## Publisher's Announcement—Supplementary Data

When authors supply supplementary data files with their article, they must state whether they wish to have these files published online alongside their article (some authors may choose to submit supplementary data as an aid to the referees only).

Also, authors are asked to ensure that the supplementary data are saved in files separate from those for the manuscript and figures, and that all file names are supplied. Authors should also supply a separate caption for each file of data and, at the end of the manuscript, add a paragraph entitled Supplementary Data, in which they detail what data are supplied.

All supplementary data will be subject to peer-review.
