The purpose of the Third International Conference on Antiviral Research is to provide an interdisciplinary forum at which investigators involved in basic, applied, and clinical research worldwide can meet to review recent developments in all areas of antiviral research. Specific topics to be covered in the program include synthesis and chemistry, biochemistry and mechanism of action, molecular biology and targeting, *in vitro* evaluation, animal models, pharmacokinetics, toxicology and clinical trials. Within these areas there will be invited 'overview' speakers, oral presentations and poster presentations. In addition, there will be minisymposia on 'Targeting of Antiviral Agents' and 'Drug Development for Human Immunodeficiency Virus Infections'.
