


Message from the MMWMC Chairman



1992 marks the second decade of the IEEE Microwave and Millimeter-wave Monolithic Circuits Symposium. Back in 1982, the founders of this Symposium wished to promote an emerging technology that would impact the microwave industry the way Silicon integrated circuits revolutionized computers and consumer electronics.

A glimpse of the status of MMIC technology insertion in the microwave marketplace will be provided by our invited speakers.
