

Information for Authors

Biochemistry (Moscow) is a monthly international journal that publishes papers, concurrently in Russian and English, in all fields of biochemistry as well as on biochemical aspects of related areas, including molecular biology, bioorganic chemistry, microbiology, physiology, and medicinal biochemistry.

Regular papers may include final original results obtained experimentally, descriptions of new experimental methods of value for biochemistry, and theoretical material suggesting new principles and approaches to biochemical problems. Regular papers should not exceed 30 typewritten pages, including references, tables, and figures (three figures are equivalent to one page). Manuscripts dealing with particularly significant and novel findings which receive the highest scores from two peer reviewers are published in the “**Accelerated Publications**” section (publication time of 4-5 months).

The “**Short Reports**” section offers a means for rapid publication (3-4 months) of short papers (up to 12 typewritten pages and 4 figures or tables) of immediate importance. The accompanying letter must give the reasons why the authors believe that the work justifies accelerated publication.

The journal also publishes **reviews** of timely topics in biochemistry and related areas which are either solicited or suggested by the authors and approved by the Editorial Board (publication time 6-7 months). Manuscripts should not exceed 40 typewritten pages.

Short vivid minireviews (up to 16 typewritten pages) are published in the “**Biochemistry News**” section. The publication time for these materials is 4-5 months.

The “**Discussion**” section provides an opportunity to comment on or criticize work previously published in *Biochemistry (Moscow)*, or to present a new hypothesis (maximum 4 typewritten pages, publication time of 3-4 months). Replies from other interested parties may be solicited to polemical papers presented in this section.

Beginning with the year 1996, the journal has a permanently updated WEB site (<http://www.protein.bio.msu.su/biokhimiya>), providing the tables of contents for all subsequent journal issues. Free access is also provided to all special issues of the Journal since 1997 until now and also to 3-4 whole papers (i.e., with full text, figures, tables, etc.) of each issue that were most highly ranked by the reviewers.

Before typing a manuscript, the authors should consult detailed **Instructions to Authors (2004)** published in Vol. 69, No. 1, pp. 108-115. Manuscripts not conforming to these Instructions may be returned to authors without consideration. **The editorial board reserves the right to**

decline manuscripts which are ranked low by reviewers and do not correspond to the journal level.

The final accepted manuscripts should conform to the following specifications.

1. Text should be typed in **Times New Roman** font using Windows Microsoft Word 6.0 or a later software version and sent as file on a diskette along with the typewritten manuscript (two copies).

2. The text file should be prepared using only **Normal** Word template, without use of **programmed** headings, inserts, and references, and enlarged distance between letters. Never use “endnote” option for creating the reference list because the typesetting program does not recognize reference numbers in this case and simply omits them.

3. The authors should check their diskettes for viruses before submission.

4. Greek and Latin letters should be preferably typed with Symbol font.

5. The text file should in no case contain any previous revisions (including those hidden using Word Tools-Revisions option, which are recognized as normal text by the publishing program). Before submission, the Word option Tools-Revisions-Accept-All should be applied to the text file.

6. Only minor alterations are permitted at the stage of proofreading. Substantial changes, such as replacements of entire paragraphs, phrases or figures are not permitted as they often entail changes in the whole journal issue.
