

## One meg A500 on the cards?

COMMODORE often makes running changes to the design of the Amiga This gives them flexibility in the choice of suppliers and gives room for making savings on cost or improve-

The latest version of the A500 circuit board indicates we may soon see the A500 with a megabyte of ram as standard. By using the same type of high capacity ram chips used in the A590 ets on the board to add more to bring the capacity up to 1 meg.

The upgrade will have to be fitted by







# LANCASTEK

HERE does Second World War mania come from? There are far too many simulations of aerial combat around, and Lancaster is yet another. What is wrong with the distant past or the future? Couldn't the format of Theatre Europe be built on?

NCE upon a time there was the typewriter. Press the buttons and the letters appeared on paper. Most word processors are like that. Even with the addition of spelling checkers and other magic, they are still typewriters under the skin.

Lately, with the advent of desktop publishing, graphics have become part of some word processors. But there's been little to stretch the parts of the Amiga that other computers cannot

reach.

Pen Pal is an attempt to change all that. It's an Amiga-only word processor, but instead of conforming to the word processing rules it takes the features and potential of the machine to provide one of the most innovative and well thought out user interfaces to be found on any program on any computer.

As well as normal word processing functions, it also crams in simple drawing, graphics and database features. There's a lot to it.

Starting it up gives little indication of the depth of the program. At first it looks like any of umpteen packages—tools down the left hand side, menus along the top, scroll bars surrounding a large, blank area where your text will shortly appear. Nothing spectacular, except that it uses a PAL

It's when you move the mouse around that things start to pop. As your strangely bent pointer glides over tools or areas, a box appears giving the name of the option beneath. A few minutes playing with the first window proves that Pen Pal uses Intuition—front-to-back and resizing behave exactly as they should. Any remotely experienced Amise owner will fisel at home.

Text appears in 11 point Topaz, the default font we'n all used to. Everything on screen reflects exactly what will appear in the final document – the infamous wysiwig—and selecting a new font or a new style produces precisely the expected effect. Font selection is particularly clever in that it allows you to choose the size first and then the font to fit.

Pen Pal can import, and subsequently print, any IFF picture, including HAM ones. It handles them in the usual manner of letting you draw a box into which pictures can be placed. It's happy to let you force the graphic to fit the space, or just do a best fit without distorting the proportions of the picture.

anything I wanted to do just fell to hand without my having to go off and look up whether it was possible. Pictures are displayed in eight colours. Whatever mishandling the picture suffers, Pen Pal stores the original internally and uses the resolution and palette it knows about to give the best possible results on printing.
With the Forms Fill In option you

can use the drawing tools to create a form, and the computer will then refuse to let you type in text anywhere but in the permitted fields.

The graphics tools arrayed down the screen are simple. Line drawing and

box creation, with some fill options, will produce most of the layout tricks you'll see in professional publications. If you want more than that, draw whatever it is in your favourite paint program and import it. Things created with the Pen Pal facilities can be resized, moved around and adjusted ad infinitum.

The spell checker has some 100,000 words – all of them American. Although it works well enough. I got confused by the options. I told it to start spell checking from the top of the document but it started from the current position of the cursor and worked its way up.

And the program doesn't understand ram discs. It always thinks

understand ram discs. It always thinks that the ram disc is completely full and can't accept any more.

But the help system is a real winner. It's got lots of text on most features, arranged so that it's as easy to browse through by clicking on entries as it is



to find a given feature.

warmly appreciated

To save space on the master disc the

printer drivers are held on the second disc and a small program is provided to copy just the one you want. Painful. since you have to type the name of the driver exactly, and printer drivers tend to be more incomprehensible than a Polish street map.

That done, Pen Pal itself knows how to read the installed driver and uses that data to set up various things inside itself to do with graphics printing et al. It will either print full wysiwig or use the printer's own fonts to speed up pure text output. When doing Amiga fonts it takes about four seconds per line of text on my 80 cps

Epson-compatible dot matrix printer I immediately felt at home with this program. Other things worked well hard drive installation on an A590 was easy and the various hotkeys are

There are downsides. One is speed.

In common with many wysiwig editors. Pen Pal can be diabolically slow when doing large, on-screen text operations. Three seconds to paste a 30 word chunk into a 200 word paragraph.

The worst problem I encountered was while testing its large document capabilities. I tried to feed it a 30,000 word Ascii file, some 170k. After 10 minutes of flashing its very pretty Please Wait icon at me, it died

Now, I wouldn't have minded had it taken one look at the document and told me to go away and find something smaller. I wouldn't have minded as much if it had chuntered away for a while and then said "Burn - I'm full" and let me recover. But on a multi-tasking machine it's not the done thing to gracelessly collapse

Because I tend to write plain text, and lots of it, it's not going to be my personal favourite word processor. mostly because of its lack of speed.

I'd recommend it, though, to anyone who wants a fully-featured Amiga word processor to write small to medium documents, do simple newsletters or just the normal domestic writing that the Amiga should excel at. Pen Pal makes all these things fun. It's nearest rival is Kind Words which although half the price doesn't have the database features, nor the ability to use HAM pictures or standard Amiga fonts.

# Data basics

EN PAL'S database is interesting. It is really a list manager rather than a full-blown database. It accepts information in various formats, can sort it, merge it with your text, print it out in label format, add up figures - all of the things that a computer really ought to be able to do.

Defining a database takes place in a standard Amiga requester with lots of fields to chose from. Data can be text. numbers, currency (Pen Pal helpfully supplies a dollar sign), dates, times... there are even picture and sound types.

These are there partially to maintain compatibility with an earlier and partially because future Pen Pals will be able to display pictures in the

database. Neither field type does

anything at the moment. The definition process creates a list

of fields into which you can type your data. Once you've entered it, you can order everything alphabetically, by date, or by any other field This done, you can create what Pen

Pal calls a View. This is a particular set of things you'd like doing to the database - sort in a certain way, prepare the data in columns - and you can have more than one View per database, so you can display or use the data in various different ways with minimum effort once you've set

It's simple and very fast. A 100 item database can be searched or ordered in a couple of seconds.

# **Trip-a-Tron**

ELCOME my son, welcome to the Tripa-Tron. It is with this name, that seems to pay homage to a hippie's favourite pastime and an obscure early synth favoured by certain psychedelic groups, that cultural guru to the enlightened, leff Minter, has deemed to bless his latest venture into light synthesiscan.

It all started on the humble 64 with Psychadelia, which returned in cut down form in Batalaya, his concept compendium. Then, in a fit of madness perhaps, be transferred his attention to various shades of Atari and produced Colourspace. Driven on by little voices in his head, or perhaps his ashtray, he has finally produced Trip-a-Tron for the Amiga.

The less hip and with it of you may be wondering what all this light synthesis is about. Well, without getting too uncool and heavy, it is just like a music synth except instead of sonics you will be painting real-time swirling universes of pixels which expand and metamorphosise and decay throughout a multi-verse like a million bright ambassadors of morning. Got iff Good.

Now that that's settled, the show must go on. The first thing it is advisable to do when coming into possession of Trip is to make a really strong cup of rea, pull up beambag and study the manual very carefully. This is actually quite a pleasant experience, since it is entertaining and informative at the same time, simultaneously even.

T HIS cunning little volume comes in the form of an attractive filofax style bundle, the only regret being that it doesn't have an alghan cover. Many questions relating to possible stumbling points are answered early on like why it is called a light-synth and not a light-tukulele. Tricky one that

Dudes who recall earlier versions will be pleased to learn that you don't have to get too far into it just to have a good time – just load up the demo files and have a play with the mouse. Pressing a button does something and moving the mouse does other things

HE programming environment is not state of the art wimp stuff, but is quite friendly and simple and displayed in a very legible font, which is the most important thing. Line-entry syntax checking should remove most potential huse.

A sequencer module allows you to pre-program effects to occur at exact instances in a defined sequence. This supports both real-time recording and

editing functions, allowing highly complicated combination of effects to be produced. You nick the place and then chose the time and it does its thing in its own way

It is hard to categorise something like Trip and therefore hard to measure it against anything meaningfully. It is out front in a field

possible crimes, jumping into the rom This bad press is mainly due to the antics of obscure German coders and crackers – hackers is the wrong term to describe these people because they don't break into large computer systems, their only interest is in writing demos and, for some of them, removing protection from games and spreading these "cracks".

Typically these crackers write a demo using the K-Seka assembler because it is the most similar to the assemblers they used on the C64. They will put in enough code so that it looks like it works and then bung it in the post next morning to all their

There is nothing wrong in programming like this if you are just writing a demo for you and your friends. In most cases the authors of these demos do not expect them to end up in public domain libraries or reach the general oublic.

The problems begin when these coders find that after writing a few demos it is quite easy to write a game. But do they make sure that it works properly on all Amigas? No.

It therefore seems an obvious thing for all coders to stick to the rules, especially new coders.

NOWADAYS the problem lies not in whether to obey the rules or not, but what the rules exactly are. If you take Commodor's words on the subject you might think that everything you do has to be done by using libraries and devices, not touching anything low level like the custom chips.

Of course, Commodore does not mean this. What the boffms there point out is that as the Amiga is a multi-tasking machine. If you don't access it via the operating system the Amiga will not be able to cope with handling all the different tasks; trying to take over the screen, trying to take over the screen, trying to take over the screen, trying to use any other aspect of the Amiga's imput or output.

In this respect using the operating system is the only way to program the Amiga. But that is only if multitasking is necessary for your program. If you try to make a game multi-task you will soon get rather annoyed when it slows down or stops each time you put a disc in the drive or move the mouse

move the mouse. Commodore built two library functions for people who do not need to multi-task – Forbid() and Permit(). Forbid turns off multi-tasking, so any other tasks running are suspended, giving your program 100 per cent of

set of instructions to kill the system. set up your screen and everything else your demo needs. I have written a file called BASE.S (Listing I) which I use

for the basis of all my productions. It starts by opening the graphics library. Although I do not use any graphics library functions in the program. I need the address of the library to tell me where the workbench copper list is stored.

I then have to create my copper list. The main problem with my copper list is that I do not know where my bitplanes are going to be in memory because AmigaDos will load this file

into whatever chip memory it can find. Some less-experienced coders think that they can take a piece of memory, say at \$70000, clear that and use it for their screen, regardless of whatever else may be there at the time. While that will work most of the time on a 512k Kickstart 1.2 Amiga, it will generally fall down on any other system. If you have anything else in memory before running, it probably won't be there much longer

Obviously this is not a very good idea, although I still keep coming across people who do it.

What I do is to put zero into the bitplane addresses in the copper list -Se0 to Se6 in the example listing work out the addresses of where my bitplanes are, and stick it into the copper list. MOVE.L #screen.d0 gets transferred into the relevant places in the copper list a word at a time.

ITH this method, not only are you guaranteed not to rub over something that is already in memory, but it will work regardless of

The easiest and cleanest way of setting up a copper list is to put your copper list address pointer - part of the graphics, library structure. First you must save the current value of this pointer so it can be restored on exit

One odd command you may notice in my copper list is \$9c.\$8010. This generates a level 3 copper interrupt. What is a level 3 copper interrupt, I hear you ask? Well, it's funny you should ask because that's what I'm

going to talk about next. Anyone who has programmed inferior processors to the 68000 series

What this means in practical terms is that the main program can just sit and wait for the left mouse button to he pressed while the interrupts go off and do all the clever work.

HE nice thing about interrupts is that they are called at regular time intervals, in this case every 50th of a second. This means you can write sprites, for example, around the screen by one position. As the routine is called every 50th of a second it gives the illusion of smooth movement.

You will find these interrupts referred to as "excentions" in a lot of literature because Motorola decided to he different to the rest of the universe. which calls those things interrunts. As interrupts are interrupts whatever type of processor you are using, I will continue to call them interrupts. There is no need for companies to add to the list of computer largon unnecessarily In Listing I you can see how to set up the simplest type of interrupt, the

level 3 copper one. The Amiga system uses level 3 interrupts for all sorts of things. They are generated when a new disc is inserted for example. Therefore we must be careful not to trash this interrupt and allow the system to carry on its necessary interrupts after

our program has finished fixed routine in rom. I could tell you where this is, but as it changes from version to version of Kickstart, we will have to work out where it is instead. As it happens, it is very easy to find

out where this routine is - you just read the contents of S6c in memory. To set your own interrupt routine you have to write the address of your routine into S6c and enable level 3 copper interrupts

This is done by moving \$8010 into Sdff09a (INTENA). From then on, any write of \$8010 to \$dff09c (INTREQ). the interrupt request register, will cause the CPU to jump to the interrupt routine pointed to at address S6c. The conner move \$9c.\$8010 creates the desired effect.

UR interrupt routine begins with a MOVEM instruction that saves all the registers on the stack. It has interrupted the 68000 at an unknown point in our main program. OK, our main program is only two lines long this time, but it is a good idea to get into good habits and save all the registers at the beginning of an

if it is not a copper interrupt, then the interrupt is passed on to the original interrupt handler routine in rom. This is done by a direct jump at the end of the interrupt routine. However, this interrupt address is calculated by the program and will be correct for whatever version of Kickstart you may care to use.

We then have space for our interrupt code. In this example we are just changing the foreground and background colours by -2 and 1 respectively every 50th of a second, hence the colourful effect.

After our lines of interrupt code we jump into the level 3 routine in rom, just in case the rom routine does anything important. I don't think it

does in Kickstart 1.2 or 1.3, but it doesn't do any harm to jump in anyway, and it may be necessary for

anyway, and it may be necessary for future Kickstarts. Now we move back to the main

Now we move back to the main code and, assuming you have got bored of the Jeff Minter style colour changes and have squashed your mouse button, the program carefully shuts down and rebuilds AmigaDos for you.

RIRST we put our old level 3 interrupt address – the rom address we read from \$6c earlier – back into \$6c. For good measure we then disable copper interrupts, as we like to return things to the way we found them.

Next we put our old copper list address back into the Workbench copper list pointer. This re-enables the good old CLI screen. We close the graphics library we opened earlier and re-enable multi-tasking with a Parmitto Now we have detected to to CLI. The last thing to do is clear d0 – MOVEQ #0,d0 is faster way to do it than CLR.L d0.

When a program exits to CLI, the

when a program exits to CLI, the value in d0 is returned as the error code. It is a good way to pass parameters back to the CLI, but we don't particularly want an error code with our demos.

Then we RTS and return back to AmigaDos. If you find that it doesn't work and you get the good old strobing power light and red boxes, then you know that it's your code at fault

With this routine set up, all you need to change each time is your interrupt routine, the copper list and the number of bitplanes you initially set up.

MIGABASIC works - and that is about all that can be said of it. It will do what you ask, but only if it really feels like it, and it will never do it nearly as fast as you'd like it to

It's hardly surprising then, that a variety of other Basics have sprung up: compiled ones like HiSoft Basic Compiler and interpreted ones like GFA-Basic, which now has a separate compiler. But they aren't cheap, so what the world in general has been waiting for is an extension library which gives AmigaBasic what it

Anyone who has played with AmigaBasic for more than five minutes will know that it has a few bricks missing. Stewart C. Russell looks at a package which sets out to fill in the holes

should have had all along.

The waiting is now over. HiSoft, in conjunction with SunSmile Software in the States, has released Extend. This wondrous wad of longwords won't actually make the daily running of AmigaBasic any quicker - what it does is to allow the Basic programmer full access to Intuition without having to open every Amiga library in rom and on disc. And this is a good thing

Extend is a disc-based library like You put in your Libs: directory. To use libraries AmigaBasic needs to access the relevant bmap file, and HiSoft provides the Extend.bmap file for this

The usual problem with using library functions and routines from Basic is that they need oodles of code to get them working. Basic and C variable types are different, one tiny error in the protocol will result in a Guru. Believe me. I know - I've been there

Extend v1.3 contains 50 functions and subprograms. The majority of them deal with menus, requesters and gadgets, while some others deal with fonts, IFF and scrolling. The latter might seem strange as AmigaBasic

does have a scroll command: unfortunately it is bugged.

If you've ever tried loading and saving IFF screen images from Basic you will know how difficult, and above all, slow it can be. Extend's SaveIFF routine saves the day, A 16 colour med-res display can be saved to ram about 60 times faster than a Rasic routine would. SaveIFF also compresses the data, so the resultant file is often less than a third of the size the uncompressed data would be

There's also LoadIFF, which quickly loads your image on to a screen that you specify. It is here that Extend shows its transatlantic origins - if you don't have a PAL screen open for a 256 line PAL image, Extend creates a very crushed 256 line NTSC interlaced

Serious headbangers can use the ViewHAM command to have a look at HAM images. Unfortunately Extend lets you look, but not touch - HAM is too complicated for Basic to keep track of. This isn't strictly true: HAM from Basic has been done, but the routine is huge, very slow and suffers from colour banding problems, so it's not

viable. There are a few other functions for fonts, external commands, file handling, memory allocation, and even a routine to produce a "Wait" mouse pointer. Setting up the library for use is very simple, all the work is done by one command to initialise the current window.

Extend is as forgiving as it can be, given AmigaDos's somewhat capricious nature, but if it says in the manual that a function called incorrectly will cause a crash, you'd better believe it

# Souped-up menus

MIGARASIC, despite being a bit of a dog, does handle menus fairly well. Extend goes much further - it allows subitems on menu items, and hotkey shortcuts, like Right-Amiga-O for Ouit for instance. On top of this you can define exactly how you want menu items coloured and highlighted. Most powerfully of all, you can set up mutually exclusive items. This is useful, say, if your program has a

loading. Now if you need anything more complex, you've outgrown anything AmigaBasic could ever do.



a major omission from AmigaBasic

The manual is good, written in that weary but snappy style which gets a bit old after a while. It does the job though, and it's packed with examples, which are also present on the disc - one example for every command.

What, for me, makes Extend so good is that you can use it in your programs and then distribute them without any complications. The downfall of Basic

extenders for many of the 8 bit machines was caused by their nondistributable status, but Extend has none of these problems - HiSoft and SunSmile have made Extend.library and Extend.bmap freely distributable.

And because you can use Extend with the HiSoft Basic Compiler, you can now write good code in Basic and hold your head high.

# Easy Gadgets

HE real giveaway that a program uses Basic is that there is a complete lack of gadgets, or at least, proper Intuition ones, Here, SunSmile

## Spit and polish

ROGRAMS often have to ask the user Yes or No questions, such as whether it's OK to format the hard drive or not. This is where requesters come in.

With Extend it's just as easy to produce a pretty little system requester as it is to use an unpretty "INPUT Y/N" statement. They both do the same job, but the requester looks far better and is resistant to turnioheads trying to input garbage.

If the program processes any amount of data you'll want to ask the user for a filename in the nicest possible way. Unfortunately, the Extend file requester is really quite an appalling kiudge. Instead of using the standard ARP file requester, which most of us finefulding HISOH'l know and love, SunSmile has gone for its own rather feeble offering.

It doesn't even have a scroll bar or a device selection list, so if you're looking for a file from a hard drive you have to edit the string gadget and then

click on the down arrow repeatedly to find the file you want.

It refuses to be put on a lores screen (the ARP one can be coaxed to do this) even though it is narrow enough to do so. It also doesn't update the directory list at every access – this can sometimes be good, if you've got a sery full disc, or can sometimes be a pain, if you want to access a file you've just written.

SunSmile could do itself a great service by replacing the Extend file requester with something better. It's better than nothing, but it's not good enough.





I've never thought that assemblers are slow. Indeed the reason I started programming in assembler in the first place was because after a couple of weeks of coding in C I got bored of waiting for compilers and linkers and all the other disc-spinning, timewasting progletts to finish, only to tell me I'd left off a squiggly bracket from the end of line six

What I needed was a language where I could make changes to my program and see the results almost instantly. I was, of course, used to Basic, where all one has to do is type

## Polished performer

DEVPAC V2.14 consists of a blue and white plastic ring- binder containing a 154 page manual, the two unprotected program discs and a pocket 68000 reference guide

Initially I thought this 68000 guide was a cheap gimmick, but looking through it I found that it contains all the useful pages from the Motorola 68000 programmers reference manual, a book I needn't have bought now. It won't teach you machine code, but it's an invaluable guide for any programmer

The Devpac manual is comprehensive, covering setting up your system to run the assembler, an introduction to the editor, assembler and debugger, plus a good set of appendices covering everything from AmigaDos error codes to a bibliography. It is well presented and easy to follow.

The first program disc is a slightly

cut-down workbench, containing the assembler, debugger and editor, all in the C directory, along with the include files and some example programs. The examples are fairly simple and

unimaginitive, but are a good introduction to using the Devpac assembler and editor

HiSoft has since released an upgrade, Devpac 2. This is faster and has more options than the version I first used. It can now assemble directly to memory instead of only to a disc file, which means you can assemble code and test it without

Jez San of Argonaut Software was
one of Devpac's greatest fans. He used
it to write, among other things, the ST

for Jez, so he wrote his own assembler called ArgAsm 68000. It claims to be the fastest Amiga assembler, being able to assemble your code before you've even finished typing it. Well, almost

Since ArgAsm is designed to outperform Devpac it is not surprising that it is compatible with the Hisoft assembler, even down to understanding Devpac's ST directives. What is surprising is that it is also compatible with Metacomco and Cape assemblers.

## **Fast and furious**

ARGASM 68000 comes in a yellow and black plastic ring- binder. The manual is shorter than the Devpac one at 69 pages – not always a bad thing, but this time it is. It doesn't go into nearly as much detail as the Devpac manual and gives me the impression that it was written in a hurry.

Not only is it short, but it seems to miss out several features of the assembler all together – the Assemble to Binary File function, for example. Hopefully a future release of the software will contain a completely new one.

The program comes on two unprotected discs. The first contains the assembler, Arg, and the editor, ArgEd. You do not get a debugger with ArgAsm. The manual recommends the

best debugger to use is Monam2, the one supplied with HiSoft's Devpac 2. As this is not available separately from Devpac, you would have to buy both assembler packages to use ArgAsm with its recommended monitor.

The first ArgAsm disc boots up into an Amiga shell, better than Devpac which drops you out into a CLI. The second disc contains the

The main selling point of ArgAsm is its speed. It claims to be five to 15 times faster than Devpac 2. As I never take anybody's word for anything, I did my own tests on the two assemblers.

The first thing to note about these tests is that ArgAsm has no Assemble to Memory option. In Devpac 2 you can assemble a file to memory and test it, still within the assembler. The nearest you get to this in ArgAsm is assembline to a ram file.

If you only have a 1 meg machine you will soon find that you haven't got enough memory to assemble. If you do have enough memory to save it to ram, you then have to switch to a shell window and run the program from there to test it.

Both of the test files I used could not assemble to a ram file on a 1 meg Amiga. Both assembled to memory easily in Devpac 2.

Because there is no Assemble to Memory option in ArgsAnn, and there is not enough ram in a 1 meg Amiga to assemble anything much over 300k as source and object to a ram file, the only way to test your programs in ArgsAnn on a two drive, 1 meg Amiga is to assemble of 10ppy. This can take longer with ArgsAnn than assembling to memory on Devpac 2.

increase over Devpac 2. Any assembler is limited by the speed of the Amiga's drives when assembling to or from floppy. And as ArgAsm relies on assembling this way, you lose the advantage of speed.

Where ArgAsm comes into its own is on very large files. For these you are talking at least 1.5 megabytes of ram and a fast hard drive. Games programmers will find ArgAsm invaluable because assembling to

memory is not something they use.

ArgAsm would seem to work best for assembling to floppy – and that is what it was written for, a fast assembler to use for the development

of future Argonaut games like Hawk, the new flight simulation soon to be published by Electronic Arts.

No only is Argasm fast, it is aimed at programmers who want to write programs which run fast. To this end Argasm will display instruction cycle timings and flag settings to help outmise your code.

A valuable Devpac option missing from ArgAms is jump to Erro: If you assemble a file and there are, say, three errors in it, by selecting jump to Error you can go to each line in turn which contains an error and after it or add more code. This will be implemented in future versions. If only because the programmers at Argonaut want IL ArgAMs has an

option on the assemble screen to edit it lines with errors while assembling. It is supposed to stop assembling when an error is found, allow you to correct it, and then continue assembling. This option did not seem to do anything on my review copy and I could find no mention of it in the manual. I assume it is a feature to be added at a later date.

One of the irritating things about Devpac is that it refuses to load source file larger than the buffer size set previously. ArgAsm has fixed this. Any size source file can be loaded into ArgEd — it automatically sets the buffer size.

However, on Devpac 2 the buffer allocated to the assembled code is set automatically, but on ArgAsm you have to set the buffer manually. And if you haven't set a buffer large enough, ArgAsm is limited in what it can expand, and sometimes refuses to assemble.

No one writes perfect code first time, especially when just starting off. To aid this problem Devpac comes with a monitor, Monam2. This can either be used inside the assembler environment or as a stand-alone monitor/debuseer.


The debugger has a status screen at the top giving information about the current state of the registers, and it allows you to browse through memory disassembling, single stepping or just hunting around for Ascii text. You can even load source code to into a separate window to allow you to examine the source while you debug the assembled code.

Once you get used to Monam2 – and it is very different from every other monitor I have used on the Amiga – you will find it invaluable in helping debug your code. Even Argasm's superior error messages can't compete. HiSoft has promised a faster

Devpac, Argonaut will undoubtedly release an ArgAsm with more features. Perhaps by then the gap will have

So which assembler should you buy? Well, if you are learning to program in machine code and have had little experience with assemblers, you should definitely go for Devpac 2. The documentation is excellent and you will get everything you need in the one package.

If you are already an Amiga machine code programmer and find your current assembler too slow, you should look at ArgAsm. It certainly is the fastest assembler available for the Amiga.




