

Call for Papers

1964 Conference in Tokyo

The International Conference on Microwaves, Circuit Theory, and Information Theory, will be held at the Akasaka Prince Hotel, Tokyo, Japan, from September 7–11, 1964. The Conference is sponsored by the Institute of Electrical Communication Engineers of Japan, with support from a large number of other organizations including the IEEE and URSI.

All papers will be presented in English and will be published later in book form by the sponsoring organization. In addition to technical sessions, visits to nearby scientific research laboratories and manufacturing companies, exhibitions of products, and sightseeing trips are being planned.

A Call for Papers has been issued for original contributions in the fields of Microwaves, Circuit Theory, and Information Theory. Those wishing to present papers should submit their title, a one-page abstract of 100 words, and a two-page summary of 800–1200 words, to Dr. Kiyoshi Morita, c/o The Institute of Electrical Communication Engineers of Japan, 2-8, Fujimicho, Chiyoda-ku, Tokyo, Japan. These materials must be received in Japan no later than March 31, 1964.

Because the Conference is to be held just prior to the Olympic Games in Tokyo, reservations must be made well in advance to insure availability of hotel rooms. Those planning to submit papers and all others planning to attend the Conference should notify Prof. Toshio Utsumomiya, Secretary of the Conference, at the address given for Dr. Morita, as soon as possible.
