpoon and Red Phoenix (based on works by Larry Bond, the co-author of Red Storm Rising) and Wolfpack (which simulates the naval events of 1942 in the North Atlantic).

#### **DUSTER**

Realtime are another prestigious programming team working on a

game for Mirrorsoft, featuring their renowned filled-3D graphics. Their new one combines these with a fantasy role-playing section to create the bug-hunting mercenary world of Duster.

#### KILLING CLOUD

Vektor Grafix are also best known for their 3D flight sim Bomber, but their new game is an action adventure using the graphic techniques they've developed, but in a different context.

#### **DYNAMIC DEBUGGER**

This one has been a long time

#### FTL

FTL are the people behind Dungeon Master and with a bit of luck we will be seeing the add-on game disk Chaos Strikes Back fairly soon - but you will still need a 1 meg machine to run it. They are also working on Dungeon Master II and there is even talk of a game design program. Don't hold your breath, though - they will not release anything until they



are totally happy with it. And why won't they do an Amiga version of *Oids*?

#### CINEMAWARE

Cinemaware are one of the most prestigious software houses around and they have big plans for the year. There are two more in the TV Sports range — Baseball first and then Boxing. Closer is Antheads, the data disks for It Came from the Desert to take you on another '50s B-movie jaunt.

Wings is another new area for Cinemaware, because it's a flight sim, though done in their inimitable graphic style. It's set in World War One with over 300 missions to fly.

#### SPECTRUM HOLOBYTE

Spectrum Holobyte had a massive success last year with Falcon and the first Mission Disk and they look set to follow it up equally impressively with the second Mission Disk and the new "full-blown battlefield strategy game" Flight of the Intruder. The game is set in

Vietnam in 1972 and, unusually, is based on a book. There is even a film, starring Sean Penn, under production, which could make a fascinating tie-in.

Also planned for the Autumn are Vette! and Tank, sports car racing and tank simulations respectively. That's a pretty full release schedule for specialists like Spectrum Holobyte.

#### MILLENNIUM

Another addition to the Mirrorsoft stable is a deal with Logotron to market their new label Millennium. All Logotron games will now be issued under the new name. The reason for the change is simple enough - Logotron have long had connections with both business and leisure software and as they've recently dropped the business side they no longer wish to be associated with the business sector. Their first game is Kid Gloves which is reviewed in this issue. Following that are some 3D vector games that look to have some stunning routines. They are Resolution 101 and Thunderstrike. Nearer to release is Cloud Kingdoms, a cutesy puzzle solving test of reflexes and mind.



#### DRIFTING ON AN AMIGA

Coming soon from Impressions will be a wargame based on one of the most famous battles in British history, the battle of Rorke's Drift. In 1879 when the Empire was at its height 137 British soldiers fought off an attack from approximately 4,000 Zulus. The battle was so fierce and the British fought so well that a total of 11 Victoria Crosses were awarded. Soon you'll have the chance to control all the British soldiers, to test your powers of strategic planning and to win a battle against odds of almost 30-1.

#### NEW KIDS ON THE BLOCK

Outside eyes have been gazing in on the games industry and seeing pound signs. Electrocoin, the longestablished arcade machine manufacturers and distributors, have recently set up a company called Electrocoin Software with the intention of converting arcade games to home machines. With over 15 years' arcade industry experience Electrocoin Software look to be in an enviable position when it comes to grabbing the big licences and could well prove to be stiff competition to the likes of Ocean and US Gold. The first game, a conversion of the SNK game Time Soldiers, looks likely to be here fairly soon as ES have five in-house programmers already working on the conversion. See just how good a job they did in a forthcoming issue of Amiga

#### MORE CHRONO

Following the success of their adventure game Chronoquest, have decided to Psygnosis release a seguel. Chronoquest II (imaginative lads the Psygs) will be icon-driven and will follow on directly from the first game, in which you were travelling through time to find your father's murderers. Unfortunately, it looks as if you're not going to get home as soon as you thought you would because the damn time machine has run out of fuel. Only skilled puzzle solvers need apply to be involved with this one.

### **'BIRDS' TAKES WING**

In keeping with their promise to release one new Real Things package every four months, RGB Studio's Real Things – Birds is about to hit the streets – or if the realism is to be believed – the shoulders of passers-by!

Continuing the hierarchical structure of RGB's Horses package, Birds is much more than clip art – and though the 'educational' label will inevitably be attached, it is also much too much fun and far too useful to be just educational.

Like Horses, Birds is designed to be used with Deluxe Paint III or any other package that supports IFF pictures, Anim animations and AnimBrushes. It is Deluxe Paint III that really brings it to life allowing complex choreographies of background, foreground and several animated brushes to intertwine on the screen.

The package contains a dozen species of birds – predominately water birds – in great detail, and

includes over 40 animbrushes. Some of these are of "flocks" at a distance to give static pictures 'life', but the majority are detailed studies of the various species in their habitats, feeding, preening etc. There is also a 'self-drive' demonstration of how bird flight works that gives great insight into the motion patterns of birds as they flap their wings.

To complement the bird images is a full set of brushes and backdrops that allow DIY scenery to be constructed. Among these are the two best rendition techniques for water that have yet been produced on the Amiga – both are stunningly realistic.

Overall the package is much bigger than *Horses*, filling two disks – this will be reflected in the price, £29.95 instead of £24.95. A full review of *Real Things* – *Birds* will be the main feature of Issue 12's graphics section.

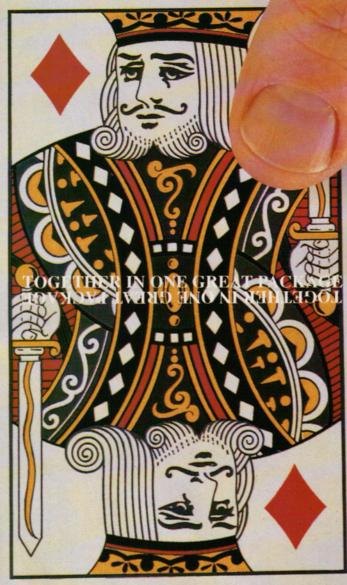

Astro Marine Corps
From Dinamic comes this arcade blast giving the player the chance to get his sweaty mitts on nine super-powerful weapons with which to go out blasting criminals. Seems a bit heavy handed? Not really, when you consider the crims in question

are a mixed bunch of alien races hell-bent on taking over the galaxy. In fact the only way to stop them is to blast them to kingdom come – and the only man for the job is a member of the AMC.

Colorado

After the brilliant Dragons Breath, what will French lovers Palace follow up with? The answer is another French game, this time from recent signees Silmarils. Colorado is an arcade



adventure sending the player back in time to nineteenth century Colorado (imaginative lads the Silms) and into the shoes of drunk and womaniser David O'Brian. Now ol' Dave has happened across an ancient map which will lead him to the lost goldmine of the Cheyenne - but only if he can get there, because the journey will be fraught with dangers including hostile indians, trappers and wolves. There are plenty of arcade sequences to take part in and more than just a couple of logical puzzles to solve.

Flimbo's Quest System 3's Last Ninja II is coming along nicely as is the new game Flimbo's Quest. It's a beautifully-animated cartoon platform game for fans of the genre, featuring seven levels created by a mad professor who's captured Flimbo's girl. The levels are infested with all manner of meanies created by the professor, so sharp wits and bravery are the order of the day.

**Fatal Gravity** 

A novel puzzle game from Infogrames. The player controls a triangle and the game is played by guiding the triangle through several rooms. Unfortunately, the only way to get out of most rooms is through doors halfway up the wall. The player must bounce onto suspended platforms and bounce from one to the other to exit the room. Wacky stuff that's not only good looking but promises to be a bit of a mental excercise too.

International **Championship Wrestling** 

Grapple fans will think all their Christmases have come at once when they get their hands on Hewson's latest. One or two players can get to grips with international stars like Ivan 'The Bear' Trotsky (imaginative lads the Hews) and wrassle them all around the ring - oh! Just think of the hours of fun you'll be able to have as you go after that elusive

Championship Belt (handbags for hitting your fave baddie are not included in the packaging).

**Lords of War** Arcade action with a medieval flavor is on its way in Lords of War from Gainstar. Four knights get together to go biff a nasty dragon 'cos whoever succeeds in doing this will inherit a kingdom. However, only one will get the chance and to find out who that will be, the lads in shining will battle with each other first. You are one of those knights - and with a little luck, lots of courage and a bit of magic it just might be you that gets the booty.

Island of Lost Hope There's more treasure to be found in this Gainstar graphic adventure, which gives you the chance to wear the boots of a young seafaring captain in pursuit of the treasure of Forgotten Souls. Things were going well until you ran into the infamous

pirate Captain Black (imaginative lads, the Gainies). Sea dogs and adventurous types should sign up and climb aboard real soon.

**Dan Dare III** - The Return

Forty years on since his first appearance in the Eagle, Dan Dare is back on the monitor in Dan Dare III - The Return from Virgin (imaginative lads, the Virgs). Danny boy has escaped from the Mekon after being captured and transported to a huge satellite for Treenisation'. All he has to do now is explore the satellite and find enough fuel to power his escape rocket, which just happens to be lying around. Dan fans, prepare.

Virgin are also cashing in on the World Cup in a couple of months' time with the release of World Cup Soccer '90. An arcade footy game featuring all the usual bits and bobs plus a couple more, such as injured players being stretchered off the pitch. Mmmm... sounds like fun!

# RISING FROM

With Light" series, the well-Hodgkin criticised 'electronic painting' for being so quick and clean, depriving him of time to think! Obviously for some people the mixing and cleaning time is a period of thought and contemplation - something we all need to indulge in as often as possible. But works and how to use it. usually, when we just want to express an idea as quickly and cleanly as possible, what a hassle it is mixing tles of oil and turps or pots of water, tubes of paint, dirty rags, dirty brushes, messy palettes, all taking up space and time with the constant cleaning, mixing and remixing - just to get the right colour!

fter working with a Quantel We don't have the vast facilities of the Paintbox for BBC2's "Painting Paintbox, but even with an Amiga the chance to select the exact colour and known American painter Howard shade you want from a large range and get on with the painting can be a liberating experience. Nevertheless, electronic colour is still a difficult medium to handle effectively so for this next tutorial we are going to concentrate on colour - what it is, how it

#### **Learning about Colour**

If the Amiga were of no use for anycolours the conventional way - bot- thing else it would have great value as a way to learn how colour works. Almost from the moment that you turn on it starts the educational process. The first clue comes when you set the screen preferences for yourself: the colours are controlled by three sliders

that vary the amount of red, green and blue present in each colour. We have all set up our own lurid screen display by trial and error, but how do the sliders really work?

The screen display of virtually all colour computers - and all TV sets as well, for that matter - is determined by the relative values of red, green and blue light, known simply as RGB to the cognoscenti. These three colours of light are the so-called 'additive' primary colours which can be mixed together in varying amounts to produce light of any colour. When all three of the pure primaries are mixed, the result is white light. Although a little knowledge of physics tells us different, it always seems strange that white light is made up of the complete spectrum of the colours. How can such distinctive primary colours as red, green and blue apparently cancel each other out and produce what common sense tells us is the absence of colour? But, of course, they do: the addition of these three primaries, red green and blue light, forms pure white:

#### Red, Green and Blue Ham!

If you have DigiPaint 3 or Photon Paint you can experiment with this effect to understand it better. Clear

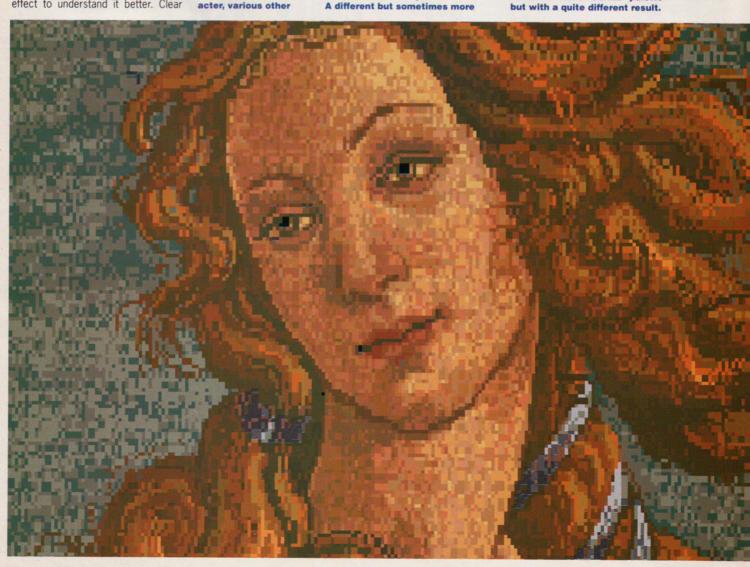


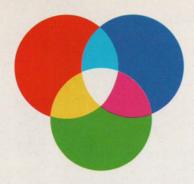
'standard' pictures were loaded into the spare screen after "Venus" had been loaded to the main screen. The new palette is loaded with the new picture and "Venus" initially looks a mess. This is immediately rectified by selecting Remap from the Picture/Change Color menu. The results are shown alongside. "GoldVenus" uses the "KingTut" palette, "PinkVenus" uses that from "Gorilla", and "OchreVenus" the "Africa" palette. As you can see, the success of this method depends on the number of suitable colours in the new palette. A different but sometimes more





effective method of forcing palettes is to use DigiView. A proper description of the use of DigiView for this purpose will be given in a future Digitising Tutorial. Briefly, the method is to load the new palette first using DigiView's convenient Load Palette menu selection, then Freeze the palette on the Palette Control Panel. The correct number of colours must be chosen on the Color Control Panel (32, 16, 8 etc - not 4096!) and then the picture loaded. The effect can be seen in "PinkVenusDGV" which again uses the "same "Gorilla" palette but with a quite different result.







the screen to black and choose 'OR' from the Mode menu. With a circular custom brush about 3cm across (and, with Photon Paint, 'Trans' and 'Solid' selected on the brush menu). try painting pure red, green and blue (FOO, OFO, OOF), partly superimposing them as in Diagram One, 'RGB -CMY', above. (If it helps, imagine that you are in a theatre and have three circular spotlights focused on a blacked-out stage). Where they overlap, notice the colour effects. Red and green make yellow, red and blue make magenta, blue and green make cyan and all three make white; suprising, but true.

Almost as strange is the behaviour of paints or dyes on paper or cloth. This time the primary colours are Cyan (blue/green), Magenta (blue/red) and Yellow - the 'subtractive' primaries. Many people remember mixing blue, red and yellow paints at school to get almost any shade - this is a reasonable approximation of the effect of cyan, magenta and yellow. Since these primaries are subtractive, a mixture of all three results in the absence of all colour black - though in the printing process used for full-colour magazines like this one some pure black ink is used as well to get a good, deep, opaque black. Again the process can be simulated using a HAM paint program, this time using the 'AND' mode on a white screen (also shown in "RGB - CMY"). Here cvan and vellow make green, yellow and magenta make red,

magenta and cvan make blue and all three together make black.

In theory this is how most print processes create a full-colour picture - superimposing various shades of cvan, magenta and vellow - though in reality the process is very difficult to manage effectively. This explains why it is so difficult to get a good screendump in colour, even from the most expensive printers: the printer is blending CMY ink on dull paper that can only reflect light, but the screen display is mixing illuminated RGB values, literally 'painting with light'.

#### The Saturated Value of Hue!

Although the pure, rich primaries of RGB and CMY have been used for the examples so far, the screen and the printer both use a whole range of 'values' and 'saturations' of these hues to achieve a broad spectrum of colours. The 'Colour Wheel' illustration over the page shows a range of about 72 of the fully-saturated hues that the Macintosh can display. These fullysaturated hues are around the outside. (Apologies for using a Macintosh example, but it makes life easier since we use Macs to lay the mag out - Ed.)

On the inner rings are shown various shades of the colours achieved DIAGRAM ONE: RGR - CMY On the left are the 'additive primaries', red green and blue. Thes three colours of light combine to produce white, but mixed in different proportions will give any other shade.

On the right are the 'subtractive' primaries. cvan, magenta and yellow. These three colours of paint or dve can be combined to produce almost any other shade. All three together should give a reasonable black.



In a HAM display very few pixels have their own uniquelydefined colour. Instead, they derive their component RGB levels from the pixels adjacent to them. The advantage of this is that many different colours can be displayed, by a sort of 'domino' effect; the disadvantage is that updating a changed display can be quite slow. To understand how HAM works we need to get a bit technical.

To display a picture on screen the colour of each pixel must be stored as a list (the 'bitmap') in memory - starting at the top-left pixel and ending at the bottom-right. Each colour used must have a unique 'code' to describe it, and the more colours the more complex the code. On the Amiga and other 16-bit machines, four bits are usually used to define this code. In binary, this equals 16 unique colours chosen from the 4096 available and these are kept in a 'table' or register of the colour palette currently in use. With some hardware and software tricks this number can be increased to 32 or

64 - above this the 16-bit bus cannot normally cope.

HAM AND SHAM

In HAM mode, 6 bits are used to define the colours. The first two - the 'significant' bits can have four binary values, 00, 01, 11, or 10. If the value is 00 the next four bits define one of the 16 'normal' colours in the register. These can be used anywhere on the screen without causing problems. If the value is one of the other three possibilities, 01, 10, or 11, the colour of the pixel is instead derived from that of the one before it. Now the colour is the same except that one of its RGB components is different - 01 changes blue, 10 changes red and 11 changes green. The remaining four bits define the value of this changed component.

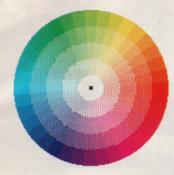
In effect this means that if two very different colours are to be adjacent there must be a 'fringe' two pixels wide between them. For example between Black (000) and White (15,15,15) will be Red (15,0,0) and Yellow (15,15,0) unless white is one of the 16 'register' colours. It is this

fringeing or 'ramping' that is the great limitation of HAM. Nevertheless careful choice of the register colours can almost eliminate the effect and several sophisticated programing tricks have been developed to overcome it though the application of these slows down operation.

SHAM or SuperHAM is a software technique that has been used on the Atari ST for some years to provide a HAM-like 'omni-colour' mode. In effect it involves palette switching 'onthe-fly'; every line of the screen display can have a different 16-colour register that is switched at the start of each horizontal raster scan. Such a technique allows all 4096 colours of the Amiga to be used on screen simultaneously in the highest resolution without any ramping; it is also very memory intensive and locks up the processor almost completely. The latest version of NewTek's digitiser software, DigiView v4 and ASDG's 'ScanLab 100' scanner software both use versions of SHAM to produce 4000-colour hi-res pictures.

by varying the saturation and value. In simple terms, the addition of white to a colour decreases its SATURATION and the addition of black decreases its VALUE. Most computer painting systems will allow you to vary the Hue, Saturation and Value (HSV) as well as the proportions of Red, Green and Blue in a colour, but not DigiPaint 3 which uses a different, though equally valuable, system. Experiment with the Hue, Saturation and Value sliders in your favourite program. The "Waterfall" Tutorial below is a reasonable starting point.



#### **Colour Cubed**

The colour wheel, although it illustrates the relationship between the various saturated hues quite graphically, is too large to use for selecting colours in the course of working. (Try telling that to the AF art department: they have to use colour wheels on the Mac – Ed.)

Instead, the developers of HAM drawing systems have very sensibly devised or adapted the 'Colour Cube'. Photon Paint II and DigiPaint 3 both have similar 'colour selection' squares which represent sections through the cube along the three axes, red, green and blue. In use the squares are better thought of as holding the proportion of one colour steady - the left square red, the middle green and the right blue; try it and see for yourself. Holding down the left mouse button and moving the pointer around within the left square changes the green and blue values but leaves the red alone. If this is still a bit too much to grasp don't worry. It is, in any case, practice that is called for and this method of selecting colours 'by eye' quickly becomes intuitive if you use it often.

#### **Palette Management**

DigiPaint, going its own unique way as usual, also provides a 'Tone' selector showing all of the tones or 'values'



#### **Waterfall**

"Waterfall" (above) is one of the pictures included on the Deluxe Paint III Art Disk. It is a beautiful example of computer art, showing a bright waterfall flowing through dark and mysterious undergrowth into a pool. To show the way that the Value slider could be used to change a 'ready-made' picture, "WaterfallLight" (left) was produced. Now the pool and surrounding vegetation is dappled with light and even the moss is glowing in the sunshine. A simple effect but it has to be handled with care and subtlety otherwise it will just look as if you have turned up the brightness knob on the monitor. In this case the foreground leaves were made much brighter green and those in the background together with the moss much less so. The blues in the water were given more Value but the greys of the rocks were left exactly the same. Using the same picture from your disk, or another, try to get the same effect.

In contrast. "WaterfallWierd" (bottom right) shows a much more dramatic transformation after meddling with the Hue slider. Initially, the intention was to produce a moonlit scene, but the red vegetation looked so strange that the effect had to be heightened by making the water green. In this way the mood of a picture can be completely changed with little effort. The trick is not to overdo things! available for each of the 16 register colours (see sidebox 'HAM and SHAM' on the previous page), and a 'Range' selector showing the spread of 8 colours used for the Range drawing mode. Photon Paint provides instead a palette of 48 colours in addition to the 16 register colours. These can be defined by the user to set up a more limited or 'working' palette that can be returned to frequently and used throughout a painting so as to impose a visual style and continuity.

This is a traditional painting technique that will be familiar to conventional artists and designers, and provides a useful transition for users of *Deluxe Paint* moving to HAM painting. Sometimes choosing from the full range of 4096 colours is more than a bit formidable.

Non-HAM painting systems like Deluxe Paint or Zoetrope are constrained to a total of 32 colours maximum so the concept of a limited or 'managed' palette must be accepted and absorbed without delay. Deluxe Paint and Photon Paint both provide several tools that aid palette management. Individual colours can be modified with the RGB/HSV sliders and moved or exchanged with others on the palette. A spread of tones between two colours can be produced based on RGB values (and even on HSV values in Photon Paint).

In Photon Paint it is usually easy to find exactly the right colour from the colour squares, but in Deluxe Paint, with only the sliders, it can be quite difficult. One way to produce the colour you want is to make a spread of four or more shades between the two colours that are closest, then

choose the most suitable of these new shades to modify with the sliders. In this way a range of earth tones can be formed from black and orange, or sky blue from pure blue and cyan. Gradually in this way a palette with three or four ranges of colours is built up before you even start painting.

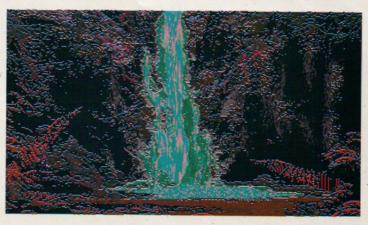
When you create a particularly good palette you might find it useful to save a small brush from the painting with a suitable name – Earth & Trees – Flesh Tones – Sea & Sky, or whatever. Create a 'Palettes' drawer which you can keep permanently at your disposal.

As you produce more paintings and gain greater skill you will build up a whole range of palettes that will save time later. In the meantime, look at the colours used to produce the pictures on the Art Disk that accompanied the program that you use. These can be carried over to your own paintings or used to start new works. Alternatively, before you start your own work try changing the palettes of pictures on the Art Disk. This can be very informative and is the basis of this month's tutorials.

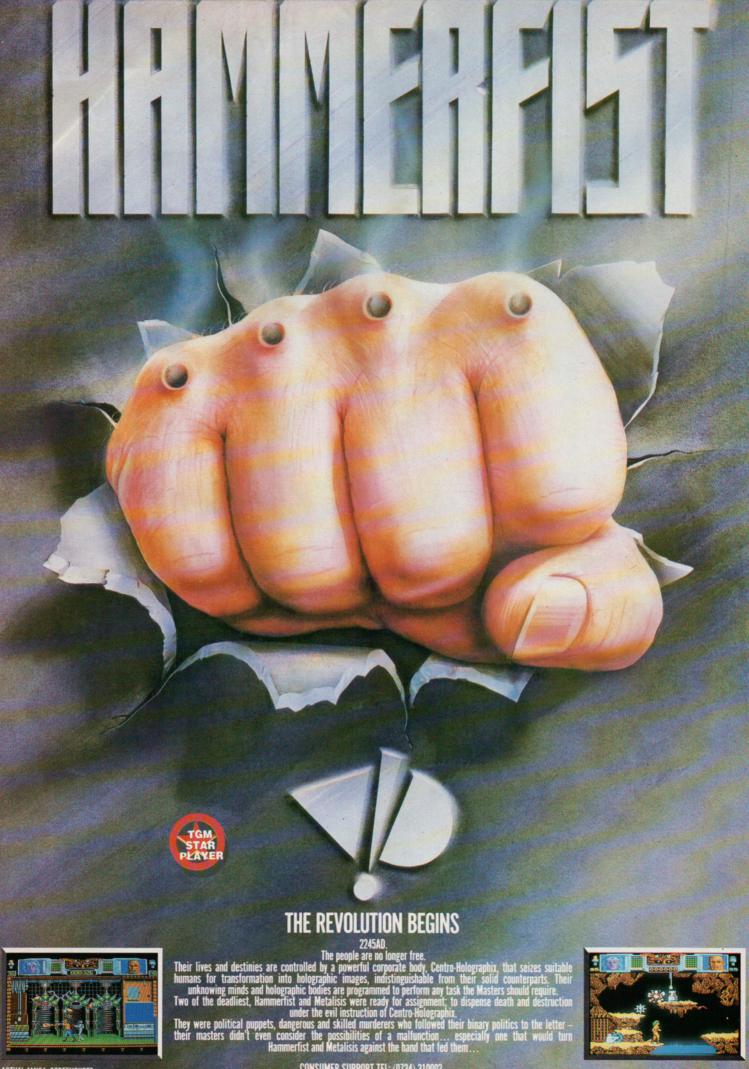
#### Conclusion

Using the Amiga, some good painting software and the techniques described here we can make a good start on any picture. Nevertheless, to return to dear old Howard Hodgkin, it really is neccessary to take time to contemplate what you are doing.

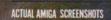
All too much of the artwork produced on computers by amateurs and professionals alike is dross - slick and plastic and meaningless. In many ways this is a product of the medium itself. Its very accessibility and speed mean that many more images can be produced and even quite unskilled people can paint slick-looking objects. This is where we need to be quite selective - don't always go for the bright, smooth look. Let your pictures look rough and 'worked'. Use more of the rich, deep tones and not just the saturated ones - or alternatively try painting with pastel shades, or a mix of the two; that way you will introduce more 'depth' into your Contemplate your palette!

here are two qualities that colour digitisers either do or do not have. The first quality is real-time grabbing: if they are real-time, they can grab still pictures of moving objects, which generally means they must work at about the same frame rate as a video recorder, 50 frames a second. If they are not real-time, they must grab from a static object.

The second quality is full-colour: if they are full-colour, they can read a colour composite signal from a video camera, but if they are not, they must build up a colour image from three separate red, green ad blue images. Now, though the technology involved in a full-colour real-time digitiser is well impressive, the results are not necessarily going to be superior to a good, old-fashioned jobbie possessing neither of these qualities.

So, for the purpose of this feature we'll assume that you've been out to the shops and come home with what I consider to be the best digitiser on the Amiga market – Newtek's Digi-View 4 at around £150. You have also purchased a black-and-white video camera with a composite signal. At Photofile we use a Vidicon camera made by Norbain Imaging, but a Panasonic WV 1410 is ideal at about £220. Right, so what's next?

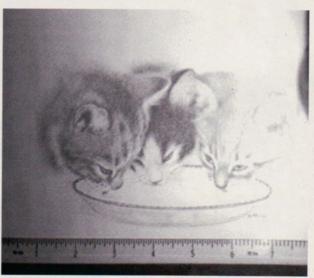
Before you do anything else, put that stuff down, go back to the shops, take out your whimpering wallet and get yourself one or two more rather important things.

#### **Don't Skimp on Lighting**

Firstly, and possibly most importantly, you'll need good lighting. For the best results at least three and preferably four separate light sources should be used. Anglepoise lamps are ideal — they are easily adjustable and can be swung out of the way when not in use. If you can, try to get two sets of two lamps with one set having a wider spread of light than the other.

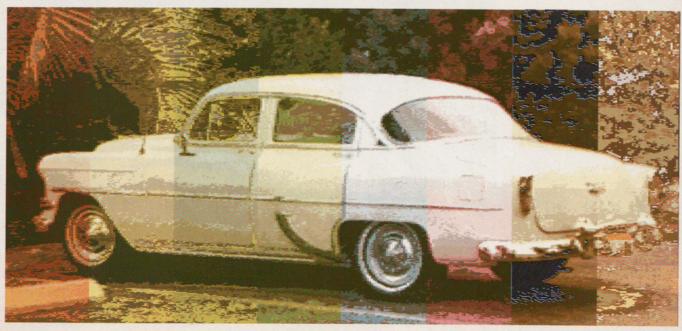

Sometimes pictures or objects will benefit from different light intensities, but rarely enough to warrant using different bulb wattages.

Next, you need some light bulbs. This may sound like obvious advice but, believe me, light is the key to good digitising. Digitisers pick up and exaggerate gradations of light intensity which you wouldn't notice on your original picture, but which become clearly visible on your digitised image. (See the picture on the left called "Light Fall-off"). What's more, normal household light bulbs actually give off yellow light, so when digitising large white or very light areas, shades of white tend to become shades of pale yellow!

Fortunately, there are ways around these problems. The first is to





use the sort of anglepoise lamp which takes small fluorescent tube lights. These give a much more even spread of light. However, you might have to pay up to £20 each for these tubes!

There is another alternative, one which we favour at Photofile. We use special light bulbs that simulate daylight. They're the sort used by artists when natural light fades and their advantage is that they show true colour. That is, they are fitted with a special colour correcting tinted glass that acts as a filter emitting an enhanced spectrum. The only problem is that these bulbs come from France and don't seem to be widely available here.

We tracked down a supplier in Loughborough called Spencely Barker who import these wonderful things and sell them to us for about £4.00 each. Spencely Barker supply bulbs by mail order: you can contact them on (0509) 231945. Ideally, use 75 watt bulbs: don't go for bulbs of over 100 watts or you'll have the corners of your pictures curling up from the heat! A piece of glass placed over the picture will stop this, but may cause you problems with reflections from the lights and camera.

#### **A Steady Hand**

When digitising you must keep your camera absolutely steady for up to five minutes at a time, so it's no use balancing it, teetering, on top of a pile of books! Copy stands are handy but very expensive and illuminated ones even more so. You can pay anything up to £500 or more for a top-of-the-range, four light-point model.

A cheaper and in many ways better alternative is to get yourself a tripod. You should be able to pick up a decent one for well under £50. Make sure it has a pan-and-tilt head for easy adjustment and can be pointed directly downwards at a subject. Tripods also have the advantage of being portable, unlike huge and unwieldy copy stands.

Digi-View 4 and other digitisers of this genre utilise a coloured wheel

comprising of a red, green and blue filter. The wheel is manually rotated during the digitising process and one shot of the subject is taken through each of the coloured filters. The digitiser's own software then very cleverly combines the three shots to produce a full colour picture from a black and white camera. A problem can arise here when manually rotating the filter wheel. If the camera or target image is accidentally jarred and moved even a millimeter, then the target will be displayed with a red, green or blue halo around it and you will have to start the whole process again! (See the picture of the halo effect above, called "Halo Effect).

A simple but expensive way round this problem is to get yourself an RGB splitter such as the Print Technik model, available from HB Marketing for £99 plus VAT. The splitter device is simply inserted in the cable line between the camera and computer and eliminates the need for a filter

wheel altogether by doing its job for it electronically. Another advantage of the splitter is that with it you can digitise colour pictures from a video (provided the video has a good still frame).

Another option, which is open to Digiview users only, is to use a Digi-Droid. At around £60 this little chap connects to your joystick port and, via a long lead, turns a motorised filter wheel which is attached to your video camera. When told to do its stuff, the droid will scan red, move the filter wheel round and repeat the process for the other two colours while you put the kettle on. Not only does this save time, it also removes any chance of you jarring the set-up.

If the floor is not completely steady even the vibrations caused by someone walking near the active digitiser can be enough to cause the halo effect, so try to choose a solid floor for your new studio. Check the firmness of your floor by placing a glass of water on your digitising table, then walk around the room watching for ripples. You can actually make use of the "halo technique" to create an interesting effect. Try digitising a small object through the red filter, move the object slightly and digitise it through the green filter. You will have created a 3D image suitable for viewing through 3D glasses. (Again, see the picture below called "3D").

#### **Less is More**

The easiest subjects to digitise are photographs and the smaller the piccie the better. The smaller the area to be digitised the closer the camera can be positioned to the target and

the more detail can be captured. Also the possibility of uneven lighting is quite simply minimised.

When digitising rectangular pictures, such as photographs, it's often better to move the camera closer to the target and crop the picture horizontally or vertically to eliminate borders. If you have to leave a border around the picture and the backdrop is going to be exposed, there is an important point to remember and one which will make a lot of difference to the result. If you're digitising a picture that uses a lot of greens, make sure your backdrop is green, for oranges use orange and so on.

This is because the digitiser, in anything but HAM mode, is using a very limited number of colours and will use the most prominent ones. If you use, say, an orange backdrop behind a picture with no orange in it, you are wasting colours which could have given your picture more detail. You may even find that some of the lesser-used colours in your picture have been changed to that of the backdrop. (A startling example of this is shown by the pictures "Backdrop Right and Backdrop Wrong").

#### **Green for Envy**

When digitising high-contrast monochrome pictures you will find that light grey detail is lost in areas of bright white. Adjusting the contrast and brightness control will help, but it's a fiddly job and you may find that the white area has to be darkened too much before the grey detail is plainly visible. A much better result will be obtained by digitising the picture at a brightness slightly greater than you would normally use, but through the green filter on your colour wheel. The green filter picks up the grey detail well and darkens the bright areas slightly. Try it, it really works. (Again, see the samples on this page, "Cat Clear and Cat Green").

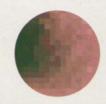
#### Hold to Slide

Slides can also be digitised, but frankly it's hard work. Cine-to-video

back-project a slide onto a screen, via a half-mirror, won't work. This is because, though you won't be able to see it beforehand, your image once digitised will appear extremely bright in the centre, darkening steadily to the outer edges. The same problem will occur if you digitise from a slide viewer. Pictures obtained simply by digitising an image projected onto a screen produce terrible results.

transfer devices such as those which

If you really need to digitise slides you will have to replace the lens on your video camera (probably 8 or

16mm) with a 25mm lens (£50 up). This will produce an undistorted picture from a 35mm x 24mm slide. You will also need something to hold the slide while it's digitised. The type of slide copier that attaches to the end of a camera lens is excellent but, unfortunately, no good for colour shots because there is nowhere for the coloured filter wheel to be fixed between the lens and the slide.

Of course, if you have an RGB splitter, you're laughing because you don't need a filter wheel and a standard slide copier is all the equipment you need to buy. If you're not that fortunate you must use your ingenuity to construct something to hold the slide. A 25mm lens should give you a distance of about three inches between lens and slide, leaving plenty of room for the filter wheel. You will need to place a piece of light-diffusing glass (available from any photographic shop) between the slide and your light source. Your slide projector uses a halogen bulb and is an ideal light source. Try to avoid projecting the light from a projector directly into your eyes. If you do, your poor old peepers will probably fall out!

Of course, if you can't afford a digitising set-up of your own or you only need the occasional picture, Carl and the chaps at Photofile are happy to digitise your pictures for you. You can find details of their digitising service in their advertisements.

Meanwhile, now that you know how to digitise well, look out for Brian Larkman's forthcoming tutorial in which he will explain how to use, improve and generally play about with your digitised images to best effect. ■

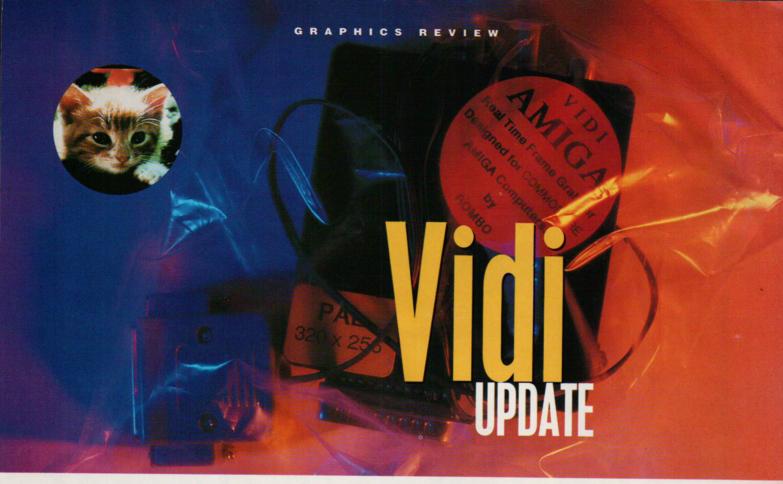

ince our review of the VIDI-Amiga video digitiser in Issue 3 of Amiga Format, Rombo have been hard at work producing upgrades to what was even then an excellent product. The first of these upgrades to arrive comes in the form of VIDI-Chrome, a software-based package that promises to bring colour to your digitised artwork.

#### **VIDI Overview**

The original VIDI was a mono affair that could only grab images in NTSC resolution with 16 grey-scales. Since then the VIDI hardware has been upgraded to support a much more useable PAL-resolution screen. Other changes to the VIDI hardware include the change of power supply source; the original VIDI drew its power from the joystick port, but the new VIDI has now been updated to draw power from the external disk-drive port. According to Rombo, this change was neccessary because some Amigas (mostly newer models) are unable to supply the extra 50mA required to power VIDI.

With the arrival of VIDI-Chrome, your mono VIDI digitiser can now grab images in marvellous technicolour. The VIDI-Chrome package consists of a single program disk containing the VIDI-Chrome software, a couple of demo pictures, a brief manual (or should that be pamphlet?) and a set of three colour filters.

As you have probably already guessed, VIDI-Chrome employs the famous system of red, green and blue filters to grab separations of the same image. These separations are then combined to produce the result-

ing image. Thanks to VIDI's impressive speed of operation, this usually tedious process is made considerably less tedious.

#### **Colour Control**

If you buy VIDI Amiga as a complete system comprising of the VIDI hardware and VIDI-Chrome software, you actually get two separate versions of the grabbing software. The first,

which is bundled with the VIDI hardware, grabs images in 16 greyscales and the second (which arrives in a separate package) handles colour grabbing.

Grabbing a colour image with VIDI-Chrome is simplicity itself. Just like Digi-View, red, green or blue separations may be grabbed simply by choosing the appropriate menu option. However, unlike Digi-View, VIDI

continuously grabs frames until you click the mouse button to stop, therefore allowing you to alter the brightness and contrast of the incoming signal to produce the best possible separation. Once you've grabbed all three separations, clicking on the 'Display HAM' menu option will combine the three separations into the final image.

The digitising process is made considerably simpler with the inclusion of a 'Grab HAM' option which allows you to grab all three separations from a single menu option. Click on Grab HAM and VIDI starts to grab



red frames - once you're happy with the separation being displayed, click the mouse button and VIDI then starts to grab green frames - click on the mouse again and VIDI starts to grab the blue frames. A final click of the mouse button ends the digitising process and the final image is produced.

On the whole, the HAM images that VIDI produces are of high quality. However, VIDI images do seem to suffer from HAM fringing, something that the original Digi-View suffered from. With the additional purchase of an image processing package such Progressive's as PIXmate. this can be reduced. Although the captured images aren't up to par with those produced by NewTek's digitiser, the tradeoff in quality is compensated for by its fast operation - being able to adjust the brightness and contrast of the digitised image while the digitiser continually grabs frames



in real time can be a real time-saver. With NewTek's unit, you could never quite be sure if the image you were grabbing was precisely what you required - if you wanted to adjust either the brightness or constrast of the incoming signal, the only practical way of doing this was to feed the video signal into the back of your monitor and use your monitor's CVBS switch to display the signal directly from its source.

#### Conclusion

VIDI-Amiga is ideally suited to the home user who owns a single drive



Amiga 500 with a half megabyte of RAM and wishes to grab images from their home video recorder. While the basic mono VIDI will happily grab images from a video recorder, don't think for one minute that VIDI will grab colour images from that same video recorder - you'll need to buy a RGB splitter (£100) before you can even start thinking about such things (the same is also true of Digi-View). If do you wish to use the extra facilities available within the VIDI-Chrome package to grab colour images, you're going to need to purchase a mono video camera.

Due to the nature of the A/D converter used by VIDI, the images that it produces can never hope to compare to those produced by Digi-View, although they do get close! However, Digi-View has the disadvantage of being somewhat unusable without at least a megabyte of RAM (even then, you still won't be able to use NewTek's new Dynamic screen modes as seen in the latest release of Digi-View!) Even though Digi-View can be used in conjunction with a video recorder, images of acceptable quality aren't really obtainable without the addition of a monochrome camera such as the Hitachi MV-720K.

Digi-View has the added advantage of being able to grab images in just about every resolution under the sun. If you can name a combination of colours and resolution, chances are that Digi-View can grab an image for you in that format; 2, 16, 32, 4096 or even 22 million colours (for output to a video frame buffer), Digi-View can



handle the lot! VIDI images are unfortunately limited to low resolution only.

If your primary reason for purchasing a video digitiser is to grab images in full colour, then there is still only one real choice for under £150 -Digi-View. NewTek have managed to refine their product to such a high degree that it has become almost unbeatable.

Although Digi-View is slow (unbearably so, at times!) the images that it produces cannot be touched (even JCL's SuperPic and Marcam's FrameGrabber cannot produce images of such quality). If, on the other hand, you need to be able to grab mono images from any composite video source and will occasionally want to grab colour images using a video camera, then VIDI Amiga is well worth considering.

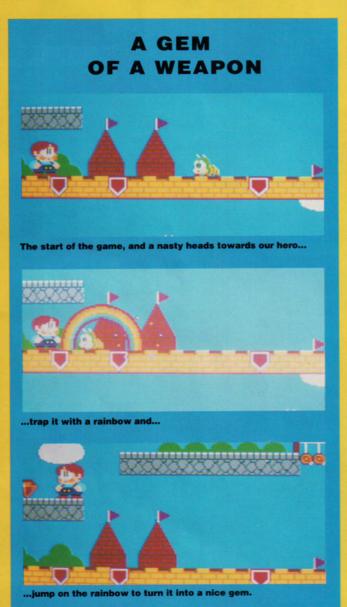

#### Jumping into exploding stars is effectively the same as a smart OCEAN £24.99 ■ Joystick



fter much confusion and uncertainty, this fantastic conversion of the Taito coin-op has finally arrived on the Ocean label.

The stars of this one or two player game are two characters called Bub and Bob (no relation) who you may remember from their earlier adventures in a Firebird game called Bubble Bobble. They were turned into bubble-blowing brontosauri by the evil Boss of Shadow and only after much struggling did they regain human form. It was then they decided to get away from it all, to live in peace and tranquillity on an archipelago known as The Rainbow Islands.

Unfortunately, the Boss of Shadow found their hideout. With the help of his minions he has rounded up all the inhabitants of the islands and is holding them prisoner. Naturally, only Bub and Bob can rescue them.

There are seven islands in all (one for each colour of the rainbow) and each island is made up of four stages with an end-of-level guardian sitting at the top of the last stage. It's a vertically-scrolling platform game in which you guide your character to the top of each level. Of course it's not that easy as the BoS has loads of his minions running and flying around and contact with any of these causes you to lose one of your four lives.

To combat the baddies you're armed with - guess what? - rainbows. Hitting a baddie with a rainbow causes it to turn into a juicy lump of fruit or cream cake or flower or something of that ilk and collecting the goodies (no relation)

scores you points. There's an added advantage in that every third baddie killed turns into a magical item - such as running shoes to speed up your character, or potion bottles which increase the speed and reach of your rainbows (first doubles then triples). Then there are other random items which give you a small fairy drone, and, if you're really lucky, ones that bring huge bags of points flooding from top of screen.

As well as being a weapon, your rainbows are also extremely useful as bridges, so you can shoot them out and walk across them to reach other platforms. There is a problem with the rainbows though - you can't jump onto them and they disappear after a while.

Then there are the diamonds. Occasionally a killed baddie will turn into a coloured diamond which you can collect for extra points (pick them up in the right order and secret rooms are revealed at the end of the island).

Run, jump and work your way up the screen - but don't take too long or the baddies turn red and angry and speed up. If you're really tardy, water rises from the bottom of the screen to drown you when it covers your head.

#### **INGENIOUS DEVILS**

The Japanese really have turned coin-op games designing into an art form and they are so devious at it! Remember *Space Invaders*, in which you had to hit the spaceship exactly on every 22nd shot so that you could get a guaranteed bonus of 300 points?

Well, the intricacies of game design have come a long way since those early days, but the Japanese designers are still just as devious. Recently, games like Super Mario Bros and New Zealand Story have been full of little extras for the player to discover – and Rainbow Islands is no exception.

There are warps to find, secret rooms, extra bonuses and a whole heap of sub-games to play once you really get stuck into it. Should you manage to complete the game you can then spend months trying to find all the weird and wonderful tricks that are there: but naturally you're not given any clues to how you can find them.

Just to get you started off, though, here's a little hint. Try collecting all the diamonds in the order of the colours of the rainbow – starting with red, then orange, and so on all the way to violet. Do this all on one world and you can get to the secret room.

Remember, you can determine which colour a diamond will be by killing a baddie on a certain part of the screen, i.e. kill a baddie on the far left of the screen and it'll produce a red diamond – kill one on the far right and it'll produce a violet one. All the other colours are in between the two. **Andy Smith** 

#### **GRAPHICS AND SOUND**

As you'd expect, the graphics are very cute – all the nasties look harmless enough until you run into them. They're also very bright and colourful and everything has been well drawn and animated. The jaunty soundtrack is great and the occasional effects are fine. A great cutesy game that's an audio visual treat.

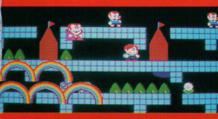

# HEREWITH THE CLUES

ere is a game that is out of the ordinary. It's a murder mystery based on a package presented by Dennis 'The Devil Rides Out' Wheatley. The idea of the pack is that you get a load of photographs, pieces of evidence, letters and other bumpf and have to solve a murder — and once you reckon you know who did it, you open a sealed envelope and see if you've got the solution right.

So how do you play this on a computer? Well, what CRL have

done is digitise all the info from the pack and the player accesses the info by clicking on various parts of the screen which shows all the stuff laid out on a table.

The plot, then. You are the Assistant Commissioner of the anti-terrorist squad in pre-war London. A murder has just been committed in a nightclub. This proves to be messier than it at first sounds: the anti-terrorist squad has been watching the premises for a while because

some known IRA sympathisers have been using the club, which has a secret room at the rear, for their meetings.

The murdered man is one Serge Orloff, owner of the club, who's also in with the gang of 16 subversives. The problem was, Serge had been helping the police with their inquiries because he was afraid of being deported back to Russia for other crimes.

After reading the reports from your assistant, who believes the murder was committed by a member of the group, you're left with two things to do. Firstly, identify the murderer and secondly, discover which members of the group were in the secret room at the time of the murder. The second part of the task is necessary because explosives and so on were found in the secret room: so they can then be charged with 'conspiracy and complicity in the manufacture of infernal machines for felonious purposes'.

Once that's done, you'll have to get in touch with CRL who'll enter you into a competition and reveal the solution. **Andy Smith**

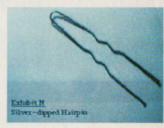

rench house Coktel Vision are certainly milking the Paris-Dakar licence: they released a game last year called African Raiders that was based on the famous race, and now they present another one.

There are three skill levels to this driving game in which

all the action is viewed from the cockpit. That means you can choose between three cars that have increasingly better performance and increasingly worse handling. It's a six stage game in which you have to finish each stage in the fastest possible time. The start of the race – keep between the stones and go as fast as possible.



Normally the route you should take is marked out with small stones. However, stages two and four are across country, so you just head in the general direction of the finish and try not to bump into too many boulders or other big, solid obstacles along the way.

# TYPHOON THOMPSON

he year is 2124 and men have boldly gone where no man has gone before, out into the far reaches of space. Even passenger craft make trips to distant galaxies. But it pays not to be too blasé about space travel where the ocean planet of Aguar, in the Omega sector, is concerned.

Aguar was the last known location of Inter-galactic Flight 396, which left a faint signal as hope of survivors. Many trips have been made to Aguar to find the survivors, but all have been destroyed by the mischievous and deadly sea-sprites. Those that managed any communication told of a single child held prisoner by the sprites and of the strange spirit guardians that tried to help them rescue the child (without much success).

You play Typhoon Thompson (no relation), a reluctant hero who has been tricked into attempting a rescue. Riding a small Jet-Sled and armed initially with a laser cannon. you must tempt the sprite flyers out of their islands, blast them and pick them out of the water before they can swim back to safety. Once all the sprites have been caught you can hold them hostage until the head sprite of the village gives up one of the four artifacts you need to rescue the baby. Returning the artifacts to the spirits gives you another weapon to help you defeat the sprites, such as scatter bombs, sprite magnets or freeze-bombs.

Once you have all four artifacts, you can take on the spriteflyers of the last village before freeing the child. Maff Evans

#### **GRAPHICS AND SOUND**

Despite their diminutive appearance the graphics are full of character and humour. Every object and action in the game has such realistic animation, as well as a few additional touches to add a little extra polish.

The start sequences and end-of-level scenes are extremely funny, especially if your sense of humour is a bit on the silly side! The 3D motion and scrolling is also excellent, both smooth and effective, giving a true feeling of skipping over the sea's surface. The sound consists of a few warbling ditties and pings which, while fitting the game very well, won't exactly set the Amiga music enthusiast's pulse racing.

#### **LASTING INTEREST**

Every time you play the game the animation sequences are altered, so that it's like watching an ever-changing slapstick cartoon. Once the novelty of the cute animation has worn off, you find a thoroughly playable action game which screams out for more than its fair share of attention. The game is a little easy to complete after practice, but it's such a joy to play that you'll be unable to tear yourself away from the machine until you do!

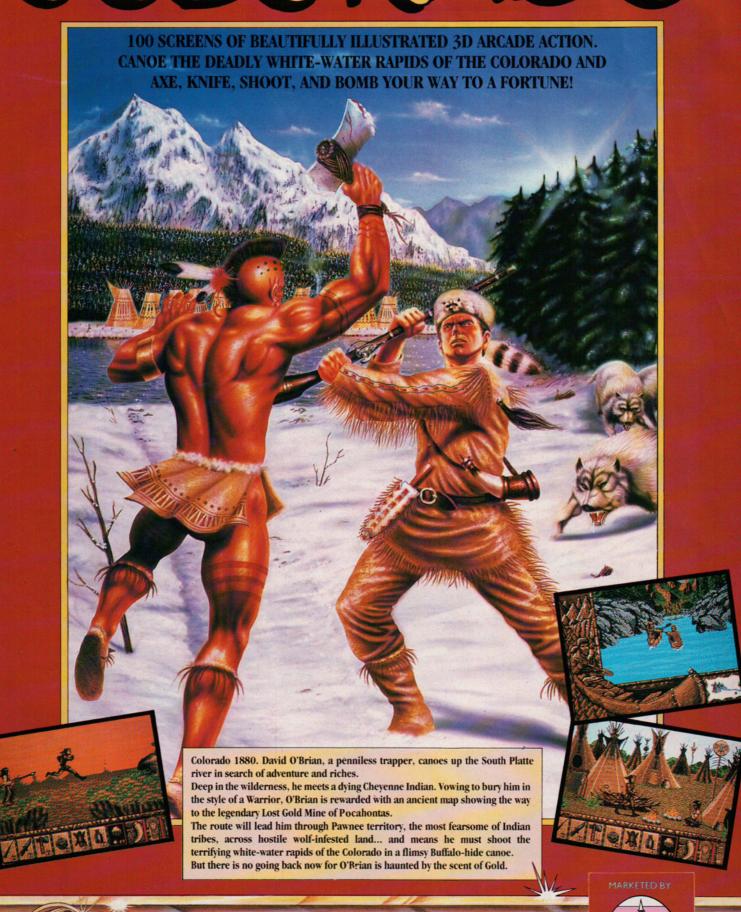

screen single-colour originals. Unfortunately the scrolling means that you have to be pretty au fait with the original to get anywhere, since you can't see what's coming or plan your routes acordingly.

Timing is the essence of the game, but as the suped-up version's sprites trundle out of view frequently it gives the mining novice quite a challenge to get this right. Fans of the original are in for a disappointment: the feel has been warped to extremes. The timings are off, the methods barely work and the conveyor belts don't act as in the original, so that screens like 'Miner Willy Meets the Kong Beast' are now virtually impossible.

It would have been nice to play Manic Miner again just for a bit of nostalgia, but this version has none of the spark that made the original fun. Maff Evans

he American Sherman tank and all its variants did sterling service for the allies during World War II, so for all those of you who've dreamt of getting to grips with one of the ugly brutes, here's your chance.

It's a one player game containing three scenarios based on actual battles and campaigns in which Shermans played an important part. The first is The Normandy Landings, in which the Sherman is in an aggressive role: five single scenarios can be played individually in any order or all five can be played one after the other to form a sort of campaign game. The other scenarios are The Ardennes, where Hitler launched a massive tank offensive, so your role is far more defensive;

and North Africa, where things are much more strategic.

Once you've decided which to play, you can alter the game's perameters to suit; that is, alter the enemy's difficulty levels and so on. Do all that and you then get your instructions from the Sarge before setting off.

Playing the game involves managing four tanks and achieving the specified objective. The first Normandy mission requires you to knock out a couple of enemy bunkers and then take control of an enemy camp. A map of the location is provided - giving orders to the tanks is simplicity itself. Simply select the destination and the tank goes trundling towards it - once all four are away you can jump into the command seat of any one of them simply by pressing a key. Then you can take control if you wish and fight the enemy yourself or just sit and watch. The autopilot can be switched back on just as easily.

Remember when playing the campaign game that you only have four tanks with which to complete the game and once one tank is out of action, it's out of action for good. That's not a problem if you play the scenarios one after the other however, because you're given four at the start of each regardless of how well you did in the last scenario. **Andy Smith** 

#### **GRAPHICS AND SOUND**

The graphics really are very good – very fast filled 3D with options for other views as well as the usual driver's eye view. The sound isn't so hot, but it's adequate. Fast and well animated – a good looker.

#### **LASTING INTEREST**

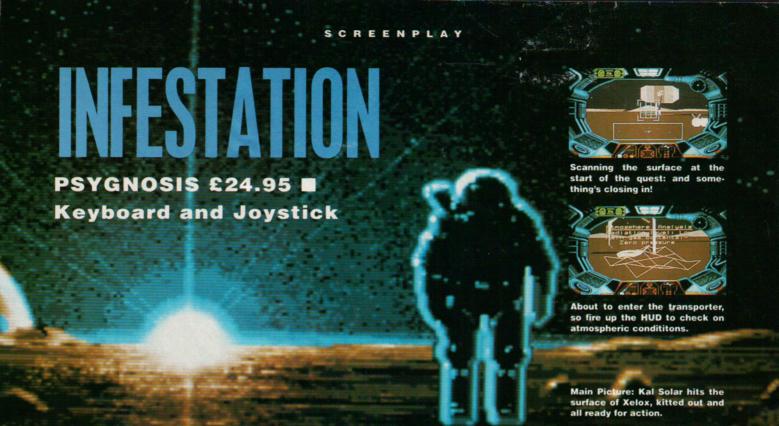

Infestation draws its inspiration from the film in both claustrophobic atmosphere and storyline, telling of research station Alpha II on the moon of Xelos.

Recent transmissions from the station have become garbled and unintelligible. The only thread running through the messages tells of a violent life form that has been laying eggs all over the complex eggs that hatch into deadly insectoid warriors. The diminishing crew has tried to eliminate as many of the eggs as possible, but there are simply too many for them to handle with the meagre equipment they have to hand.

Enter your character - Kal Solar, mercenary soldier, trouble shooter and all-round hero. The

game takes place in a filled-3D environment, commencing with Kal being dropped onto the barren surface of Xelos, armed with a handful of Cyanide cartridges with which to dispose of the eggs, a pressure suit, a Manned Manoeuvring Unit (MMU) which allows him to hover above the moon's surface and a pulse rifle for disposing of the occasional enemy-controlled drone.

You must find your way into the complex and travel around dropping cyanide cartridges in the proximity of the alien eggs. Easy enough? Not with alien-controlled droids out to kill you, not to mention the condition of the complex itself: blacked-out corridors, radiation leaks and areas of zero pressure. All around the complex you may find discarded items of technology, which will undoubtedly come in useful at some point.

But take care: you mustn't fail! The safety of the universe is in your hands... now where have we heard that before? Maff Evans

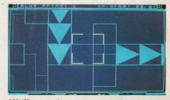

aking a rest from their usual style, 1940s serial-orientated games, Cinemaware have once again turned to the US TV sports channels to bring us a second sports sim, TV Sports Basketball.

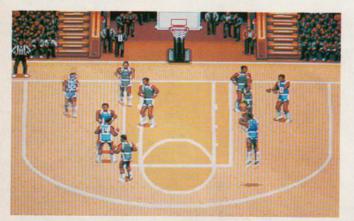
Following in the same vein as their previous sports release, TV Sports Football, the game places you as a player or manager (or even both, should you be so inclined) in an American basketball league. You can either opt to play as an established US league team complete with its own set of players, or perhaps design your own team from scratch.

Those not wishing to take up any excercise – be it computerised or otherwise – can just

watch their team carry out the set tactics and shuffle the figures around depending on the results.

If you feel left out of the action you can always jump in and start controlling the team directly. If, on the other hand, you feel like putting yourself in the shoes of a single player and following him through his career then you can select the 'role playing' section.

The pattern of play in the league follows very closely the pattern of the actual American basketball league, the top teams from each division qualifying for the play-offs, which may even lead to playing in the World Series – but only if you're good enough! **Maff Evans**

As you would expect, Cinemaware have done the business in the presentation department. The intro screens are humourous, the animation is superb and the music is atmospheric. All the usual touches such as the wacky promoters and charismatic TV presenter have been included, as well as extra features like cleaners sweeping up pieces of broken backboard in the distance. The overall feel is very much in the American TV mould - even the programming credits read like the end credits of a TV show!

#### LASTING INTEREST

The wealth of options initially presented to the player makes it seem as though there is a good deal to keep you playing, but unless you have a large supply of friends to play against in the league or you prefer watching the computer plays the games for you then you'll soon wander off to find something else to lavish your attention on.

The whole thing is rather like watching a cartoon of a game of basketball rather than actively taking part – the computer does far too much, which prevents the player from getting seriously involved. Only dedicated 'manager' fans will find the game enthralling enough to capture their attention for more than a few hours.

#### JUDGEMENT

The dividing line between an accurate simulation and a playable action game is often considered a narrow one. Unfortunately, Cinemaware's latest offering falls the wrong side of the line. TV Sports Basketball is packed with information to make it one of the most stunningly accurate sports simulations ever, but the actual game sections are severely lacking in gameplay. Stopping the opposite team from storming past your players and scoring every time is virtually impossible - a task which isn't helped by the unruly and badly-implemented control system.

It's hard to believe that the team that brought us the superbly-presented and wonderfully playable TV Sports Football can have come up with a product that's enough to put people off the game of basketball for life. Nice graphics, a myriad of setting and options and slick presentation are all very well, but look a little deeper and all that is left is nothing more than an expensive and frustrating basketball manager game.

The Black Tiger of the title is the character you control: a legendary warrior of heroic status, known more for his powers of destruction than diplomacy. But there's no point being a hero without a guest to fulfill, and Black Tiger's is a corker: three fearsome dragons have risen from the depths of hell, bringing torment upon the world. BT must despatch these creatures and restore civilisation to a more even keel...

The mission takes the form of a platform shoot-em-up, as you

guide BT through six levels of subterranean fantasy settings, spread over many screens scrolling both vertically and horizontally.

Mr Tiger walks along ledges, and can be made to jump across gaps in the scenery and straight up to climb vertical columns of rock. Arrows show the route that needs to be taken to locate the exit, although interesting items and places can be found by moving off the signposted trail.

Each underworld scene plays host to hordes of diabolical creatures, all of whom are out for Black's blood. Successful attacks deprive BT of chunks from his precious energy meter, until eventually his current life comes to an

end. However, Black can defend himself with throwing knives and a particularly vicious blade-on-achain device which is launched at the enemy, yo-yo fashion.

On the enemy's demise, a 'Zenny' cash token is left which can be pocketed. Whenever Black comes across one of the numerous stone men, they spring to life offering some sort of assistance, and occasionally providing the opportunity to buy extra equipment with the Zenny coins: arms and armour, extra energy and time, plus keys are all up for grabs. The keys can then be used to open the locked chest which litter the caverns for whatever reward - beneficial or harmful which wait inside.

On reaching the end of each stage, the inevitable end-of-level guardian (or indeed guardians) must be defeated in order to pass through to the next. Black Tiger has a limited time within which to escape from each level, and the mission continues until Black Tiger has defeated the dragons, or his remaining lives have all been senselessly wasted in pursuit of his quest. #### **GRAPHICS AND SOUND**

Black Tiger might not appeal to the more quality-conscious Amiga owner. The playing area is guite small, and the intrusive jerky background scroll makes play less than fluid.

But there's some nice animation as the enemy creatures as they explode and breath fire. although things can get a little confusing in the heat of battle.

Spot effect and soundtrack do their respective tasks, but are nothing to shout about.

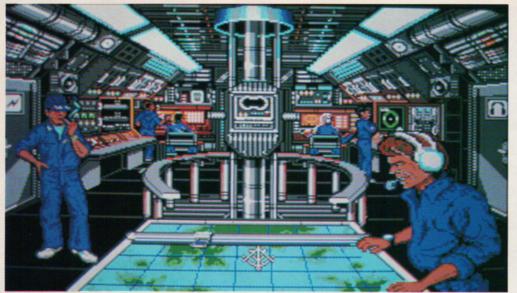

icroProse have had things to themselves for a long time in the submarine simulation market: their aged game Silent Service gave the player a chance to experience the thrills and spills of captaining a World War II sub. Now Electronic Arts bring things right up to date with a simulation of the latest range of American and Soviet subs.

It's mainly a one player game, but on some missions two players can play head-to-head via modem, each controlling a different side's sub. There are 10 missions in total (although the first is merely a practice mission) which may not sound like much but, as anyone who's played this sort of game will know, one mission can last a very long time. Moreover, once you have played them in the American sub you can play them again in the Soviet one, effectively doubling the number of missions.

The whole game is played and controlled from a main screen depicting the inside of your sub. By moving the mouse over certain members of your crew and clicking, you reveal different areas of the sub. The areas include the radio room where orders are sent and received, the navigation room where waypoints and so on are

set, the engine room, torpedo control, damage control, the sonar room and the periscope. Obviously the options available in each room vary, but the act of switching between rooms simply involves hitting a function key.

Once you've got your orders and have decided on a strategy the first thing to do is jump from room to room and complete all the necessary tasks. Then you can switch on all the latest gadgetry (things like the contour computer, which gives you a constantly-updated image of the surrounding sea bed) and settle back for some nail-biting tension. **Andy Smith**

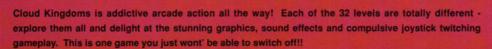

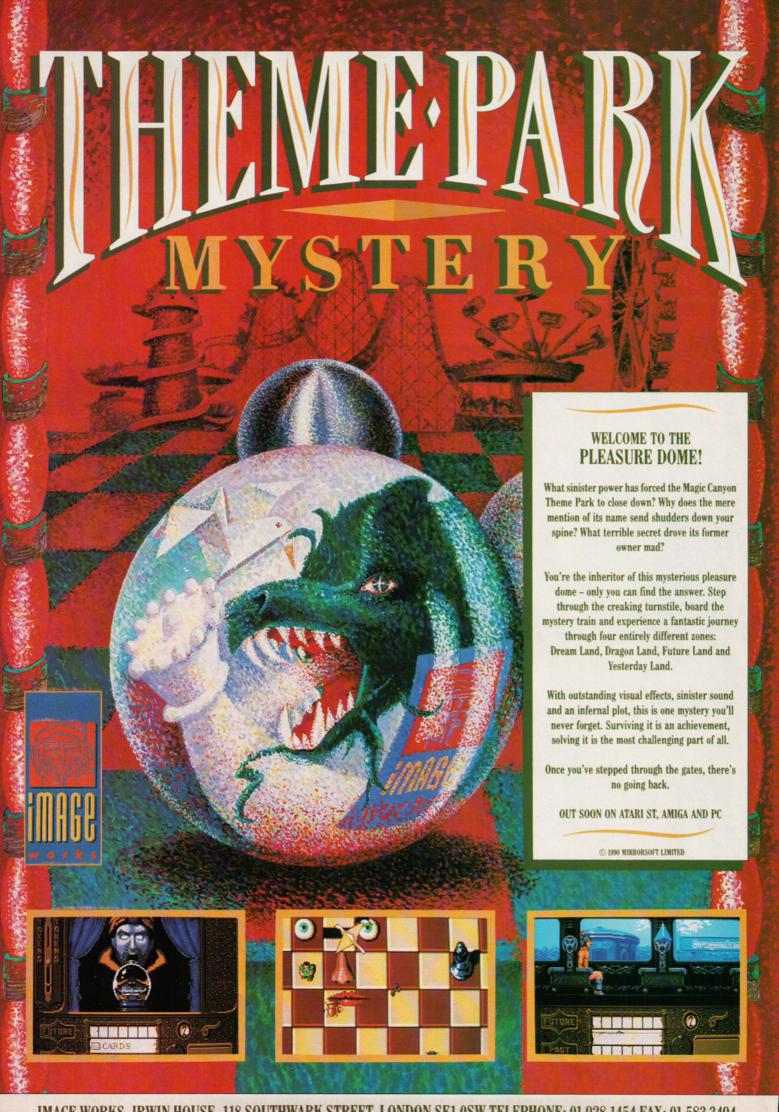

ust because you're relatively new to the scene doesn't mean you have to produce something radical, does it? German new boys Thalion don't think so.

In fact, simple puzzle games seem to be making something of a come back, what with Pipe Mania last month and Atomix this month. And like Pipe Mania, Atomix takes a couple of ideas from previous games and modifies them to suit. The game is made up of 30 levels and on each level the objective is to manipulate a set number of atoms into a molecule: for example, the first level sees you moving

two hydrogen atoms onto an oxygen atom to make water.

Unfortunately, the atoms can't just be plonked any old how - they have to fit together properly, as shown in a picture on the bottom left of the screen. The other problem is that once you've picked up an atom with the square cursor you can't move it around as you wish. Push the joystick in a direction and the atom will move in that direction until it runs into either a wall or another atom.

Sounds like you could live with the problem? It's trickier than you'd imagine. And as if that weren't enough, there's also a murderous time limit to compete against. Fail to complete a level and it's game over - and there are no passwords to enable you to restart at the last level. There is, however, a second chance in the form of a trade-in where you can 'spend' 10,000 points in return for another stab at the last level.

As you'd imagine, the chemicals to be built become more complex as you go on, the mazes become more awkward to manoeuvre around (often you're left with only one possible place in which to actually build the thing) and the time limit never gets easier. Andy Smith

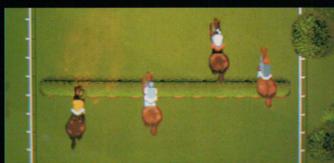

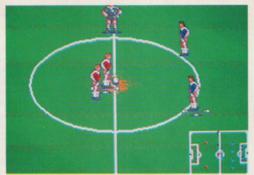

Even Anco, publishers of Kick Off, tripped themselves up when they tried to enhance the excellent original (Amiga Format Gold Award, Issue One) with an expansion disk called Extra Time. That went down like a lead balloon because, to quote our review: "it's almost like you can take all the good bits out of Kick Off and play a very average football game". But now there's Player Manager.

There are two very major differences between KO and PM. Kick Off is the best one or two player arcade footy game whereas PM is for the solo player and contains not only an enhanced version of KO, but a whole management game as well.

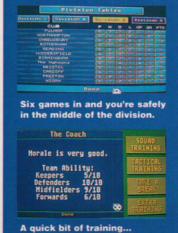

ndy Attacker and Ben Breaker are unlikely names at the best of times, but it's even harder to believe both of them are FBI agents. Then again, when you're designing a coin-op machine's scenario you are allowed some poetic licence.

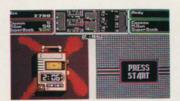
It's a one or two player game converted from the original Sega machine in which Andy and Ben are out to destroy the nefarious Dr K. The action is viewed from above and takes place in the 16 levels of Dr K's fortress, which is infested with his army of biogenetically-engineered humanoids.

The agent's job is to destroy each level of the fortress by dropping three special explosives per level – the exact positions the bombs have to be dropped at are

marked out by large red crosses. Finding the places to drop the bombs involves wandering through the mazes that make up each level and constant referral to the map at the top of the screen.

Finding the crosses is much easier than dealing with the baddies who patrol the levels and come popping out of concealed exits, but there are two ways of dealing with the baddies. The first way is to dodge them, pressing yourself tight up against walls: don't rush too much and this proves to be a good way of avoiding them, as a lot of the baddies follow set patrol patterns. The other way to destroy them is by shooting them with your machine gun and rocket launcher. The limited ammo supplies of each of these weapons can be replenished by walking over extra ammo boxes, which can be found lying around each level.

Plant the bombs and find the exit before the time limit expires and any remaining time is converted into bonus points: then you are ready to move onto the next, harder, level. **Andy Smith**

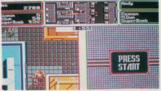

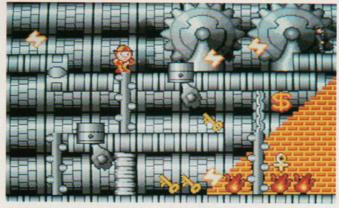

ow often have you wished you were somewhere else when boring relatives come to visit? Well take pity on Kid, because his great uncle Indiana Stallone was one of the most boring relatives anyone could have.

Every Sunday, Kid's family were treated to ridiculously unbelievable anecdotes from the old man, about how he fought off savages in the Amazon jungle, tripped out on the West Coast (California, that is, not Blackpool), visited the Ice Age and fought Gladiators in Egypt. Uncle Indiana was old, but the Ice Age? And were there Gladiators in Egypt? This was all too much for Kid, so one Sunday he scurried out of the room and took refuge in his uncle's study.

Nosing through the junk he found an old dusty pair of boxing gloves and decided to try them on. Admiring himself in a Raging

Bull pose in the mirror, he noticed the gloves sparkling. Thinking that this shouldn't be happening, he tried to take them off, but as soon as they touched there was a bright flash of light and Kid found himself standing in a jungle with a rather unfriendly looking native approaching. Maybe he should have stuck with the boring stories!

In Kid Gloves, you take control of Kid in his attempt to return home. You must fight your way through five time zones, starting in a prehistoric jungle and continuing through ancient Egypt, the Ice Age, London gripped by the industrial revolution and the psychedelic West Coast

Each zone is split into ten screens, each containing a variety of monsters to avoid, obstacles to negotiate and items to collect. Kid can collect keys to open doors barring his way, money to spend in

the shops and food for bonus points. The monsters can be dispatched with a shot from Kid's weapon. This is initially a catapult with two reusable magic coins, but extra weapons such as fire bombs, bouncing 'deathstars' and a powerful laser can be bought from shops found on the way - if Kid has picked up enough money!

Occasionally, tricky situations can be overcome by using a little magic from Kid's limited supply of spells. Using magic causes a random spell to be cast ranging from Sesame, which opens doors, through Safety which causes dangerous obstacles to be rendered harmless, to Frozen, which stops monsters in their tracks.

Once Kid has made his way through all the screens in the five zones, the gloves can tranport him back to home and Uncle Indiana's not-so-boring stories. Maff Evans

'90s Amiga. Generally the tone is of a half-hearted attempt, which in this day and age isn't quite good enough.

#### LASTING INTEREST

Initially, Kid Gloves is great fun to play. Watching Kid in his oversized sportswear jump around making strange noises is most amusing. However, much in the same way as 'classic' (in other words, 'old') platform games worked, the game depends on the player learning patterns and timing for completing of the levels. This is fair enough when you first start playing, but once you've learnt the patterns it becomes incredibly easy to waltz straight through from screen 1 to screen 50 in no time at all

There just isn't enough variety involved from game to game, so once you are proficient at the levels every turn could play just like the last. Not even the most hardened platform fans are going to be happy with a game that loses its appeal too quickly. nor are they likely to return to a game that doesn't provide any challenge after they've seen the different screens.

#### JUDGEMENT

Nowadays, a game set in a familiar mould must try to include that extra spark that pushes it ahead of all the others in the genre. Despite a humorous plot and an attempt to create a cute 'small boy' hero for players to identify with, Kid Gloves is just a basic 'progress from screen to screen' platform game like so many seen in the past. The sound and graphics are acceptable without being special, the gameplay overly simple and the addiction short lived. Even those new to computing and not old enough to remember the original Manic Miner can see the Amiga version to realise how much the format has aged, and sadly Kid Gloves just follows the tradition without providing much interest to leave its mark on the History Book of Software.

#### **GRAPHICS AND SOUND**

The graphics of Kid Gloves have obviously been designed with cuteness and colour in mind, but instead of cute the sprites are just small and the use of colour is a little over the top at times. The backgrounds on the **Egyptian and Californian levels** are so gaudy that it's extremely difficult to see where the walls and floors are supposed to be.

The sound is all right, with some jolly sampled effects, but the music sounds more like a C64 tune circa 1985 rather than

onsidering the Amiga's domination of the low-end desktop video market - a market which it practically started! - it seems almost unbelievable that there is such a shortage of quality video titling packages available in this country. Sure, there are many 'Desktop Presentation' systems available, but if all you want to do is to add titles to your home videos of granny and the kids on the beach, why should you have to pay hundreds of pounds for a 'do it all' package? Chances are that it will probably contain a large number of features that you're never likely to ever want to use anyway!

So what do we need from such a package? Put simply, all that is needed is a program that will allow you to quickly and easily knock up eye-catching screens that can utilise any number of different font styles and effects. Does such a package exist? Up until now, the only packages even worth considering consisted of just three titles (no pun intended) – HB Marketing's Video Generic Master, Aegis' VideoTitler and finally the unacclaimed king of them all, Zuma's TV\*Text.

TV\*Text Professional is the follow up to Zuma's earlier product and offers all the power of the original plus a generous helping of new and improved features. As such, both the price and minimum machine



specification have increased: you will need at least a megabyte even to get started with the program.

# **Screen Modes**

Unlike its predeccesor, TV\*Text Pro supports all Amiga screen resolutions and virtually all Amiga screen modes (excluding HAM). For most titling work you'll probably want to work in high resolution, but if memory constraints get the better of you TV\*Text Pro also supports low resolution (with up to 64 colours), low resolution interlaced and medium resolution (with up to 16 colours). Although TV\*Text Pro allows the use of non-interlaced screen modes, these screens can be interlaced at anytime for improved transportation to video tape.

The Amiga's ability to produce overscanned (borderless) screens is one of the main reasons why the machine has been so successful within the video industry. Any video software that does not support it is looked upon as nothing more than an ameteur toy. Not wishing to disap-

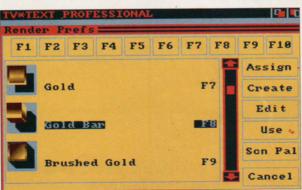

point, TV\*Text Pro supports two degrees of overscan – medium and maximum. A medium overscanned screen will remove a large percentage of the border that normally exists around an Amiga screen. On the other hand, a maximum overscanned screen has virtually no border, making what you see appear to fill the entire display.

#### Fonts

Any video titling package is only as good as the fonts that can be used with it. Zuma have been producing





quality fonts for the Amiga for many years now, so it would be a big surprise if TV\*Text Pro was let down in this department. Thankfully this is most certainly not the case, as the package comes complete with three disks crammed with fonts of varying sizes (ranging from 8 point, right up to a massive 102 point) and styles.

Even if you grow bored with the collection of fonts that Zuma provide, TV\*Text Pro will happily accept any standard Amiga bitmapped fonts (including colour fonts!) such as those which are to be found on your Workbench and Extras 1.3 disks.

This is one particular area of desktop video where the Amiga really shines – if you buy a professional video titler, obtaining extra fonts is a costly affair. With the Amiga, all you have to do to source new fonts is to either use the Workbench FED tool to produce new ones, or have a quick chat with your friendly PD supplier. For little more than the cost of a couple of disks, your collection of fonts could multiply considerably.

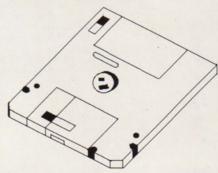

## **Rendering Effects**

TV\*Text Pro's strength lies in its impressive text rendering facilities. Unless you're lucky enough to have a large collection of colour fonts, standard mono Amiga fonts can look a little dull. However, with TV\*Text Pro you don't need to use colour fonts to produce good-looking multi-colour text, because the program includes a powerful effects generator that allows any mono font to be displayed on screen using a variety of different rendering styles and effects.

Using the rendering effects is simplicity itself. All you have to do is to choose the rendering effect required, type in your text and TV\*Text Pro does the rest. However, unlike similar programs, text is not typed straight onto the screen. Instead. TV\*Text Pro uses a separate text-entry window that is used to enter text a line at a time. Once you've entered the text to be used, pressing return activates the rendering process. Within a matter of seconds, your mono font is displayed in its multi-colour, rendered form. The text is treated as a brush that can be moved around and eventually pasted down using the mouse.

If the preset rendering effects aren't to your liking, then you can use TV\*Text Pro's powerful effects editor to create your own from scratch or to modify existing effects. The editor itself is split into distinct pages. One page handles the rendering effects for the face of the text, and others handle the outline and shadow. Even the light source direction that dictates how a shadow is cast can be altered by clicking on one of eight light-bulb icons around the screen.

If you can think of a rendering effect that could be applied to text, chances are that TV\*Text supports it. Outlines, strobes, extrusions and metallics are only a few of the effects supported.

# **Drawing Tools**

With TV\*Text Pro, video titling doesn't just stop with titles, as the program also includes an impressive list of object drawing tools. Objects such as circles and boxes can quickly and easily be created and pasted down using the same rendering effects available with text.

If you have any logos or pictures that you wish to use as a backdrop, TV\*Text Pro will happily accept these. Because colour palettes are never the same between one picture and another, TV\*Text includes a very powerful 'Auto-Color' facility that attempts to match the colour palette of your IFF file to the palette currently in use. Of course, this can be switched off and the colour palette from the imported IFF file will be used instead. TV\*Text Pro not only reads

IFF files, but it will also write them. If you're happy with what you have produced and wish to use the screen with an external program, the current screen can be saved out as an IFF compatible file.

As well as using IFF pictures as backdrops, TV\*Text Pro also includes a menu filled with options for creating

attractive looking backdrops. Most immediate of these are the dithering options, but the program also allows you to use text or brushes to create wallpaper or tiled effects.

#### Conclusion

TV\*Text Professional is undoubtedly a powerful program, but I just couldn't help wondering what it could do that couldn't also be achieved within a quality paint package such as Deluxe Paint 3. Now that DPaint offers fully overscanned display options, support for colour fonts and more powerful conventional font handling, there is no real reason why any display put together within TV\*Text Professional couldn't be knocked up just as quickly in DPaint 3.

The advantage of TV\*Text Pro is that it requires no artistic talent from the user as most of the work is carried out for you. If you try to carry out a similar task using DPaint, you're going to need to be a dab hand with the pixels to produce results that even come close to those obtainable from Zuma's package. With TV\*Text Professional, anyone can now produce professional-looking video titles with considerable ease.

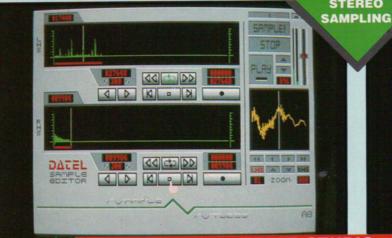

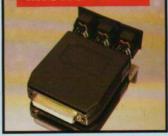

# THE WHOLE TRUTH ABOUT games programming PART 4

DAVE JONES, the ace coder behind Psygnosis' hits Menace and Blood Money, spills more secrets.

n this and next month's articles I will detail the largest part of the Menace code: namely, the alien movement and control routines. There will be no source with this month's instalment because I will only be describing WHAT the routines accomplish - next month will cover HOW they are accomplished, along with the source.

# **Movement is Life**

So, we want to have aliens flying about the screen in nice patterns, attacking your ship, launching missiles at you, tracking your movements and doing all the other things that aliens do best. All the basic ingredients of a good shoot-em-up. What should spring to mind to control all of the movements is a decent data structure. As I have said before, there is no substitute for sitting down with a pen and paper and having a good think about what has to be accomplished. The best idea is to start off with the basic data that would have to be stored about an alien flying about on screen. This would probably be the following:

Alien number Alien X coordinate Alien Y coordinate Alien speed

There will also have to be some way of telling the alien what to do. The simplest form would be a coordinate for it to move to. Once it gets there it would need another coordinate to go to. It would do this repeatedly until we tell it to stop, or until is has been destroyed. First, then, we will define the basic structure to describe a particular alien

; reset the rs counter

X.Pos

; one word for the alien's x coord

; one word for the alien's y coord Y.Pos rs.w ; a byte to hold the alien number Sprite.Num rs.b ; a byte to hold the alien speed rs.b Speed

Following this in memory would be a table of x,y coordinates for the alien to move to in sequence. An example piece of source that moves an alien from left to right and back again could be defined as follows:

dc.w = 0.100

; start alien at x=0, y=100

dc.b

; use alien number 6 with a speed of 2

320,100,0,100,\$7fff ; move to 320,100 then to 0,100

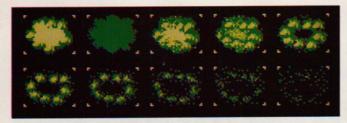
; the \$7fff is an end marker

This basic structure will provide only limited control of an alien, so it's time to add a few more features. Most of the aliens are animated (Figure One, overleaf, shows an eight-animation Menace alien) so as well as defining the alien number, we also have to define its current animation number. Note that in games an animated object is usually given a number that relates simply to the base address of that alien. The number of animations it actually has is stored separately. This makes changing the number of animation frames very simple, because the alien numbers all remain exactly the same. So we will also have to store the number of animations the alien contains somewhere in the structure as well as its current animation number:

Anim Num rs.b Num.Anims rs.b

; a byte to hold the current animation ; a byte to hold the maximum anims

The basic idea, then, is that for each game cycle we increment the

Anim.Num (0,1,2,3,... etc) until it hits the value in Num\_Anims when we would reset it back to zero. Straight away a small problem crops up in that we may not want to animate an alien every game cycle (1/25th of a second for Menace). In fact very few of the aliens animate every game cycle as this is a little fast, so we will also have to introduce an animation delay into the structure:

; a byte to hold the animation delay Anim\_Delay rs.b 1

The method of incrementing the Anin. Num until it hits a maximum then resetting it to zero is termed a WRAP animation as it wraps around to zero. In some cases we may want the animation numbers to increase to a maximum and then decrease to zero: this is termed an UPDOWN animation. To indicate whether or not to use a wrap or updown type of animation requires us to store a single bit of information. There are many occasions in the controlling of an alien that only requires a simple on/off definition. These tend to be grouped together in the data structure and called a MODE word or byte. This is simply a collection of bits used for general-purpose description of simple on/off controls. This is now added to the structure:

; single byte to hold eight flags rs b 1 Mode

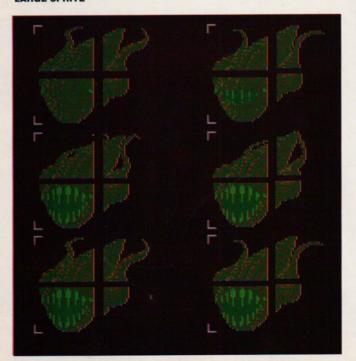
; define the updown flag as bit 3 UpDownequ 1<<3

Note the equate of which bit in the control byte reflects the animation type. NEVER use 'magic numbers' in your source such as the statement

btst #3.Mode

This in no way tells you what bit 3 signifies: you may remember as you are working on the project, but what about in a year's time when you

come back to re-use some of this source? The above should have been written as

btst #UpDown.Mode

which is very clear and has the advantage that to change the actual bit number that the UpDown flag is set at requires only the EQU statement above to be changed. Always make the assembler do as much work for you as possible. Right, lecture mode OFF, let's introduce the next element into the structure.

#### **Reason for Living is Dying**

Most aliens' sole purpose for existing in a shoot-em-up is to be blasted. Do we want them to die after being hit once, though? For most, I think not. We will have to introduce a variable to define how many times we can fill an alien with laser shot before it explodes:

Hits Num rs.b : number of shots an alien can take

: Sff for infinite

As you can see a certain value has been introduced that makes some aliens indestructible. This is not used very often but is handy, say for some asteroids tumbling across the screen that you simply have to dodge and cannot destroy (anybody who reached Level 6 of Menace will know exactly what I mean!)

As far as describing the alien, that is about it. I have made no mention of the size of the alien in the structure as in Menace all aliens were 32 x 24 pixels in size. To make larger ones simply meant moving a few about as though they were joined together (see Figure Two). It certainly makes life simpler handling only one size of alien, though you do lose out a little on flexibility.

#### **Back to Motion**

Now back to the movement of the aliens. The basic GOTO command was implemented simply by defining pairs of x,y coordinates for the aliens to head for - they continued until they were destroyed or until a special coordinate value told them to stop.

This is very inflexible for performing, say, a small circle movement. We would have to define goto points for many points on the circumference of the circle. This may take quite a while to work out, and would have to be recalculated for any other aliens at different x,y coordinates on the screen that wanted to perform a similiar circle.

One simple way of overcoming this problem is to use a relative coordinate system whereby rather than interpreting the x,y values as goto coordinates, they are simply offsets that are added to the present x,y coordinate. This allows us to define a shape as a set of offsets from a base point, the base point being arbitary. This should be able to be used in conjuction with the goto points so we can switch freely between absolute and relative movement at any time.

It is apparent that some form of control data has to be added into the coordinate list to switch between relative and absolute or one may be mistaken for the other. What basically happens in Menace is that movement always starts off in absolute mode, but at any time we can switch to and from relative mode by making one of the coordinate values a control word. For example to goto the middle of the screen, then move in a triangle shape, then return again may look something like:

dc.w 160,100 : goto 160,100 ; switch to offset mode dc.w OffsetMode

; move 2 along and 2 down a few times dc.w 2.2

dc.w 2.2 dc.w 2.2

dc.w -2.0 : move 2 back a few time

dc.w -2.0 dc.w -2,0

dc.w 2,-2 ; move 2 along and 2 up a few times

dc.w 2,-2 dc.w 2.-2

dc.w OffsetMode ; toggle back to absolute mode

dc.w 0,100 ; back to the start x,y

Control words have certain bits set that distinguish them from a goto coordinate (not much point in, say, having 32768 as a coordinate with a screen width of 352 pixels). What we end up with is a small language that describes the path aliens follow. We can go on adding control features

that make the path data more compact yet more powerful. The offset mode will set a bit in the MODE byte to indicate when it is in offset mode.

#### **Memory Economy**

To cut down the amount of data required to describe a complex path (like a large ellipse formed from offsets) it would be ideal to be able to branch to some other path data, and then return after executing so many of its commands. The triangle path above, for instance, requires 40 bytes for the offset data. If we required 12 aliens to perform the triangle movement, but at different coordinates on the screen, we only want to define the offset data once, and have the rest of the aliens branch off to that data inbetween executing their own path data. Menace has a GOSUB command in the path data for this purpose. The gosub command passes over to the new offset data, then at the end of the data is the equivalent of a RETURN command which returns control back to original path data. The above could be written as:

: goto 160,100

dc.w 160.100

If we had 12 similar paths to the above the memory required would now be drastically reduced.

# **More Memory Economy**

Another useful memory saver is a FOR type contruct that allows any part of the path data to be repeated a set number of times. Imagine trying to move a series of aliens in a 'stepping' motion whereby they move, say, along 16 pixels then down 16 pixels, achieved by:

dc.w	OffsetMod
dc.w	4,0
dc.w	0,4

The above performs one step, but if we wanted to repeat this 10 times, it would normally mean repeating the data 10 times or using many GOTO statements – but, yes you've guessed it, a loop function was implemented: simply appending the command

dc.w DoLoop

to the end of the data will cause the last xx bytes of path data to be repeated so many times. This caused two new items to be added to the alien structure, namely

Loop_Offset	rs.b 1	; the number of bytes to loop back
Loop_Count	rs.b 1	; how many loops to perform

This limits the loop command to only allowing one size of loop in each individual path, although this restriction was not noticed as multiple loops were never required.

#### **Other Tweaks**

A PAUSE function was added that allowed an alien to pause at a specific point for any length of time. A simple function but used quite often:

dc.w Pause, Pause Value; the Pause value is in 1/25 seconds

A SEEK mode was added that allowed an alien, at any time, to start to track your ship and try to collide with it to reduce your shield. This is worked similarly to the pause function with a count specifying how long to seek your ship before carrying on with the rest of the path data:

```
dc.w Seek, SeekCount; seek ship for 1/25 * SeekCount secs.
```

Related to the seek command above is the FIRESEEK command which allowed one alien to start another path. This was used to allow aliens to fire missiles that used the seek mode:

```
dc.w FireSeek,SeekCount; start a seek path from this alien
```

To finish off the command set some additional simple commands that came in useful were added. These are:

ChangeSprite – allowed you to change the sprite number at any time. Useful for transforming aliens into other types.

ChangeSpeed – quite obvious this one. Slow moving sprites can be given a quick turbo boost to attack the ship.

ChangeAnim – allows manual changing of the animation number. Used to mimick, say, turning a corner at any point on the screen

And that, basically, is that. Table 1, below, lists the full data structure for an alien path. Hopefully you can see the benefit of designing such a control system for moving objects about. It need not necessarily only be used in a shoot-em-up style game but can relate to many styles of game. It soon becomes quite simple to add more powerful commands to the code, which results in the code being useful in many more projects.

Now you know what the commands do – next month I will present the source and explain how they are accomplished. ■

After word processors, the most common "serious" application — and the subject of this article — is the database. But what exactly is a database? By simple definition, a database is a program for storing information on disk, then retrieving some or all of the stored information at a later date. This simple idea can be extended to allow the user more control over exactly what information he or she retrieves according to specified rules.

For instance, a small business's database might contain a list of customers' addresses. By simply setting the correct rules, an operator can display just those customers who live in the London and South East areas.

Amiga databases, thanks in part to the power of the machine and in part to the imagination of the designers, are not limited to such overtly trite examples. Many databases break new ground – like displaying pictures, playing sounds, even simulating a strip of microfilm – and with prices to suit all pockets, Amiga owners are spoilt for choice!



# MICROBASE Anco £19.95

For those on a budget there is only one choice, and although it comes from a company better known for their "adult" card games and one particularly infamous footy game it performs surprisingly well. 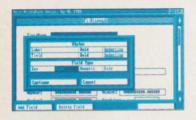

a single (protected!) disk and comes with probably the shortest manual ever supplied with any business software - at just 12 pages, almost anyone could manage to digest this.

The program is Intuition-based and runs in its own colourful (blue!) screen, but is not very suitable for multi-tasking due to the protection methods employed. Also absent is a "Ouit" option. In its favour, MicroBase features simple indexing and simple sorting on text fields. It even has a powerful label printer and is fully compatible with Anco's budget word pro-



cessor, MicroText. It does nothing to rave over - but it is capable and solid. At the price, MicroBase is good value for money and an excellent introduction to databases.

# K-DATA Kuma £49.95

The next rung up the ladder from MicroBase, K-Data has features which nudge it into the semi-professional category even though it maintains a budget-level price. It has been around for some years now and is claimed to be the best-selling flat-card system for the Amiga.

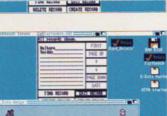

Supplied on one disk, K-Data comes in two different versions - one for unexpanded A500s and an enhanced version for the larger machines. The main omission on the smaller version is a proper file request box. Recent releases, however, benefit from the inclusion of a standard ring-bound manual, which is a great improvement on Kuma's previous efforts.





The most notable feature of K-Data is its similarity to the ST's GEM, a hangover that gives away its origins. This does not detract from the quality of the product which is generally good overall. To conserve memory, K-Data is split into two parts: a designer where the form layout and fields are defined; and the database which does all the donkey work.

When K-Data is run, it opens a small window on the Workbench screen. As each file is opened, it appears in the window as a drawer of filed cards. This can be viewed as a virtual desktop and, again, works just like GEM - the icons can be grouped and dropped in the trashcan, thereby closing the files.

At the same time, another window opens listing the records stored in the database according to their key field. This works just like a file requester: find the record to update/edit and double-click on it simple. Up to four files can be open at one and the same time.

The main fault with K-Data is its constant insistence on redrawing and moving windows, which does tend to make the operation of the program slow. Otherwise it is stable enough to be usable under most conditions.



# GLOSSARY OF TERMS

Append: Add information to the end of a database

Case Sensitive: Defines whether capital letters should be checked in a search. If case sensitivity is switched OFF the strings "ABC", "abc" and "AbC" all return the same result.

Create: Design a new database.

Data: Information which is stored by database software.

Database: A set of one or more records. See Record.

Delimiter: A special (user-defined) character used during importing and exporting to define the start and end of fields and records. See Import and Export. Also used to mark fields for mail merging.

Export: Output information from the database in an alien format (usually ASCII) so it can be read by other software). See Import.

Field: An area in which to enter a single item of information.

Field Name: Used during data entry and rule searching to identify a field. For instance: Address1 or FirstName.

Filter: Locating one or more records in a database according to a set of user-defined rules. See Relational Operator.

Fixed Length Data: Set of data stored using a fixed amount of disk space. Sacrifices compactness of storage for speed. See Variable Length Data.

Fixed Length Record: A record containing a fixed number of fields. See Variable Length

Flat Card Database: Simple database containing information on separate sheets like a Cardex. These are suitable for many applications.

Form: Refers to the way some databases allow users to "paint" a design for a form layout. This could be an address label, for instance.

Import: Read information output from another program. See Export.

Index: Special file created by a database to allow swift, random access to all records. A database file can have many indexes "attached" to it.

Key Field: Another name for an Index field. Quote Wrapped: A method used to store exported ASCII data to delimit fields within records. See Delimiter.

Record: A set of one or more fields. See Field.

Relational Database: A complex database where fields in one file can have an effect on fields in another. Records are said to relate to one another. This only applies to the more expensive systems.

Relational Operator: An operator defining part of a rule - Typical operators are: = (is equal to): <> (does not equal); >= (is greater than or equal to).

Rule Searching: See Filters.

Update: Add or delete records - or just change information - stored in the database.

Variable Length Data: Data stored using the minimum amount of disk space. Saves space at the cost of poor speed. See Fixed Length Data.

Variable Length Record: A record with an unknown number of fields. See Fixed Length Record.

Virtual Memory: Area of hard or floppy disk used as a buffer. This allows the size of a database to be limited to only by the amount of on-line disk storage. Not all databases support this particular feature.

# SUPERBASE PERSONAL Precision £59.95

First in a set of three, this was the first database to use the revolutionary system of a control panel which resembles a video recorder. This not only allows the user to search through records very quickly, it is also a very easy system to learn. Superbase has the distinction of being the cheapest relational database described here. This mention of low cost should not be taken as judgement of the quality of Superbase: the price defies its power.

Unlike K-Data, the whole of Superbase is integrated into a single program which will run in 512K at a pinch, although it is more useable with 1Mb plus. Setting up the database is very simple once the plethora of options has been mastered; a task eased greatly by well-designed requesters. Four field types are available: text, numeric, date and external. Depending on the type these can be made required, calculated or

validated according to a formula. External fields allow graphics and text files to be attached to the database – Superbase supports all Amiga IFF graphic modes including HAM.

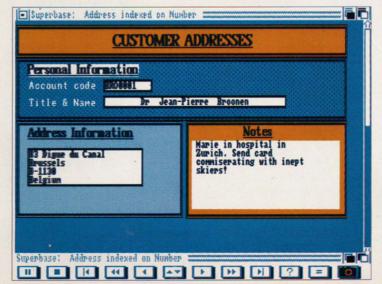
Three separate modes are available for editing and viewing data: Record view displays the records as a list of fields; Form view allows fields to be "dragged" freely around the screen; and Table view displays the data horizontally with the field names heading each column. Editing is not possible in Table view.

Superbase's real power lies in its extensive reporting capability, which is unrivalled in this price bracket. The relational characteristics allow several

# WHAT'S IN A FIELD?

A field is a storage area for a single item of data like a name or a single line of an address. Several fields combine together to form each record on the database. Different packages support many different field types; most are common to all. Field types are specified when the database is set up. The three common types are:

ASCII or string: All databases support this basic type although some support added features like left and right justification and even case correction!

Numeric: These fields only support numbers – and in simpler packages, just integers (whole numbers). More comprehensive packages

like Prodata and the Superbase range can perform calculations on the contents of such fields.
Date: This speaks for itself. The format of the date can usually be specified.

As already shown, there are many extensions to these basic types. As a rule of thumb, the more expensive packages include more options - although many of these are not necessary for the "average" user. Facilities such as "input validation" come in handy when there is a need to store numeric information such as prices. This helps avoid typing errors which could over or underprice items by checking for a reasonable value.

databases to be opened at once and records combined to report to screen or printer. At a simpler level, single files can be filtered with ease through an extensive set of logical and relational operators and indexed records can be accessed almost instantly. Even a label printer has been included with the basic program.

The glaring fault with Superbase lies in its DOS interface. The directory (or disk) has to be set before summoning a file request. Worse still, this option is hidden on a different menu! Nevertheless, the program has become de facto the leading Amiga database in many respects.

# MICROFICHE

A brave attempt to take a database and make it as graphical and therefore as intuitive as possible. The idea is to locate records by scrolling a small magnification window over a larger sheet of "microfiche" – such as those found in libraries. When compared to traditional techniques, this concept seems strange initially but it soon becomes second nature.

Initially three windows are displayed: a small microfiche window; a larger display window where the records appear; and a list of "forms".

The system permits a large degree of control over how much or little information appears in the fiche. It is possible to have a large number of display forms and swap between them very quickly.

Defining a database in MFF is tricky. Three field types are supported: text, numeric and picture. As with normal systems, the fields are named and typed first. However, before editing can commence an editing form must be defined. Each field is added individually, appearing in a small box which can contain either a reference name or the field itself. Field selection is made by clicking a small diamond located in the left of the box. Herein lies the problem: the sector diamond and associated resizing and movement gadgets are small and bunched together, making them difficult to hit.

Text fields can be expanded to any size within the constraints of a window. Picture fields import IFF files, but only support two- or four-colour images because *MFF* runs in the Workbench screen; extra bitplanes are removed resulting in some images becoming unintelligible.

Microfiche Filer is idiosyncratic in many ways. Nevertheless, its strengths far outweigh its weaknesses in most areas. This is an everyday database, tailored to simple jobs – fun to use and powerful enough for most home user tasks. Not one for the professional though.

# PRODATA Arnor £99.95

Comes from the purveyors of the fine word processor *Protext*. Like *Protext*, *Prodata* is aimed at those users content with largely keyboard-based operations and is completely devoid of pop-down menus; Arnor seem happy with PC-like pop-up types. That said, it



is the most powerful of the flat-card databases and has the professional feel, a comprehensive manual, and support for dozens of printers.

Setting up the database is simplicity itself, being much more traditional than most Amiga systems. Data types include numeric, text, date and integer and comprehensive input validation is available. When the fields have been defined, data entry is extremely straightforward.

The most powerful feature of *Prodata* is undoubtedly its expression evaluator. This allows filters and layouts to incorporate calculations and a very comprehensive set of tests, giving *Prodata* the clear edge over its rivals in this area. Also, layouts can be made "intelligent" allowing blank (that is, unused) fields to be eliminated — when using address labels, for instance.

Many users will find *Prodata* too "PC-ized" for their liking – but ex-PC users, and of course *Protext Amiga* owners, will feel at home. Import and Export can be tailored for *Protext* making mail merging very simple.

# ORGANIZE 2 Microsystems Software £99.95

Comes from the Works package – hence the apparently high price. Although Organize 2 is yet another flat-card system it does have the added advantage of being able to import dBASE III database files, although it is not programmable. Also, as part of the Works pack it is

fully integrated with Analyze 2 and Scribble 2, so data can easily be interchanged with these through the agency of the clipboard.

Four data types are supported: string, date, numeric and Boolean (yes or no). Numeric fields can be



either integer or fixed point format. Setting up the record format, therefore, is simplicity itself. When the record format has been defined the data can be entered directly without having to design a form first. If a form is required this is a simple matter of dragging the appropriate fields to the appropriate positions.

Index and filtering are rudimentary compared to, say, *Prodata* or *Superbase*, but this avoids confusion

and the variations supplied are enough to cope with most situations. Simple calculations can be defined for numeric fields within the form layout; plus an option of accumulated figures. *Organize* is a safe option – simple to learn and easy to live with.

# SUPERBASE PERSONAL 2 Precision £99.95

This upgrade adds a comprehensive text editor and mail merge to the basic package as well as improved documentation – in a ring bound manual. Superbase 2 also has better external file handling and a "dongle" for protection – a sad mark of the

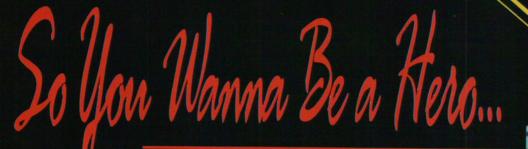


# DESIGNING DATABASES

This is where the utmost care must be taken. It is very important to ensure all the required fields are in place before entering the data. Adding new fields to records at a later date may be difficult or even impossible depending on the software. For this reason it is often a good idea to leave one or two empty text (known as wildcard) fields attached to each record to hold spurious data. It is also a good idea to test a

layout for suitability before finally committing too much data to its tender mercies.

The physical design of a database will depend as much on the particular software concerned as on the application. Remember though – as in programming – there is a lot to be said for simplicity. Why bother including Date or Calculation fields in a record, if you don't need them, just because the software supports them?

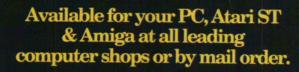

times. Many other minor improvements have been made including limited support for Lotus, dBASE and DIF files. Essentially though, what applies to Superbase Personal, applies here too.



# SUPERBASE PROFESSIONAL Precision

£249.95

The ultimate solution in Precision's range for those who require the undoubted ease of use of Superbase Personal with the added facility of programmability. Professional is supplied on no less than three disks comprising: a Workbench disk, a set of examples and the forms editor. These are accompanied by two voluminous manuals and, like Personal 2, a "dongle" for protection. Even though Professional is awe-inspiring at first, the task of learning how to use it is greatly eased by the excellent documentation. It is not, however, intended for beginners.

The two features separating Professional from its competition are its programming language, which is relatively easy to learn, and the superb Forms editor. This object-

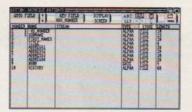

oriented package is the key to producing anything from high-quality graphical reports to invoices and statements - imagination is the only limit. External files and graphics can easily be incorporated into the form, which can be tested within Superbase at any time during use.

# ACQUISITION 1.3 Taurus £249.95

The only serious competitor to Superbase Professional. Although having received much less publicity, Acquisition was written with the Amiga in mind and exploits, so the manufacturers claim, the full power of the machine. The package is supplied on three disks with a massive 350-page manual detailing how to get started with the system and an overview of the command language Acom. Beginners are directed a separate 200-page towards introduction to Acquisition which is sold separately.

At the heart of the system, Acom serves as a very powerful interface with the system. Commands are available to access the even low-level graphics functions - one of the supplied examples blits a Garfield around the screen, another draws a complex 3D plot. Some would say this is overkill but it shows how Acquisition can form the heart of a much more powerful system. Minimum system requirements are set at two disk





drives and 512K - more realistically. 1Mb and hard disk.

Compared to Superbase. Acquisition is very difficult to get to grips with. Once the application (not necessarily a pure database) is running, however, it will prove the stronger of the two. The initial learning curve makes Superbase a more user-friendly option - but Acquisition is a strong competitor.

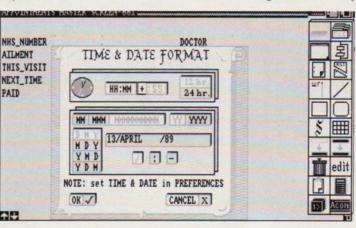

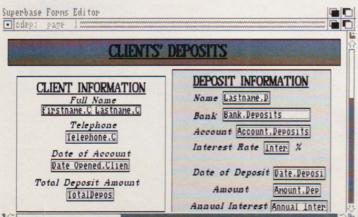

# PASSWORD PROTECTION

For the small and occasional user, there is rarely a need for a password facility to protect the information contained in a database. However, passwords come into their own when several people need to use the same system. This can protect casual - and inexperienced - users from modifying or even reading important or sensitive material.

For instance, the person in charge of a system, the data manager, could set three passwords. The first would allow read access only - for the day-to-day operators: the second would also provide the ability to add new records - for the input clerks; the third, the ability to change data at will - reserved for the system manager only.

offer compatibility with dBASE III Plus. The portability of dBASE programs makes this an interesting option in itself, although dBMAN systems are available in their own right for the ST, UNIX, XENIX and even mainframes. Among the many enhancements, dBMAN V includes windowing support, a relational report writer and a compiler. At the time of writing, dBMAN is not available in the UK.

## Conclusion...

For the first-time user, there is little to choose between the two leading budget packages, MicroBase and K-Data. MicroBase, being the cheaper of the two, has less features but does have a label printer. Conversely K-Data boasts better reporting and search facilities, and integrates completely with K-Spread 2 (featured in 'A Serious Business' next month).

Slightly more upmarket, Microfiche Filer's unique graphical approach will find a niche with users appreciating totally intuitive operation. It falls down where large, complex databases are concerned because all records are limited by available memory. This price range also brings Superbase Personal into play at £10 cheaper. Although less intuitive than Microfiche Filer, Superbase is a pleasure to learn and very easy to use. Being fully relational, Superbase Personal is the most comprehensive of the budget systems.

The more professional user on a budget is guided towards Superbase Personal 2 with its powerful text editor and perhaps Prodata. Although Prodata is the least "Amigaized" database, it will find a home with

# IS INTEGRATION NECESSARY?

Several databases are available for the Amiga, but not all of them can easily exchange data with other productivity software such as word processors and spreadsheets. Many can import and export information as ASCII, but very few can claim to be truly integrated. The question which must be posed is this: does the application require data to be exchanged regularly?

For instance: a computer club may want to send out monthly newsletter to all its members. Or, a

computer dealer may need to incorporate data from both accounts and database files to send out monthly statements. Both examples require a mail merging facility - which could prove difficult (or impossible) to implement between packages produced by different software houses.

Some packages, Superbase Professional and Acquisition for instance, incorporate a text editor, thereby completely avoiding the problem - but the privilege certainly costs extra.

The last option for dedicated power users is dBMAN V - ostensibly a dBASE III Plus clone. The strength of dBMAN is its portability with versions available for most 16-bit machines including the ST. It is by no means a beginner's database and should really only be purchased either as a run-time system or for serious database development work.

#### ...And Advice

The problem of which package to go for must be resolved from two main considerations:

1) Is it easy to use? It is pointless buying an "all-singing" package with a programming language if the person using it has no idea how to program?

2) Is it affordable? This will depend on individual resources. However, it is pointless saving money by buying a package incapable of the job demanded. Conversely, it is unwise to spend more money than

These points apply to all software and especially that in the business sector. Make sure the application is completely understood before searching for software to ease the task.

Protext users. In the same bracket is the Works bundle which contains the popular integrated system of Scribble 2, Organize 2 and Analyze 2.

The top end of the market sees two packages vying for a place. Superbase Professional, the highpowered (and high-profile) upgrade from Superbase, combines the smaller package's ease of use with the power of a forms editor and builtin language. The less well-known Acquisition 1.3 is claimed to be more powerful but will take a lot longer to get to grips with. Both of these are aimed squarely at the the power market - however, only Superbase supports dBase files, which could be seen by some as a weakness.

When two hearts beat as one – especially two robotic hearts – you know you're in for trouble. Hammerfist and Metalisis were two ordinary fun-loving cyberdroids until someone decided to cut back on expenditure.

The logic went like this: two bodies, many similar bits, remove the duplicate items, save lots of dosh... the cutbacks went a little too far. The results of which mean that only one or the other of the robots can exist at any instance, instant transmutation from one body to the other being the only way to flip between personalities.

This co-existence, verging on non-existence, really got up Hammerfist's and Metalisis' shared nose. As you can imagine, they are both mad as hell – although, obviously, only one of them can be mad as hell at any given time.

Trapped in the mechanical world that made them, Hammerfist and Metalisis are after blood and bolts. And only you can guide them towards success along their path of destruction.

There are numerous moves to be learnt, so listen up. For fighting moves hold down the joystick fire button and push the joystick in the required direction of attack. For directional moves simply push the

joystick in the direction in which you actually want to go.

The following aggressive moves can be used when you're in control of Hammerfist:

- Punch forward fire plus left or right.
- Punch up fire plus up.
- Punch down fire plus down.

Metalisis is no sweetheart either – she has the following moves available to her:

- Flic-flac while stationary fire plus up.

You can change characters simply by pushing up on the joystick. Pushing down will cause the character to duck. To turn into the screen press fire three times or hit the space bar. To head-butt (nice couple, aren't they?) or open doors hold the fire button and pull down

#### **Getting Started**

Hammerfist can only be run by

resetting the computer and inserting the Coverdisk into the drive. A prompt will appear asking whether or not you wish to run Hammerfist – type Y and press Return if you wish to play the game. Pressing N will send you to the Coverdisk main menu. Hammerfist also appears as the first option (F1) in the main menu. You will only be able to run Hammerfist from here if your machine is blessed with 1Megabyte or more.

After a few seconds you'll be presented with the Hammerfist

Before you go any further, do you have 1 Mbyte of RAM and Deluxe Paint III? No? Well then, this isn't for you, I'm afraid.

# MEGA WB

PROGRAM: PUBLIC DOMAIN FILES: MEGA WB, MEGA WB.DOC

When run, Mega WB expands the Workbench work area far beyond the resolution limits of your monitor. In other words, you could have a Workbench area that stretches beyond the edges of your monitor. Imagine having a work area of 1024 pixels by 512 pixels. Or even, if you have the memory, 3000 pixels by 3000 pixels.

Of course, your monitor or TV can't display the whole work area in one go, and only shows the usual 640 by 256 image. In effect, you window in on a small area of the Workbench. By moving the pointer towards one of the edges of the screen, you can move around the Mega Workbench area.

## **Getting Started**

Double-clicking on the MEGA WB program icon (inside the MEGA WB drawer) from Workbench sets up a default expanded Workbench area of 1024 pixels wide by 512 pixels high. That's roughly twice the normal Workbench size.

Pressing key F5 from the Coverdisk's main menu will also set up an expanded Workbench work area of 1024 by 512 pixels.

Follow these instructions if you want to create a custom Workbench area:

- Highlight the MEGA WB program icon by single-clicking on it from Workbench.
- Click on Info in the Project menu. (Remember, click and hold the right mouse button to make the Project menu, and all the other menus in the menu bar, appear.)
- You will see a box labelled Tool Types. Inside you will see Width=1024. Click the pointer somewhere inside the box to get a cursor. Delete 1024 and type in a value of your choice.
- By clicking on the down-pointing arrow inside the Tool Types box, Height=512 will appear in place of Width=1024 (or whatever your new Width value may be). Change

the 512 to a value of your choice.

 Once you've made your changes, be sure to click on the SAVE gadget situated towards the bottom left of the Info box.

Do note, Mega WB won't work if you try to create work areas that require more memory than your machine is endowed with.

To de-install Mega WB, doubleclick on the MEGA WB program icon. Do ensure that all windows and icons lie inside the standard Workbench area before you try to reduce the Workbench area back to normal.

Here's a program meant to change your working environment. Fnarr, fnarr. When installed in a multi-Amiga office, managers report dramatic increases in productivity levels yet workers insist that their output has not changed.

This fondness or friendliness is most frequently reported by more senior office workers who yearn for "the good old days" and frown upon technological advances. ### **Getting Started**

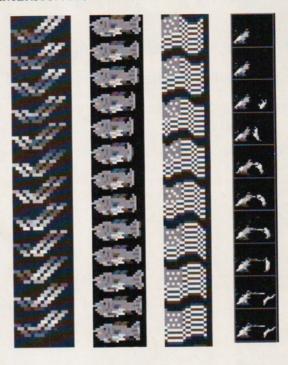
Pressing F7 from the main menu will transport you to the Workbench from where you can run Keybiz simply by clicking on the KEYBIZ icon located inside the KEYBIZ drawer.

Turn up the sound on your monitor or amplifier and continue with your normal work. If you wish to remove Keybiz, click once on the CloseWindow gadget in the Keybiz window that is displayed in the top-left of the screen.

Haven't you sickened of the Amiga mouse pointer? It's so dull, drab, lifeless, inanimate... Pointer Animator to the rescue! Tim Kemp's excellent program animates the Workbench pointer by substituting its own custom pointer. The pointer image is rapidly changed to give the illusion of animation. The image sequences are standard IFF ILBM files meaning you can easily edit predefined animations and create your own! In addition to the normal three-colour pointer, Pointer Animator supports a 15-colour affair.

Our eyes are specially designed to detect motion. On a normal Workbench screen with a good contrast between the pointer and display colours, you can easily distinguish the position of the pointer. On a 32-colour screen, it can be difficult to identify the pointer. Even with very similar colours, an animated pointer is easy to spot.

For a full run-down of how to go about creating your own animated pointer, look at the comprehensive help file. If designing animated pointers seems too much like hard work, there are four examples for you to tinker with on the Coverdisk.

## **Getting Started**

To run a pointer animation from the Workbench, all you need to do is double-click on the animation's icon. Hit key F4 on the keyboard to read the *Pointer Animator* help and get to the Workbench. From the Workbench enter the *POINTERANIMATOR* drawer. Inside you will find icons with the names *AMICHECK*, *FISH*, *FLAG*, and *NOSE*. Double-click on any of those to get an animated pointed. Double-click on *POINTER-STOPPER* to revert to the standard mouse pointer.

# USING YOUR FORMAT DISK

IMPORTANT! Before using your Amiga Format disk, you should make a back-up of the master disk as soon as possible.

# BACKING UP YOUR DISK

For many reasons, it is important to make a backup of the Coverdisk as soon as possible. Copying the disk may sound like a complicated task suitable for techno-buffs only, but it is surprisingly simple provided you read the following instructions carefully:

- First, turn on your machine and load Workbench. Once the Workbench screen appears and the disk-drive light goes out, remove your Workbench disk and insert our Coverdisk.
- 2. Next, click once on the Coverdisk icon and then press the right mouse-button and the Workbench menus will appear. Now, while keeping the right mouse-button depressed, move the mouse pointer over to the 'Workbench' heading and a menu will drop down. Move the mouse pointer over the 'duplicate' menu option and then press the left mouse-button.
- 3. After a few seconds' disk access, the Workbench DiskCopy tool will be loaded and run. Now just follow the onscreen prompts and your *Amiga Format* Coverdisk will be copied to a backup disk. When the machine asks for the destination, insert your blank disk into the drive. Further instructions are in the user's guide that comes with your Amiga.

# USING THE PROGRAMS

All programs on the Amiga Format disk are specially set up to make them as easy to use as possible. If you can use the Amiga's Workbench then you can use our Coverdisk! If you do have problems with a program, full instructions on loading and using the programs are included in Disk Extra and these should get you up and running. If you still have problems, you should read the documentation file (.DOC) that is included

with every program. To run any of the programs on this month's Coverdisk, follow a simple procedure: unless specified differently within Disk Extra, just double-click on the program's icon on the Workbench and it will load and run. Full details on how to use the programs once they have loaded are inc-luded as a documentation (text) file with the program.

To display a documentation file, just double-click on the appropriate .DOC file and a window will open containing the file's contents. Pressing the space bar will advance the text a page at a time.

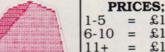

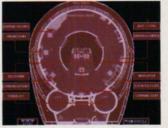
#### STAR TREK . ats

Space... the final frontier. These are the voyages of blah, blah, blah, blah. Like the countless episodes of the cult series which appears to have gone way past its five-year deadline, there seem to be countless games based on the *Star Trek* theme. Unfortunately few of the *Star Trek* games have attracted cult followings and there's little chance of them ever becoming classics.

Now feast your eyes on the latest Star Trek game, a two-disk PD extravaganza offering you the Universe to explore. It's a huge game; brilliantly complex, stunningly detailed and enormously playable. Superlatives over, here's the rest of the story.

You're in control of the Enterprise (no surprises there) and can run from deck to deck shouting your orders and deciding where in the Universe to go. From time to time you will get missions from Starfleet HQ which you must complete. As in *Elite*, you can trade with planets and battle with any aliens you feel like wasting.

The game runs on a 512K machine; 1Mbyte is recommended because you lose many of the excellent sampled sounds on a less well-endowed machine. Still, it's better than no game at all.

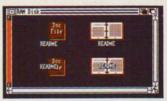

#### ICONTOOLS Fish 284

Icontools is a collection of hacks rather than a single utility. The utilities exploit areas of .info files (icon image files) that the current version of Workbench fails to clear or reset upon loading the icon.

Fix allows you to specify the two colours that appear in the borders of the Workbench windows, Lift lets you position the filename anywhere in the icon's immediate vicinity and Center will position the filename in the middle of the icon.

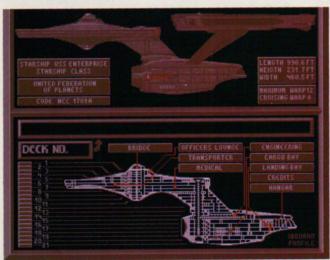
While the hacks work with existing Workbench versions, there is no absolute guarantee that this will be the case with Workbench 1.4 and beyond.

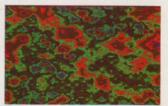

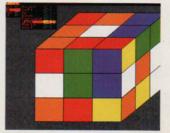

# ROLL OVER AMIGO

Not content with your mouse? Well, now there is an alternative. **MAFF EVANS** checks out two of the possibilities.

The Amiga mouse is a sweet little thing. Rolling around the desk doing what it's told, getting things that it picks up off the surface clogged around the ball, getting its wire caught around objects, running out of room just before the pointer reaches its target. Well, there is one simple solution – a trackball.

A trackball is basically a mouse on its back which sits on the desk next to your machine. Although it may not seem like the greatest idea in the world to switch to using a trackball rather than a mouse, there are a few benefits to be found. For one, it stands less chance of its wire getting caught around things – which can be dodgy if the object in question happens to be something like a cup of coffee. Just try unsticking your keyboard once some hot drink has been tipped across it!

Another advantage is that you don't need a clear space to use it. Imagine a musician on stage with his Amiga running a sequencer. The musician has all his gear rack-mounted up, so there isn't a great deal of space to use a mouse. What does he do? Bung

a trackball on the top of the machine and hey presto – full control in a much-reduced space!

So now you all want to get hold of one. But what are the alternatives? This month, two trackballs wended their way into the Amiga Format office, so here's a brief appraisal of how the pair performed.

#### FT-100 TRACKER

The first up for inspection is from HB Marketing, long renowned for their involvement in the serious side of the Amiga. The trackball itself is designed to blend in with the Amiga design-scheme, being the same colours and similarly-shaped so that it sits prettily next to the machine.

As well as the roller, the device has two buttons, placed to the left of the ball, which act as the mouse's left and right buttons.

The makers have also included a unique device to relieve the user of the old 'twisted wrist' syndrome endured while 'clicking and dragging' with the trackball. By flicking a switch at the back of the tracker, a third button beneath the other two can be clicked once to simulate the left button being held down while the pointer is moved. Pressing the button a second time 'releases' the mode.

This is supposed to make it easier for the user to operate the trackball, but for those of us (including me) who are left-handed, this causes more problems than simply having the buttons in the corners. The roller itself didn't fare too well either. At times it refused to cooperate at all, leaving the pointer to either wander hope-

lessly off course or just stick in the middle of the screen. This is a shame, since the 'drag mode' is a good idea which is unfortunately wasted on a dodgy trackball.

Having gained a good reputation in the Atari 8-bit community, Atari's classic trackball has arrived in an Amiga version. Being somewhat larger than the FT-100, the Trak-Ball is a big, ominous-looking black plastic affair with a large roller-ball in the centre and two heavy-duty buttons in the top corner.

Personally, I prefer this 'traditional' layout to HB's fancier design, as it's not so easy to forget which button is which – actually it's quite obvious which is which! The roller itself is superb. The smooth and free motion moves the pointer easily across the screen with little effort, so that precision movements can be made quickly and easily.

In all the Atari Trak-Ball is the one to go for: it just goes to show, just because a product is old, doesn't necessarily mean it's bad. In fact, it could become a classic!

omputer Aided Design has traditionally been a rather elitist area of computing. Even with the arrival of the low-cost personal computer, the computing power required to drive the most basic CAD application put such packages firmly out of the reach of the budding amateur.

Even today, with powerful PCs coming in at ten a penny, modern CAD systems have advanced to require even greater levels of performance from the host hardware. With such steep processing requirements, it seems that the CAD user on a tight budget is still cut off from the technology that is required. Does a low-cost computer exist that can finally bring the power of the modern CAD system to the masses? Of course it does and its name is Amiga.

The combination of high-resolution screen modes and fast graphics processing have put the Amiga at the forefront of low-cost computer aided design. No other computer at the price can hope to compare to the CAD potential that the Amiga offers. Even a comparable PC CAD system could end up costing you well over twice the price of an Amiga CAD system, while still failing to deliver many of the extras the Amiga is famous for.

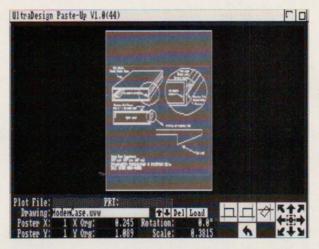
The Amiga's ace card is undoubtedly its multitasking capabilities. Many established CAD users have switched to the Amiga from systems costing many thousands of pounds for this very reason.

CAD applications are heavily processor intensive, so anything that saves time can also save money. Particularly time-wasteful is printing. Using a conventional pen plotter, dumping a complex drawing can take a long time: time in which the computer is rendered useless. With the Amiga, the user can carry on working during the printing process.

The cornerstone of the Amiga CAD revolution has undoubtedly been one package - CADVision's X-CAD Professional. This single package has done more to promote the Amiga as a serious contender within the CAD market than any other package. Realising the sales potential of the

Latest arrival in the Amiga CAD field is UltraDesign, from the US company Progressive Peripherals and Software. Progressive, who are better known for their successful image-processing package PIXmate and the Marcam FrameGrabber, were also responsible for the budget CAD system, IntroCAD. Although IntroCAD was far from professional, it paved the way for this latest release.

#### **Designer Software**

UltraDesign is a professional-standard computer aided design package designed to compete against the likes of Amiga X-CAD Professional and AutoDesk's industry-standard PC CAD system, AutoCAD.

The UltraDesign system consists three separate programs: the UltraDesign editor itself, a printing utility called PasteUp and CADverter, a very handy little utility to allow you to convert CAD files from other systems for use within UltraDesign.

The UltraDesign main screen consists of a single window, which is your view of your drawing. Like all CAD systems, your drawings can be considerably larger than can be displayed on the monitor screen. However, UltraDesign uses a 'viewport' system that provides a 'window' on this larger workspace. It is possible to zoom right out to display the entire workspace within the current viewport, as well as being able to zoom in to examine the most intrictate items.

Depending on which drawing mode is currently selected, a row of icons runs down the left-hand side of

#### CAD CONVERSIONS

The Amiga IFF file format has made life so easy for Amiga owners, that the ability to share files between applications from different software producers is taken almost for granted. However, start using another computer and you'll soon realise how unusual the Amiga is nowhere else within the computer industry will you find a computer that has such a high level of data portability.

Because the Amiga is a fairly new arrival within the CAD market, it would be rather unreasonable of Progressive to expect existing CAD users to scrap all their previous work in

favour of UltraDesign. Although standards exist within the CAD world, CAD file formats are numerous. To make the transistion between old and new considerably less painful, UltraDesign includes a very handy file conversion utility called CADverter.

This utility allows you to convert to and from different CAD file formats. File formats supported include the industry-standard DXF format as used by AutoDesk's AutoCAD system on the PC-compatibles, Hewlett-Packard's HPGL, Roland's DXY, Progressive's own IntroCAD system and Aegis' Draw.

the screen. Selecting a particular drawing operation is simply a matter of choosing the appropriate drawing mode and then clicking once on the relevant icon. *UltraDesign*'s drawing modes are split into distinct sections – Lines, Circles or Ellipses, Text, Dimensioning and Filling or Hatching.

#### **Drawing Tools**

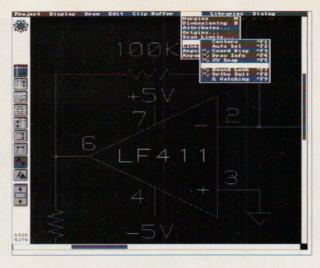
UltraDesign features all the standard CAD operations, plus a few more of its own. As well as the usual tools to create and edit objects, UltraDesign adds a few new tricks of its own. Drawing tools include circles, ellipses, boxes, multiple lines, arcs, arrowheads, ellipse rotation, filleting, razor lines and rubber-banding.

Positioning the cursor at the exact coordinates that you require can be a fiddly and often frustrating process. *UltraDesign* gets around this with the inclusion of a Seek To... option which attempts to place the cursor at the exact point that you require. All you have to do is to move the cross-hair close to the desired location and click the mouse button – *UltraDesign* will try to lock the cursor to the nearest object that meets specified criteria.

UltraDesign drawings aren't just limited to boring wireframe diagrams. Using a system called Hatching, any specified area may be filled with either a solid colour or a fill pattern. To aid the process of producing fill patterns, UltraDesign includes a versatile tool to make the previously tedious task of producing hatch files considerably quicker and easier.

#### **Get Layered!**

Layers are an all-important aspect of any CAD system. The use of layers allows any drawing to be split up into several overlaying sections. This is particarly useful with complex drawings, as individual elements can be

isolated from the rest of the drawing. Thankfully, *UltraDesign* is particularly well-endowed in the layers department – it allows up to 65,536 different layers to be used. I challenge you to use that lot at once!

Text is particularly well handled within *UltraDesign*. Once defined, a line of text can be pasted down, rotated, reversed, flipped, inverted and scaled with ease. By default, two different font types are available to

#### PRINTER SUPPORT

Printing isn't handled directly by the UltraDesign program – instead your drawings must be saved out to disk and then imported into a separate printing utility called PasteUp.

According to Progressive, PasteUp represents a new dimension in producing hard copies of CAD drawings. The program allows the arrangement of any number of drawings onto a single page, in a very similar manner to a desktop publishing program. Drawings can be presented in exact scale, at any angular rotation. Even if the output device (printer, to you and me) cannot handle the printing of large-scale diagrams, the PasteUp program features a postering facility which will split the page up into several pages to be joined after printing.

PasteUp supports a whole range of different output devices and formats including standard Preference-supported printers. If you are using a dot matrix Preference printer, PasteUp will

print at the highest possible resolution. Other printers supported include drivers for the Hewlett-Packard, Houston Instruments and Roland plotting languages.

However, most exciting of all is
UltraDesign's support for both the Encapsulated
(EPS) and standard PostScript languages. Not
only can your drawings be output to professional printing devices such as laser printers
and Linotronic imagesetters, but UltraDesign
can be used to prepare images for other Amiga
packages.

Probably the most common use of this facility becomes apparent with a package such as Professional Page 1.3. Now that ProPage supports the importation of EPS files, UltraDesign drawings can be pulled straight onto the page of your DTP documents. This option alone makes UltraDesign equally useful for DTP work as it is for CAD applications.

#### Conclusion

With the arrival of *UltraDesign*, the Amiga's potential as a serious CAD workstation has risen to even greater heights. Although the package is not as immediately useable as its main competitor, *X-CAD*, it offers many extras that should earn Progressive's product many devoted followers.

Particularly impressive among these are both the *PasteUp* and *CADverter* modules, described in the box-outs on this page and the previous page, which only go to prove that Progressive certainly have been listening to the ideas and comments of their intended user base.

To many of us, particularly home users, the price of *UltraDesign* may seem rather steep, but you must take into consideration that similar packages on other systems will set you back considerably more.

However, even at this relatively low price *UltraDesign* is undoubtedly aimed at the professional user blessed with lots of RAM, Flicker Fixer boards, high-resolution plotters etc. If you're a budding amateur, a better bet is almost certainly CADVision's budget *X-CAD*, *X-CAD Designer*.

For the professional user, not only is *UltraDesign* a true alternative to *X-CAD*, but also DTP users who require a drafting program to produce diagrams and the like for their page layouts may well want to check out this impressive product.

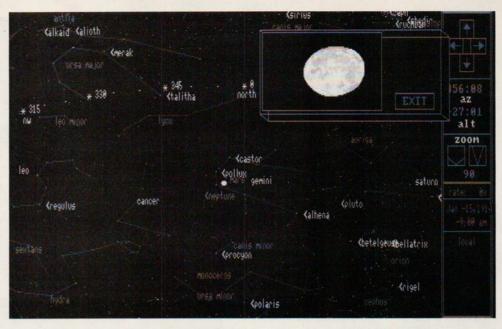
or the majority of us, the night sky is nothing more than a mass of stars. A few us can identify a couple of the more common celestial bodies, such as Venus, and a couple of the more immediately obvious constellations such as Orion, The Plough (or should that be the Big Dipper?) and the Seven Sisters (Bob insists that there is also a constellation called Dudley the Hamster, but none of us can find it!), but very few of us can identify the remaining 99.999% of visible stars.

This, then, is where *Distant Suns* comes in. If you have ever stared up into the night sky and thought to yourself 'I wonder what that star is called?' or 'I wonder what planets are visible tonight?', then *Distant Suns* may well be the program that you've been looking for.

Distant Suns is a powerful graphical database program containing details of over 2,200 stars (expandable to a further 9,100 or more using the Distant Suns expansion disks). The program provides a quick and easy method of identifying any celestial object at any point in time, at any place on the Earth. At its simplest level, just type in the time, date and your location (expressed in terms of longitude and latitude) and Distant Suns will display a map of the heavens complete with any extra information that you may require.

If it's planets you're looking for, Distant Suns will label any that are visible. If you're playing 'spot the constellation', then once again Distant Suns will do the hard work by tracing the outlines of every visible constellation. By using the program's Point and Identify option, information on any star is just a mouse click away.

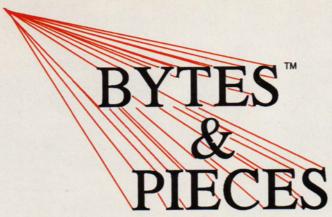
#### Conclusion

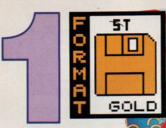

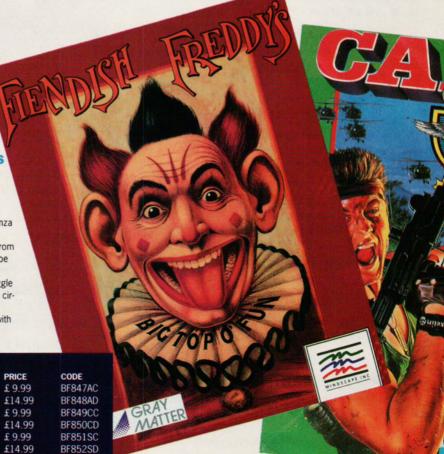

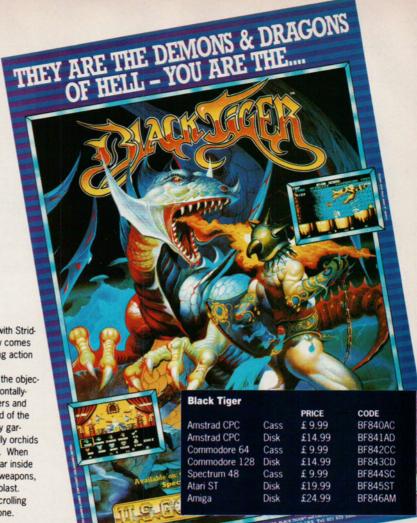

nother sequencing package? You may well ask 'Does the world really need another music sequencing package for the Amiga?' One could ask a similar question of car manufacturers when they release a new product and their answer is, of course, 'Yes' every time.

The market does not get any smaller: in fact, it is now widely known that Commodore UK are not only throwing in music sequencing packages as part of their 'Class of the 90's' education bundle but are also trying in earnest to squeeze their product into more professional music studios. Proof of an expanding serious market as well as increasing home use. The bundled sequencing package is Dr T's MRS, the Spartan child of KCS.

#### Two Programs...

So what have we here? What's in the spotlight on the test-bench this month? Well, the *Copyist* notation program is one of the few pieces of scoring software for the Amiga and so it gets a good going over later in these pages. The sequencing package — the *Keyboard Controlled Sequencer*, better known as *KCS* — has been around since the dawn of the first cheap 16-bit home computer. Updates have been both regular and vigorous and now the latest Amiga version is available.

To call it merely a sequencer is hardly fair, because extras have been bolted onto the original that take it from being a mundane workaday

sequencer to a multi-talented system that only stops short of making the tea. If you know and have used the software bear with us in the following review while we outline the way in which the

package works. The additions will be highlighted for you to drool over later.

#### ...Beat as One

Both programs can co-exist, obviously, but here's the twist. Dr T have what is known as a Multi Program Environment which will cause one program to hook into another and interreact. In fact, they claim that up to 19 programs can co-exist and inter-react: if they are Dr T programs, that is. Methinks a wardrobe full of RAM will be necessary for this as both the programs under review use one meg: for these two to run happily 2Mb RAM is the minimum and even more is going to be needed if you think of RAM disk storage for temporary files.

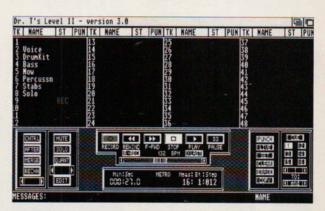
#### KEYBOARD CONTROLLED SEQUENCER V3.0

KCS v 3.0 has three operational pages plus several host routines/ programs that can inter-react and control certain areas. The three main operation modes go by the names Track, Song and Open.

Heart of the KCS is the main Track page. You get a screen display of 48 tracks, awaiting your input, which occupy the top half of the screen. The bottom half is divided into three. Real-time quantize, flip to edit, MIDI re-channeling, track control et cetera are taken care of in the lefthand column. The right-hand column copies, erases, over-records and jumps to any of six cue points. The centre section is the 'tape transport' controls - in other words the fast forward, rewind, play, pause, stop, record - plus the metronome and location counter in not only bars and beats but also time elapsed.

The status of each track is noted – that is, solo or muted – and as soon as you finish recording one track the record option jumps to the next available track so that you can carry on without interruption.

If, however, you decide that your last effort was no good the 'R-Rec' option will halt operations in midstream and start you off again. A subtler version of this is the 'X-Last' which, rather like the similarly-branded laxative, purges the system of your last efforts!

Nothing mysterious here, just that you can either have normal metronome speeds of 40 to 240 beats per minute or you can go weird and demand tempos from 10 to 999. Tempos are adjusted by dragging the slider bar, clicking the arrows either end of the bar or using the qwerty keys which cause the tempo to jump in a pre-defined ratio.

Also on screen as opposed to menu are the basic MIDI filters for controllers and aftertouch which will



save on memory usage and simplify the data that is going in.

#### Punch It Up!

Replacing sections of tracks is achieved with the usual 'punch' button. Again on the main page as an icon, it lets you set the points at which you will enter and depart from record in the track. Cleverly, it automatically puts the new section onto a spare track and mutes the original section: thus you never actually lose data until you are happy with the new section.

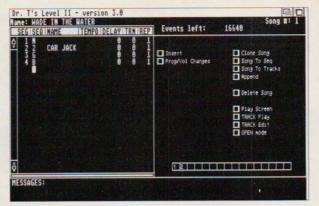
Several other smart routines enable you to copy or erase new data from track to track and to retain the punch cue marks or have new ones for each track. There is also a more complex live-edit mode which allows you to delete notes from a track or alter their velocities in real time as the track is playing. In total there are no less than 17 track functions, like punch, mute, etc. which should keep you occupied for some time to come.

#### Shift It!

There are many ways of transfiguring one set of MIDI data into another. This is another way of saying that data such as velocity can be converted into volume data, or vica versa, to create accents from, say, a pitch bend or modulation wheel.

You can also delay or pre-delay tracks. This is known as 'shift' and each track can be shifted in time forwards or backwards. The amount you can do it by is limited to three settings and notes shuffled off the end of the track are not sounded. This is often used for creating echo effects but I have to say that here it is a bit limited in application.

All the usual sequencing functions of naming tracks, swapping track location, erasing tracks are on hand. One oddity is that the Merge function in fact merges incoming and outgoing MIDI data – in other words it is a soft-

#### Think about Sync

If you are planning to use KCS synchronized to other pieces of equipment then I should inform you that KCS will synchronize to most things in most ways. As a formality it obeys MIDI sync and song position pointer. It will also configure itself to work with incoming SMPTE code thanks to a host program called Phantom and it will send a special set of MIDI-exclusive commands to a Fostex R8 eight track recorder and slave it up to the screen control panel: you rewind the sequencer and the R8 rewinds as

well. The same goes for play, fast forward and reverse since the R8 is kitted out with a MIDI In port. Obviously, to get the maximum benefit from this labour-saving routine KCS and the multi-track recorder need to be locked in sync – see 'That Syncing Feeling' below.

#### Keep on the Track

At first in Track mode you have to take a little care since the right-hand mouse button, which usually opens up the menu bar, is a controller in its own right in the active area of the screen. The menus carry an enormous variety of options, like copy all tracks to a sequence on the Open sequencer page, go to any bar, alternate ways of setting cue points, clear tracks, merge tracks, auto loop and record, and mute last recording, which is essential when trying out various 'takes' of solos.

One peculiar feature of the KCS is that the length of Track One is taken to be the length of the whole section. You can override that by specifying the track length from a menu option, but this is a method that I have never felt happy with because it predefines something that you may wish to override at a later stage. OK, you can stitch various sequences together but that tends to be repair after the damage rather than inspired work at the time of creation.

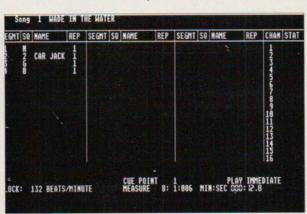
#### **Edit Problems?**

The edit screen for track mode has only one basic form of editing, of the 'data-stream' type. Down the left hand half of the screen is all the data for each event. Although this is an extremely accurate method, there are several things about it that I find a bit of a bind. First of all, it is entirely in the form of numbers and so as a trained musician I find it awkward to visualise what the bar and pattern should be like. Even a graphic display would help and it is far quicker to work with graphics than numbers.

For example, the duration value of all notes and events, expressed as a number, bears very little relationship to what the musician can hear or visualise: although there is a sort of 'help' option that roughly abbreviates the name of the closest note value. The rests between the notes are specified as a number between 0 to 65535, again fairly meaningless. The notes are named, thankfully, but again - why not display them? Even if you have never used a musical instrument before and so have no preconceptions, you would find this a neuralgic nightmare.

On the plus side is the tremendous amount of word-processor-type functions that you can perform in edit mode: cutting and pasting, splitting, creating back-up sequences, and so on. You can alter any of the data





#### THAT SYNCING FEELING

Although there is ample scope for a tutorial on this subject, a few quick explanations about synchronization and its whys and wherefores might not go amiss right here and now.

Synchronization is the locking together of one or more devices so that they work together. For instance, you might have a software sequencer and drum machine locked together by MIDI Clocks – a simple process where you ask the drum machine to listen out for the clock speed sent from the sequencer and to ignore its

own internal clock. Not only will sequencer and drum machine work at the same rate but also they will stop and start together.

The Fostex R8 multi-track tape recorder is a clever gadget that has a 'MIDI In' port that will read incoming MIDI codes and thus perform the same functions, that of slaving the transport controls to a sequencer. But to run an ordinary tape recorder 'in sync' with a sequencer is a little bit more fiddly. One of the tracks on the tape has to be sacrificed so that a time code

generated by a time-code generator and reader which is a separate (and not a cheap) piece of hardware. This time code is then read from the tape and transformed by the hardware box into code that the sequencer can understand. In this case the tape is controlling the sequencer speed and possibly the location too. The time code is usually SMPTE although it could be FSK, a much simpler ersatz code. The subject is complex; more to follow in this column at a future date.

fields en bloc or individually. It is also very easy to flip to another track without exiting the edit mode and hear any highlighted events.

In Track mode you only hear the track you are working on, so to edit and hear all the tracks together you have to go to Open edit mode. This is also where you would globally cut and edit events.

#### Gone for a Song

The Song Mode is fairly straightforward. Any amount of track sections can be mixed onto a sequence which in turn can be chained up to form a song. Up to 100 small sequences, called segments, can be linked to together in a multiplicity of ways. However, it would seem that any alterations such as transposition and

would take an indeterminate amount of time, but the principle is that it takes particular areas such as note values, velocities, pitches, time, pitchbend etc, and subjects them to some fairly heavy-duty mathematical logic controls in an attempt to create a structured chaos out of which comes a new order - which is pretty philosophical for a mere sequencing tool!

You can create macro controls that can be called up so that you can, say, transpose a tune into a different scale, or alter the logic of its accents and timing. The name given to this gadget is the Programmable Variations Generator and Master Editor - PVG for short. It can create rhythmic cycles that build up and edit preset fields, with the Master Editor keeping a tight rein on the whole play-



processing data that the marketplace has demanded.

I would guess that for most of the main functions there are at least two methods of operating them and possibly twice as many variations on the way that they operate. On the other hand it will take you a very long time indeed to exhaust the possibilities and know the alleyways of this program in detail which, if you are a newcomer to the field, could be a daunting task.

To sum the program up; it comes from a long line of KCS software and so has many refinements. However it seems a shame that despite its many and varied innovative features the editing seems to be rather behind the times as far as editing display goes; you have to type in every single editing detail. Nevertheless it is a powerful force to be reckoned with and is a well tried and tested professional tool

Current owners of the old KCS can update for a mere £30 and should you be interested in the SMPTE aspect you can get the 'Phantom' SMPTE generator and reader for £249.00. It will also work as a MIDI interface if you ask it nicely.

cutting the length of segments would have to be done in either the Open or Track mode before linking them together. Loop points can be set as can channel mute and solo. You can also alter the order in which the segments play back as you are. going along.

A couple of neat features are the step time mode, which takes the form of a list of events which you type in you can set up parameters and insert from the host keyboard as well. The other is the program's use of the IFF voices available to the Amiga sound chip. It can load up to 16 voices and access any four of them at any one time. The option for this is taken from the environment menu. They are alterable and touch sensitive and can be set for any range of notes.

#### Extra! Extra!

Onward to the extra goodies that come with KCS v3.

Automix: The first is 'Automix', basically a screen full of active faders which will first of all control relative volumes of MIDI equipment but can also be adapted to any area you would like to control.

PVG: The second addition is a complex beast and is almost a composing tool with artificial intelligence. Almost, but not quite. I have to confess that to dig into its hidden depths

back process. It is pretty complex and a bit unmusical at first but rather interesting after a while.

#### Conclusions

In the space we have available it is not possible to cover all the KCS features in great depth, but at least most of them have had a mention.

One of the benefits of having a well tried-and-market-tested piece of software is that you have all the options, bolt-ons and ways

#### MIND YOUR PPQ

There is always much bragging in any sequencer literature as to the amount of PPQ it has - that is, the accuracy to which it will record each note. What happens is that the software breaks down each guarter note (crotchet) into a specified number of clock pulses; you could perhaps think of this as a clock ticking, the greater the number of ticks given to a second the greater the accuracy of the clock. This is the case with MIDI sequencers. Ppq, by the way, stands for Pulses Per Quarter note. Subtle nuances

in tempo and note accuracy become rarified the greater the number of PPQ.

KCS v3 has a variable number of PPO to define its accuracy. The default is 240 but it will go as high as 384, which is pretty good. However, tucked away in the back of the copious and corpulent manual is a little warning which recommends no higher setting than 240 BPM.

The reason for this is that the timing will eventually suffer: the program uses the gaps between events to run around and to do its work ready for

the next output. With this time cut down and larger numbers to crunch there will be a tendency for the notes to start disappearing up their own points of exit (!) and for the software to suffer with severe stres from overwork, at which point it will probably

for a bit.

#### COPYIST

As part of the Multi Program Environment the Copyist Apprentice will take KCS files directly, if they are both resident and running, and turn them into a score which you can edit and print out. It can also work in other ways. You can use it as a stand-alone music entry system, rather like a music typewriter, or you can load in MIDI files which it will turn into nota-

tion. It will also work with SMUS files to ensure compatibility with more low-budget sequencers like DMCS.

The reality is that you could well paint yourself into a corner as far as memory space is concerned. For KCS and Copyist to co-exist requires 2Mbyte of RAM. If you opt to

store temporary files in RAM disk, that will require more. You could store temporary files (that is, those that are created by *Copyist* from *KCS*, MIDI or SMUS prior to conversion to notation) on a disk drive but it is very slow.

#### **Setting the Score**

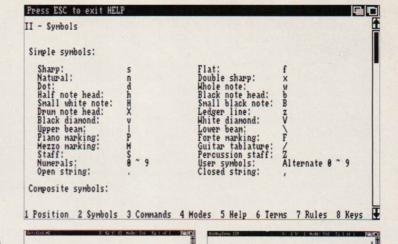
On booting up you choose where the temporary work files are stored and the resolution to see the score in. Then it's down to scoring. The program will work on up to 12 staves at a time and the notes are entered, altered and edited by a combination of either menu options, alphanumeric keys and cursor.

Thankfully there are help pages on hand, because learning your way through the keystrokes could take a bit of time, even though the essential ones are the initials of the note or sign in reverse. Instead of dragging notes and symbols from a graphic menu you have to define the note and enter it; perhaps the former is intuitively quicker.

As a short cut you can have notes before and after or vertically aligned with the first note from simple keystrokes. It has all the logic of beaming and linking notes together where required and supports guitar and percussion notation. Entering text, lyrics and headings seems to be no problem either, although you do have to place them on the page yourself rather than the 'auto lyric' option often used in notation programs.

Copyist will notate all time signatures, clefs, signs and symbols, put notes of different values on the same beam, and position slurs, ties, expression markings, grace notes and ornaments.

Once all is in, then, it is print-out time. Copyist supports Epson and Laser with the option to route the output through the chosen Amiga print driver. However it pulls the score in RIGHT: Part of the 8-page Help section.

and out page by page and this is a mite frustrating. Niceties like page numbering and headings seem to be missing from the *Apprentice's* menu.

Its way of working I felt was not the most user friendly and it would have been nice to get a minature version of the page you are working on but nevertheless it is a well-thought through package. It main failing is the quality of the score itself. All the symbols and notes seem a bit emaciated and there seemed no way of setting a heavier or thicker typeface. As its name suggests it is the apprentice version of the *Professional* and the *Copyist DTP*. It is a good apprentice but not a master.

#### MODULATED MONITOR

Anyone who uses the Amiga with a TV modulator will know what that the picture quality is far from satisfactory. Although the Amiga produces beautiful screen displays, these are let down by the poor quality of Commodore's A520 TV modulator.

However, there is a way to improve picture quality substantially by channelling the output from the TV modulator into an aerial booster amplifier (intended for use with indoor TV aerials). These devices can be bought for around £15 from most electric stores, such as Tandy. The resulting picture almost matches that obtainable from a proper monitor.

#### **EPSON DRIVER TIPS**

Here's a couple of scorching hints which will help you get a decent graphics printout from an EpsonX-compatible printer.

1. Check the current density settings within Preferences – if you are using density 1 or 3 then watch out, because the paper-type setting affects the line-feed distance, leaving gaps between lines! If the paper type is set to single, then the line feed must equal the number of dots printed minus one third of a dot.

The wrong value here can result in horrible horizontal banding, which can make your printouts look pretty awful! The best way of working out the ideal setting for your printer is simple – just experiment with it.

2. Try checking the printing gap setting in the printer. Don't be put off by having to delve inside your printer – the results are worth the

effort! On the Star LC-10, this adjustment is carried out using a small lever located at the left-hand side of the metal bar on which the print head travels. If in doubt about its location, refer to the manual that (with any luck at all) came with your printer.

This adjustment can make a surprising improvement in print quality. I have found that the different density settings in Preferences tend to require different gap settings to obtain good results.

3. Remember to use a white background colour or select 'negative' in Preferences in order to save wear on your printer ribbon (not to mention your ears!!)

#### DIGIVIEW DISTORTION

Here's a handy tip for anyone using NewTek's Digi-View video digitiser with a colour video camera. If you are suffering from colour signal distortion interfering with the digitiser (which normally expects a mono signal such as that produced by the Hitachi MV-720k camera) and you're not afraid to do a little wiring, then help is at hand. The following modification will turn the colour signal from your camera into glorious monochrome (don't worry, no modification is required to the actual camera).

All you need is an 8 ohm loudspeaker like those found in old transistor radios. Failing that, pop along to your local electrical spares store (such as Tandy), who should be able to help you.

1. First, of course, turn off all power to the digitiser.

2. Next, get hold of a spare video lead and cut it in half. The cable will contain a central core and a braided outer sleeve – strip an inch or two back from either side of the break.

- 3. Connect the central core from one half to one loudspeaker terminal, and the other central core to the other terminal. Join the two ends of braid together.
- 4. Check that there are no short circuits wrap some insulating tape around the braided join just to make sure.

5. Turn on the power and connect the video directly into the back of your Amiga monitor, if you have one. Flick the CVBS switch and the video picture should appear... minus colour. If so, the camera should now work much better with Digi-View.

If nothing works, check your wiring. It's worth saying that, at video frequencies, electrical components such as loud-speakers can act as complex components and even those with identical impendances may give varying results.

# Having problems with your stand alone NotePad?

Have problems with our 'Stand Alone NotePad' tip? Read on!

NotePad tip will already have found out, the tip doesn't actually, as such, in practise, um... er... work. The problem isn't with the actual tip itself (Jason's tips always work – that's what Jason says anyway), but several printing errors managed to creep in after

I-INotepad VZ.Z

the text file left Jason's word processor (as anyone who knows him will agree, Jason never accepts responsibility for anything!)

The first printing error cropped up in nearly all the 'copy' commands that appear at the bottom of the first column. Those

of you who know AmigaDOS sufficiently well will probably have spotted it straight away – the exclamation marks should actually be vertical bar symbols ('I'). All you have to do is to substitute every exclamation mark with a vertical bar and you're away. For example, the first line that features this error currently reads Copy C:Copy!MakeDir!Install!Ed RAM:, this should read Copy C:Copy!MakeDir!Install!Ed RAM:.

The second printing mistake can be found in the line that reads MakeDir DF0:DEVS:Printers. Anyone who knows AmigaDOS fairly well will probably have already spotted the mistake – the second colon (':') should actually be a backslash symbol ('/'). The line should now read MakeDir DF0:DEVS/Printers. To be certain, we tried the tip again and hopefully it should work (honest guv).

#### MAKING THE MOST OF MACROS



Macros can be wonderful things. If applied correctly, a simple macro can not only save you many hours of typing, but can also take a vast

amount of the drudgery out of programming.

One particular language that has more than its fair share of drudgery is Assembler. Many programmers build up libraries filled with macros to carry out particular tasks, thereby allowing code from different projects to be used over and over again.

The macros below were designed to take the drudgery out of writing hardware copper lists. Instead of having to write reams and reams of meaningless 16-bit values, your copper lists will finally become readable ("Impossible!" I hear you shout). Anyway, enough waffle, here's the juicy bits. But first we'll start with a look at the format of each macro individually.

CMOVE data, address

This is the copper MOVE instruction. The two values normally given have been reversed to match the 68000's MOVE format. For example, moving a value into the hardware colour register zero is achieved using the following command – CMOVE \$000,COLOROO

CWAIT line, column CWAITline, column, lm, cm

These macros provide both the normal copper WAIT instruction and the masked WAIT instruction. The vertical line and horizontal column must be given. The macros will then build up the neccessary word. If no mask is defined, the mask generated will be the default value of SFFFE. CSKIP line, column CSKIP line, column, lm, cm

Just like the CWAIT macros, the CSKIP instruction provides both direct and masked versions of the copper SKIP instruction. If no mask is defined, then the mask generated will be \$FFFF.

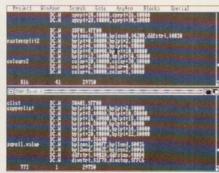
BWAIT line, column BSKIP line, column BWAIT line, column, lm, cm BSKIP line, column, lm, cm

These four macros are similar to the Cxxxx macros with one exception. If the copper has been used to start a blitter operation, these macros will force the copper to wait until the blitter has finished. Note that the macro is checked AFTER the blitter is freed.

CEND

Not a great deal to this macros business really. This macro was created purely for cosmetic reasons and is basically just a friendlier version of DC.W \$FFFF,FFFE which is used to end a copper list.

#### TIME TO MOVE ON?

To expand, or not to expand? That is the question. I bought my Amiga 1000 when they first came out — well someone had to! Although I have since bought the extra 256K RAM expansion (knocking the machine's memory up to 512K) and a second disk drive, it is still relatively unexpanded. I have built up a nice little nest egg over the years and will soon be wanting to add a hard drive and other such luxuries to my machine. Could you possibly answer a couple of questions?

1. With the dawn of ROM-based Kickstarts, ECS and peripherals made for use on only the A500 and 2000 (Xetec's FastTrak etc), is it time to lay the old A1000 to rest and buy myself a nice new Amiga 2000?

2. If so, do I say goodbye to The Music Studio and Leaderboard? (both will only work under Kickstart 1.1)?

3. What exactly is Fast RAM, and why haven't I got any?

4. In either case, I need a hard disk drive that also provides space for RAM expansion. Is RAM quicker when installed in the hard drive unit?

1. With the impending release of both Kickstart 1.4 and the Enhanced Chip Set, it seems that Commodore have forgotten A1000 users. Thankfully, third party developers have not. One company in particular that A1000 users have to thank is Delaware Valley Software, who are soon to start shipping a board that will life into breathe new Commodore's original (and arguably their best) Amiga.

The Delaware Wonder Card is a very clever little board that slots in as a replacement to the Kickstart daughterboard inside the A1000. This board allows the Amiga 1000 to use both the ECS and even Kickstart 1.4, which is ROM-based! Not only that, but once the ECS is installed the A1000 will have access to all the new ECS screen modes and the ability to use up to a megabyte of chip RAM.

Optional extras include a battery backed clock, an audio filter switch and the ability to software select between 1.2, 1.3 and 1.4 of the Amiga O/S. How can an A1000 owner live without such a device? (My A1000 is going to get one as soon as they are available in this country!)

Needless to say, as soon as it is available we will review this wondrous piece of hardware. Until then, Delaware can be contacted on 0101 215 446 9227.

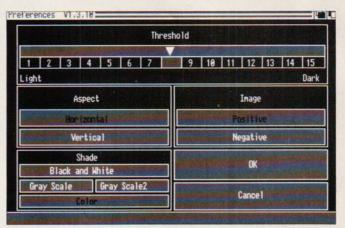
2. Most software that will only work under 1.1 of the operating system has since been rereleased in a 1.2/1.3 compatible form. Both Music Studio and Leaderboard are included in this.

3. Fast RAM is memory that cannot be used by the Amiga's custom chips – only the 68000 can access it. If you buy a RAM expansion to take your Amiga over 512K, you will have Fast RAM in your machine. (There's also Slow RAM, but we won't go into that!) If you need a RAM expansion for your A1000, then GTS sell A1000 RAM expansions. GTS are on 077082 234.

4. As far as I am aware, no such device exists for the A1000. Looks as if you may be forced to buy a separate RAM expansion and hard drive.

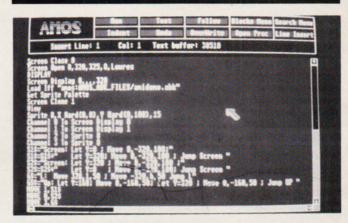


The Graphic 1 screen within Preferences.

Curiosity has forced me to put ink to paper and ask Workbench a few questions.

1. What is the correct meaning of the abbreviation, CLI? I have heard it called the 'Command Line Interface', the 'Command Line Interpreter' and even the 'Command Language Interpreter'. Which is correct? 2. I am considering purchasing HiSoft's BASIC compiler. Is its speed worthy of its price tag? Also, can I access the Amiga operating system libraries (Graphics, Intuition etc)? If I use the operating system routines, will my programs run at near machine code speed? 3. Is GFA BASIC (once compiled) as fast as HiSoft's system?

1. CLI definitely, no question about it, no arguments, most certainly stands for 'Command Line Interface'. Take no notice of anyone who says otherwise – both Commodore and myself say so!

2. HiSoft BASIC, like
AmigaBASIC, allows you complete access to the power of the
Amiga's operating system.
However, as any Amiga applications programmer will tell you,
the Amiga OS routines are far
from fast (the graphics library is
particularly bad) so your programs will never be that fast.

If it's ultra-fast graphics, animation and sound that you're after, then a better bet could well be Mandarin's soon-to-be-released BASIC language, AMOS. This excellent provides the kind of graphics and sound facilities that were previously only accessible from assembler.

3. GFA BASIC is a blisteringly fast language, faster than both HiSoft BASIC and AMOS. For an idea of the speed of GFA BASIC, check out our review of the GFA Compiler in Issue 8 of AF.

a hash symbol. What could I possibly be doing wrong?

#### M Lawrence Hampshire

Humm, strange one that. There are several reasons why your printer could be refusing to print in colour. The first possibility is the blatantly obvious one – have you got a colour ribbon in the printer, or is it just a black ribbon?

Secondly, have you actually told the Amiga that you are using a colour printer? This is achieved using the Workbench Preferences tool. To check, load Preferences, enter the Change Printer screen and then click on the Graphic 1 gadget and you should see a screen display similiar to the one printed on this page.

You'll notice that there is a box called Shade at the bottom

left of this screen that contains four gadgets. The one that you are interested in is colour, which should be highlighted (click on it if it is not). Once you've done this, save off your new configuration and try to print in colour – if all goes well, your problem should now be solved. Note that you will have to carry out this procedure for all your boot disks (DPaint etc).

The problem with hash symbols is simple to solve. Somewhere on your printer you will find a row of dip switches. These are used to configure various aspects of the printer. One of these dip switches (pin 5, if my memory serves me well) is used to tell the printer to print either hash symbols or pound signs. Refer to the manual that came with your printer to find out exactly which dip switch to flick.

- 1. Why is there such a large variation in price between RAM expansions? For a 512K RAM expansion, I've seen prices in your mag that range from as little as £50 to well over £100. Are all RAM expansions created equal or are some more equal than others?
- 2. With a MIDI interface, is it possible to use a normal keyboard and guitar for input, or must I buy a device made specifically for use with the interface?
- 3. What is the difference between Aegis Sonix and Deluxe Music? Which package is best?
- 4. Excuse me for being totally thick, but what exactly is C?

1. Speaking very generally, there is very little difference between 512K RAM expansions. However, there are several things to take into consideration when choosing the one that is good for you.

Some RAM expansions offer battery-backed clocks that allow the Amiga to keep time even when it is turned off. Most people rarely use these, so it is simply as case of deciding whether your require such a facility. Usually, the lack of a battery-backed clock can knock about £20 off the price of a RAM expansion.

Another factor to consider is future expansion. If 1 Megabyte is enough for your needs just buy the cheapest 512K RAM board that you can find: otherwise you are advised to look for a board that offers further

expansion. Quite a few boards come populated with just 512K but can be taken further by simply plugging in extra RAM chips.

2. MIDI is an industry-standard communications protocol that was devised to allow any MIDI

device (regardless of make, model or type) to talk to any other MIDI device. As long as the instruments that you have support MIDI, they will happily work with your Amiga MIDI interface (providing you have the

appropriate software to hand!)
3. Aegis Sonix and Deluxe Music are in many ways very similar. They are both music packages that allow the creation of music by placing notes onto a standard musical stave. Deluxe Music is a far more powerful package, but is rather user-unfriendly at times. Aegis Sonix, on the other hand, is favoured by many because of its ease of use. If you're new to music software, then Aegis Sonix is probably a better bet.

4. C is a programming language devised during the early seventies by Brian Kernigan and Dennis Ritchie at Bell Laboratories, for use on their then-new operating system, Unix. C is a highly-structured programming language that lends itself particularly well to systems programming (operating systems, low-level device drivers etc). The language was designed to offer high speed of execution, a very high level of portability (C programs from one system can be taken across to another system with minor modifications) and C programs suffer from very few overheads once compiled.

A large amount of the Amiga's operating system was written in C (Graphics and Intuition libraries etc. AmigaDOS was unfortunately written in a wretched language called BCPL, which is even more hideous than COBOL!), hence its popularity. If you are planning on writing applications that use the Amiga operating system, then C is a very good choice.

B.F.P.O. WELCOME

he first thing which leaps out at you with this hand scanner is just how easy it is to use. Fitting the thing takes one 13-amp socket for the power supply, one parallel port for the 25-way connector, a fairly flat surface for the scanning to take place and Jean's your aunty.

You get software which will allow you to manipulate the images in quite complex ways and the hardware itself. We won't go into the power supply (which is no more than a black box) but the rest of the kit deserves some examination.

#### Logical, Captain

The real work is done by the modest logic chips, which reside in a small plastic case that plugs into the parallel port. Logic-based they might be, but even their Spock-like abilities will not allow them to deal with 4094 of the Amiga's 4096 colours. The Datel Amiga Handscanner is a monochromatic device. But don't let that put you off. To achieve colour scanning would cost a damn sight more than the most decent human beings could afford. A flatbed, colour scanner will cost you anything from a thousand pounds upwards.

What you do get are 'grey scales' rather than a flat, boring, badly-photocopied mono. The grey scaling will produce half tones at sixteen levels of gradation or, if you prefer, a simple two-tone. Both of these formats can be saved in either IFF or RAW form. The former allows you to transfer the captured images over to other soft-



ware such as desktop publishers or paint packages where you can add as many colours as you like.

#### Head!

The trick, of course lies in capturing the images in the first place and to do this you need to concentrate on the scanning head itself. This is connected to the interface by way of a small 8-way DIN plug. In appearance the scan head bears a striking resemblance to a late '70s idea of an interplanetary scout ship - a kind of rounded-off 'T' shape - upon which you will find four controls.

The brightness is monitored by a thumb-wheel at the rear of the device. While this affects the way you see the image appearing on screen, it also controls the way in which the software defines light from dark. Although

it appears to be the least important of the devices at your command, getting it right is imperative if you wish to have a clear image to play around with later.

Next to the brightness control is the Resolution switch. A four way switch, this works in tandem with the software and needs to be set at the same level.

On the side of the scan-head are two more switches: the one nearest the back defines to the software just what type of image you are scanning. You are given four options: three are set at Photo which are, in effect, the grey scale settings. The three different options here are dependent on the quality of the original image you have chosen for scanning. Although the documentation claims that Photo gives you 'newspaper type grey scales of dot density', the final output is going to be only as good as your printer can achieve. The Photo options are basically there for you to pick out a few details and if used properly will make life easier when it comes to touching-up the captured picture.

The final option on this switch is called Letter, but as there is still no way for the scanner to know whether you are running your hand over a picture of your favourite star-person or the collected letters of Boris Yeltsin, what it actually does is provide full monochrome with no scaling. This is the ideal setting for line drawings, simple cartoons or photographs of people you hate and have decided to make look bland when you put the images of them into the Yearbook or 'Wanted' poster.

The final control on the head is modestly called Start. A simple on/off job, this (obviously!) tells the scanhead that you are over the section of image you wish to be scanned.

#### **Softly Software**

Four controls leave the scan-head itself feeling light, which is fine by me as it makes long hours of work less arduous. You are not left with just three ways of getting the image right, however. The main power of the package comes with the software.

The Amiga 1000 isn't capable of auto-booting this so have Kickstart at the ready in order to get moving. If you've not got the 1000 then simply whack in the disk and off you go. The first thing you see are some dancing images, Mickey Mouse and the like, which is the product's way of showing off and telling you 'just how easy it is' – once you've become sick and tired of this, click on the left mouse button and on you'll go.

You will know when you are in business as the normal cursor icon changes into one of the scan head. While powering up the green scan light (positioned at the front of the scan-head) will have lit up for no apparent reason, as soon as the software has got itself sorted and is resident in the system, however, this light will soon extinguish and you will be ready for action.

Once everything is running, which might take a couple of attempts as the model used for this review did have a tendency to be petulant and fall over every so often, it's time for the first of many menus to pull on down! Because the bulk of the Amiga's screen is used to display the images themselves, this pull-down menu system was the only really workable option and it serves its purpose effectively enough.

There are six categories available to you in the form of Project, Scan, Edit, Extras (!), Compress and Function. The first thing to do here is bring down the Scan menu and inform the scanner just what width of image you wish to be captured. Five selections are available: 400, 640, 800, 1280 and 1600 pixels wide. Although it is tempting to go for the top whack every time, avoid this temptation. The optimum width is dependent on the quality of the original graphic, so trial and error are your best pals in the early stages of this operation - and most of the others.

#### **Old Buffer**

The next step is to set the number of 'pages' or screens you want scanned – from one to four pages. Because images are scanned to a buffer, the ability to scan and store up to four attempts can be a real time-saver. Each page consists of 20,000 bytes of data while the buffer itself allows

for ten times as much information, giving 200,000 bytes to play around with in the form of 2.5 screens wide by four deep. Screen memory and buffer memory are independent, which makes re-doing cock-ups that bit easier.

Once you have decided how many pagers you wish to scan it's time to get into details. Scan density is set from 100/200, 300 or 400 dots per inch and these settings have to be tied into those which you set on the scan-head itself. There is scope for experimentation by not doing so but only if you're really into fuzzy images with little definition. 400 dpi is no mean feat, by the way, and does provide you with some quite dapper-looking scans for later use. The company claim 95% accuracy in scanning with the 400 dpi.

Once you're all set up it's time to get going: in fact once you have selected the number of pages you require, the green light on the scan head springs back into action and it's down to you to press the start button.

#### **Fiddle About**

Don't use glossy surfaces, my old blind, deaf and dumb servant used to tell me, and she was right. Glossy images just bounce the light back up the hooter of the scan-head so, if you can, photocopy first or use matt images to begin with. The scanning itself takes little time and you don't have to have a hand steadier than Maradonna's to achieve clear results. Happily the scan-head is light and better still while a completely flat surface is best the scanner can cope with a normal desktop.

Once you are happy with the quality of the image on screen you can

either save it direct to disk for later transfer or you can use the software's built-in editing tools. These include Cut, Copy, Paste, Mix and Brush, The two options can prove very effective by allowing you to paint a captured picture in full or part (just keep your finger on the mouse button) on top of other images, or to integrate a Letter with a Photo. Cut and Copy are straightforward in application, allowing you to tidy up your graphics and save data to the buffer for later use: for example (and if copyright allowed) you could put John Major's head on the body of Maynard Keynes. On top of this lot there is also the essential Undo command.

Effects abound but get boring after a while – there are only so many times you will want to see a black and white picture turn upside down (Invert), from left to right(mirror) or turned from black and white to white and black(pos/neg). You'll probably dabble here for a while before hoiking the scan into some beefier program for a real working over.

Basically, the software does the business effectively enough but with no great flair. You do have a deal of access to the buffer itself which is a boon for long hauls of work say, for example, when putting together a fanzine. The Compression facilities allow you to squash buffered information as well as that of the files which you are editing – in effect it is a 'size to fit' option which is rather lacking in any fine tuning.

#### Conclusion

Overall the Datel (or GeniScan as it comes to be known half-way through the rather flimsy manual) is a work-manlike tool. The hardware is light, easy to use and capabable of achieving some excellent results once you have worked out the scaling, angling of the head and equation of image quality to scan requisites. The manual could have done well to give some workable examples with the occasional screen shot but there you go, trial and error.

The software has been pepped up since version 1 (you now get the 400 dpi density) and once you've found your way around it will also produce some extremely effective visual delights. However, the main worth of the system lies in its ability to export images to sofware of greater editing strengths if you have access to such things. Finally, don't think that the images you get on screen will be matched by the printed effort. A ninepin dot matrix printer will probably not do a great deal of justice to them and sadly there is no way of finding this out as no print function is included.

#### NORTH AND SOUTH

D Whittle starts his letter with tips for North and South with 'Dear Sir/Madam,' but I don't really think I suit that name. Imagine - called to the palace... the queen touches both shoulders and says 'Arise, Sir Madam'. Arrgh! Anyway, on with the hints...

#### THE START OF THE GAME

When playing a one-player game as the South, choose either 1962 or 1963 for an advantage. If, on the other hand you choose the North, then select 1964. To start a fair two player game then choose 1961, since both armies will then be equal.

Other screen options include the ship which will allow anyone owning South Virginia to gain an extra army about every eighth full move. However you have to be careful, as if you have any more than 12 infantry, 6 cavalry or 2 cannon, then you will be stopped from docking, which means you will be unable to gain the extra army.

For a slightly longer game choose the raincloud for when it rains over an armyoccupied state. This will stop that particular army from moving.

If you're feeling adventurous, then choose the Indian - this will be explained later.

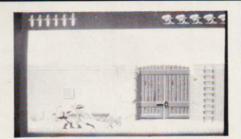
#### MOVING FROM STATE TO STATE

At the start of the game head for the counties with forts in them as they will open the train line, giving access to money for extra armies. You will also need to occupy the states between the forts with the train line going through it, otherwise it'll be like waiting for the delayed train from Bristol Temple Meads. Another important position is the port in South Virginia, as it could give an extra army just when you need it.

If you choose the Indians, then you will see to the West of the map an Indian and a Mexican. The Indian will attack any army that stavs North-West of Texas for too long, which results in the loss of a whole army. The Mexican will attack you if you stay in Texas for too long, throwing a bomb which does the same damage as an Indian attack. These sequences are amusing if it's your opponent that's getting hammered, but a little worrying if your side is taking a beating!

If you are worried that an enemy army is going to attack one of your forts, then leave an army there. That way he'll think twice before attacking.

The more states you own the more





money you'll receive, so remember to defend your states and try to corner the enemy in one state. Then he'll have to fight to the death, unless he's stronger than you, in which case he'll break free.

#### FIGHTING BATTLES

At the start of a battle, press the fire button until the meter at the top of the screen is full. With luck the cannonball fired should hit the enemy with an eye-watering blow!

If there is a bridge, wait until an infantry or cavalry is crossing: that way you'll kill two birds with one stone.

If the bridge has been destroyed and you want to get across to the other side follow the path that should be at the top or bottom of the screen. If you do decide to use the path, remember that it can only be traversed in single file, so if you send a full Infantry, only three men will survive.

At the start of the game try and send in your cavalry to slaughter the enemy artillery, infantry or cavalry as soon as possible. However, take care when confronting the infantry or artillery: they can fire at you before you reach them, so keep moving to avoid their shots. If you leave your artillery in one place, then the enemy will try to destroy it. If you see his meter rising for a shot, move your artillery straight away, then his shot will be wasted.

#### **TAKING PORTS**

If you have more forts than the enemy chances are you'll receive more armies than him, so try to take as many forts as possible at the start of the game and so reduce the number of armies he receives. To take a fort, you must move one of your armies into an enemy held state. Once you start moving, go to the top of the wall to avoid the dogs and the explosives. Remember to jump the gaps or you'll fall to the ground! If you see an enemy soldier heading your way, either fire a dagger or move to the top or bottom of the wall, then he'll pass you. Follow these points and you should take the fort in no time.

#### **DEFENDING FORTS**

You need to get a shot in as early as you can, so to appear at the same height as an enemy soldier, press either the up or down key. As soon as you appear loose off a dagger to stun him. If he fires a dagger at you then just jump over it. Once you have stuuned him, run up and keep punching him to slow him down. At the start, let your men attack him one after another and you should (hopefully) keep the fort.

#### **TAKING TRAINS**

As soon as the train sequence starts, push up to climb up onto the second carriage instead of the first. Make your way to the right, jumping the gaps between the carriages and avoiding the guards. When you jump a gap, loose off a dagger to stun a guard, so that he can't stop you from jumping. Once you reach the cab you will get the gold that the enemy would have received.

#### **DEFENDING TRAINS**

Defending a train is similar to defending a fort. When an enemy soldier jumps a gap between the carriages, send on a soldier and let loose a dagger. This should knock him to the ground so that he has to climb back onto the carriages. If you miss him with the dagger, then run up to him and attack him with your fists to slow him down.

#### **GENERAL HINTS**

Always try to surprise armies when you can. Try to combine armies to increase their strength. Try to remember to leave Texas as soon as you can, otherwise the Mexican will get you! The same applies for the Indian steer clear or you'll get it in the neck!

#### The Tips (From the Table) ackie's Car isn't found

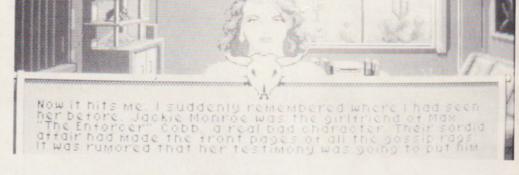
- 1 Jackie's Car isn't found unless you are in your house on the morning of June 2. Let Jackie into your house and select 'Take Jackie to Car.' Once you are at the car you will find the fluid, but to find the body part you must select 'Investigate Scene Further.'
- **2** This body part is delivered to your house by a neighbour. To get it you must be at home on the morning of June 3 and you must answer the door.
- **3** You are given the tape the second time you go to M-2 on June 5. The first time you are stopped by an ant.
- 4 To collect either of these pieces you must kill the first ant and then go on to destroy enough ants to scare off the rest.

#### GENERAL TIPS

To collect the body part and the Fluid on the first day, first go to JD's farm, then go to the South-West Cone. If you do this without answering the door first, you can take the evidence to Dr. Wells for analysis.

By June 6 the ants will go into hiding and all ant activity stops until the main attack on June 9.

Mines three, four and five, the pump-stations, the North Cone and the North-West Cone are all dead-



ends and nothing ever happens there. Ignore the strange lights you hear about – they're just red herrings.

The nest is below M-1, but it is impossible to enter before the main ant attack.

Walk up to the guards and get their attention before going back to the right hand room. The guards should go past, leaving you to sneak out of the room and rune through the doors.

Towards the end of the game the mines and South-West cone may be destroyed. If this happens you can only get into the nest by plane. Fly to M-1 gassing any ants on the way. When you reach the mine fly a little to the left and turn round to land on the dirt track. Now you're ready for the nemesis!

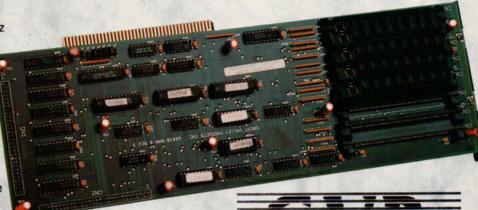

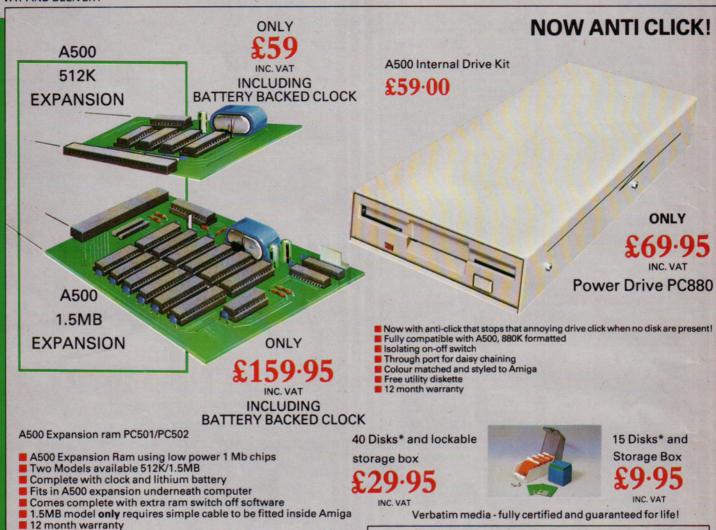

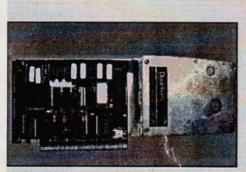

collection. With a few exceptions these are all originals, or magazine or Public Domain certified disks. I would like to offer a cautionary tale to others who discover their prized collection is full of errors or corrupted disks.

Don't assume, just because a disk comes from a manufacturer and you break the seal yourself, that it is virus free. How easy would it be for a malicious person to deliberately leave a virus to cause havoc? Check your disks!

Are the software companies even aware of the alarm caused by non-standard bootblock messages flashing on the screen, particularly for new computer owners?

Please don't write programs that behave in this way - everyone automatically fears the worst and begins to wonder where the disk was infected. Accusations fly thick and fast as partners blame each other: for buying games untried? Through mail order? From the sale bin? That scruffy shop? That posh shop? Was the seal broken? Did the assistant get the disk from the back room? Surely you didn't buy it from that shop which allows yobbos to X-COPY their own disks on the display machine? Did you run it through all the virus checkers before use? Was the write-protect ever left off?

Would the software companies please use standard bootblocks only: then we do not have the alarming messages of 'non-standard bootblock' and should a virus ever damage a bootblock we can rewrite the bootblock with the industry-standard one and still use the program.

My advice is not to trust your money to Mail Order companies that use a box number address without a phone number, and never part with your money unless the item you want is in stock.

To advertise a disk for sale long before its release date is widely practiced in many computer magazines, so if you must order in advance make sure it's from a company you can trust.

The Hacker's Handbook was so named before 'hacking' became a dirty word. It does cover subject matter that is potentially illegal in its application, but it's actually of most use to those trying to stop people getting into their computer systems.

#### LANGUAGE BARRIER

Although I am currently enjoying

Dave Jones' series on Amiga games programming, I think many of us are at a disadvantage as we cannot compile and save the code that Dave has generously provided. Neither the Devpac assembler from ST/Amiga Format or the Argasm assembler recently provided have the necessary 'include' files to allow us to compile the code. Perhaps here a good PD assembler may be considered for inclusion in a future issue.

Still on the subject of assembly language, I am a computer systems manager, and have written programs in 4GL, Pascal, Fortran and a couple of others. Assembly language has always eluded me, however, as I have never seen an adequate beginners' tutorial about 68000 machine language, other than the odd short series which lasts a couple of issues.

I would welcome a course in assembly language which was practical rather than explaining what each instruction does. Perhaps the first month you could start off and have a simple article on printing a message on screen, and in the coming issues on how to open a custom screen, and maybe designing a simple sprite and getting it to move very simply on the screen. The point, I think, is to have something that is achievable every month to keep the interest in the subject.

Perhaps this tutorial could even be based along the lines of The Very First tutorial that comes with the Amiga. I have always thought that having a disk on a magazine was an excellent way of teaching new skills to readers.

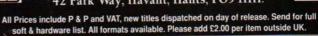

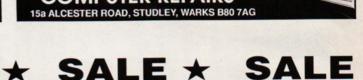

#### ASSEMBLER CORNER

I have very little reason to say anything adverse about your magazine, except concerning the "Dave Jones Series".

I am very pleased to see this kind of addition to the magazine, but unfortunately the source code given on the disk is of no use to me since I use the K-Seka assembler/debugger — which will not even allow me to edit the source, let alone assemble it.

Is it possible that you could include a version which I may use, with or without the comments? I'm

sure there must be many people with the same difficulty I have.

Finally, it may be a good idea to have a section which is entirely for the assembler users, consisting of programming hints and routines – supplied by the readers and/or games programmers (such as Dave Jones). Sinclair User, which I used to read in the days of my Spectrum, had such a feature and was very successful.

Devpac is generally accepted as the Amiga industry standard assembler. If you do insist on using K-Seka (you're a brave soul!), then converting the source code to Seka format is simply a matter of removing tabs and substituting the Devpac assembler directives for their Seka equivelents (which is easier said than done, I'll warn you now!)

#### **LESS IS MORE**

As an Amiga user to be, I feel justified in writing to an Amiga magazine at last. After congratulating you on a great magazine I want to address a point to Roger Barefoot, who wrote to you about flight simulators a couple of months ago.

In his letter he complains of a lack of ground detail in the latest flight sims. Fair enough, but in the newest experimental military flight simulators the ground graphics are being generated with less detail, the idea being that by creating the picture with blocks of colour the eye is tricked into seeing detail that isn't there. This also enables the speed of the simulator to be increased without detracting from the visuals.

Finally, a question about this

Amiga that's arriving on my doorstep in a few days time. I have been told that the Amiga does not support a proportional joystick. Having tried to play flight simulators with switched sticks on my old BBC 'B' I can imagine that, despite the fantastic graphics and sound, it will almost be a downgrading from my Beeb in the control area. I would be glad if you could prove me wrong.

#### NO PROTECTION

I refer to the recent attention drawn to software piracy or 'hacking'. In my opinion, the very existence of the hacking groups is a direct consequence of the software companies.

If the software companies did not protect their products then the hacking groups would not even exist at all and these people's talents would be put to a far more constructive use. Obviously, the software would be copied more easily, but perhaps to a far lesser extent than if circulated by a large hacking network of groups. Most people, I feel, would much prefer to own the original copies complete with instructions, etc.

If the software companies have to continue to protect their products from these petty 'hacking' groups all that will happen is that prices will go up as protection gets more and more advanced and the hacking groups will thrive.

When someone has paid the original it is nice to have the peace of mind to have a back-up copy to use in case the original becomes

corrupt. Sure, the companies may offer replacement deals at a reduced price, but this may come as little consolation when this occurs to a £25 game or a more expensive piece of software.

I would prefer to see unprotected software, but with some sort of a passworded entry – a random word from a manual, say – which I see as a good comprise to the problem. This, I feel, would get rid of the 'hacking' groups which exist who have such a harmful effect on the profits of the software companies whose hard work goes in to producing good quality software for our machines.
