

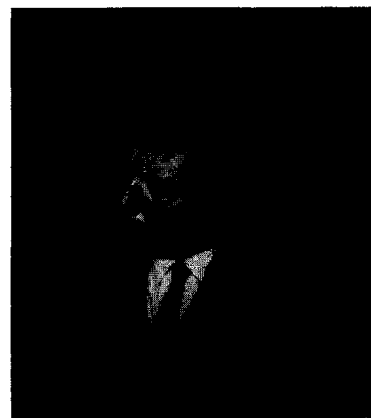
Appointments

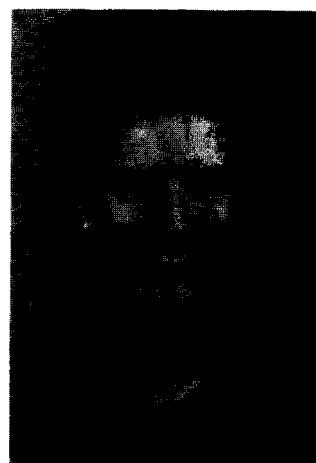

EONS distinguished merit award goes to Dr Agnes Glaus

Dr Agnes Glaus, Head Nurse of the Department of Medicine C and Member of the Board of the European Nursing Oncology Society (EONS) was recently selected to receive the EONS Distinguished Merit Award. The award will be presented to Agnes Glaus during her award lecture on 15 September 1997, during the plenary session at ECCO in Hamburg, Germany.

Agnes Glaus graduated from the St Gallen Nursing School in 1974 and received further training as a public health nurse as well as in nursing management 1976–1978. She has been serving as head nurse of the Medical Oncology Center at the Kantonsspital St Gallen for the last 19

years and is a former president of the Swiss Oncology Nursing Society, a member of the U.S. Oncology Nursing Society and an Associate Editor of the *Journal of Supportive Care in Cancer* and a Consulting Editor of the *European Journal of Cancer*. Agnes Glaus received her Master of Science Degree in Cancer Nursing at the University of Guildford, U.K. in 1992 and her Ph.D-Degree in 1996 at the Health Science Centre at the same University. She is internationally well known as a conference moderator and speaker, and for her extensive research and teaching in supportive care in nursing, especially "Fatigue in Cancer".
