#### I. Research Starter Grants

Members of the Society who are within the first five years of assuming their first professional position are eligible for a grant of \$2000 to \$5000 to aid in their research. These grants will not provide overhead money to the grantee institution. Applications for this year are due 1 February 1988.

II. Travel Grants for Active Members

Members of the Society who are within the first five years of assuming their first professional position are eligible for a grant of \$300 to \$500 to enable them to present a paper at an annual meeting of the Society. Applications are due 1 May 1988.

III. Travel Grants for Graduate Students

Graduate students working under supervision of a Society member are eligible for a grant of \$300 to \$500 to enable them to present a paper at an annual meeting of the Society. Applications are due 1 May 1988.

IV. Undergraduate Research Awards

Undergraduate students interested in investigating a career in natural products research are eligible for a research award to study under the direction of a Society Member on the faculty of an American college or university. These awards (\$2000 to the student and \$500 to the advisor) do not provide overhead money to the grantee institution.
