Sectional Anatomy of the Head and Neck with Correlative Diagnostic Imaging

THIS IS A new atlas by a team including anatomists, radiologists, dentists, otorhinolaryngologists and others. It focuses on the anatomy of the head and neck illustrated in high quality plastinated sequential sections in sagittal, oblique, frontal and transverse planes. The anatomy is correlated with diagnostic imaging using mainly MR, CT and X-ray images with the addition of ultrasound, angiography and other techniques as appropriate.

The result is an excellent reference atlas ideal for all anatomists, those taking higher examinations, and all surgeons and physicians working in the area. Unfortunately it is marred by several spelling errors. Nevertheless, I believe it should be an addition to every postgraduate library.
