

NOMINATIONS SOLICITED FOR ACS AWARDSELI LILLY AWARD AND PFIZER AWARD

You are invited to submit nominations for the 1980 Eli Lilly Award in Biological Chemistry and the 1980 Pfizer Award in Enzyme Chemistry. To submit a nomination for either of these awards, the name of the nominee must be sent together with one or more supporting letter(s) describing the candidate's achievements in the field and a curriculum vitae which includes a list of the candidate's publications. The originals and seven copies of the supporting letter(s) and curriculum vitae should be submitted to Dr. Hans Neurath, Division of Biological Chemistry, ACS, Department of Biochemistry, University of Washington, Seattle, WA 98195. The deadline for receipt of nominations is July 15, 1979.

Eli Lilly Award in Biological Chemistry

Purpose. To stimulate fundamental research in biological chemistry (excepting therefrom immunology, clinical investigations, pharmacology, and experimental therapeutics) by young chemists working in the United States.

Nature. The award consists of \$2,000 and a bronze medal. The traveling expenses incidental to the conferring of the award are paid.

Establishment and Support. The award was established in 1934 and has been supported since that time by Eli Lilly and Company.

Rules of Eligibility. A nominee shall not have passed his/her 36th birthday on April 30, 1980, and shall have accomplished outstanding research in biological chemistry of unusual merit for an individual on the threshold of his/her career. Special consideration shall be given to the independence of thought and the originality shown. At the time of the nomination, the nominee must be actively engaged in the line of research for which the award is made. This award will not be voted to any person who has previously received another award sponsored by Eli Lilly and Company for the same technical accomplishment.

The Pfizer Award in Enzyme Chemistry

Purpose. To stimulate fundamental research in enzyme chemistry in the United States for young men and women.

Nature. The award consists of \$2,000, a certificate, and a gold medal. An allowance of \$150 is provided for traveling expenses to the meeting at which the award will be presented.

Establishment and Support. The award was established in 1945 by Paul-Lewis Laboratories, Inc., now a part of Pfizer Inc.

Rules of Eligibility. A nominee must be engaged in non-commercial work, must have accomplished outstanding work in enzyme chemistry, and shall not have passed his/her 40th birthday on April 30, 1980. The presence of an enzyme action must be unequivocally demonstrated in the nominee's work. This award will not be voted to any person who previously has received another award sponsored by Pfizer Inc. granted for the same technical accomplishment.
