

INFORMATION FOR AUTHORS

Submitting Manuscripts for Publication

Manuscripts for review should be submitted in pdf format as an email attachment to the Editor, David Rutledge, at **rutledge@caltech.edu**. I will respond as quickly as I can to your submissions, but there may be substantial delays. Please make the pdf file with a word-processing program or by converting a printer file, rather than by scanning. The maximum file size is 1MB and all fonts need to be embedded in the file. Each manuscript must include an abstract of 200 words or less. The manuscript should be formatted so that is easy to read on either a computer screen or on paper printed out in black and white. The manuscript should be single-spaced and single-column, with figures and captions included within the text. Figures should be large enough to be easily viewed on a computer screen. Label axes carefully and use large lettering. Instrument screen dumps and screen photos should be redrawn to make them clear. Plot theory and experiment on the same graph so that they can be compared easily. Shading and color should be avoided for the reviewers who print the manuscripts.
