The first Exxon Frontiers of Science Workshop on Catalysis and Catalytic Processes will be held at Corporate Research Laboratories, Exxon Research and Engineering Company, Annandale, New Jersey, November 15–18, 1991. The purpose of the workshop is to promote informal discussions on emerging concepts in heterogeneous and homogeneous catalysis and catalytic processes. Researchers working on various aspects of catalytic chemistry at interfaces, molecular control of catalytic materials, catalyst characterization, reactor and reaction engineering, and catalyst/process modeling are encouraged to apply.

Attendance will be limited and every participant is expected to give a presentation. We plan 40 short talks (30 from academia, industry, and private and government research organizations and 10 from Exxon) and a poster session for 20 graduate students. The participants will be chosen by a panel of 12 scientists from academia and Exxon. Financial assistance for travel and local expenses will be provided by Exxon for participants from academic institutions. Those interested in attending the workshop should send a paragraph describing their current activities, a list of recent publications, and an abstract of their proposed presentation by June 1, 1991.
