PROGRESS AND CONTROVERSIES IN ONCOLOGICAL UROLOGY II

19–21 March 1987, Sonesta Hotel, Kattengat 1, Amsterdam, The Netherlands

This symposium is the second in a series of international symposia on progress and controversies in oncological urology. The first symposium was held in Noordwijkerhout, 8–10 September 1983.

The symposium is designed to provide the participants with the results of the most recent developments in the diagnosis and treatment of urological malignancies.

The program will consist of two parts: formal presentations with subsequent round tables and one half day of seminars and seminar reports on eight different aspects of prostatic carcinoma which are suitable to reach consensus about minimal requirements for use in clinical routine and prospective trials. The idea of the seminars and the subsequent report is to reach a certain base-line for future consensus meetings on the various aspects of prostatic carcinoma.
