

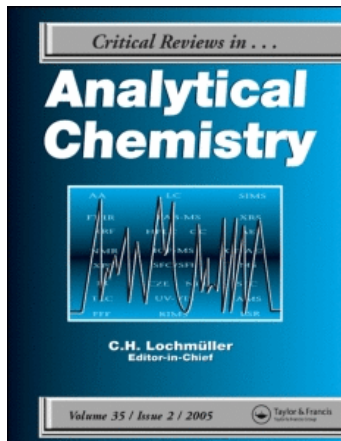

Where will the new frontiers in chemical measurement science be found? It is an intriguing question because I remember tales of when the first papers on vapour phase fractometry were presented at a Gordon Conference more than half a century ago. The gathered participants listened politely, and privately noted that all that would be done had been done. That was followed by 50 years of discovery in gas chromatography! It is hard to tell the future and to predict where frontiers lay.

A friend just wrote me how hard an Editor's job is because there are many that can write and fewer that can also think. Readers of this Journal have widely differing perspectives and are urged to write the Editor to suggest topics for review and even likely authors. We did that for ionic fluids and I would like to see reviews of nano technology and the measurement challenges it presents.
