Applications For Field and Laboratory

An essential source of current information regarding revisions to the EPA's Good Laboratory Practice (GLP) Standards regulations, this manual provides practical ideas and procedures for establishing a compliance program and for refining the compliance process. Thirty-three chapters, written by experienced quality assurance professionals, outline approaches that have resulted in successful compliance. The text is liberally illustrated and contains samples of forms that the various authors have successfully utilized.

The chapters are organized by sections and focus on GLP requirements, quality assurance responsibilities, computer validation, special studies, and regulatory impact. The authors, representing industry, field and laboratory research, and government agencies, also describe methods for avoiding some common mistakes. Additionally, four appendices contain the text of the GLP Standards, a Q & A section, the recently established EPA penalties for non-compliance, and the standard forms used for submitting data to the EPA.

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
