## Report on the Activities of the EORTC-NCI Exchange Program

THE EXCHANGE PROGRAM originated in an agreement between the EORTC and the U.S. National Cancer Institute signed in April 1985 by virtue of which research scholars with at least three years of postdoctoral research may apply for an EORTC-NCI fellowship to do fundamental cancer research in laboratories in the U.S.A. or in Europe. Details of the Exchange Program, qualifications of the candidates and instructions for application are given in the European Journal of Cancer & Clinical Oncology (1985, 21, 995-997 and 1986, 22, 537-538) and the EORTC Newsletter (No. 129, April 1985). Additional information if needed and application forms should be obtained from the Brussels office for the EORTC-NCI Exchange Program.

We are reporting that appointments of candidates began in June, 1985 with the following exchanges from Europe and Israel to the U.S.A.

Of the 36 selected fellows there were 23 men and 13 women. They were 29-59 years old with a mean age of 37 years.

All candidates have completed three years of research related to oncology at the time they left for the U.S.A.; all had been accepted in specific laboratories of interest to them and all were assured that they would be welcomed back by their former employers after their American experience.

Selected fellows receive one half of their stipend from a European source, most often their home institution or a European foundation as arranged by EORTC; the other half is provided by NCI.

Dr. Ihor Masnyk, director of international affairs NCI and Dr. Omar Yoder of the NCI Liaison Office in Brussels have executive responsibilities in this program in collaboration with the selection committee of the EORTC. Mrs. Moore-Deflandre, Honorary Secretary General of the Commission for Educational Exchange between the U.S.A. and Belgium has been instrumental in securing the

It is expected that this program will continue and could probably be expanded in view of the enthusiastic reception on both sides of the Atlantic.

The EORTC Selection Committee is considering additional candidates, from all member countries and from the U.S.A., for it is a part of the agreement that qualified American researchers recommended by NCI should also be assigned to EORTC approved laboratories.

Candidates are invited to apply in time for the Exchange competition which takes place on April 15 and November 15 each year. Applications should be received as soon as possible before the deadlines in order to allow processing by the Selection Committee.
