THE SIXTH U.S. CONGRESS FOR APPLIED MECHANICS

THE SIXTH U.S. Congress for Applied Mechanics will be held at Harvard University, Monday through Friday, 15-19 June 1970, under the auspices of the U.S. National Committee for Theoretical and Applied Mechanics. It is proposed to have sessions devoted to all of the major topics in Applied Mechanics—Solid Mechanics, Fluid Mechanics, Control Theory, Heat Transfer, Biomechanics, etc. Each day will open with a General Review Lecture on a major

area of Applied Mechanics and will be followed by four or five concurrent sessions containing largely contributed papers.
