MESSAGE FROM THE TECHNICAL PROGRAM CHAIRMAN

The 1989 IEEE MTT-S International Microwave Symposium is truly outstanding. It is the culmination of a series of exceptional symposia of the 1980's. 519 papers, over a hundred papers more than the two previous years was an added challenge to the members of the Technical Program Committee who worked diligently to compose the program. This program, along with the Microwave and Millimeter-Wave Monolithic Circuits Symposium and the ARFTG Conference, offers the engineer an exciting full week of microwave theory and techniques.

The Plenary Session will be held in mid-morning on Tuesday. This year's Keynote addresses will be presented by Dr. Simon Ramo (TRW) and Dr. Harold Rosen (Hughes Aircraft Company). Their talks will stress the theme of the Symposium "Microwaves Among the Stars".

Because of the large number of papers accepted, four parallel sessions are scheduled. The Symposium retains features of earlier symposia, such as Focused Sessions, the European Microwave Session, Open Forum Sessions, Panel Sessions, Workshops, regular length papers (20 minutes), short length papers (10 minutes) and 90-minute sessions. The 296 papers selected are broken down into 97 regular papers, 81 short papers, 89 Open Forum papers, and 17 invited papers. 12 papers are presented jointly with the Microwave and Millimeter-Wave Monolithic Circuits Symposium. These papers give an excellent view of the progress in microwave theory and techniques; the lower frequencies are represented with subjects like microwave acoustics and the higher frequencies with optical techniques. In addition, rapidly evolving fields such as superconductivity and Gallium Arsenide are extensively covered.

The Focused Sessions are geared to cover technical areas of great interest. The six sessions cover topics in optical interaction with microwave circuits, microwave acoustics, microwave properties and applications of superconductors and high-power microwaves. There will also be a Special Session honoring life member Dr. Seymour Cohn organized by Peter La Tourrette.

The European Microwave Session will feature three outstanding papers that present the latest microwave developments throughout Europe. Discussed will be Active Microwave Imaging, Modeling of Microwave and Millimeter-Wave Passive Components, and Solid-State Local Oscillator Sources for Millimeter and Sub-Millimeter-Waves. This session, as in previous years, was organized by R.H. Jansen.

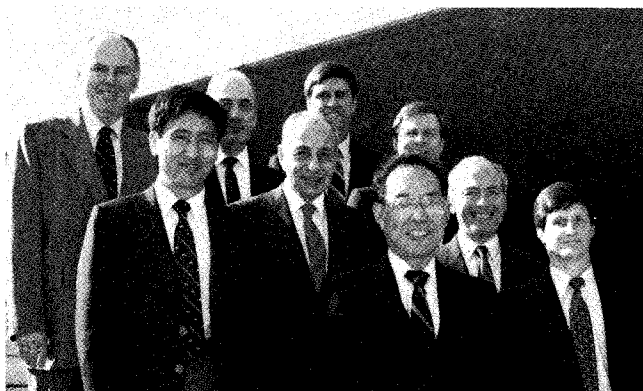
This year, seven panel sessions offer a broad spectrum from "Entrepreneurship", "Improving the Time to Market", and "Education" to the more technical "Superconductor Applications", "Heterojunction Devices", "Microwave Hardware Descriptive Language" and "MMIC Design". A wide diversity of six workshops is also offered with topics including lightwaves, high power, synthesizers, interconnections and packaging. In addition the Symposium is introducing an Evening Rump Session, "Microwave Characterization of Superconductors".

This year's program has a strong international flavor; over 240 papers were submitted from outside the United States. Once again, GaAs is heavily featured in the Symposium. Including three joint sessions with the Microwave and Millimeter-Wave Monolithic Symposium, a total of eight sessions are devoted to this topic. Another three sessions are devoted to solid-state devices and their applications. Other areas covered in the Symposium include: Biological Effects, CAD, Ferrites, Field Theory, Filters, Guided Waves, Optics, Measurements, Microwave Acoustics, Microwave High Power, MIC, Microwave Superconductivity, Millimeter-Wave, Passive Components and Arrays.

The 1989 International Microwave Symposium program demonstrates a high degree of activity in the microwave community. This outstanding program is made possible by the contributions of the authors and the dedicated work of the Technical Program Committee. Special thanks are in order for the efforts of Vice-Chairman Ken Yano, Open Forum Chairman Michael Kim and Focussed Session, Panel, and Workshop Organizers John Horton and Ken Conklin.

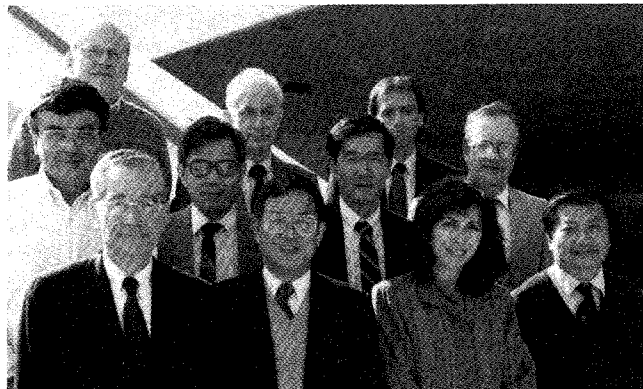
