Two sessions each are devoted to computer-aided-design, filters, measurements, millimeter-wave technology, and systems. Acoustics and ferrites, biological effects, MIC techniques, and optical and submillimeter techniques complete the program, with one session assigned to each.

This *Gateway to the Future* is made possible by the contributions of the authors, the efforts of the Symposium Steering Committee, and the dedicated work of the Technical Program Committee. We are looking forward to a most productive meeting in St. Louis!

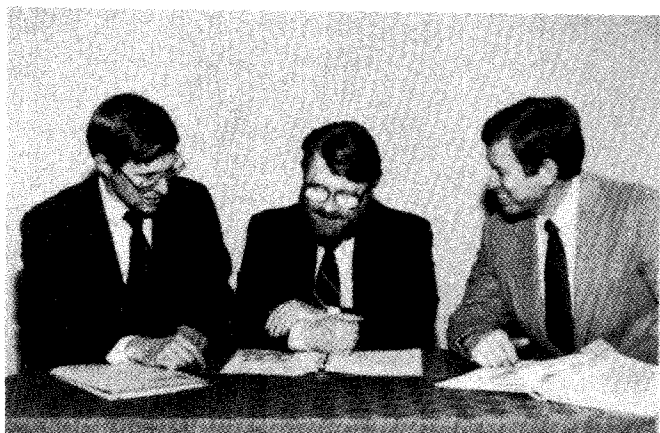

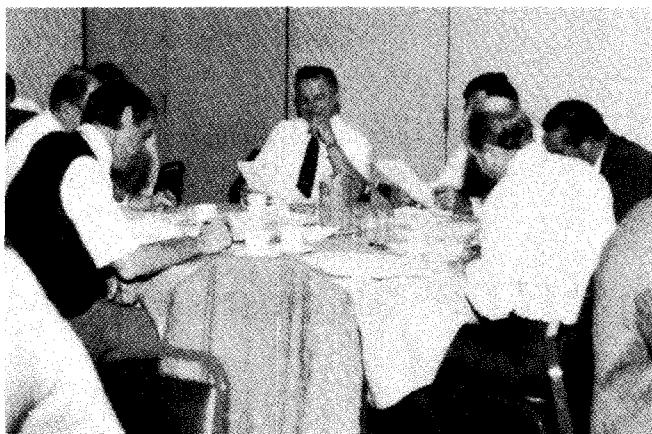
