44th Convention of Nobel Prize-holders

Lindau, Germany

27 June – 1 July 1994

The 44th Convention of Nobel prize-holders will be dedicated to physics. Twenty-four laureates from Europe, Japan and the USA have announced their participation in the event, at which they will report on their work.

The topics of the lectures will cover a wide spectrum of present research in physics, as well as general philosophic issues. Special lectures will be given on laser, non-linear optics, high energy physics and semiconductor physics. In more general contributions the future standing of basic research will be discussed. Another lecture will deal with scientific education, and the question of what Newton and Michelangelo have in common will be discussed. Finally, the conception of the development of the cosmos will be dealt with.

As every year, there will be the opportunity for conversation and discussion between prize-holders and students on all days.
