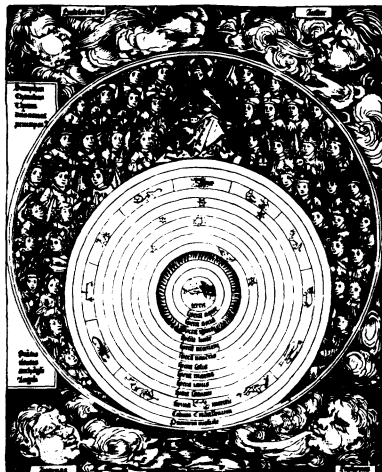

## SIC ET NON

*A Critical Edition*

The *Sic et Non* is a collection of texts from the Bible, church fathers, and popes, which expresses opposed positions on 158 fundamental questions of theology and philosophy. Peter Abailard (1079-1142) adapted the yes-and-no method of the *Sic et Non* from the method of adjudication of canon law, and he extended it to cover the whole field of theology.

This is the first critical edition of the *Sic et Non* and it is based on eleven manuscripts, all that are known at present. This edition will be published in fascicles over a period of two years.
