Side Effects of Drugs Annual 23, edited by J.K. Aronson, Department of Clinical Pharmacology, Radcliffe Infirmary, University of Oxford, Oxford, UK. Elsevier, Amsterdam, 2000. 628 pp, hardbound. Price NLG 425 (EUR 192.86) / US\$ 215. ISBN: 0-444-50212-2.

This is the latest volume in a world-wide yearly survey of new data and trends in adverse drug reactions. The **Side Effects of Drugs Annual** offers clinicians in widespread disciplines a reliable and critical overview of all that is known in the area of adverse drugs reactions. Written by an international team of specialists in the various areas. Audience: clinical pharmacologists, medical investigators, clinicians, pharmacists, pharmacologists, neuropharmacologists. Every four years, these Annuals are collated into the reference book, Meyer's Side Effects of Drugs (see below).

This renowned encyclopaedia of adverse drug reactions, now in its 14th edition, gives an up-to-date and critical review of the world literature over the past four years. This is the critical review by an international team of specialists of the yearly Side Effects of Drugs Annuals. This 14th edition summarises in 49 chapters Annuals 20-23 (1997-2000). This book covers essentially all drugs and drug classes currently used in clinical medicine. There are good indexes of drugs and of side effects.

This is the latest in this series of calendars for the pharmacist or anyone interested in the history of medicine, containing 12 colour plates illustrating different objects from European collections, described on the back in English and German, with a bibliography. The large size (49 x 49 cm) makes this calendar an asset to any office or laboratory, and the heavy quality paper makes the illustrations suitable for later framing.
