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Publisher's Note

It has been a successful and productive year for Biophysical Chemistry. We have improved our services to readers and authors and we have improved the quality of the journal and its related products such as ScienceDirect. We would like to share with you some of the highlights of the past year:

- Inflow to Biophysical Chemistry has increased, as we have seen for most of our journals. This is partly due to the availability of our web-sub-mission system. Our readers make heavy use of the material published in Biophysical Chemistry and our other Physical & Theoretical Chemistry and Spectroscopy Journals, evident from the increase in full text downloads from our ScienceDirect Database to about 2 Million in 2003, up from 1 Million in 2002.
- As of 2004 most of our regular Articles will be published in electronic and fully citeable format in around 1 month after acceptance. For Biophysical Chemistry speed of publication is an important issue. We feel that our new service will make a difference; articles can be cited soon after acceptance. The actual appearance in the printed issue will not change the publication date as defined by the online availability.
- Biophysical Chemistry is included in a new initiative: 'Colourful e-Products'. If we have received usable colour figures together with your accepted article we will ensure, at no additional charge, that these figures will appear in colour on ScienceDirect, regardless of whether

- or not these illustrations are reproduced in colour in the printed version.
- As of this year, Elsevier accepts **electronic sup- plementary material** to support and enhance
 the scientific research. Supplementary files
 supplied will be published online alongside
 the electronic version of the article in
 Elsevier web products, including ScienceDirect. For more info, go to:

- Elsevier and the American Chemical Society have agreed to provide linking between their services for scientists. This implies that users of Elsevier products and services will be able to link directly to ACS scientific journals and that users of CAS products and services will be able to link, via ChemPort, directly to Elsevier scientific journals. - ScienceDirect reached the impressive milestone of loading the five millionth article into the database. In addition to an extensive full-text journal collection, ScienceDirect has increased its offering of other types of full-text content, such as the recently launched reference works program.
