


FIG. 2. Schematic diagram of prediction analysis by the Chou-Fasman algorithms of MTSs of Mn SOD in rats and mice (rats, mice). The amino acid sequences were from the published papers (13,14).

Maddalena Di Fiore, pages 782–788: On page 782, in the abstract, lines 2–3 should read ". . . (phylum Mollusca, class Cephalopoda) . . "instead of ". . . (phylum Mollusca, subphylum Cephalopoda)," and lines 13–14 should read "These findings suggest that the reproductive system of the octopus utilizes sex steroids that are probably involved in a more complex endocrine control of the reproduction" instead of "From a phylogenetic point of view, these findings are very interesting because they indicate a common origin of a sex hormonal system between Mollusca Cephalopoda and Vertebrates." On page 785, line 11 should read ". . . (Fig. 3b)" instead of ". . . (Fig. 3a)."
