The Price of RSC Journals

It is generally recognised that the cost of chemistry journals has risen steadily in recent years, while library budgets have tended to fall. This has inevitably led to librarians cutting back on journal subscriptions. But what criteria should librarians use when judging one journal against another?

As one recent study has shown, whether judged on price or quality, learned society journals come out on top.

John Christensen, physical sciences librarian at Brigham Young University, has conducted a survey comparing price/million characters and price against impact factor of the chemistry journals taken by his institution. In his words:

*"The underlying problem in the cost of chemical journals is the fact that commercial publications are four times more expensive than non-profit (mainly society) publications, when considering either quantity or quality".**

Learned and professional societies such as The Royal Society of Chemistry exist to promote science and its practitioners, and have a duty to members to make journals affordable. As you will see from our 1996 price list on page 2, RSC journals continue to be made available at highly competitive rates.

New Journal from the RSC and ACS

A new journal, **Organic Process Research and Development**, is being co-produced by The Royal Society of Chemistry and the American Chemical Society. This new bi-monthly journal will contain comprehensive reviews of developments relating to the batch and semi-batch chemical process industries. Each issue will include:

From January 1996, the contents list, currently printed on the back cover, will be expanded and moved inside to include a pictorial representation of the paper content.

Management Board changes

Professor E W Abel has retired from his position representing the RSC on the Board. He is replaced by Professor A G Davies of University College London. Professor Davies is also Chairman of the RSC Journals Committee.

Professor R Hamelin has retired as a representative of the Société Français de Chimie, and his place is taken by Professor J Gore of the Université de Lyons.

Name change for Analytical Proceedings

From the January 1996 issue, **Analytical Proceedings**, which has been the RSC's journal for the publication of short, significant pieces of analytical research since January 1994, will be renamed **Analytical Communications** (ISSN 1359-7337). The new title reflects more accurately the current content of the journal, the majority of which is in the form of communications.

Journal of Materials Chemistry – the French connection

Professor Jean Etourneau of the Institut de Chimie de la Matière Condensée de Bordeaux has agreed to be an Associate Editor for **Journal of Materials Chemistry**. Professor Etourneau will provide a focus for the submission of work from mainland Europe, particularly in the subject area of solid-state materials chemistry. Professor Etourneau's expertise will complement that of Professors Allan Underhill (Editorial Board Chairman) and Martin Bryce (Scientific Advisory Editor).
