ANNOUNCEMENT OF STUDENT PAPER CONTEST

A student paper contest for full-time students (9 hours/semester graduate, 12 hours/semester undergraduate) will be held as part of the 1991 Symposium. To be considered, papers must be received by the Technical Program Committee by December 14, 1990. A student must be the lead author, and the second author should attach a statement that his/her contribution is primarily advisory. There should be no more than two authors.

PRESENTATION OF PAPERS: All student papers accepted by the Technical Program Committee and presented by the student author at the 1991 MTT-S Symposium are eligible for the contest. First, second, and third prizes will be awarded. All papers will be presented at regular sessions of the 1991 Symposium. The papers will be judged for content, presentation, and visual materials. Selection of the three finalists will be made by a panel of judges chosen by the 1991 Symposium Steering Committee.

PRESENTATION AWARDS: Prizes will be awarded as follows:

First Prize: \$400. Second Prize: \$250. Third Prize: \$150.

In addition, a plaque will be presented to the first place winner and certificates to the second and third place winners. The presentation of awards will be made at the 1991 Symposium. The conference registration fee will be waived for all student authors presenting his/her paper.

TRAVEL STIPENDS: Students whose papers are accepted for presentation at the 1991 Symposium are eligible for assistance with hotel and travel expenses. Assistance must be requested when the abstract of the paper is submitted to the Technical Program Committee.
