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
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




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AS THE LEAVES REFUSE TO FALL

How did Hangtime come about? What was the inspiration for it?

with friends in your area.

It came out of college. When I was at USC, I was the guy who had a loop of everything going on. People would always come to me and ask about the upcoming parties. I'd share what I thought was going on and they'd tell me what they'd heard was going on; I kept track of everything with pen and paper. About three years ago, I decided to keep track of everything on a digital format. It's much easier and much more complete.

What kinds of events can people find on Hangtime?

We've got everything from birthdays to Beyoncé. One of the great things about Hangtime is that when you open up the app, it goes out and finds all the things your friends might be doing nearby, as well as interesting large events that we think you might like. It learns your likes and dislikes based on events you've attended in the past.

So it's similar to Ticket Master but more social?

Yeah. Our goal is to help you figure out what's going on at your college. Right now you've got all these different resources you have to visit to find out what people are doing, but we've aggregated all of that into an app.

How do you find the information and make sure it's correct?

Everything that shows up on Hangtime comes from our partnerships with different companies. It's not just stuff we hear about on the streets – events come from real companies.

What about the safety aspect?

That's always a big concern, especially if you're new to a college campus. The app shows you which of your friends will be at the event so you can meet up with people you know. Also, the information is verified so all of the events are real – nothing shady. Of course, don't give out your personal information to anyone you don't know. Something neat on Hangtime is that you can look at people's profiles, kind of like Facebook, so you can check out who will be there without exchanging personal information.

Are there any networking opportunities available with this app?

Sure, we post about career days and companies who might be hosting recruiting events.

What was it like building the app?

We started in three schools and built this bare-bones app. All it did was show you through Facebook what events you were invited to and then what events your friends were invited to. It blew up in just a few days, so at that point we knew we had something. I knew about Facebook when it was just six guys in a house, so very early days. Back then it was incredibly college focused, and it became an essential tool for college students. I grew up in the Midwest and I didn't know anyone at USC, so when I got to college I didn't know what to do or where to go. We wanted to create Hangtime as a vital tool for college students like me that could help bridge that gap.

What have you learned through this process?

I was surprised at how hard the technical problems were to solve. We needed to make sure that we got the events in the system fast enough – we process all event and all your friends' events in three to five seconds. That's very difficult to do.

For students looking to start a company, what advice do you have for them?

This is a great time to do a startup. I don't think there's a better time than now. Start a company that you have passion for and that you really believe in. Don't worry about the money just yet; that part comes later. When you love something, you'll be happy. Also, when you're first starting out, surround yourself with people who truly believe in you, not just people who want a slice of the pie. You're looking for a mentor in investors, not just their money.

TALKING TELENOVELA



Tell me about Reina de Corazones – what's the premise?

Reina de Corazones is about my character Reina Ortiz, a humble seamstress who must overcome the barriers of amnesia to find true love. As she struggles to recover her memory, she's dealing with a secret agent who wants to settle the score with her and she has no idea why. Overall, it's an incredible drama dealing with mystery, espionage, conspiracy, intrigue, crime and romance.

Who would this telenovela appeal to?

The show will appeal to people who like the genre but are willing to see more of a drama series narrative.

If you could describe the show in one word, what would it be?

Unpredictable.

For people who've never watched a telenovela before, what can they expect? What's different about the way it's done?

I know they think all telenovelas are the same ... A couple that wants to be together but they can't live their love story because of the hatred of their antagonists. At the end, they always end up married and live happily ever after. Yes, this is the same, but with a twist. It's a tale of love and vengeance set amongst the lavish hotels and casinos of Las Vegas.

This is the first role on an American-based network. What has the feedback been like so far?

Well, all I'm feeling is love right now. Maybe because *Reina De Corazones* is a hit. I don't know what would had happened if that wasn't the case. [laughs]

You have three more upcoming feature films being released (*El Charro Misterioso*, *El Cumpleaños de la Abuela, Dariela Los Martes*) – can you tell me about them?

I have worked in many films in Mexico but I never had the opportunity to do a period film. In *El Charro Misterioso*, I play the wife of a bank robber in Mexico. The film was based on a real bank robber of the '80s. They say that he

was the father of organized crime in Mexico. El Cumpleaños de la Abuela is a comedy about a family reunion gone bad. It was so fun to shoot because I love comedy and it was a movie between friends. Both the cast and the producers are really good friends of mine so I had a blast. And finally, Dariela Los Martes is an indie film shot in Mexico City, Paris and New York. The film is basically my story. It's me playing me ... a film dealing with sleeping disorders and depression which I personally dealt with. When Mauricio Valle, the actor, director and producer of the film called me, he said he wanted to do a failed love story, and it ended taking a whole other path. For me, it was the beginning of my healing process.

Each fracture film seems very different (crime thriller, comedy, etc.) – what does it take to switch back and forth between different genres? Does it ever get difficult?

We actors live for this stuff! This is like a dream come true. We want to do everything and not get stereotyped into one genre.

Did you do anything to prepare for the different roles?

For El Charro Misterioso, I had to read a lot about women in the '80s and their own way of breaking the rules. For El Cumpleaños de La Abuela and Dariela Los Martes, I just spent hours talking with the director about the characters.

You're also a writer and producer for Dariela Los Martes – how did you get into that side of film?

I got into writing and producing because I wanted to feel free. Often as an actor, you feel frustrated when you don't understand the decisions the producers make. I just needed to be in control on this one. I've always been a fan of indie films so it was great to work on one. I think I became a better actor since I realized the effort, the hard work, the obstacles, and the responsibilities that came with producing.

You're an advocate for Greenpeace – can you tell me a little about that organization and your work there?

I worked with Greenpeace for several years but now I am focusing all my attention and energy in a foundation called AnimaNaturalis and its campaign "Circo Sin Animales" which means "Circus without Animals." We fight for animal rights and their freedom, and thanks to the aggressiveness of our campaign, many states in Mexico have prohibited the use of animals in the circus.

Like you, many people aspire to act from a young age. What's the most important quality someone must have to be successful in this business?

Number one: Luck! You can't improve it but you can wish and pray for it. Number two: Patience. Luck doesn't come easily. Number three: Vocation.

HOW ASSERTIVENESS CAN HELP STOP AN **ASSAULT AND IMPROVE YOUR**

Powerful words and powerful actions can be two of your best tools

Women on campuses throughout the United States face sexual assault and harassment at a higher level than any other group of people. We are most vulnerable between the ages of 14 and 24 to experience sexual assault, unwanted sexual contact and sexual harassment. In fact the statistics suggest that from 1 in 4 to 1 in 2 (depending on the research cited) women in this age group will be sexually harassed, sexually assaulted or coerced into unwanted sex. WHY IS THIS?

As a counselor to high school and college-aged women for over 15 years, I've asked that question a lot. I have been an instructor on college campuses, an anti-violence educator and in communities across the country. I have spent a great deal of time researching assault, listening to survivors, interviewing perpetrators and putting together the elements that make young women so often targeted for assault and intimidation. I want to say that there are many things you can do to drastically reduce the chance that you will be targeted by a perpetrator and then become a victim.

Young women are out in the college scene, interacting with young men and women, socializing regularly and trying new things. At these ages, we are new to many of the dynamics of social interaction, often on our own for the first time, and appropriately eager to make new connections and relationships. However, there are many things we need to learn and understand about our social environment, so that we can take care of ourselves and have a good time. You are learning in your classes how to prepare for your chosen career – please, learn just as much about how to be an aware, assertive and confident social being with the ability to take good care of yourself and choose wisely based on solid information. Then go have fun!

to change the often misogynistic culture surrounding harassment and violence against women in general. But I am writing to and for young women right now. No one should ever be taken advantage of when incapacitated, or for any reason. But the reality is that anything we do that REDUCES OUR AWARENESS and ASSESSMENT/JUDGMENT will place us at greater risk. When I talk to perpetrators of date rape, other sexual assault and even harassment I usually hear (or read between the lies... oops I meant lines) that they are looking for the easiest

I cannot guarantee that even with 20 years of martial arts experience and lots of training about assertiveness that I myself will never be targeted. But I can assure you that there are things you can do to greatly reduce the likelihood of assault without diminishing your freedoms.

VICTIMIZED.

SO WHAT MAKES A POTENTIAL VICTIMIZER ASSESS US AS AN EASY TARGET?

Incapacity. Usually in the form of being very drunk. Drinking alcohol to excess (sometimes to near blackout) will put you at greater risk. For both stages of assault where you have a chance to intervene early (when you are being targeted, and then when you are being tested) you will find it harder to intervene, to assess, to stand up for yourself, to yell "NO," or to fight if you are very drunk.

Lack of capacity or awareness. Use your senses. Don't diminish them when you are in public or with people you don't know. Think sight, sound, taste, touch and smell. Ear buds for instance, reduce your ability to hear someone approaching you from behind.

it's true. Many perpetrators, victimizers and abusers assess for this stuff. So hold your head up, look people in the eye and walk and talk with a confident and assertive tone. If you don't know how, take a class, or maybe identify

with a confident and assertive tone. If you don't know how, take a class, or maybe identify someone you respect on TV or in your life who seems to have those qualities, and try to mimic them. See a therapist if low self-esteem or serious anxiety or depression have you facing the world this way. It helps to actually feel more assertive and capable than just to act like it. But faking it until you make it is also okay.

Being alone and having any of the above lack of capacity. Being alone is not in and of itself a big problem. But being alone when incapacitated is a problem. Please, stay with your friend and get her home safe if she is drunk.

WHY WOULD ANYONE USE, ABUSE, ASSAULT, FORCE SEX OR INTIMIDATE A WOMAN?

You have heard it before: Power. I'm speaking more broadly here and not just about violent assault or coercive sex. Power is not the exclusive reason, but generally speaking, when someone perpetrates abuse or violence, they are getting a dose of power. The reasons for wanting or needing that kind of power are myriad, and I won't go into them here, but your job is to spot people who use others and keep them out of your life. Look for those who act in negative or aggressive ways, cross boundaries or are impolite or pushy; then assertively intervene to either get them away from you, get them out of your life, or not invite them in where they can do harm in even the most subtle ways.

TO HURT SOMEONE YOU NEED ACCESS. DON'T GIVE A PERSON WHOSE BEHAVIOR IS LACKING IN KINDNESS ACCESS TO YOU.

Perpetrators are looking for anything about a person or situation that tells them they can get away with whatever they are planning. And they do usually plan. Then, they TARGET. Here is where you want to be effective: Be assertive in language and physical stance. Take a self-defense class, read some books about boundaries and test out setting assertive limits in your life. Ask yourself if you lack confidence or why you choose to drink to excess especially when out socializing. Get help from a therapist or trusted advisor about why you are doing this and how to stop.

Often when we have social anxiety, lack self-esteem, feel scared or alone we will do things that leave us more vulnerable than if we approached the world from a place of pride, confidence and deeply held positive regard for ourselves. That is what you deserve and help is available to get you there.

Last, here are some things to remember especially regarding our recent campus assault problem:

- Be a good friend. Be a responsible bystander (BY NOT BEING A BYSTANDER. Do something!)
- Call the police, draw attention to, and YELL if you see someone being victimized or targeted. Victimizers depend on silence.
- Don't leave your friend alone if she is drunk. Get her home safely.
- If you want to consume more alcohol than will allow you to be coherent, at least do it in the relative safety of people you know and trust.
- Studies show that when women fight back (by yelling, hitting, shoving or defending their boundaries) that the assault is more often stopped than if she is silent.
 Your voice is a powerful, tool!

We all have these people in our lives: They cut in front of us in line, they are rude to us in class, they make our jobs a living hell, they cut us off in traffic, they bray loudly on their cell phones when we are trying to study in the library. In short, they violate basic rules of polite behavior.

But don't worry, here at Campus Talk, we have developed a few simple

WAYS TO

Publicly investigate just how slowly you can make a croaking noise.

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
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
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

Tell me a little bit about your background. How did you get started in styling?

At first it was just a passion for clothes and a personal hobby. I grew up in South Florida, and my mom has always been really into fashion and a big encouragement. I went to the Miami Art Institute for fashion design. So I had some really good background.

Did you know that you wanted to be a fashion stylist?

I always knew that I wanted to do something in fashion. I kind of always thought that I would grow up to be a fabulous fashion designer, but it takes a lot of work and time to get something like that started. I actually did start designing clothes right out of school, but it didn't pick up the way I wanted it too and I wasn't about to really do with it what I'd hoped. So I started getting into styling.

What are some of the challenges you've faced while trying to build your career?

Trying to break through to some of my clients

– encouraging them to try new things and
not get stuck in a rut. I'm constantly telling
my clients, hey, don't be afraid to step out
of the box a little bit, maybe be a little
more fashion-forward.

What do you think are some of the top trends right now for fall?

I actually love how we're using spring colors this fall. I just came from New York fashion week and people were still wearing a lot of whites and creams, and lots of pleats and ruffles. It's very girly and fun. We've been seeing a lot more of the moto look for fall, and while the season is definitely still headed in a masculine direction, we've kept some of the color in it, which I love.

So where do you think most people go wrong when dressing themselves?

I think a lot of people go wrong either with fabrics, or by not recognizing what's right with their body type. A lot of times my clients will say things like I want to wear this, or I want to wear that, and I'm always telling them, you know, let's be fashion forward, but at the same time, let's stick with really good, structured pieces. If you're wearing quality fabric and something that fits your body type well then you're always going to look amazing.

Without purchasing new clothes, what are some tips that you can give to people who are on a budget for how update their look?

I'm always a fan of throwing on a third layer, whether it be a scarf or a necklace. Headpieces are really big this year, so maybe go out and buy a cute \$3 hairpiece or some other funky new statement jewelry. Rings are really on trend. Makeup up-dates can be fun too, so maybe go buy some funky eye shadow or a new lip color that's bright pink or maroon or red. I think you can always put new style in your look if you have knowledge without spending a ton of money.

What's some advice you can give for people who would like to become a stylist?

Follow what you love and know your niche. I think it's so important to know what your personal style is before you can style others and guide them in their own direction. Being a stylist really goes beyond being able to trend forecast and lead your clients into being trend-savvy as well – you have to help them enhance their own personal style. Everyone has their own particular taste and as a stylist it's your job to enhance that flavor, not to change it.

What are some things you've had struggles with in doing your blog?

I've really found having a blog to be amazing and hard at the same time. I do a number of things: from style to travel, hair to makeup and beauty. The most important thing about blogging is finding what your readers are particularly interested in and then learning how to play that up. So for example, if I make a post that's very fashion-forward where I have on really bright colors and I find a get a lot of likes on that, I try to keep playing that up. Making my readers happy – that's what's really important to me.

What are some misconceptions about blogging?

That it's easy, for one! It's very time consuming. It requires a lot of watching your statistics and learning how to track your progress. If you don't track it, you never know what direction to go into in order to grow and get more followers.

So what else is next for you? What are your goals?

I definitely am going to continue to move into designing at some point. I love sketching and trend forecasting and putting my own personal twist on upcoming trends. I constantly find myself wanting to design and make my own looks. So that's what I'm looking forward to moving into the future.

You've been acting for a long time. How do you manage to keep yourself grounded?

"Wow! What a question! I don't know that I am that grounded! [Laughs] I think the biggest thing in LA is having a group of friends in town that are like family – that's what keeps you normal.

What kind of insider information can you give me from your years in the business?

I always say the key to success is to make it easy for people to hire you, and then make it easy for them to hire you again. When you audition, walk into the room ready to give them every possible reason to choose you. Then, once you get onto a show or film, do the best job you can and keep a great work ethic, so it makes it easy for them to want to hire you in the future.

What are some of the challenges you have faced in your career so far, and how do you overcome them?

The entire acting industry is a challenge! I do the second most competitive job on the face of the earth – every aspect of it you have to overcome. The reason you get through it is because acting is something you have to do, not just something you kind of want to do. You have to eat, breath and sleep wanting to be a performer. The only way you get through it is that you don't have another choice.

Copycat was your first experience as a host. What was that like for you?

It was a chance for me to get to be me, to show off myself instead of a character. So it was really, really interesting. I had a lot of fun doing it though – most fun I've ever had! We did a lot of run-through's with the cast, and that was helpful. Once the real contestants were there and the lights came on, everything just kind of falls into place.

How did you prepare yourself to be in front of a live audience? I don't really get nervous about that. When the lights come on, I'm not like "Oh no, there's a live audience," I'm more like, "YES! I get to be in front of a live audience!" I look at it differently than most people because I'm born to do this. This just is what I do.

Did you enjoy hosting more than acting?

They both exercise different muscles; they flex differently. I like both equally.

So looking back on the first season of Copycat, is hosting something you would like to do again?

Absolutely. We'll know in January if we've been picked up for season two.

You're shooting Dancing with the Stars right now. How's that going?

It's the most work and most fun you've ever had in your life. There's not a bigger show on television.

Have you had any dancing training?

No. Zero.

What is the show like?

It's like the most adrenaline, the most fear and the most fun ever. I almost feel numb. I am definitely looking forward to pushing my limits with something I've never done before.

Speaking of trying new things, what's something that's on your bucket list?

Everything you need to know about buying, gifting, and drinking fruit of the vine this season.

With the holidays right around the corner, some of us are asking the question: how the heck do I pick up a great wine?

Whether for gifting or enjoying over a feast here are some tips from Sonoma wine expert Paula Moulton that will ensure that you select a great wine at ANY price point!

BE ADVENTUROUS: Dare to be different and pick your wine based on the beauty of its label as long as it fits in with your price range. You may be surprised to learn that wine labels oftentimes reflect the personality of the wine in the bottle so perhaps your eye will be your trainer for the evening.

DON'T FORGET TO SHARE: Wine is about sharing, so bring the gift of wine based on what you would pick to drink yourself.

WHAT ABOUT THE RULES: Break the Rules! Your host/hostess is making pizza, but you only drink white wine and you've heard that red wine is traditionally paired with pizza. You might be surprised to learn that a full-bodied white and even a sparkling white or Champagne pair well with pizza.

DON'T FORGET TO LEARN: You want to branch out and try wine from other countries so research your host/hostess and bring a wine from the country of their origin.

REMEMBER THE SEASONS: Pick your wine based on the season. Is it winter and time for something hearty or is it summer and sizzling hot, pick your wine based on the weather?

In general, I pair wine using a simple technique that I learned from a famous sommelier in France. "Wine pairing should be looked at like we look at couples. There are two types of couples in this world: There are the couples who are similar to one another and make each other whole almost like being one person, and then there are the couples who are completely opposite and one would never put them together."

Yet both couples work together and form a powerful bond. As you pair wine, ask yourself...

IS THIS WINE SIMILAR TO THE MENU?

Ex: A heavy beef stew with lots of pepper and bay leaves would have flavors similar to a peppery, earthy red wine like a Cabernet Sauvignon or a spicy Pinot Noir. The bold aromas and flavors of the wine are similar to the strong and spicy ingredients in the stew.




Ex: A creamy white sauce over pasta would pair well with a nice Sauvignon Blanc. Why? The acidity in the wine is opposite from the creamy, smooth sauce and actually subdues and balances both flavors.

- Fourth card from the top is the other ace
- Hand the spectator their card, the ace of spades
- Show your card by turning it over, but you really turn over three cards by using the pinky break method.
- Separate your three cards by "breaking" the deck with your little finger.
- Instead of lifting just one card, lift the top three cards and the audience see the ace of hearts.
- Return the three cards to the top of the deck, face down.
- When you pretend to do the lightning switch and hand them your card face down, they expect the other ace, but instead are getting one of the queens.
- •Take their card (the ace) quickly and put it on top of the deck.
- While distracting the spectator with some patter and direct eye contact, deal him the second card from the top of the pack (the queen) and return "this" card to him.
- •When he turns his cards over, he has two queens instead of two aces.

THE PINKY BREAK METHOD

A pinky break is the trick used by card magicians to mark the spot in a deck of cards where the trick card is sitting. It is a very basic and useful trick for many card tricks, so any aspiring card trick magician should have this one down pat.

METHOD:

- Assemble a deck of cards.
- Take the cards and hold them in your left hand, using the dealer's grip.
- Try to ensure that the deck is sitting squarely in your hand, with the deck closer to the outer fingers. You are presenting a view to the audience of a square and complete pack.
- Place your pinky (littlest finger) at the back of the deck.
- Work quickly to ease your pinky into the part of the deck where you need to mark the placement of a card. Separate this part very slightly with the pinky.
- Press your thumb down on the edge of the top card on the deck. This helps to hide the break.
- Look at the deck. You should be able to see the tiny separation in the deck. The other end of the deck that is closer to the audience should be held slightly higher so that you can hide the break.
- Cut to this location as required by



HERETICS FORK

Consisting of a metal piece with two opposed bi-pronged forks attached to a belt or strap, torturers strapped this device to a victim's neck with one end pushed under the chin and the other to the sternum. The strap was used to was used to secure the victim's neck to the tool while the victim hung from the ceiling o was suspend so that they could not sleep.



CRUCIFIXION

A well-known technique due to the crucifixion of Jesus Christ, it is an intentionally slow and painful execution where the condemned individual is tied or nailed to a large wooden cross and left to hang until they die, which usually took several days.

LEAD SPRINKLER

A stick-like device with a rounded end that could be opened up, this device was usually filled with molten lead, tar, boiling water or boiling oil. The holes in the rounded end would allow the contents to drip onto victims stomachs or other body parts like the eyes.

COFFIN TORTURE

A popular technique during the middle ages, this method involved placing the victim inside a metal cage that was roughly the size of the human body.

They would then be left their until the crows came to feed on their remains.

THUMBSCREW

Also known as 'pilliwinks', this device was used to slowly crush not only the fingers and toes, but larger devices of similar design were also used to crush knees and elbows. There was also a similar device called the Head Crusher - you can guess on which body part it was used.


ROPE TORTURE

When fancy devices could not be found, ropes were said to be the easiest to use of all the torture devices due to its availability and flexibility. Some tactics would include tying the victim to a tree and leaving them exposed and defenseless, hanging victims at the gallows for entertainment and tying the victims limbs to multiple horses that would then be made to run, separating the limbs from the body.



TONGUE TEARER

This scissor-like device could effortlessly cut the victim's tongue. Torturers would force the victim's mouth open with a mouth opener. The tongue tearer would be used to twitch the tongue with its rough grippers. Once the hold was maintained, the screw would be tightened tearing out the tongue.

MOM OF THE YEAR



ANGUISHED MAN


