COMMISSION FOR EDUCATIONAL EXCHANGE

AWARDS FOR RESEARCH IN THE TREATMENT OF CANCER SPONSORED BY THE EUROPEAN ORGANIZATION FOR RESEARCH IN THE TREATMENT OF CANCER

Field of award: cancer research.

Terms of award: From one to three years at the National Cancer Institute in Bethesda, Maryland or at NCI-related laboratories in the Washington, D.C. area. The successful candidate will receive a stipend at the level of an N.I.H. training fellow. Sponsoring organizations may entertain applications for extension.

Sponsor: The European Organization for Research in the Treatment of Cancer in collaboration with the National Cancer Institute of the National Institutes of Health.

Eligibility criteria: Preference will be given to candidates:

who have received their Ph.D. or M.D. no more than three years before application;

who have personal qualities, a proven level of academic or professional excellence, as well as outstanding records;

who are able to communicate effectively in English;

who demonstrate a knowledge of and professional goals in cancer research.

Preliminary application: Candidates should provide:

a completed Preliminary Application Form, obtainable on request from the Commission at the address below;

an essay in English stating why they have applied to this program, what research in the field they have performed in the past, what are their professional and research goals.

On the basis of the preliminary application, the candidate's eligibility for an award can be determined. Eligible candidates will be provided with final application materials.
