Information for Authors

Biochemistry (Moscow) is a monthly international journal that publishes papers, concurrently in Russian and English, in all fields of biochemistry as well as on biochemical aspects of related areas, including molecular biology, bioorganic chemistry, microbiology, physiology, immunology, and medicinal biochemistry.

Regular papers may include final original results obtained experimentally, descriptions of new experimental methods of value for biochemistry, and theoretical material suggesting new principles and approaches to biochemical problems. Regular papers shall not exceed 30 typewritten pages, including references, tables, and figures (three figures are equivalent to one page). Manuscripts dealing with particularly significant and novel findings which receive the highest scores from two peer reviewers are published in the "Accelerated Publications" section (publication time of 4-5 months from the date of receipt of the revised manuscript).

The "Short Reports" section offers a means for rapid publication (3-4 months) of short papers (up to 12 type-written pages and 4 figures or tables) of immediate importance. The accompanying letter must give the reasons why the authors believe that the work justifies accelerated publication.

The journal also published **reviews** in timely topics of biochemistry and related areas which are either solicited or suggested by the authors and approved by the Editorial Board (publication time 6-7 months). Manuscripts shall not exceed 40 typewritten pages, including references, tables, and figures.

Short vivid minireviews (up to 16 typewritten pages) are published in the "Biochemistry News" section. The publication time for these materials is 4-5 months.

The "**Discussion**" section provides an opportunity to comment on or criticize work previously published in *Biochemistry (Moscow)*, or to present a new hypothesis (maximum 4 typewritten pages, publication time of 3-4 months). Replies from other interested parties may be solicited to polemical papers presented in this section.

The journal is surveyed by Chemical Abstracts, Chemical Titles, Current Contents, Science Citation Index, Excerpta Medicus (MEDLINE), Biological Abstracts (BIOSIS), International Abstracts of Biological Sciences, Agricola, and Index Internacional de Cardiologia.

Beginning with the year 1996, the journal has a permanently updated WEB site (http://www.protein.bio.msu.su/biokhimiya), providing the tables of contents for all subsequent journal issues together with summaries, key words, and authors' addresses.

The authors should consult detailed **Instructions to Authors (2001)** published in the January issue of Vol. 66, No. 1, pp. 106-113.

The submitted manuscript should be initialed by all authors.

Submission of the manuscript in electronic form, along with the typewritten manuscript, is requested. The diskette (3.5 inch) should contain one file, preferably in WinWord (Word for Windows version 6.0 or higher) in IBM PC-compatible format, with the entire text including references, figure legends, tables, summary, etc., and separate figure files. The style of the file should be simple: avoid "styles" and formatting changes within the file. Submission of the graphical material in electronic form is encouraged but is not mandatory. The electronic versions of figures should be in one of the following formats: *.WMF, *.TIF, *.BMP, *.DOC, *.JPG. Text labels in the figures should use only Arial Cyr font. Please check for viruses.

Translation of articles for the English edition is done by a group of highly qualified biochemists working on an honorarium basis. However, authors **having good professional English language** can translate their own articles following the Instructions for Translators (available from the Secretary of the journal, R. D. Ozrina, tel.: (7-095) 939-29-01).
