E.S.O. EUROPEAN SCHOOL OF ONCOLOGY

1984—Seven full-immersion courses of five and a half days each.

CONFERENCE ON IMMUNITY TO CANCER

Williamsburg, VA, 10-12 September 1984

A conference to present recent advances in the various branches of cancer immunology will be held at the Colonial Williamsburg Conference Center, Williamsburg, VA, on 10-12 September 1984. The conference is cosponsored by the Biological Response Modifiers Program (BRMP) of the National Cancer Institute and the Monsanto Chemical Company. Participants are invited to submit a one-page abstract, identified by session title, for a poster session (deadline 15 June 1984). From the abstracts chosen for the poster presentation, a minority will be selected for inclusion in the Proceedings. There will be a registration fee of \$75.00 made payable to Program Resources, Inc. (deadline 15 July 1984). Early registration is suggested as the conference is limited to 300 participants.
