

## INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

### Scope

The IEEE TRANSACTIONS ON NEURAL NETWORKS publishes high-quality papers in the theory, design, and application of neural networks, ranging from software to hardware. Emphasis will be given to artificial neural networks. Readers are encouraged to submit manuscripts which disclose significant technical achievements, indicate exploratory developments, or present significant applications for neural networks. This TRANSACTIONS contains a Letters section intended to serve as a vehicle for rapid publication of new, significant, and timely research results. The Letters section also includes information of current interest, and comments and rebuttals in connection with published papers.

### Types of Contributions

Three types of contributions are regularly considered: Papers, Brief Papers, and Letters. Papers and Brief Papers go through the same review process, while Letters go through a shorter, simpler review process. In general, the maximum length for Papers is 32 pages typed double-space, including figures; the maximum length for Brief Papers is 16 pages typed double-space, including figures; and the maximum length for Letters is 8 pages typed double-space, including figures.

### Submission of Manuscripts

For Papers or Brief Papers, six copies of the complete manuscript plus a cover letter should be submitted to the Editor, Robert J. Marks II, 1131 199th St. S.W., Suite N, Lynnwood, WA 98036-7138 USA. Registered mail should be sent to the Editor at the University of Washington, Mail Stop FT-10, Seattle, WA 98195 USA. The manuscript should contain a short one-paragraph abstract which briefly describes the subject and the contribution. Authors are encouraged to put detailed derivations in Appendices. Do not send original artwork until requested. Upon acceptance of a Paper, authors will be requested to supply their biographies (100 to 200 words) and photographs (black and white passport size preferred).

For Letters, six copies of the complete manuscript plus a cover letter, a signed IEEE copyright form, and original artwork should be submitted to the Associate Editor, Letters, Kurt Hornik, Institut für Statistik und Wahrscheinlichkeitstheorie Technische Universität Wien, Wiedner Hauptstr. 8-10/107, A-1040 Vienna, Austria. The manuscript should contain a short one-paragraph abstract. Letters should focus on reporting the results obtained, their significance, and the conclusions reached. The amount of supporting detail should be kept to a minimum. Publication of a manuscript as a Letter does not preclude later publication of a fully developed version. The maximum length for Letters is 8 pages typed double-space, including figures.

In general, this TRANSACTIONS follows the standards of the IEEE. The booklet *Information for IEEE Transactions and Journal Authors* is available on request from the IEEE Publications Department, 345 East 47th Street, New York, NY 10017-2394.

### Page Charges

After a manuscript has been accepted for publication, the author's company or institution will be requested to pay \$110 per printed page to cover part of the cost of publication. Page charges for this TRANSACTIONS, like those for journals of other professional societies, are not obligatory; nor is their payment a prerequisite for publication. The author will receive 100 free reprints without covers if the charge is honored. Detailed instructions will accompany the proofs.

### Electronic Form

The IEEE will accept your electronic media together with your hard copy for publication according to the following guidelines:

Please make certain that changes made to your paper version are incorporated into your disk version. Please don't try to be overly fancy; time is better spent "fine-tuning" the content and leaving the *format* to the publisher. Package your floppy disk to minimize possible damage in shipping and let us know *exactly* the type of computer and word processor used, including version number.

Together with your wordprocessor version, include a "FLAT ASCII" version on the disk, if possible.

The IEEE can accept: any IBM-PC (or 100% compatible) disk format: 5.25"/360k/1.2Mb—3.5"/720k/1.44Mb (DS/DD, DS/HD, DS/QD, etc.); Macintosh disk format; 0.25" magnetic tape cartridges (UNIX: tar, bar, dump); 3.5" floppy disk (UNIX workstations: tar, bar, dump); 8mm tape cartridge (UNIX: tar, bar, dump); any of the following:

*Interleaf, TeX, and LaTeX*: the IEEE will gladly accept manuscripts keyed using any of these systems. However, if you have written macros that are required to produce your hard copy, then, of course, IEEE requires them to be *available* on your electronic media. Please do not forget to include them with your submission.

### Copyright

It is the policy of the IEEE to own the copyright to the technical contributions it publishes on behalf of the interests of the IEEE, its authors, and their employers, and to facilitate the appropriate reuse of this material by others. To comply with the U.S. Copyright Law, authors are required to sign an IEEE Copyright Form before publication. This form, a copy of which appears in the January 1992 issue of this TRANSACTIONS, returns to authors and their employers full rights to reuse their material for their own purposes. Authors must submit a signed copy of this form with their manuscripts.

### Submission of Final Manuscript

**Page Numbers:** Number all pages, including illustrations (which should be grouped at the end), in a single series, with no omitted numbers. Figures should be identified with the figure number and author's name on the back; use a soft pencil when identifying photographs, and preferably keep the information in the margin of the print, off the body.

**References** should be started on a separate sheet of paper, and must be double-spaced. **Figure captions** should be started on a separate sheet of paper, and must be double-spaced. Do not include captions on the illustrations themselves, since captions are set in type separately. Figure captions should be sufficiently clear so that the figures can be understood without detailed reference to the accompanying text. Axes of graphs should have self-explanatory labels, not just symbols (e.g., Electric Field rather than *E*).

**Illustrations:** Original illustrations should be submitted along with the manuscript. All line drawings (graphs, charts, diagrams, etc.) should be prepared on a white background in black ink. Photostatic copies of drawings are acceptable only when they are exceptionally clear, with high contrast, preferably on glossy paper. Lettering should be large enough to be readily legible when the drawing is reduced to two- or one-column width—as much as 4:1 reduction from the original. In the original size, this lettering may appear too large, but the reader will benefit. Lettering on figures is preferably done by template. Photographs should be used sparingly. A good line drawing of apparatus is usually more informative than a photograph. All photographs must be glossy prints. All materials, including drawings and photographs, should be no larger than 22 × 28 cm (8½ × 11 in).
