## Invitation to the Twenty-Second International Conference on Antiviral Research Miami Beach, FL, USA, May 3–7, 2009

The 22nd International Conference on Antiviral Research (ICAR) will be held in Miami, FL at the Miami Beach Resort and Spa. The conference will begin on Sunday afternoon, May 3, 2009, and conclude on Thursday morning, May 7, 2009.

As always, the purpose of the ICAR is to provide an interdisciplinary forum at which investigators from around the globe who are involved in basic, applied and clinical research can meet to learn about and discuss recent developments in all areas of antiviral research. A clinical symposium will be held during one of the sessions, and the meeting will also include another mini-symposium on a timely topic to be selected nearer to the meeting dates. This meeting is an outstanding venue to obtain current information about your own areas of research as well as a useful view of activity across the spectrum of antiviral research.

Miami is a well-known vacation destination as well as a great venue for a scientific meeting, and it is readily accessible by air from a variety of cities around the world. In addition to its celebrated beaches and water sports, Miami is both a financial and a cultural center. The climate is outstanding, with an average May temperature of 78 °F (26 °C).

In addition to the white sand beaches along the ocean, the hotel has a heated outdoor pool, a beachfront fitness center and spa, and a beachfront Aqua Sports Center for the rental of boats and other types of equipment. There are three on-site restaurants, and access to other restaurants at adjacent hotels. The hotel includes a fully equipped business center and high-speed Internet access.
