The IEEE Home Page premiered January 4, 1995 on the World-Wide Web, along with THE INSTITUTE, the IEEE monthly newspaper (and supplement to IEEE SPECTRUM). To investigate, readers will need full Internet access, plus "browser" software such as Mosaic, Lynx or Netscape.

gives you the inside track on society membership, new technologies, technical activities, active Society Web Pages and more—within 37 specialized fields of interest.



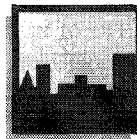
STUDENT ACTIVITIES...
