

ACS Congressional Fellowship

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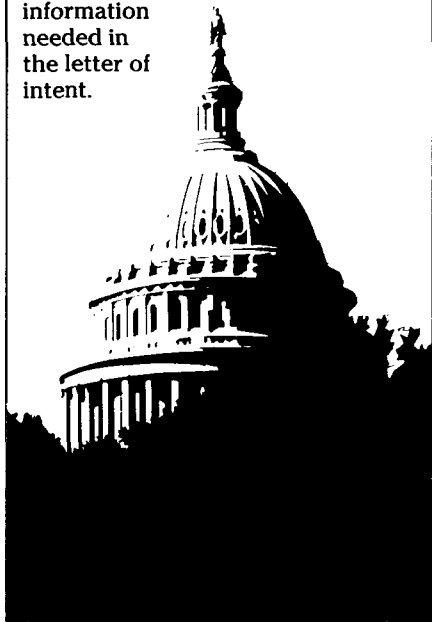
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- Gain firsthand knowledge of the operation of the legislative branch of the federal government,
