NEW COMPUTER PROGRAMS FOR THE ANALYSIS OF CLINICAL TRIAL DATA

Richard Sylvester represented the E.O.R.T.C. Data Center at the BMDP-77 tutorial given in London on 30-31 August. The purpose of the tutorial was to familiarize potential users with the new BMDP series of computer programs.

These new statistical programs are a big improvement over the old series and represent a welcome addition to the literature. New programs which are of particular interest to people who are involved with the statistical analysis of clinical trial data have recently been added. Of particular interest are new programs on the analysis of contingency tables and a new program for the analysis of life tables and survival functions. New programs which may be used to identify important prognostic factors are in the design stage and will be available in the near future.
