FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS AND ANSWERS

Q. Is IEEE on the World Wide-Web?

A. IEEE has a Home Page on the Web.

Q. How do I get to the Web?

A. You will need full Internet access, plus a "browser" software such as Mosaic, Lynx or Netscape.

Q. What is IEEE's Web address?

A. <http://www.ieee.org> is IEEE's World Wide Web address or URL.

Q. Can I get prices on-line?

A. Right now, 30 of our new and best-selling products are on the Home Page, under the "IEEE Bookstore."

Q. Is the IEEE catalog on-line?

A. Not yet...but we plan to get it there.

Q. Can I find price and product information on IEEE standards on-line?

A. Yes - there's a link from the IEEE Home Page, or you can use a direct URL:

Q. What is IEEE planning for the Web?

A. IEEE plans to provide an electronic guide to the services, activities, products and people of the IEEE - the world's largest technical professional association, and the world's leading producer of information on electrotechnology. Like others on the Web, a great deal of information is "under construction," but we're growing all the time.

The IEEE Transactions/Journals/Letters department will be listing an advance look at the Table of Contents of its coming issues. The page will start in mid-March, and be titled "Publication Preview."

IEEE Spectrum will make value-added use of the synergies between electronic and print media. For example, additional material related to information appearing in Spectrum will be accessible through the Home Page

Q. Where can I learn more about IEEE's Web activity?

A. Keep watching the IEEE Home Page for what's new, and access/read **The Institute**. The monthly column called "Traveling the Information Highway with Bob Alden" is especially helpful.

Q. What's there?

A. Readers should be aware that this is just the beginning of an exploration into cyberspace, so many of the locations in the IEEE corner of the Web are still "under construction." At present, the IEEE Home Page offers **The Institute** and:

MEMBER SERVICES...

a source of useful information about IEEE membership and benefits, including IEEE sectional and regional activities, Ask*IEEE, the Financial Advantage Program, and more.

IEEE BOOKSTORE...

where you can browse a selection of the IEEE's new and best-selling books, videos, merchandise and apparel, find out about Continuing Education, get ordering information, and more.

IEEE's TECHNICAL SOCIETIES...

gives you the inside track on society membership, new technologies, technical activities, active Society Web Pages, and more—all within 37 specialized fields of interest.

STUDENT ACTIVITIES...

a home page devoted to keeping you in touch with the many IEEE services available to students, including student membership, IEEE-related newsgroups, and the RAB Student Page. You'll also find instructions on how to register your branch Web server as well as an Institute-wide list of student pages.

LOCAL ACTIVITIES...

where you can find regional home pages, a list of sections and chapters, and other pointers of local interest.

FOR ORGANIZATIONS ONLY...

created expressly for librarians, booksellers, and subscription agents, this web location provides details concerning ordering, subscriptions, and shipping.
